Records Credit Bureau of Columbus, Inc., searched 5/24/68 by Mrs. CARLA JACQUES, disclose residence of NOAH LANE to be 687 Valerie Lane. He is listed as employed as mechanic, Glenn Davis Pure Oil Station, Main and Hamilton Road, since 5/65. He has a "B" credit rating.

Neighborhood inquiry and investigation at Glenn Davis

ROYSTER stated that from previous acquaintance with PUCKETT, he was aware PUCKETT did not like the late President KENNEDY or his brother. At no time did ROYSTER hear any mention of the name of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., and he did not have any specific information as to the identity of the intended victim nor the name of the person "they" sent to shut him up. ROYSTER emphasized that he had reported the information to his minister, FLOYD EATON, Creedmoor, N. C., on a confidential basis on the possibility that it might have bearing on the assassination of Rev. KING, but he, ROYSTER. had no additional information in the matter whatsoever. ROYSTER added further that he had been the only other individual present in the store at the time of the conversation. At about the time the above comments were made, MELVIN PUCKETT'S brother, ULYSSES C. PUCKETT Ocame to the store and filled the prescription and ROYSTER Jeft.

ROYSTER expressed the opinion that PUCKETT was a member of the local unit of the KKK. He based this opinion on the fact PUCKETT has a Citizens Band Radio in the store and one of the numbers on his list was that of the KKK.

ROYSTER further reported that three PARHAM brothers operated a garage at Bullock, N. C., known as the Bullock Garage. He understood DAVE PARHAM left Bullock, N. C., about two days prior to 4/4/68, driving a red Mustang. He was gone for approximately one week before returning driving a light blue Mustang. He stated DAVE, a white male, in his 30's or 40's, who, insofar as he knew, had moved to the vicinity of Bullock during the summer of 1967. ROYSTER stated that he thought possibly DAVE PARHAM could have been the person referred to by PUCKETT although he was unaware of any association whatsoever between PUCKETT and PARHAM. Furthermore, he had heard some conversation indicating DAVE PARHAM had been gone during the week of 4/4/68, on duty with the National Guard.

On 5/28/68, MELVIN PUCKETT, Puckett's Grocery Store, Stovall, N. C., advised that he and his brother, ULYSSES, operate a combination drug store and grocery store in the Stovall Community, of Granville County, N. C. PUCKETT stated that he cannot recall any conversation in which he was alleged to have participated on 4/3/68, concerning the announced candidacy of BOBBY KENNEDYhor could be recall making any statement to the effect that "That man won't live to carry out what he aims to do, we have a man on the way to get him." PUCKETT advised that he often discusses current events with customers and that he would be unable to even quess the identity of the farmer with whom he was speaking on 4/3/68. PUCKETT advised that the statement as described above, does not sound familiar to him and that he could not imagine any conversation where he would have made or even recall hearing such a statement.

PUCKETT stated that the only group that he is a member of is the Stovall Baptist Church. He stated he had no further information which could shed any light on the conversations in referenced Bureau airtel.

On 5/28/68, ROBERT HYLER, Grocery store owner, Bullock, N. C., advised he is acquainted with the PARHAM Brothers who own and operate the Bullock Garage. HYLER advised that the PARHAM brothers have operated this garage since 2/68; to the best of his knowledge are law-abiding citizens. He advised he believes there are three brothers, D. A. PARHAM, LEWIS PARHAM and GRAHAM PARHAM. HYLER advised that all three brothers reside in Granville County, N. C.

On 5/28/68, DAVID A. PARHAM, JR. was contacted at his place of employment, the Bullock Garage, Bullock, N. C., and he advised that he and his brothers have been operating the garage since early in 1968, and that he is the mechanic, LEWIS is employed by IBM Corporation in Durham, N.C., and his brother, GRAHAM is a farmer in Granville County, N.C.

PARHAM advised he does not nor ever has owned a Mustang of any color; however, he was driving a red Camaro, Chevrolet, around the beginning of April, 1968, for a couple of days. He advised that he did not leave Granville County, N. C., during April, 1968, until he was called up as a member of the N. C. National Guard on 4/5/68, as a result of the racial disturbances at that time.

On 5/31/68, J. L. CAMP, Route 1, Silver Creek, Georgia, operator of the County Line Tavern, advised that 5 or 6 weeks age, a man came to the tavern after having been picked up as a hitch-hiker by a Mr. BALDWIN. The man had no luggage and when he indicated need for employment, CAMP effered him a job on CAMP's manuficated need for employment, CAMP effered him a job on CAMP's manufication. The man gave only the name of JEEN HOSELIN, and when asked concerning relationsor next of kin, indicated only that he had a mether in Gadedon, Alabama. He said the man seemed to be inexperienced in farm work, and after remaining there a time, asked permission to go to Alabama, supposedly to pick up his clothing. He returned within a fee days, indicating he had been unable to locate his mether, and did not return with any clothing. He occasionally mentioned having also been in Birmingham, Alabama, in the past, and having worked for a cafe of some type. CAMP allowed the man to stay in a small house trailer next to the tavers, and while there, he was not visited by anyone, and never mentioned any relatives or friends by name.

On 5/27/68, CAMP allowed MOSKLEY to work as a bartener in the tayern, and observed him making mistakes in customer's change. On the morning of 5/28/68, MOSKLEY was noted to be missing and that is the last he has seen or heard of this person. He later determined that \$26 was missing from the previous day's proceeds.

On 5/30/68, CAMP observed a picture of JAMES HARL RAY, aka ERIC GAULT, in a newspaper, and decided that MONTLEY bere a resemblance to RAY. He described MONTLEY as being a W/M, age 28-30, 155 lbs., 5' ll", with dark brown or black hair, and had

On 6/1/68, at about 4:45 p.m., Detective CHASE, Intelligence Division, Metropolitan Police Department, Washington, D. C., relephonically advised SA ALLAN M. POWER that STEVE ISAACS. City Editor, "The Washington Post," reported a female reporter covered a meeting that date where RALPH ABERNATHY for the Poor People's Campaign was supposed to speak. For some reason, ABERNATHY was replaced by ANDI YOUNG. The female reporter mentioned to ISAACS that a red neck" in the crowd closely resembled JAMES EARL RAY. This reporter noted the "red neck" left abruptly when it was learned ABERNATHY would not speak. ISAACS indicated another reporter covering this meeting also thought the "red neck" resembled RAY.

At 5:03 p.m. on 6/1/68, Mr. STEPHEN ISAACS, City Editor, "The Washington Post", advised SA ROBERT W. DAWSON that reporter CAROL HONSA (Mrs. CARL BERNSTEIN) covered a

conference of the Capital Trust Club at the Shoreham Hotel this date, and that at about 10:30 a.m. she saw a white man, who was wearing no socks, that she believed to look like an old photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and like the artist's sketch which appeared in the "Commercial Appeal," a Memphis, Tennessee, newspaper. She said that LARRY STILL, who was formerly a reporter for "The Evening Star," a Washington, D. C., newspaper, had also seen this individual.

On 6/1/68, CAROL HONSA, City Editor, "The Washington Post," whose married name is Mrs. CARL BERNSTEIN, advised that she was assigned to cover the Capital Press Club, Washington, D. C., conference at the Shoreham Hotel concerning the urban crisis. She said that she arrived at the Palladium Room of that hotel at about 10:45 a.m., at which time a conference concerning religion and the ghetto was just ending. She observed a young white man sitting in the rear of the room studying the program of the conference. This individual did not appear to be listening to the proceedings, and he was not observed to talk to anyone. HONSA stated that because of his dress he appeared out of place; and she was suspicious of him. She said that most persons were dressed in business clothing, but this individual wore a sport shirt, open at the neck, possibly beige or dirty white, a long sleeve rust colored cardigan sweater, dark trousers, possibly gray, and black shoes with no socks. She said that she had never seen this individual attending any meeting of this type on previous occasions. HONSA stated that this individual appeared to be waiting for the next sermon of the conference, which concerned civil rights organizations and the ghetto; Rev. RALPH ABERNATHY, President of the Southern Christain Leadership Conference, was scheduled to speak.

HONSA stated that after a coffee break, about 11:00 a.m., speakers for the conference were introduced; and at this time the above mentioned individual was standing at the rear of the

room near a steel service door. He appeared to be confused, and shortly after the speakers were announced, he left the room by the steel service door. She said that she did not know why he was standing, as there were plenty of seats with only about 70 - 75 people present at the meeting. About 10 minutes later he re-entered the room but left again almost immediately.

HONSA stated that because of this man's appearance and actions, she was suspicious of him; and when he left immediately after it was learned that Rev. RALPH ABERNATHY would not be a speaker, she suspected he might be there to cause some harm to ABERNATHY. She said that she spoke to LAWRENCE STILL, President of the Capital Trust Club, about this individual; and at the time she talked to STILL. AL SWEENEY was present.

HONSA stated that she had never seen this individual before or since he left the meeting, and that she could furnish no information to identify him. She suggested that he might be known to STILL or SWEENEY.

HONSA commented that her husband considers her an "alarmist".

HONSA advised that as she returned to the Washington Post offices around 4:00 p.m., she was thinking about this individual and about the possibility of ABERNATHY being assinated as KING was; and at this time she thought about this individual possibly looking like JAMES EARL RAY. Upon arriving at the newspaper offices, she had the photographs of RAY obtained from the newspaper morque and reviewed them. She stated that the individual she had seen somewhat resembled the 1966 Missourt State Penitentiary photograph of RAY and the "Commercial Appeals" artist's sketch.

HONSA described the individual she had seen as a white male, approximately 30 - 35 years of age, 6 feet tall, slender build, 160 - 180 pounds, thin face, light brown cropped hair with side burns to the middle of the ears, fair complexion which was slightly pink as though sun burned or wind burned. She said the individual reminded her of a "red neck".

At approximately 7:00 p.m. on 6/1/68, SA DAWSON was unable to find any individual in the lobby of the Shoreham Hotel fitting the description as furnished by HONSA.

On 6/2/68, Mr. LAWRENCE STILL, 5704 New Hampshire Avenue, N. E., advised SA DAWSON that he did not see the individual that HONSA had spoken to him about. He said that he may have seen the individual, but did not recall him. STILL stated that he did not have any recollection of seeing anyone at the meeting mentioned by HONSA that looked like RAY. STILL stated that he would immediately report any such thing to authorities. STILL advised that ALFRED L. SWEENEY, who is Chairman of the conference, Telephone 593-5023, could possibly furnish additional information.

On 6/2/68, Mr. SWEENEY, who resides at 1105 Lamberton Court, Silver Spring, Md., advised that he had seen the individual pointed out by CAROL HONSA, and that he hid not been disturbed by this person present at the above mentioned conference. He said that his first thoughts were that the person was a worker at the hotel, but he had no information in this connection. He said that he had no way of identifying the individual. Mr. SWEENEY stated that he has seen photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and he does not consider the individual mentioned by HONSA to at all resemble RAY. SWEENEY further stated that because of his interest in civil rights and the urban crisis, he would be the first to notify authorities in the event he saw an individual he believed to resemble RAY.

In view of no identifying information being obtained by HONSA, and since other individuals do not believe the individual resembled JAMES EARL RAY, WFO is taking no further action in this matter.

ROBIRT LAWRENCE RUSSELL, FBI Number 892 144A was interviewed in the San Francisco County Jail, Hall of Justice Building, San Francisco, California, on June 4, 1368.

RUSSELL advised that his true name was ROBERT LAWRENCE RUSSELL although he was confined to the San Francisco County Jail under the name ROBERT LAWRENCE. RUSSELL stated he was born on _____ in Atlantic City, New Jersey. He stated he is being held on a charge of grand theft and his trial date is July 10, 1968.

RUSSELL related he was arrested in New York City, New York, about September 23, 1967, and has been in custody ever since except for a week in November, 1967. He advised that in November, 1967, he was released because he was cooperating with the New York City Police Department and/or the New York County District Attorney's Office. He advised he was returned to California and since returning to California has been confined first in the San Francisco City Jail and then the San Francisco County Jail, located on the sixth and seventh floors respectively of the Hall of Justice Building.

He advised that his wife is VALERIE RUSSELL, 12 East 31st Street, New York City, New York. He advised she was a legal secretary who formerly worked for Judge MUPPHY, not otherwise identified. He related his wife is pregnant and expecting a baby in the next two weeks.

RUSSELL advised that he had written a letter which he gave to BRUCE GOVERN while they were both confined in San Francisco City Jail. He advised that this letter was entirely a figment of his imagination and had no basis in fact except that he said he knew a man by the name of GALT in New Orleans, Louisiana, in 1967.

RUSSELL stated after examining the photographs of JAMES EARL RAY that he saw RAY who was using the name JIMIY GALT in the Roosevelt Hotel bar in New Orleans, Louisiana, in April, 1967, late in the month, or May, 1967.

RUSSELL related he was using the name JAMES ALEXANDER at this time. He related that eventually he was arrested in the City of New Orleans and was booked under the name JAMES ALEXANDER.

He advised that he did not consider the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY wherein RAY is wearing sunglasses to be a good likeness. He related that the photograph showing RAY in a business suit with a white shirt and wearing a tie was a good likeness of the man he knew as JIMMY GALT. He described JIMMY GALT as a white male American, 180 to 190 pounds, 5'10', and having black hair. He advised he never paid any attention to GALT's eyes. He stated he could not recall any scars on his forehead or hands. He was unable to describe the nose and made no remarks concerning the chin. He advised that GALT wore a watch and a diamond pinky ring. He also wore sunglasses with a black frame. He advised that he met RAY in the bar at the Roosevelt Hotel in New Orleans.

RUSSELL advised that he had won some money gambling and was in New Orleans to enjoy himself and to see if he could make any other scores. He stated he was aware that the State of California wanted him at that time.

He advised that he had frequented the Hotel Roosevelt bar for several days and noticed RAY, or GALT as he was called, in the bar and eventually met him. He advised that GALT had a great deal of money. He stated it was his belief that he could have had as much as \$25,000 and this was based upon the fact that he saw GALT take money out of his pocket and that he had several \$50 and/or \$100 bills in his possession. He advised after seeing GALT with this roll that he decided he wanted to get to know him and to get to know where his residence was located so that he could get the money from him. He advised he intended to burglarize GALT's residence if necessary.

He advised that after talking with GALT at the bar in the Roosevelt Hotel that he eventually told GALT that he was wanted by the police. He advised that he saw GALT several times during a two or three week period. He advised that eventually GALT indicated that he also had done time but had been out for five or six years.

He described GALT as being very quiet, did not like Negro people, and seemed to enjoy gambling.

He related GALT never took him to his residence. He advised it was his belief that GALT lived either with his brother or his uncle in New Orleans, Louisiana. He stated this was based upon the fact that they went riding in an automobile one afternoon and that they drove by a house which was located three or four blocks from the French market and also near a big church, and GALT indicated he lived there.

He advised that the automobile they were riding in belonged to GALT's girl friend.

He advised that this house was located about ten or twelve blocks from Canal Street and five or six blocks from a big church, stating that the street had big houses on it and that at least two families lived in the building.

He advised it was his recollection that he was introduced to GALT by a barmaid in the Roosevelt Hotel. RUSSELL stated that he frequented the bar every night and was so well known there that he could even leave a tab. He advised that he cannot recall the barmaid's name or her description. He stated it was his recollection that the bartender was a white male American, about 55 years of age, with gray hair, wearing glasses, who was short and stocky. He stated this bartender had a helper behind the bar who was either of Mexican or Spanish extraction.

RUSSELL stated GALT was frequently in the company of women and he believed that the girl he was with most of the time was named EVELYN (Last Name Unknown) who came from some place in the South, possibly Montgomery, Alabama. RUSSELL stated that it was his belief or recollection that EVELYN was a friend of a girl who had worked at JACK RUBY's place in Dallas, Texas. He advised that also in RAY's company was another woman by the name of IRENE and that he believes she might have been from Los Angeles, California, and had some connection with a bar either as an owner or a prospective purchaser.

RUSSELL related that although he met GALT in the bar at the Roosevelt Hotel, that he also saw him in a restaurant or bar across the street from the Royal Orleans Hotel and near Napoleon's Bar. He remarked that the Royal Orleans Hotel had a bar called the Touche Bar which opened after 4:00 p.m. He advised that located on a corner immediately adjacent to the Royal Orleans Hotel was Napoleon's Bar and that further down in the block was a small bar which had a large back room entirely devoted to gambling. He advised that he was in this small bar with the back room for gambling with GALT on at least one occasion and that GALT placed bets in this room with a girl named "PAT."

He stated that a city building was located across the street from the Royal Orleans Hotel and that very close to this city building was a bar called Sinatraville. He advised that the bartender or owner of this establishment would know GALT and would know RUSSELL as JIMMY ALEXANDER.

He stated that if the owner of the Sinatraville were contacted, that he should be asked about the little blonde girl that came from Mississippi or Alabama, the one who quit her job. He stated that the owner should be asked if he has seen ALEXANDER or JIMMY recently.

He advised that there was a restaurant located over the Absinthe House and that he was in this restaurant on one occasion with JIMMY GALT.

RUSSELL related that after he had been in New Orleans a short time he was arrested and was held in jail for a few days, and after he got out went back to the bar, Sinatraville, inquired about the girl and was told that PAY had gone to a place in Mexico. RUSSELL could not remember the exact dates for the above.

He related that also during the time that he was in New Orleans, a girl he was out with one night got picked up by the police. He stated that he immediately got in contact with the syndicate through a bartender at the Touche Bar in the Roosevelt Hotel and that this girl was then released almost immediately.

He advised that during the time he was in New Orleans that MATT MONROE (phonetic), a singer, was appearing in the Roosevelt Hotel. RUSSELL related that he got to know MATT MONROE and KENNY (Last Name Unknown), MATT MONROE's pianist. He related that on one occasion they went to a bar on Bourbon Street and that JIMMY GALT came in and joined them. He related MATT MONROE resided at the hotel during his engagement.

RUSSELL advised that during the time he was in New Orleans, the Japanese International Floating Fair was in town. He advised that he became very well known aboard this ship and in fact was able to have the Mayor of New Orleans declare one of the officials connected with the Japanese International Floating Fair an honorary citizen of the City of New Orleans.

He advised, Maybe RAY killed him. I believe that RAY was hired. Both men were killed by the same people. He related that by both men he meant President JOHN F. KENNEDY and Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING.

He stated, "I have no knowledge of RAY's present whereabouts. I believe RAY is alive and is either in New Orleans or Rio de Janeiro, South America."

He stated he believes he might have PAY's New Orleans telephone number in some notebooks which he had but which are now in the possession of a District Attorney in New York City as a result of his having been arrested in New York City.

He stated, "I believe that I could locate RAY or his body through making calls or contacts."

He said he had no knowledge of RAY's whereabouts and had no knowledge that PAY was dead.

It was his opinion that President JOHN F. KENNEDY and Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING were killed by the same people. He said it was his belief that the same people are responsible for these two deaths and that the money came from the same people. He advised that it was his belief that President KENNEDY was killed because Cuban exiles held him responsible for the death of Cuban patriots in the Bay of Pigs invasion. He stated it was his opinion that these same Cuban exiles were responsible for the death of MARTIN LUTHER KING because the United States had not supported an invasion which was to be led by a RAOUL TIGART (phonetic). He advised that this man named RAOUL TIGART was captured by CASTRO forces.

He advised that in July, 1964, he was able to become very friendly with some men in Trenton, New Jersey, who were connected with the syndicate. He advised that a man known as CARL or PAPPY (Last Name Unknown) who had done time at Leavenworth but was now a wealthy man had a phone booth registered to the Famous Restaurant on State Street in Trenton, New Jersey. He advised this man, PAPPY, came to him and asked him if he wanted to make a million dollars and that he could make a million dollars by "knocking a guy off." PUSSELL stated that he told PAPPY you have your own men, why don't they do it. PAPPY responded that he did not want to get involved.

He advised that PAPPY checked him out and later indicated that he should get in contact with MARIA CASTRO at the Rio de Janeiro Hotel, Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

He advised that he did call MARIA CASTRO at the Pio de Janeiro Hotel. He stated at the time he made this call he was accompanied by a girl by the name of ADELE MANCINI who lives in Philadelphia. He advised that he spoke to MARIA CASTRO through her aid, GONZALES (phonetic), and was offered one million dollars

to kill FIDEL CASTRO. He stated that MARIA CASTRO indicated that they would make all arrangements.

He advised that in talking with MARIA CASTRO she indicated that one million dollars was the same price that was paid for the death of President KENNEDY.

He advised that this CARL or PAPPY had a partner by the name of JOHN KEYES (Phonetic), also of Trenton, New Jersey.

He advised that ROBERT KENNEDY wanted him to help work the HOFFA case and that a man known as PAUL MONROE contacted him to help him organize cab drivers in Atlantic City, New Jersey.

He advised that during the time he was in New Orleans in 1967 that he called Mr. GARRISON several times but GARRISON never came to the Sheraton Hotel to see him. He stated he wanted to talk to GARRISON about the death of President KENNEDY but got no response. He advised that he had information to furnish GARRISON about the KENNEDY case. He related that both ROBERT KENNEDY and Mrs. JOHN F. KENNEDY had written to him in November, 1963, when he was confined in the New Jersey State Prison. He related that he had written to Mr. ROBERT KENNEDY and Mrs. JOHN F. KENNEDY after the death of President KENNEDY. He stated, "If I told my theory, I would be killed. My theory about the KENNEDY and KING murders."

He stated that he had written a letter to the "Saturday Evening Post" in New York City about the KENNEDY case and that this letter was written in either February or March, 1968.

He advised that he had just prepared a script for a motion picture regarding the KENNEDY case for which he received the sum of \$5,000 from Leonard Anderson (phonetic) Associates in New York City.

He advised that FRANK HOGAN, the District Attorney in New York City, had in his possession personal property belonging to him, RUSSELL, which consisted of notebooks, cards, etc., which he is certain were they returned to him would be productive in locating some telephone number for GALT (RAY) in New Orleans, Louisiana. He also advised that a Mr. MIKE DOUGHTY, telephone number \$09-695-6281, New Jersey State Penitentiary, a kitchen officer, also has some personal papers of his.

He advised that his San Francisco attorney is Mr. GEORGE T. DAVIS.
