On 5/22/68, JOHN WESLEY MEWBOURNE, inmate #37548, Colorado State Penitentiary, Canon City, Colorado, was interviewed by SA WALLACE G. HAGUE at the request of MEWBOURNE.

MEWBOURNE, who has FBI #470625 A, stated he desired an interview inasmuch as he was acquainted with JAMES EARL RAY as an inmate of the U. S. Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas, during 1955. He stated he is of the opinion RAY was hired by members of the Ku Klux Klan and was killed by Klan members after the shooting of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

MEWBOURNE advised he is from Birmingham, Alabama, and in view of the fact he has been a criminal most of his life is acquainted with most bootlegggers, criminals and Klan members in the Alabama, Georgia and Mississippi areas. He stated he will be transferred to the U.S. Penitentiary at Atlanta, Georgia, in approximately two months to serve the remainder of his sentence, and upon his release in about one year plans to locate the body of RAY, which he feels he can accomplish in approximately three weeks. He stated the only reason he is furnishing the above information is the fact he is certain RAY is dead and if not dead would furnish no information concerning RAY. He stated his only contact with RAY was at Leavenworth and he knows nothing concerning RAY's habits, associates, hangouts or possible whereabouts.

The above information is being furnished in the event the name of MEWBOURNE should come to the attention of the Bureau in the future.

BILLINGS, inmate, Medical Center for Federal Prisoners, Springfield, Missouri, was first interviewed at the Medical Center regarding captioned matter on 4/26/68. It is apparent from this interview and subsequent interviews that he is primarily concerned about getting a Federal detainer lodged against him from Montgomery, Alabama, lifted. He has stated that he could furnish information that would assist in identifying the subject of this case if this detainer were lifted. It is doubtful in the mind of the interviewing agent that he has this information in his possession. In his interview of 5/20/68, BILLINGS indicated that the name ENIS HEAD was totally unknown to him. He denied that he stayed on a permanent basis at Carmerdelle's Canal Bank Inn continuously from May to December, 1965. He reported that when he stayed at this place initially in Apartment 6, it was already occupied by two men who were working off shore and that these men had rented this apartment from the owner. He stated that he and BEN BLACKWELL moved into the apartment when the occupants went to work off shore and would not be needing the apartment.

He indicated he remained here for a month or a month and a half, during which time he just gambled at various establishments in Slidell, Louisiana, which is about 20 miles from New Orleans. visit BLACKWELL at the Canal Bank Inn during this time and BLACKWall had another roommate, name unrecalled. He stated after he left New Orleans, he was in Dallas and Irving, Texas, and that he was here on two occasions; however, he cannot recall just exactly when this was. He stated he believes one of the times was in 1966, when he stayed at 1627 Cooper Street, in Irving, Texas, and had a job with a firm known as Shedd Bardish Foods, Inc.

Still in 1965, exact dates unrecalled, he traveled to Las Vegas, Nevada, where he stayed at the Horseshoe Club under the names of ROBERT JAMES. Dallas, Texas. He stated that while here he sent a telegram to his wife in Pennsylvania, and she joined him in Las Vegas. He stated they then traveled to Artesia, New Mexico. He believes he arrived in Artesia sometime in July, 1965, at which time he opened a fruit stand, which he called Robert's Produce, located in the 4900 block of Main Street. He stated he and his wife lived right behind the fruit stand. In August, 1965, he took his wife as far as Wilmington, Delaware, and called his brother and told him to come and return her to her home.

He then went to Hartford, Connecticut, and got a job at Williams Ford, where he took care of the used car lot. At this place of business he used the name JAMES ROBERTS and he stayed about two weeks. He stated that at the end of the second week he stole about \$1,500 from this company from a night deposit and left. He stated he does not recall the name of the place where he stayed in Hartford, Connecticut, but it was a room in some rooming house. He then traveled to Buffalo, New York, where he stayed at an unrecalled hotel under the name LAURENT RIQUIER. He stated this was in the latter

KC 44-760 part of 1965, and the only reason he went to Buffalo was so that he could travel to nearby Batavia, New York, to bet on the horses. He stayed about two weeks and then returned to New Orleans, where he continued his gambling activities in various clubs in Slidell and Covington, Louisiana. He stayed in a motel in New Orleans called "Monte Leon" under the name LAURENT RIQUIER. He stated that this was toward the end of 1965, and that BLACKWELL was still staying at the Canal Bank Inn. He stated he wanted to emphasize that the owner of the Canal Bank Inn is incorrect when he says that he stayed at the inn from May to December, 1965, on a continuous basis. He stated this is not so and that he was quite transient during most of this period. BILLINGS stated he believes he can be of assistance in this investigation, however, he would have to have an assurance of a Federal detainer lodged against him at the Medical Center being dismissed. He was informed that no such promise could be made to him. Again, for information of receiving offices, it is documented that BILLINGS has been and still is of questionable mental competency. Service Station, Inc., 2003 Main Street, Joplin. EESTRO stated while he had never set RALPH RENTRO, that he, JAMES H. RENTPRO, recalled having been asked by his brother-in-law, HAL N. STEPHENS, Manager, Communers Service Station, Inc., if he was any kin to RALPH RENTRO, an attendnt at the Station, and that he, JAMES H. RENTPRO, had replied that he had never heard of and was no kin to anyone named RALPH RENTRO. In this regard, RENTPRO said he had never met RALPH RENTRO and had no idea as to his present location.

fired. STEPHENS did recall that at Christmas, 1966, RENTRO had mailed a Christmas card to the service station employees from some western sate, possibly Washington; however, STEPHENS said he had thrown the Christmas card sway and actually had not paid any attention to the postmark, but had only noted it was some western state.

STEPHENS said he did not know whether RENTRO was married or single, that he had never seen RENTRO in company with any person away from his place of employment, and did not have the slightest idea in what city RENTRO might be living at this time. He could only state that RENTRO had left Joplin nearly two years ago and that RENTRO's present whereabouts are unknown to him.

These records revealed that HILL was convicted of Grand Theft in the Circuit Court, State of Missouri, County of Barton on 10/10/66, and was sentenced to State Prison. HILL was paroled to California from Missouri on 5/16/67.

A social evaluation of HILL reveals he has average intelligence, but has a noticeable difficulty accurately expressing himself. His lack of education tends to be magnified by his hillbilly accent, and backwoods logic.

HILL was on parole from Missouri and had been out of that institution only a very short period of time prior to his involvement leading to his arrest and continual confinement since 6/17/67.

On 5/24/68, FLOYD EVANS HILL, California State Prison No. Bllll2 was interviewed at the above institution and furnished the following information:

He was arrested 6/17/67 by Los Angeles Sheriff's Office near Compton, California, has been in continual confinement since, and is serving a sentence of six months to ten years for Grand Theft of Pistol.

He was arrested for Grand Theft of Copper Wire in Barton County, Missouri in October, 1966, convicted, and sentenced to the Missouri State Penitentiary for a two years period. By about 11/21/66, he arrived at the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, to start serving his sentence, and where he was confined for about 1½ months thereafter being transferred to the Men's Institution Training Center, Moberly, Missouri, where he remained for about six months. From there, he was transferred to a Missouri State Penitentiary honor farm called Rinse Farm (phonetic) which is just across the bridge from the State Prison at Jefferson City, where he was confined for only a couple of weeks prior

to release on parole on 5/16/67. When released on parole, he flew to California by airlines and was on the street about one month prior to his arrest confinement on 6/17/67.

At the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, he was confined in a two-man cell, but was moved around quite a bit and had quite a few different cellmates. At Moberly, Missouri, they had individual cells, and Rinse Farm housed them in barrack-type buildings.

HILL said he knew a lot of the inmates in the Missouri State Penitentiary at the above locations, but he does not know their names. He initially stated that he cannot place JAMES EARL RAY by name, photograph, or description as having been a cellmate at any of the above institutions. Upon further reflection and consideration, EVANS thought the center photograph on the FBI Wanted Flyer No. 442-A looked a little familiar to him, but he still definitely does not recognize RAY as having been one of his cellmates. He said that if RAY is identical to the person who he recalls resembled the center photograph on the above Wanted Flyer, that person was only a casual acquaintance of his. The man who resembled the center photograph on the Wanted Flyer walked back and forth to work with him at Moberly, Missouri Institution. The person who resembled the photograph on the Wanted Flyer worked in the woodshop at Moberly and HILL went to school there for a while and worked in the plumbing shop. HILL stated he did not get too well acquainted with this individual and can recall nothing of value about the person that he thinks resembles RAY except that person claimed to know quite a bit about safes, was to get out soon and wanted some help in writing up scores which HILL ignored since he wanted no part of it. As he recalls, the person he knew who resembled the center photograph on the Wanted Flyer of RAY wanted to score on safes in California and "go to Mexico and cool it." EVANS stated that since he was not interested in the matter, no specific place in California or Mexico was mentioned.

EVANS repeatedly denied that he knows RAY or anything about RAY other than stated that above and was emphatic in pointing out that he had no contact with RAY or the person who resembled RAY when he, HALL, was in California on the street in May and April, 1967.

After viewing a photograph of the subject, he immediately recognized it as an individual with whom he had worked for several months in the kitchen at Missouri State Penitentiary. FISHER said that he occasionally spoke to RAY and sometime saw him in the exercises yard but he was never close to him in any way and they never discussed any personal things.

FISHER said that he and the subject traveled in different crowds and RAY did not seem to be exceptionally friendly with anyone although he spent most of his time with
