SUPPOSEDLY IN A GUARD'S UNIFORM OR CIVILIAN CLOTHES. HE DOUBTS VERY SERIOUSLY IF STOUT COULD HAVE PROVIDED A UNIFORM FOR RAY AS STOUT WAS A GUARD AT THE HONOR FARM AND RAY WAS CONFINED IN PRISON PROPER. HE HAS NO IDEA WHO MIGHT HAVE SUPPLIED A UNIFORM FOR RAY BUT POINTED OUT THE PRISON LAUNDRY CONTAINS MANY UNIFORMS AND SUITS AND IS STAFFED ENTIRELY BY CONVICTS. HE SAID IT WOULD, THEREFORE, BE NO PROBLEM FOR A CONVICT TO OBTAIN A UNIFORM OR SUIT OF CLOTHES FROM THIS LAUNDRY. PORTER STATED THAT ALTHOUGH HE DOES NOT FEEL STOUT PROVIDED ANY ASSISTANCE IN RAY'S ACTUAL ESCAPE, THAT HE FELT CERTAIN RAY WOULD HAVE CONTACTED STOUT FOR ASSISTANCE AFTER LEAVING THE PRISON.

PORTER STATED THAT TWO FORMER CIVILIAN KITCHEN WORKERS AT THE MISSOURI STATE PEN ALSO RAN AMPHETAMINES FOR THE CONVICTS AND WOULD UNDOUBTEDLY HAVE BEEN WELL KNOWN BY RAY. THEY ARE FIRST NAME UNKNOWN WHITE, A NEGRO, AND FIRST NAME UNKNOWN SHEPPARD.

PORTER CONTINUED THAT RAY WAS A VERY QUIET MAN, DID NOT ASSOCIATE WITH MANY INDIVIDUALS, AND THAT UNDOUBTEDLY HIS BEST FRIEND AT THE MISSOURI STATE PEN WAS NEIL AEBY. PORTER BELIEVES AEBY HAS BEEN RELEASED FROM THE MISSOURI STATE PEN BUT IS CURRENTLY

He said DONALD JAMES NISSEN, is unknown to him and has never been employed by that company which has only been in existence about one year.

PRESTON states his company manufactures an auto safety product which is sold nationally. He said his company does not handle any of the sales of this product, noting all sales are handled exclusively by Allstate Safety Control, Inc., Room 201, Tanglewood Office Building, 7509 Cantrell Road, Little Rock, Arkansas. DOWDA DOES NOT KNOW NEIL AEBY'S PRESENT WHEREABOUTS BUT AEBY WAS AT ONE TIME CHIEF COOK AT THE PRISON. ANOTHER CLOSE FRIEND WAS DONALD DEAN RIGGER FROM CALIFORNIA WHOSE WIFE WAS A PSYCHIATRIST AT NAPA STATE HOSPITAL LOCATED ABOVE ~~SAN~~ SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA. DOWDA STATED RAY WOULD ONLY HAVE AN ADDRESS FOR HIM IN CARE OF DOWDA'S FATHER, CHARLES ALFRED DOWDA, FORMERLY ROUTE ONE, SANFORD, FLORIDA, BUT PRESENTLY ONE ONE ZERO SOUTH CHANDLER STREET, DELAND, FLORIDA, DOWDA DENIES CONTACT IN ANY MANNER WITH RAY SINCE DOWDA'S RELEASE. ACQUAINTANCE OF RAY

The following investigation was conducted by SA
WALTER E. PETERS:

On May 6, 1968, ALFRED M. DEBAKEY, inmate, U. S. Marshal's Detention Center, Florence, Arizona, advised that he had written a letter to Mrs. ROBERT H. BRYANT, 3189 Crump Avenue, Memphis, Tennessee, whom he identified as his sister. He advised that he had served time with JAMES EARL RAY at the Missouri State Penitentiary from February, 1965, to July, 1966. He advised that RAY was on the same floor but a different wing and that while he was at the Missouri State Penitentiary (MSP), Jefferson City, Missouri, RAY operated the prison store and (first name unknown) CURTIS was a delivery boy for RAY. DEBAKEY identified CURTIS as being the same man who recently was interviewed and furnished information concerning RAY in Georgia.

DEBAKEY advised that he had never known RAY prior to their meeting in the MSP at Jefferson City and further stated that he has not seen nor heard of RAY since his, DEBAKEY's, release in July, 1966. He advised that his association with RAY consisted of being a customer in the prison store, talking to RAY in the prison yard and playing baseball with RAY. DEBAKEY believed that he would make bond when he was returned to Tampa, Florida, and if he does make bond, he wanted to have the information concerning RAY available in the event he should run into RAY.

It will be noted that ALFRED M. DEBAKEY is the subject of a case entitled "ALFORD MALICK DE BAKEY, also known as, CRIME ON GOVERNMENT RESERVATION - FRAUDULENT CHECKS," Phoenix file 70-3760. DEBAKEY is described as white, male, American, born [redacted] Blythesville, Arkansas, 5' 9", 150 pounds, black hair, brown eyes, slender build. His criminal record consists of the following:

Ex-convict JAMES W. BROWN reinterviewed at his present residence, Talladega, Ala., and following is synopsis of additional information obtained:

BROWN was shown all available photos of JAMES EARL RAY and picked out photo taken at bartending school as one most resembling RAY. Concerning other photo taken of RAY in California in January or February, 1968, BROWN said this did not resemble RAY, but did strongly resemble a person who came to a gas station where BROWN worked in June, 1967, in Reform, Ala. This person was driving a late-model red Mustang, and was accompanied by two white males, one being an ex-convict from the Missouri State Pen, FNU ALLEN, other unknown to BROWN. BROWN had no conversation with driver of Mustang, but ALLEN, whom BROWN had known in the pen, told BROWN that he and his two friends were going to Tuscaloosa, Ala., from Columbus, Ga. ALLEN had been released from pen few months before BROWN (June, 1965.) BROWN claimed he had seen ALLEN and RAY in conversations in the pen on several occasions and that BROWN was positive that ALLEN and BROWN knew each other.

BROWN claimed that ALLEN was considered to be a "stool pigeon" inside the pen. ALLEN came from Kennett, Mo., and had been convicted of robbery. BROWN claimed that RAY was living in F Hall when BROWN met him through JOHNNY VELANTI, and that ALLEN also lived in F Hall. (Review of Kansas City report dated 5/15/68 fails to indicate that RAY ever lived in F Hall; however, it is noted that in St. Louis report of 5/10/68, VELANTI claimed that RAY did live in F Hall.)

BROWN claimed the information he was furnishing concerned JAMES EARL RAY and he did not have him confused with any prisoners with similar names such as JAMES RAYE (as claimed by VELANTI) or JAMES WRAY.

BROWN claimed that VELANTI once said he, VELANTI, could get along in Mexico if he ever got there, and that he, VELANTI, would go to some small town past Mexico City to hide out, if he ever escaped. VELANTI named the town, but BROWN can not recall name. This claim was made in presence of RAY. VALENTI also claimed he had run off from an orphan's home at the age of 14, and was later "taken in" and raised by a Sheriff. VELANTI then became involved in allowing the escape of several prisoners being held by this Sheriff in Louisiana. Because of their close association in the pen, BROWN said it was most likely that RAY and VELANTI would get together outside.

BROWN continued to claim he had no knowledge of any convict organization in the pen, but it appeared to interviewing agents that he was possibly withholding information when pressed on this point. He said there were several poker games operated by certain convicts and that some others took bets on sporting events. One of these was JOHNNIE JOHNSON, who operated a game with his "half-brother" BOBBY ASHE. BROWN claimed he had seen JOHNSON and RAY in several conversations together and that RAY usually always played in the game operated by JOHNSON and ASHE.

BROWN identified one "SLICK" STEDHAM (ph) as a poker game operator who also was used to collect gambling debts inside the pen.

BROWN identified his closest friends in the pen as DONALD COX from St. Louis, who left in 1963 after serving

five years on robbery conviction; CHESTER KELLY (ph) from St. Louis, who is still confined; CHARLIE LAMSON, from St. Louis, who was released in 1965 after serving assault sentence, and WALTER STRAKEY, who is now believed to be in the Texas State Pen.

Reinterview JOHNNIE VELANTI, as to his association with RAY, as claimed by BROWN, and as to all background of VELANTI as furnished by BROWN. Obtain further identification of JAMES RAYE and/or JAMES WRAY, from VELANTI. From VELANTI ascertain what hall RAY resided in during VELANTI's association with him. Ascertain if he knew RAY to work as a "walk boy" in any hall; if he knew RAY to participate in poker games, and, if so, who operated the game, and if RAY ever bet on any sporting events, and, if so, with whom. Ascertain if VELANTI's wife was injured in the same accident in which VELANTI's oldest child was killed, as claimed by BROWN. Identify place in Mexico where VELANTI claimed he could go to and hide and get along with the people.

Upon identification of FNU ALLEN from Kennett, Mo., will locate and interview ALLEN as to his knowledge of RAY and the identities of the two persons with him in the red Mustang in June, 1967, in Columbus, Ga.

KANSAS CITY:

AT JEFFERSON CITY, MO.:

Will identify the persons identified by BROWN as his closest friends in the pen and set out leads to have them interviewed as to the veracity of BROWN, their knowledge of his association with VELANTI and/or RAY, their knowledge of any convict organization in the pen.

Will ascertain identity of "SLICK" STEDHAM and JOHNNIE JOHNSON and have them located and interviewed as to

their knowledge of RAY, his gambling habits, and their association with him, if any. Will determine if JOHNSON and BOBBY ASHE are related.

Will identify FNU ALLEN from Kennett, Mo., and set out lead to have located and interviewed per information furnished by BROWN.

Will review records of BROWN for any information as to his stability, reliability and veracity. Will furnish photos of all persons identified by BROWN, as set out above, to be used in reinterview of BROWN, if deemed appropriate by Birmingham.

ROBERT DALE PORTER was interviewed at the Sheridan County Jail, Sheridan, Wyoming.

PORTER stated that he recalled JAMES EARL RAY very well stating that he was in jail with him on two separate occasions. PORTER stated that he was confined in the Missouri State Penitentiary from July of 1961 to September of 1962, and again from March of 1964 to December of 1967. He stated that RAY was in the Missouri State Penitentiary when he first got there in July of 1961 and he knew him from that time until the time of RAY's escape which he believes was in about April of 1967. PORTER stated that while they were not cell-mates, they were both assigned to the same walk and therefore did get to know each other rather shortly after his arrival at the Missouri State Penitentiary.

PORTER stated that he was in maximum security at the time when RAY escaped, however, he did hear through the prison grapevine that RAY "went out the front gate." He said he does not know whether RAY was wearing a uniform or civilian clothes at this time.

PORTER stated that he never made any statements such as an ex-guard had obtained a uniform used by RAY in his escape. He said that RAY was a friend of an ex-guard by the name of JOHN STOUT, but that he doubted very seriously if STOUT would have provided the uniform. He said that STOUT supplied amphetamines to RAY and many others in the State Penitentiary, but doubted very seriously if he could have provided a uniform. He said this because STOUT was assigned to duty at the honor farm which was outside the confines of the prison proper. He stated that the guards were not allowed to carry packages into the prison and were STOUT to try to come into the prison with a uniform he would have to leave it at the prison laundry just inside the gates. He did point out however, that there would be absolutely no problem at all for a convict to steal a uniform or a suit of civilian clothes from this prison laundry. He said that it was run entirely by convicts and that there was no guard in the laundry at all. He said that any convict in the yard would have access to this

laundry and there would be no problem at all for a convict to lift a uniform or a suit of clothes off one of the racks and hide it where he could later get it.

With regard to STOUT, PORTER said that it was his belief that STOUT was requested to resign in about March or April of 1967, after he was "set up" by a convict, GEORGE RUSSELL. PORTER said that RUSSELL was trying to get in good with the prison authorities and made a deal with STOUT for him to take a watch of RUSSELL's out to a watch repair shop. He demanded a receipt and when STOUT gave RUSSELL a receipt for this watch, he, STOUT, turned it over to prison officials who thereafter requested STOUT's resignation. PORTER said that he does not believe that the prison authorities were ever aware of STOUT's activities with regard to supplying amphetamines and other barbiturates to the convicts, although he was probably the biggest operator in the prison.

PORTER said that it was his opinion that STOUT did not assist RAY in effecting his escape, but feels quite certain that RAY, after escaping, would have looked up STOUT for assistance.

PORTER said that other workers in the Missouri State Penitentiary who supplied the convicts with amphetamines and did other favors for them, were (FNU) WHITE, a Negro kitchen steward and (FNU) SHEPPARD, also a kitchen steward.

With regard to his recollections of RAY, PORTER said that he was a very quiet man who did not associate with many of the convicts. He said that he has known RAY on occasion to use amphetamines, but never saw him use any narcotics. He said that RAY never discussed with him or to his knowledge, anyone else, his plans for an escape and said that on one or two prior unsuccessful escape attempts, even his co-workers were not aware of his plans. He said that undoubtedly RAY's best friends in the Missouri State Penitentiary one NEIL AKEY. He said that he thought that AKEY had just been released from the Missouri State Penitentiary and is presently in the Cole County Jail, Jefferson City, Missouri, fighting extradition to Texas on another charge.

He advised he first saw JAMES EARL RAY at the Missouri State Penitentiary in or about 1964; he would see him in the prison yard or in the hallway but at no time did he ever talk to RAY. He advised RAY worked in the kitchen for about sixty days in 1964 but he still did not talk to him or learn anything about him. He stated RAY attempted to escape from prison in about 1966 and was placed in solitary confinement for about a year. LESTER stated it was his impression that RAY was not close to anyone, was very quiet, and preferred to be by himself. LESTER stated he could not furnish any information regarding RAY's associates or his background.

BILLY BROWN AEBY, Stark Road, Seagoville, Texas, phone AT 6-3042, interviewed in the Dallas Office, advised he is unemployed and his wife, **MARY**, works at the General Office of Gibson Products Company, Seagoville. AEBY advised he has five brothers as follows:

AUBREY, an inmate at the U. S. Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas;

NEAL, an inmate at the Texas State Penitentiary;

OTIS, a shampoo salesman residing in Houston, Texas;

FRANKLIN, engaged in the lumber business in Wisconsin;

JAMES, a Dallas, Texas businessman who operates a Mobil Station, Lovers Lane and Preston Road.

AEBY stated he is on bond at this time in connection with possession of narcotics charges in Dallas and Fort Worth, Texas. He said he expects to plead guilty to these charges if he can get an agreement on about eight years in the penitentiary as a sentence. He desires to begin serving his sentence as soon as possible. These are state charges.

AEBY said he entered Missouri State Penitentiary in 1961 to serve three concurrent nine year sentences for armed robbery out of St. Louis, Missouri. He was transferred to a prison farm in 1964. During the period of 1961-64 he was acquainted with **JAMES EARL RAY**, whom he knew as **JIMMIE RAY**. Both were employed in the prison bakery where RAY was considered a good worker. RAY worked both in the pastry crew and bread crew and in the latter capacity was a bread slicer and packager. AEBY speculated that if RAY were to seek a legitimate job on the outside, it might be in the bakery field since he would appear to be qualified to some degree in this area.

AEBY classed RAY as being "money hungry" and he dealt extensively in the sale of amphetamine powder and benzadrine to other inmates, such items apparently being obtained by RAY through prison guards. RAY used amphetamine on a restricted basis himself, but AEBY thought he was more interested in the money derived from sales. The amphetamine

powder is injected in solution in the human body.

AEBY stated RAY kept to himself a great deal and did not attempt to meddle in other peoples' business. The only inmate with whom RAY was apparently associated to any degree, was a man, name not recalled, 50 years old or more, who got caught with bullets in his pocket and was sent to an isolation ward as a result. AEBY recalled that on one occasion, RAY had an inmate named GREEN beaten up by two other inmates because of non payment to RAY for amphetamine powder. One of the inmates who beat GREEN up was recalled as (first name unknown) WABE from Kansas City. AEBY mentioned that one EARL HARRIS, a Negro "kingpin" from St. Louis, sold amphetamine powder to Negroes and was believed to have known RAY. He recalled also one RABPH CEBERTON would possibly have known RAY, but not intimately.

The only relative RAY ever spoke of was a brother in St. Louis who was apparently a middle man for money paid by relatives and friends of inmates for amphetamine powder. This was a dangerous device by which persons on the outside would pay for the powder on behalf of their relatives and friends. RAY'S brother, in turn, was believed to have turned the money over to a lawyer who was trying to get an appeal on RAY'S robbery conviction. AEBY believed RAY'S brother was undoubtedly in the hoodlum element.

AEBY recalled RAY as having the general appearance, except for hair, of the 1960 photos of RAY which appear on the FBI Identification Order No. 4182. He said RAY normally wore his hair medium length, possibly with a part which was believed on the left side. AEBY stated he would not have recognized RAY from a stand up photo which appeared in some newspapers and would not have recognized him from a 1968 photo of RAY under the name of ERIC STARVO GALT. This name is unknown to AEBY.

AEBY described RAY as having a normally modulated voice, possibly having a midwestern accent. He said RAY had clean personal habits, did not use profanity or vulgar language to any marked degree, is likely a good dresser, and would likely have the general appearance of a businessman on the outside. He said it appeared to him RAY probably has a high school education.

AEBY said RAY was not recalled to have had any special

interest or to have ever commented regarding Negroes, Ku Klux Klan, his army service, sports, foreign travel, women friends, homosexuality, clubs, drinking, and the outside world in general. He liked to play poker and AEBY considers he was a good player. He is not a braggart, is usually mild mannered and might appear timid to persons who do not know him well. AEBY has no knowledge that RAY had any interest in "hard narcotics".

AEBY said he considered RAY'S normal criminal occupation as apparently armed robbery, based on conversation, that he would be of the "hit and run" type covering wide areas. He said he cannot conceive that RAY would have killed MARTIN LUTHER KING except for money. He said since RAY was "on the lam" he would only be asking for trouble to have killed KING except for money.

AEBY said he does not specifically recall anything unusual regarding RAY'S features or personal nervous habits. He said he would not know where to begin looking for RAY if it was his job to find him. He said he does not anticipate RAY will attempt to contact him, although RAY unquestionably knew AEBY was from the Dallas area. He stated he expects to be "on the street" for a week or more at best, but would cooperate if RAY should contact him or whenever other information of value comes to his attention.

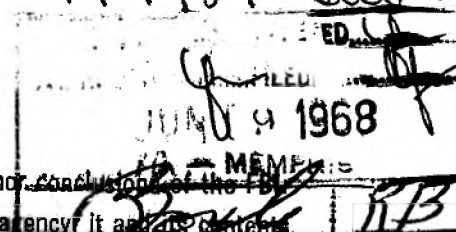
George Ben Edmondson, a former top ten fugitive who was captured in Canada after escaping from Missouri State Penitentiary, is currently incarcerated at the Missouri State Penitentiary, and during re-interview on June 14, 1968, he advised as follows:

It is much easier to obtain a passport in Canada than a drivers license. He said he is not familiar with contacts in Toronto, but is familiar with the procedure in Montreal. He advised that there is no difficulty in passing over to Canada from the United States. One method of securing a passport is to obtain it from a group of persons in Montreal for a fee. He stated he obtained his blanks from Yvon Gadbois. Gadbois reportedly has numerous baptismal blanks printed up which are prepared by several printers, the identities of which he does not know. Edmondson stated that Gadbois is also engaged in the "dirty picture business", and perhaps light "dope" such as marijuana. He is the type of person Edmondson describes as a "hustler". Edmondson advised that Gadbois has access to an official seal with which to stamp-validate the record. Edmondson understands this is furnished through a sexton of the Saint Justine Church. Edmondson stated he was also told this sexton makes an entry in the church records to validate the record should any question arise. He said he doubts this, and it could be it was used as a "come along".

Edmondson said that Gadbois fills out the baptismal record and puts a seal on it. If you do not know a "guarantor", he will provide the name of one and charges more money. The cost of a baptismal record runs from \$25 to \$150 depending on the amount of work Gadbois has to do. Edmondson said his record was applied for on Friday and it was furnished to him by Gadbois on the following Monday or Tuesday ready to be mailed for the passport.

Edmondson advised that the best method, and the one he would have used had he had a chance to study the matter, is as follows: Read an obituary in the newspaper of the death of a person about the same age as the one seeking a passport. He said it is better to get one with few relatives. He said the names of relatives, date and place of birth, are all set out in the death notices. One then writes to the equivalent of the "Bureau of Vital Statistics" in the name of the deceased person stating the birth certificate was lost and request a new one. When the new birth certificate for the deceased person is received, one sends \$5 to the passport office with a photograph and the passport is issued.

Edmondson said that although he obtained a baptismal record from Gadbeis, he did not actually use it because he studied the system in the meantime, and then sent his wife's expired passport with their marriage license to the passport office and requested the issuance of passports for both. He sent the name of an employee of his as a guarantor. The passports were readily issued.

He said it is also possible to obtain a passport with a birth certificate or baptismal record by making an affidavit. A person does not actually have to have a guarantor as this requirement will be waived.

In connection with "crossing over" to Canada, Edmondson said this presents no problem. He said the first time he crossed it was at Plattsburg, New York, about nine or ten days after he escaped from Missouri State Penitentiary. He had hitchhiked a ride from New York City. He showed a drivers license he had as identification. He believed it was in the name of Gaskorf. This time he was asked why he was going to Canada and for how long. He said he replied he was going for two weeks if his money held out. Edmondson stated he went back and forth six or eight times while he was an escapee, and except this once, he was never questioned or required to show any identification. He said the best plan is to pick one of the busiest places to cross. This could be the International Bridge at Detroit, Michigan, and at Plattsburg, New York.

Edmondson also advised persons entering Canada in a fugitive status like to leave the United States from a busy airport such as New York City, and go to Montreal. He said customs are so busy they merely spot check certain passengers and do not ask for identification.

Edmondson advised that the information he has was picked up by him by reading regulations and other sources and the system is not hard to understand.

Edmondson advised that Gadbois had several associates. He said he met some of these but did not know their names. He said he recalled one "hustler" who works with Gadbois by the name of Marcell Villeneuve, also known as Slim, who lives in Pierre Fonda. He said this person is a fence operating an alleged appliance business and he is "real well connected" in Montreal, and can get about anything one would want in the way of electric appliances which are stolen. He stated Marcell also traffics in prostitution and may handle a little "pot".

Another associate of Gadbois is Bill Maharagh who is a photographer described as about 50 to 55 years, 5'7"-8", 180 pounds, gray hair - balding, and who wears very thick glasses. He deals in "dirty pictures, pot, and generally hustles" for Gadbois. He said this man is a "blatant homosexual".

Another associate of Gadbois is a used car dealer who is an East Indian. He has been "rapped" in Montreal for "hot" cars.

Edmondson said he was arrested and put in jail at Ottawa, Canada. Marcell came to see him and offered him a lot of services for a price. He wanted \$350 and took care of some things for Edmondson. He said for another \$1000 he could get Edmondson released, but he sent this message through Edmondson's wife, as the prison authorities would not let him re-visit Edmondson. Edmondson advised he turned down the offer of Marcell and stated he was deported on August 9, 1967. Therefore, Marcell would have had a visit with him between July 1 and August 9, 1967. Edmondson further advised he was using the name of Alex Bormann while living in Canada.

It would be prejudicial to defendant Ray for petitioner to disclose what testimony petitioner will offer in this case but in all fairness to the prosecution it should be stated that this petitioner was inadvertently involved in the assassination of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy and knew

the very day that Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and Senator Robert F. Kennedy were to be killed.

Petitioner further informs the Court that this petitioner is suspected of liquidating Albert Anastasia, of Murder INC., et al and in connection with same and the ASSASSINATIONS hereinabove mentioned petitioner must reserve the right to invoke the Fifth Amendment. Unless, of course, this Court and of her Courts in other states will guarantee that petitioner will not be subjected to prosecution as a result of ANY and all testimony given in this case and a criminal case pending in the state of California, to-wit: People of the state of California versus SIRHAN B. SIRHAN.

I, Hubert James Pott, being duly sworn according to law depose and say under penalty of perjury that the foregoing statements are true to the best of my knowledge, information and belief; that same are not made out of levity or by collusion with anyone, but in sincerity and truth and

For the reasons stated herein.

Petitioner further states under oath that he has been held in Federal custody and mistreated and subjected to terror for over four (4) years; that he has served more than the time required on his sentence and the Atty. Gen'l. of the U.S. the Director U.S. Bureau of Prisons, and U.S. Judges and U.S. prison officials and doctors have joined in a conspiracy to hold said petitioner in prison illegally.

Petitioner further makes oath in due form of law that he is indigent and unable to pay the cost of filing this petition, but believes he is entitled to redress and requests permission to file and to proceed in forma pauperis.

Premises Considered, Petitioner prays:

That the Court Act hereon with celerity and cause said petitioner to be brought into this Court upon a writ of habeas corpus to testify
