

This Professional Summary is being presared at the request of the United States Penitentiary at Leavenworth, Kanses, where this forcer immate is serving a sentence of 3 years and 9 menths for Forging Joney Orders. This request was forwarded from the Joliet Diagnostic Repot. The reterial in this Summary is derived from the files of the Criminologist and should be regarded as confidential.

Innate was received at the Joliet Piagnostic Papet 5-13-52, to serve a sentence of 1 to 2 years for Hobbery. We had held up a toxicab driver in Chicago, taking his vehicle, and was apprehended shortly to creaffer by the police, who shot his during the capture. He admitted his guilt, stabing that he was heavily intoxicated and had used a pipe in place of a gue, placing it at the back of the driver's body. We had previously been on a 2-year probation in les impoles, California, for burglary, he being caught in the act of entering a restaurant from a back stairway.

We was born at Alton, Illinois, the oldest of three children, his father working regalerly as a railroad brakesan until his death in 1917. We was raised primarily in Cuincy, Illinois, where he graduated from eighth grade and later had some high school training under the C. I. Pill. He was in the imay between 2-18-16 and 12-23-16, when he was honorably discharged for lack of adeptability. He had been in Chicago for a short time prior to the offense, and had had several short term jobs as a factory hand or storement torder. He was unmarried, and seemed to be somewhat of a solitary person, with occasional alcoholic excesses.

On the Army Alpha ecomination, he occured Ill, or experier. It was thought that he had no systematic delinquent traits, and segregation at Pontiac was recommended.

It Pontice, he requested a fare assignment, and was so placed, after a short period in the innates' kitchen. He worked as a cook in the farm doraitory, and a helper in the officers quarters, and was always considered an average worker. He had no punishment reports.

The latest medical report in our possession, dated 1-30-53, is essentially magative, and he has never referred to the Psychiatrist for any unusual or abnormal behavior. Our office had a couple of mutine contacts with him, and it appeared that he had been behaving unstably ever since leaving the Impy, and that he was subject to impulsive delinquent behavior in connection with drinking, which, in turn, was related to his tendency to become easily discouraged. Our last contact with him was on 2-15-5h.

Official Version: On April 1, 1955, Ray entered a plea of guilty to an information in one count charging him with for the endersement on a U.S. Post Office money order and he was sentenced derive one and a helf years. On July 1, 1955 another information was fill gainst him in three counts, charging offenses at Not Springs Rational Part Arkenses. He was also charged in an information with an offense connected with a money order at Tallahassee. Floridge, He received a total of three and three fourths years for these various offenses.

The facts which were broughtout in this case indicate that on March 7, 1955 the U.S. Post Office at Kellerville, Illinois was burglerized and sinty-six blank U.S. Postal Money Orders and the office validating steep were stolen. The following day at Alton, Illinois an unsuccessful attempt was made to cash one of these stolen maney orders. Several other money orders were cashed at various places, and it was finally located that Ray and his co-defendant, Walter Terry Rife, our 72497-4, were the persons who were attempting to cash these money orders. At the time of their apprehension thirty four of the money orders which had been solen from the post office were found hidden under the dash above the glove compariment in the automobile, all of which had been dated and stamped with the validating stamp and some which had been made out ready for cashing while others had note.

Through questioning and comissions on the part of Ray and Rife, all of the sirty cir noney orders were accounted for with the exception of two, and Ray has admitted eaching one of them at a luggage store in Enesse City, Eauses and Rife admits coshing one of them at Mami Beach, Florida. Thus the entire group of sixty cir money orders has actually been accounted for. Following their apprehension the Postal Inspectors obtained from the room escupied by Ray and Rife a quantity of merchandise they had acquired by passing the money orders and this merchandise was eventually returned to the persons from whom it was secured by this from.

Innate's Version: Other than to admit that he had gone on a spree of cashing these money orders. Ray had no further information to give and no statement to make.

Ray has no property and says he has no particular plans for the future at this time. He would like to work on a farm, pointing out that he was a trusty at the Illinois State Penitontiary. He admits drinking to excess at times. Just what motivates him to nomate orine is not known.

This man has a good extitude towards his contence. He has no resontments and states that he feels as though the Court gave him a break. His adjustment in the population should be good. States that he had no difficulties while on a previous contence in Illimois. This wen secured to be a rather nervous person while being interviewed but was cooperative with the program while in this unit. He states that he worked on the farm while serving time at Pombias, Ill. He keeps himself clear
