On April 23, 1968, Special Agent SIDNEY H.
ROCHE contacted Mr. JAMES M. BONES, Inspector, United
States Post Office Department, and inquiry was made
concerning the possibility of the Federal Bureau of
Investigation reviewing postal money orders purchased
at the western station, United States Post Office,
Santa Monica, California, during the period of February
1, 1968, through March 4, 1968.

The money orders sold through that station during the pertinent period were in series 1,908,183,856 through 1,908,183,999 and 1,916,210,000 through 1,916,211,999.

Mr. BONES explained that because of the filing procedure utilized by the United States Post Office, money orders, after being cashed, are not kept in numerical sequence, but forwarded to the Treasury Department and placed according to date received into cardboard boxes of 2,000 money orders each. He said that for this reason it would take several days to locate these money orders, as it would be necessary to find the locates; number before the money orders could be located.

On April 25, 1968, the following Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Washington Field Office, reported to the Government Accounting Office Building (GAO), 441 G Street, Northwest, to review money orders: HARVEY W. JAMES, JAMES W. NORMENT, JR., JOHN L. PATTERSON, KENNETH L. PLESS, SIDNEY H. ROCHE, and HARVEY E. WILKINSON.

On April 17, 1968, press release given to radio, television, and press media in the Pittsburgh Division. On April 19, 1968, press release and copies of photograph and wanted flyers given to news media, Pittsburgh Division.

On April 22, 1968, Identification Order and Wanted Flyers furnished to JERRY MOORE, U. S. Narcotics Bureau, and he was requested to contact his sources regarding JAMES EARL RAY. Contacts have been negative to date. It should be noted that the Pittsburgh Office of U.S. Narcotics Bureau covers Western Pennsylvania and West Virginia.

On April 26, 1968, publicity outlets were furnished material in connection with RAY being added to the Top Ten list.

On May 9, 1968, a newspaper mat and two photographs of RAY were mailed to 294 newspapers in the Pittsburgh Division for appropriate publication.

On May 15, 1968, it was determined that the Bureau of Vital Statistics, Charleston, W. Va., receives the original death certificate on all deaths in that state. Search of records in progress. The Bureau of Vital Statistics for Pennsylvania, located at Harrisburg, Pa., is unable to check their records with regard to local deaths for the year 1968 until May, 1969. Local checks are being made within the Western District of Pennsylvania, covered by the Pittsburgh Division.

A review of unsolved bank robbery and bank burglary cases in the Pittsburgh Division from April 23 to May 4, 1968, fails to indicate JAMES EARL RAY as a suspect.

DANNY CARLTON MARKINS

The following investigation was conducted by SA RAY V_{\bullet} SHOEMAKER:

K. D. YEATER (PROTECT IDENTITY), Assistant Transportation Superintendent, Cabell County Board of Education, Huntington, W. Va., voluntarily advised Bureau agents on April 9, 1968, that he is concerned about DANNY CARLTON MARKINS, a former school bus driver in Cabell County, W. Va. On March 30, 1968, MARKINS telephonically advised YEATER he had to resign effective Monday, April 1, 1968, saying it was imperative that he be in Memphis on Tuesday, April 2, 1968. MARKINS' reason was that he was seeking employment with Roadway Transfer Company , Memphis, Tenn. then telephonically contacted Roadway in Memphis on March 30, 1968, and learned that they had no record of MARKINS seeking employment there. MARKINS requested all retirement be withdrawn and insisted he must be in Memphis by Tuesday A.M. YEATER confronted MARKINS with the information that he had learned MARKINS had no commitment to Roadway on Tuesday. MARKINS then said he was committed to a friend who expected him to go to Memphis with him. MARKINS then worked on April 1, 1968, and left that night for Memphis. He recontacted YEATER on Friday, April 5, 1968, and insisted that he had left Memphis prior to the "trouble." YEATER said he believed, however, that MARKINS left Memphis late Thursday night, April 4, 1968, and arrived Huntington, W. Va., approximately 10:00 AM, April 5, 1968. YEATER said he did not know identity of person accompanying MARKINS to Memphis.

YEATER said MARKINS has been trusted employee for more than ten years and he cannot understand his leaving with no notice. He said MARKINS is reliable individual who was outstanding employee, but has acted strangely for approximately two or three months.

On April 16, 1968, K. D. YEATER, Assistant Superintendent, Catell County Board of Education, Huntington, W. Va., advised SA RAY V. SHOEMAKER that the person who went to Memphis, Tenn., with DANNY CARLTON MARKINS was JOHN JUSTICE, residence address 5695 Altizer Avenue, Huntington, W. Va. He said JUSTICE was formerly employed by the Owens-Illinois Glass Company, Huntington, as a truck driver, but the employment was terminated several months ago. YEATER said JUSTICE is now believed to be a truck driver for Grey-Bell, Holland, Michigan.

On April 16, 1968, LEONA DOWLING, Personnel Department, Owens-Illinois Glass Company, Huntington, W. Va., advised SA SHOEMAKER from records that JOHN JUSTICE was employed by that company as a truck driver from November 20, 1963 to March 31, 1967, when his services were terminated by reason of the trucking operation being closed by Owens-Illinois. She stated the file contains no derogatory information on JUSTICE. She advised from records that JOHN JUSTICE is described as follows:

MORRIS CLAYTON SKAGGS

The following investigation was conducted by SA EUGENE F. CABLE:

MORRIS C. SKAGGS was arrested for motor violation April 15, 1965, and confined to Beaver County Jail. He was born at Jonesboro, Ark., is 6'2", and then weighed 215 lbs. He has a tattoo on his left forearm and has FBI Number 264 664 F.

A photograph of SKAGGS has been obtained and will follow.

Mrs. BETTY NIFFENEGGER, Van Buren Homes, Beaver, Pa., SKAGGS' mother-in-law, advised neither she, her husband, or her daughter, SKAGGS' wife, have had any contact from SKAGGS and are unaware of his whereabouts or activities. She pointed out that her telephone number and her daughter's telephone number and address are unpublished primarily for the reason of avoiding contact with SKAGGS. She stated her mother-in-law, Mrs. RUTH HARRIS, recently had an early morning telephone call believed to be from SKAGGS, but his whereabouts at the time of the call were unknown.

The composite drawings of subject were exhibited to Mrs. NIFFENEGGER, and she stated that they did not, in her opinion, look like SKAGGS. She stated SKAGGS! parents reside in Jonesboro, Ark., but that family members here have no contact with them primarily to avoid disclosing SKAGGS! wife's address.

Mrs. RUTH HARRIS, Beaver, Pa., advised that sometime during the week prior to April 13, 1968, at exactly 4:50 AM, she received a telephone call from an individual whom she did not initially recognize by his voice, but he mentioned CAROL, and she then determined it to be MORRIS SKAGGS. She stated she talked to another

individual who was with SKAGGS, but told them she did not want to talk to them and hung up. She then contacted the operator in an efforr to determine where the call had been placed from and the operator told her she could not determine this since it was an out of the district call. Mrs. HARRIS stated the last contact she had was a similarly foolish call in the early hours from SKAGGS prior to Thanksgiving of 1967. She stated her number is the only published telephone number of family members in Beaver County, and the only contact point SKAGGS has.

CAROL SKAGGS resides at 1284 Chapel Road,
Monaca, Pa., unlisted telephone 775-6957, and is a high
school teacher at Rochester High School. Efforts to locate
her, both at her residence and telephonically, the afternoon
and evening of April 16, 1968, were unsuccessful, however,
since a photograph of SKAGGS has been obtained, and based
on the contact with CAROL SKAGGS' mother, no further effort
will be made to locate her.

DONALD LAWRENCE STOUT

The following investigation was conducted by SA WILLIAM LOGAN CURTIS:

HARRY P. STEWART, U. S. Secret Service, reported his nephew, STEWARD LINDH, 2206, San Francisco, Calif., claimed he and two others through newspaper ad obtained ride with STOUT. At Kansas City, Mo., STOUT disappeared with their effects. Before STOUR disappeared he told them he was going to shoot KING.

On April 26, 1968, RAYMOND ZACKOVICH, Secret Service Agent, Pittsburgh, advised HARRY P. STEWART, former Secret Service Agent, retired one year ago. STEWART now residing at Route 1, Box 388, Sebastian, Fla.

(SARA) LOHMEYER who resides in apartment B3 at 720 S. Negley Avenue, which is the President Apartments. She resides there with her daughter, JEANNE M. LOHMEYER who is single. She is not acquainted with anyone known as HARVY LOHMEYER.

resides 42 Springfield Avenue, Crandford, N.J., telephone
272-4995, employed as professor of Spanish at Union College.
GEORGE described as white male, born 6'3",
175 lbs., blond hair, single, fair complexion, wears glasses.
GEORGE allegedly in possession of 1964 or 1965 white Mustang
registered to his mother, IRENE WILLARD. Parents state
GEORGE flew to New Kensington, via Allegheny Airlines from
New Jersey and arrived in New Kensington at 5:30 or 6:00 PM
on March 29, 1968, and returned to New Jersey in afternoon of
March 31, 1968, whereabouts of GEORGE on April 4, 1968,
unknown to parents.

The following investigation was conducted by SA NILE A. DUKE and SA JAMES H. REEVES, JR.:

On April 10, 1968, KAREN ADAMS, 6706 McPherson Boulevard, Pittsburgh, Second Floor, stated that she has

lived at this address for one year. She stated that the name P. D. LOHMEYER is completely unfamiliar to her.

On April 10, 1968, VICTOR OLMSTEAD, 6706 McPherson Boulevard, First Floor, stated he has lived at this address since October, 1966. He stated the name P. D. LOHMEYER is completely unfamiliar to him. Mr. OLMSTEAD said the house he is renting is owned by BLANCHE GRIFFIN and that he does not know her address and only pays his rent to her when she knocks on the door.

It is to be noted that both KAREN ADAMS and VICTOR OLMSTEAD are Negroes, and that the area surrounding 6706 McPherson Boulevard is inhabitated by primarily Negro individuals.

Mr. G. L. MONET, Postal Inspector, Pittsburgh, Pa., caused a search of his records to be made for a change of address for P. D. LOHMEYER, 6706 McPherson Boulevard. Mr. MONET stated he talked with his carrier for this particular area and that the carrier could not recall such an individual. He further advised that a search of his records for the past three years failed to reflect a change of address for P. D. LOHMEYER. He stated that any changes of address over three years old is destroyed.

On April 10, 1968, Mrs. ANTHONY DEIULUS, 815 Fulton Place, Mt. Oliver, Pittsburgh, Pa., stated that the name VERA LOHMEYER is unfamiliar to her. She stated she had lived at this address for four years and had purchased her house from one DOROTHY REUESCHE.

On April 10, 1968, DOROTHY REUESCHE, Pittsburgh National Bank, Carrick Office, Carrick, Pa., advised that VERA LOHMEYER had committed suicide on December 12, 1961. REUESCHE said she knew the LOHMEYER family and that VERA did not have any brothers or sisters. She did recall her having an uncle, ED LOHMEYER, Penn Hills, Pa., who is in his fifties and who had been seriously ill for some time.

Mr. and Mrs. CONSTRALE said they had no idea if LOWMEYER was still living, and the last they heard he had moved outwest and left no forwarding address.

On April 10, 1968, Chief of Police MICHAEL KUVINKA, Monessen Police Department, Monessen, Pa., advised that a review of the Police Department records disclosed no information identifiable with ELMER W. LOWMEYER.

On April 10, 1968, Mr. JACK T. BECK, JR., Postmaster, U. S. Post Office, Monessen, Pa., advised that he is a life-long resident of the community and was personally acquainted with Mr. ELMER W. LOWMEYER, inasmuch as LOWMEYER was formerly employed in the personnel office at the Pittsburgh Steel Corporation, Monessen, and gave him, BECK, his first job with the Pittsburgh Steel Corporation many years ago.

Mr. BECK said that Mr. and Mrs. ELMER W. LOWMEYER are both deceased, and the LOWMEYER's only had one child, a daughter, JANE LOWMEYER, who married the Reverend ROBERT MOFFETT, both of whom are presently residing somewhere in the state of Ohio, exact place unrecalled.

He did provide information, however, establishing that he is the person who was referred to previously and that he did depart from Cleveland, Ohio, on April 18, 1968, via Northwest Airlines, to Washington, D. C., and then to Clarksburg, W. Va., by Lake Central Airlines, arriving at 3:12 PM on April 18, 1968. He took a White Top Taxicab from the airport to the Clarksburg Bus Terminal, and thereafter, boarded a Greyhound Bus on the same evening arriving in Weston, W. Va. He advised that he had been staying at the Dixie Hotel, however, on this date, April 22, 1968, he had been in Buckhannon, W. Va., visiting a friend and attempting to buy an automobile. He had just returned to Weston, and was visiting with his girlfriend who is the daughter of MABEL WILLIAMS. MOATS made available identification indicating that he was born on Braxton County, W. Va., and that from March 11, 1968, to April 18, 1968, he had been employed as an oiler on the ore boat "Middletown" owned by the Columbia Transportation Company, Cleveland, and he stated that during this period of time he was on board this boat making runs in the Great Lakes vicinity. He also furnished a U. S. Coast Guard pass reflecting that his name is CHARLES WILLIAM MOATS, JR., which also carried his photograph. MOATS advised that he had served a hitch in the U, S. Navy and had received an honorable discharge in June, 1966. The following descriptive information was obtained from MOATS or from observation:

MOATS carried a current Ohio Driver's license # issued February, 1968, showing his address as 19654 Drake Road, Strongsville, Ohio, which he states is the address of a friend, CHARLES ROBINSON.

The following investigation was conducted by SA WILLIAM LOGAN CURTIS and SA NILE A. DUKE, JR.:

On April 22, 1968, CONRAD WITALIS, Vice President in charge of Electro Air Corp., McKees Rocks, Pa., advised that JOE S. RAGAN, JR., hired by that company March 27, 1967. RAGAN is employed as Sales Representative for States of Florida, Alabama, and Georgia. He resides at 6048

RAGAN described as white male, 5'7", 150 lbs., brown hair.

Photographs viewed by WITALIS who stated not similar to RAGAN.

Mr. VERLE HARPER, Grandview Avenue, Elkins, W. Va., telephonically contacted SA LINNEY L. CONNOLLY, JR., on the evening of April 22, 1968, and advised that an individual had very recently contacted HUGH CURRENCE, real estate dealer, at Elkins, relative to purchasing property and that the individual bore a strong resemblance to the photograph of ERIC STARVO GAULT that has been prominently displayed in leading newspapers.

Mr. HUGH CURRENCE, Manager, Randolph Real Estate Agency, 216 Randolph Avenue, provided the following information on April 23, 1968:

He was contacted at his office by a man named JOHN JOSEPH O'HANLON on or about April 18, 1968, relative to property located at 100 Central Street, that has been put up for sale. Mr. CURRENCE advised that O'HANLON bears a facial resemblance to newspaper photographs of ERIC STARVO GAULT, but that he appears to be considerably older than GAULT. He said that O'HANLON was seeking a temporary place to stay as well as permanent real estate, and he, CURRENCE, made arrangements for O'HANLON to stay at the residence of his father on Grandview Avenue at Elkins.

It later developed that O'HANLON's speech and talk would sometimes be irrational and disconnected, and his father became uneasy in O'HANLON's presence. HUGH CURRENCE informed O'HANLON that he would have to find another place to live and O'HANLON departed his father's residence on the evening of April 22, 1968.

Mr. CURRENCE described 0'HANLON as a white male, approximately 40-50 years of age, 5'7", 165-170 lbs., stocky build.

JOHN E. BUSCH, JR., Attorney, Hippedrome Building, Elkins, W. Va., advised on April 23, 1968, that he is an attorney for HUGH CURRENCE and he telephonically contacted the Veterans Administration Hospital at Huntington, W. Va., in behalf of CURRENCE relative to JOHN JOSEPH O'HANLON. He spoke to a Mr. HAMBLIN and was informed that O'HANLON was refused a loan in August or September, 1967, on grounds that he was "medically incompetent." Mr. BUSCH said he was referred to the Regional Veterans Administration Hospital in New York City for further information. BUSCH said he observed O'HANLON in CURRENCE's office and that O'HANLON does bear a facial resemblance to GAULT. He said, however, that O'HANLON appears to be considerably older than GAULT.

Mrs. BONNIE MARSTILLER, Secretary, Cromwell Insurance Agency, Fifth Avenue, Elkins, provided the following information on April 23, 1968:

JOHN JOSEPH O'HANLON has been in contact with DORSEY FREY, real estate agent, concerning the purchase of property in Elkins, W. Va. Mr. FREY is presently out of town. Mrs. MARSTILLER is completely familiar with the O'HANLON case and has talked to him on several occasions.

She advised that O'HANLON does bear a facial resemblance to newspaper photographs of ERIC GAULT, but that she does not believe them to be one and the same individual. O'HANLON left with her office some personal papers showing a relationship with the Veterans Administration and she displayed a letter from the Regional Office, VA Hospital, 252 Seventh Avenue, New York, N.Y., dated March 4, 1967, addressed to JOHN J. O'HANLON, 939 Onderdonk Avenue, Brooklyn, N.Y., VAC # which letter stated that O'HANLON was being awarded \$240 monthly beginning October 1, 1966. The letter also referred to previous payments to his account which had been discontinued.

Mrs. MARSTILLER stated that O'HANLON had been in her office the last year in an effort to buy real estate and her office subsequently received a post card from him postmarked Miami, Fla., October 25, 1967, showing his return address as C/O R. MC GRAW, JR., M. D., 1803 Granada Boulevard, Coral Gables, Fla.

As SA CONNOLLY was preparing to leave Mrs. MARSTILLER's office, Mrs. MARSTILLER identified a man who was walking past the office as JOHN JOSEPH O'HANLON. O'HANLON was observed to go to the General Delivery window in the Elkins Post Office, where he apparently inquired as to mail. Close observation of O'HANLON at this time reflected him to be a white male, age approximately 50-55 years, height about 5'7", weight approximately 190 lbs., gray eyes, black hair, streaked with gray, paunchy build.

This observation of O'HANLON, as well as information provided by BONNIE MARSTILLER, reflects that he is not identical with ERIC STARVO GAULT.

The following investigation was conducted by SA WILLIAM LOGAN CURTIS:

On April 26, 1968, HENRY BREWER, JR., 627 College Avenue, Pittsburgh, Pa., came to the Pittsburgh FBI Office, and advised that at approximately 9:35 AM, he observed an individual who resembled JAMES EARL RAY leaving Emil's Restaurant on Liberty Avenue. He advised that he had known RAY when RAY was in Leavenworth Penitentiary and was fairly certain the individual he saw was RAY. He admitted that he was presently taking psychiatric treatments in Pittsburgh.

BREWER, SA CURTIS, Assistant Special Agent in Charge THOMAS H. FARROW, and SAS RUSSELL M. GWYNNE and NILE A. DUKE, JR., went to Emil's Restaurant; however, the bartender, JOSEPH HOLLICK, was unable to identify a photograph of RAY as having been in the restaurant approximately 30 minutes prior. The Greyhound Bus Sation, Pennsylvania Railroad Station, Jerry's Bar, and the Roma Hotel, all located near Emil's Restaurant, were checked with negative results.

The following investigation was conducted by Supervisor FRANK E, ALLISON:

At 7:05 PM, one FNU PELFREY telephonically contacted the writer from Huntington, W. Va., and advised that he had seen the individual being sought by the FBI in connection with the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He stated he had seen this person's picture on TV for the past two weeks and that he observed him in Easy Bill's Tavern, 14th Street West, Huntington, W. Va., approximately 20 minutes prior to calling. PELFREY was reluctant to furnish information as to where he could be located, but agreed to meet with an agent. He sated he would recontact the FBI Office in 30 minutes in order to learn where he could meet an FBI Agent. PELFREY advised that he had never seen this particular individual before and that he looked the same as the pictures shown on TV except that he now had a black beard.

It was determined that all agents assigned to the Huntington Resident Agency were in Williamson, W. Va. Officer DON BOLLING of the Huntington Police Department was contacted and advised that there is a "BOOTS" PELFREY in Huntington, who is a trouble maker and loudmouth and he stated that since there may be some basis for PELFREY's call, he would send a car to the area of Easy Bill's Tavern in an effort to observe anyone resembling the fugitive RAY.

At 7:25 PM, SA CARROLL telephonically contacted the writer from the Huntington Resident Agency and advised that he had just received a call from PELFREY at the Huntington Resident Agency. CARROLL was requested to contact Officer BOLLING of the Police Department and attempt to resolve the matter.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROBERT J. CARROLL:

On April 30, 1968, at approximately 7:00 PM, an individual who identified himself as JAMES PELFREY,

517 Evans Street, Huntington, W. Va., telephonically advised he had just seen a man resembling JAMES EARL RAY at the Old Town Tavern on 14th Street West, Huntington, W. Va. PELFREY stated the man was at least 6'4" in height and had a heavy beard. He could furnish no other descriptive data. He sated he would wait at Lewis' Grocery, 14th Street West, Huntington, W. Va., to be interviewed. It is noted PELFREY was difficult to understand and sounded inebriated. He also stated he had already alerted other FBI agents to the man's location. He was unable to advise who the other agents were or their location.

Telephonic contact with the Pittsburgh Office revealed that a man identifying himself as PELFREY had called a short time previously with essentially the same information except that he claimed the man resembling RAY was at Easy Bill's Tavern.

Desk Sergeant DON BOLLING, Huntington Police
Department, was immediately contacted regarding the above.
He stated JAMES PELFREY is a habitual drunkard and trouble—
maker in the community. He also stated PELFREY has never
furnished reliable information to the police, but is more
inclined to deliberately mislead officers in investigations.
He also advised the locations described by PELFREY are
the worst areas of town. He stated he would immediately
dispatch two detectives to the location and attempt to
locate the individual described by PELFREY and also
interview PELFREY if he could be located. He stated his
department had an ample supply of wanted posters concerning
JAMES EARL RAY and he would instruct the detectives to
distribute these during their investigation.

Later in the same evening, Desk Sergeant BOLLING advised the detectives had finished their inquiries on 14th Street West concerning RAY and had determined no one matching RAY's description had been in the area. He also stated the detectives were unable to locate PELFREY for interview. He advised there was some indication the incident was a deliberate hoax.

The following investigation was conducted at McMurray, Pa., by SA J. EDWARD MADVAY, on April 26, 1968:

Mrs. WILLIAM E. GIBSON, 139 Lakeview Drive, McMurray, advised that her daughter, JACQUELINE GIBSON, is employed as an elementary school teacher at the Elm Grove School in McMurray, Peters Township, Pa.

JACQUELINE GIBSON, located at the Elm Grove School, advised that she had read accounts of the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING in the local press and had observed the artist conception sketch which appeared in the After looking at this sketch she concluded. that it resembled very strongly a former school teacher of hers named JOHN MERRYMAN. She advised that teacher MERRYMAN taught her Problems in Democracy when she was a high school student and she recalled that he, when he left the Peters Township area, maybe now teaching in the Pittsburgh area in either Pitt or Carnegie Institute of Technology. Miss GIBSON was shown the photographs of ERIC STARVO GALT with his eyes closed and with his eyes drawn in by an FBI artist, and she advised that this photograph did not in any resemble the JOHN MERRYMAN she mentioned. She described JOHN MERRYMAN as follows:

She stated definitely that the actual photograph of GALT did not in any way resemble MERRYMAN and had originally contacted the FBI because of her original thought of the similarity between the artist's sketch and MERRYMAN.

At about 10:15 PM, May 2, 1968, Mr. CALVIN PLYER, Barton, W. Va., telephonically advised SA GEORGE A. PATTERSON that on April 22, 1968, two white males in a
