At 9:00 AM on 10/17/68, Inspector CARL DOEY,  
RCMP, Toronto, Ontario, Canada, was contacted and infor-  
med that Messrs DWYER, BEASLEY and CARLISLE were  
scheduled to arrive at the Toronto International Airport  
at 1:57 PM, 10/17/68. At the same time, Inspector DOEY  
was informed of the respective positions of these men.

Inspector DOEY indicated that he had already  
received instructions from Ottawa as to the impending  
arrival of these men in Toronto and the purpose of their  
trip, but that their specific arrival time had not pre-  
viously been furnished to him. He added that he was  
assigning Corporal JOHN DUNLOP of the RCMP, who partici-  
pated in the original investigation of RAY's activities  
in Toronto, to "look after" these representatives of the  
State of Tennessee.

It should be noted in connection with this  
particular conversation with Inspector DOEY that he made  
the observation that it appeared highly improbable to him

that these men would be able to interview all of the people they wanted to talk to and still leave Toronto for Montreal on Friday, 10/18/68.

At 2:08 PM, 10/17/68, Misters DWYER, BEASLEY and CARLISLE were met at the ramp of the Toronto International Airport by SA JAMES P. MC MAHON of the Buffalo Office and Corporal DUNLOP of the RCMP as they alighted from their plane. Their passage through Canadian immigration and customs was facilitated by Corporal DUNLOP and they were thereafter driven to Headquarters of the RCMP in Toronto in an RCMP car by Corporal DUNLOP. During the brief discussion at the airport, DWYER, BEASLEY and CARLISLE expressed their appreciation for the cooperation of the FBI, pointing out that they "don't know what they would have done if it were not for the Bureau."

At that same time, it was pointed out to these gentlemen that the possibility of arranging all of the interviews which they indicated they desired while in Toronto would be extremely unlikely in the one full day which they have allocated for their stay in Toronto particularly since at least two of the interviews, those of the two landladies at the residences in Toronto at which RAY had stayed required the services of a Chinese and Polish interpreter. Despite this, they insisted they were committed to adhere to their original schedule and that they would have to accomplish as much as they could during the time they had allocated for Toronto.

Arrangements were made with Corporal DUNLOP for him to notify the Buffalo Office just as soon as the men from Tennessee "firmed up" their plans for departure from Toronto for Montreal.

Supervisor DICK LONG of the Bureau telephonically informed as follows, 10/18/68:

Bureau sent an Airtel to Memphis, August 8, 1968, enclosing copies of six documents, No. 6 being the court testimony of individuals who testified in London, England.

LONG also commented that he did not feel that the Assistant Attorneys General BEASLEY, DWYER, etc. who are in Canada, would be able to meet their appointment in Montreal nor did he feel they could keep their schedule in traveling to London, England. A Chinese person is to be interviewed in Canada and a Polish woman also is to be interviewed. Both of these interviews will require interpreters. LONG stated the only way he felt the schedule could be maintained is for the Asst. Attorneys General to cancel some of the interviews.

Bureau has arranged through the Legat in London for interviews by BEASLEY, DWYER, etc. to be handled in London, however, arrangements as of 10/18/68 had not been completed in Lisbon.

1. With reference to the forwarding minute of the Assist. Officer i/c C.I.B. dated 16 JUL 68, please be advised of the following.
2. Mr. Holmes Yen SHIN, Community Cleaners, 789 Dundas St. West, Toronto, Ontario was questioned relating to laundry mark letter "C" circled over number 24. He admitted this was his laundry mark, however he could not supply any details concerning the owner of the clothing. When laundry is brought to his shop, he issues a tag to the customer; when the customer returns the tags are matched and the laundry handed over. SHIN failed to recognize the second laundry mark EG C 83.
3. Mr. Ben Hoy WONG, WONG's Laundry, 60 Cecil St., Toronto, Ontario was contacted 9 JUL 68. He advised that the laundry marks in question were not used in his business.
4. Mr. Paul PONG, 1027 Center St., Niagara Falls, Ontario was interviewed in relation to laundry mark EG c 83 found on the pair of shorts. PONG stated that he operated PONG's Laundry, 5 Klauck St., Port Erie, Ontario prior to 1963, at which time he moved to Niagara Falls, Ontario where he now operates a Restaurant. When shown the laundry mark mentioned, PONG immediately advised it was not his mark. PONG only used 3 digits and not 5 digits in his business.
5. Mr. Yem LEE, former proprietor of LEE's Laundry, 52 Queen Street East, Hespeler, Ontario was also contacted. It was ascertained from LEE that EG C 83 was not one of his laundry marks.



On October 8 last information was received from the Superintendent of Security, Department of Transport, Ottawa, to the effect that a female employee, who wishes to remain anonymous had confided to her superior that she had met with RAY on 3 occasions, once in the Laurentians, once in Ottawa and once in Montreal. These meetings are believed to have taken place prior to the murder of Dr. Martin Luther KING.

2. Recently this woman has received telephone calls from William Bradford HUEY (phonetic) in Alabama, asking her about her association with RAY. This person is now concerned about the turn of events and consented to be interviewed by a member of this Force relative to her association with RAY.

3. On the 15 OCT 68 subject was interviewed and the following information was obtained from her.

"On the 4th of August 1967, my girlfriend and I went to St. Jovite, P.Q. to spend the long week-end. We arrived there at around 7:00 p.m. and registered at the "Petit Manoir" Inn. We had supper and then decided to go to the Grey Rock Resort for the evening. As we entered the lounge, we saw a man sitting alone at a table facing the Dance Floor. My girlfriend said 'That man is alone, let's see if we can sit with him.' She approached him and he invited us to sit at his table. He introduced himself as Eric GALT and said that he was on holidays from Chicago and was staying at the Grey Rock. He also mentioned that his brother and his sister-in-law had come up with him from Chicago and that they had left for Montreal. He said that he had been there

for about one week and that he would be leaving within the next few days for Montreal to meet his brother. At around Midnight, my girlfriend said that she was not feeling well and she returned to the Petit Manoir. Eric and I went to the Manoir Pinoteau to see the entertainment. We returned to Grey Rock at around 4:00 a.m. and I spent the rest of the night with him in his room, I was intimate with him. I did not notice anything unusual about him. He was quiet, polite, neat and reserved. The next morning, I left him at around 11:00 a.m., at which time he told me that he was leaving for Montreal. He said that he did not know where he would be staying in Montreal, but that he would like to see me again and that he would call the Petit Manoir and let me know where he was staying. He was driving an old red Plymouth around a 1956 model. I did not look at the License Plates.

He called around supper time and since we were out, he left a message with the desk advising to call a number in Montreal. I called and talked to a desk clerk at a hotel in the East end of Montreal. She gave me the address and the number of the room where Eric was staying. He was not in at the time. On Monday, the 7th of August, my girlfriend and I drove down to Montreal and went to the hotel to see Eric. I don't remember the name of the hotel except that it is around the corner from the Acapulco Club. We met Eric in the hall and he appeared pleased and surprised to see us. We shared his quarters during the two nights we spent in Montreal. He was not intimate with either of us in Montreal. He took us out to the Acapulco Club and to restaurants. He seemed to have money and appeared to pay for everything with Canadian \$20.00 bills. In fact, he gave me a Twenty before we left Montreal, in case I had car trouble. I gave him my address in Ottawa.

Some three weeks later, he called me and said that he was in Ottawa staying at the Town and Country Motel for the week-end. He stayed in Ottawa for two days and I showed him around Ottawa. I did not stay with him at the Town and Country. He did not appear to know anyone in Ottawa. I don't recall him saying where he was coming from, but I assumed it was Montreal. He did not have a car and probably came by train. He mentioned that he was working for his brother in Real Estate and that he did not do much but was paid well. He also said that he had no problems with money and could always get some.

He never mentioned any friends or associates besides his borther and I never saw him with anyone. He never mentioned the name Martin Luther KING and never indicated any hatred toward any Negroes.

I did not hear any more from him until around March 1968 when I received a letter from him postmarked Hollywood, California. I don't remember the address and have since destroyed the letter and envelope. The letter was short and did not contain much of interest. He was enquiring as to when I was taking my holidays and said if I write, to do it soon because he would not be at that address after a couple of weeks. I received the letter some three weeks before the assassination of Martin Luther KING.

When I heard that Eric GALT had been arrested and was implicated in the murder of Dr. KING, I panicked and destroyed the letter.

About one month ago, I received a phone call from one William Bradford HUEY who said that he was writing a book about James Earl RAY and when he mentioned the names Grey Rock and Eric GALT, I knew that he must have gotten my name and address from RAY. I agreed to see him and we met for lunch at the Holiday Inn. At that time he showed me his credentials, his picture in Time Magazine with RAY's lawyer and some of his books. He was very charming and appeared to know all about my association with RAY, including the fact that I had been intimate with him. He appeared to be mainly interested in what I thought of RAY and I told him that as far as I was concerned, he was a normal man. He said that I would be the Mystery woman in his book and assured me that my name would not be mentioned. He had a photographer with him and I agreed to let him take smoky pictures which they assured me would show only shadows. He gave me \$100.00 for the information and invited me to go to New York at his expense, any time I felt like it, and to call him collect if I could remember anything else.

I have no other information to offer and the above is all I can remember about my association with James Earl RAY alias Eric GALT.

4. The above information was obtained during several hours of questioning and our investigator is satisfied that it contains all that this informant knows about RAY. She is very concerned about the possibility

of her name and photograph appearing in HUEY's book and in this regard she was advised to consult a lawyer.

5. The girlfriend mentioned has been contacted, however, she has no information of value to offer. She could not remember the name of the hotel where they stayed in Montreal and could not elaborate on any of the points covered by the informant.



1. Morris KERTZER Barrister was contacted this date, and he advised that he had no objection to me re-interviewing his client Claire KEATING as long as it was done in his presence. He arranged to have Mrs. KEATING in his office at 1.30PM, at which time she was interviewed.
2. Mrs. KEATING advised that RAY never gave any indication of hatred toward Negroes. The only time the subject was mentioned was during a conversation on the subject of Separatism in the Province of Quebec, when RAY said that they had a similar problem with Negroes in the South. Mrs. KEATING advised that RAY appeared to be neutral on the subject and did not express any love or hate of Negroes. She flatly denied telling William Bradford HUIE that RAY was very outspoken in his dislike of Negroes.
3. Mrs. KEATING advised that she is willing to be interviewed in Ottawa in the presence of her Lawyer by someone in Authority from Memphis, and if he can convince her that her evidence is material to the case, she will consider the possibility of appearing as a witness. Mr. KERTZER advised that he certainly would not allow his client to appear in Memphis as a witness, without first talking to someone from there in a position to tell them exactly what is involved.

The 66th advised that they were able to discreetly obtain this list but were unable to obtain information concerning the book which JOESTEN is supposed to have written about JAMES EARL RAY.

The 66th determined that JOESTEN is registered as residing in Munich, Federal Republic of Germany (FRG), at 13/1 Grieg Strasse, in care of SCHMITZ. This registration record shows that he was born on [redacted] in Cologne, Germany. He came to his present address on 10/15/68 from 87-70 173rd Street, New York, New York.

JOESTEN is an American citizen with American Passport No. Z 668893 issued on 4/18/67 at the American Consulate General in Stuttgart, FRG. JOESTEN was married on 9/8/40 in Stockholm to the former MAY J. NIELSSON, who was born on [redacted] in Gaevle, Sweden. They have a daughter, INGRID J., who was born on [redacted] in New York. JOESTEN's wife and daughter reside in the United States.

Other records in Munich which might be expected to contain some information about JOESTEN are negative.

None of our other applicable sources has been able to discreetly determine if JOESTEN's book concerning RAY is available at no cost. It would appear that the desired information cannot be obtained here discreetly. A direct approach to JOESTEN would probably determine whether or not the RAY publication is available free.
