I received a telephone call this morning from one identifying himself as Lee Bailey, an attorney. He stated that he had gotten a letter which purported to be from Ray requesting him to serve as defense counsel in connection with the murder indictment in Memphis, Tennessee. Bailey was calling me to see if I had any knowledge of the bona fides of the letter. He also stated that he intended to tell Ray that "Because of his (Bailey's) close relationship with Dr. King, he would consider handling the matter only if Ray's defense was that he did not commit the crime".

Upon my inquiries about the substance of the letter, Bailey stated that it contained a convict number, gave his address as the prison in which he is actually being held, and named his solicitor as Michael Dresden and Co., 32 Tavistock Street, London. The letter also indicated that the writer thought he would be returned to this country on about June 19. I confirmed to Bailey that the information contained in the letter was accurate with the exception of the June 19 date which was uncertain. Bailey indicated that he would call Ray's solicitors in London to discuss the matter.

2. It will be noted that the person in question sat near the piano during his conversation with Mrs. ZANE. This person did not have any conversation with Mrs. McLAUCHLIN.

3. Telex CIB-1508 was received this point from "HQ" Ottawa.

4. Mr. Louis McILGAM (DB: 16 NOV 1938) owner of English & Scotch Hellen Company Limited, 1248 St. Catharine St. West, Montreal (Phone 366-3727) was contacted. With McILGAM's cooperation the following original documents were obtained from his employee Mr. John McILGAM i/c Shipping concerning the suit purchased by GALT.

All documents were initialed by Cpl. POWELL, Cst. G.W.J. HOUSSIAU and John WELCH. Originals held as exhibits this point with photostats attached to this report. Copies of Form C246 Exhibit Report #63/41 are attached.

5. The salesman involved with this sale was FELICIA, however, no identification could be made of any photos of RAY. This applies to all the other employees of this firm also.

6. Further enquiries will be conducted at the Montreal Post Office in question and also at the Canada Customs in an effort to obtain the originals of all documents concerning the forwarding of this suit to GALT at 2603 Highland Ave., Birmingham Alabama U.S.A.

7. It will be noted that the order was placed on 21 JULY 67, the letter from GALT was dated 9-6-67 (believed to be 6 SEP 67 in the Canadian way) and the suit was shipped on the 9 SEP 67. It will also be noted that GALT paid cash for this suit.

8. It is requested that further enquiries be conducted at Birmingham, Alabama.

9. With reference to the letter in para #4 (c) above, the envelope in which the letter was sent could not be located.

10. Cst. PHAMARS of the Montreal City Police (MCP) Ident. Section was contacted and advised concerning the laundry mark #11-2307-2219. He advised that the exact location of this mark together with the colour and type of print and whether this number is printed on the shirt or attached to the shirt with some other material i.e., linen, paper or cardboard is necessary to gather all information in this respect, however in the meantime he will make preliminary investigations.

11. Mr. A. CHEVARIE, Manager of Hip Top Tailors, 488 St. Catherine St. West, Montreal (phone 381-1561) was contacted. CHEVARIE advised that tag #3-7153 was of no value in checking his records.

12. After a search of their records, with the cooperation of CHEVARIE, a carbon copy of sales slip #11-239758 was located bearing the name Eric GALT of 2934 Notre Dame St., East Montreal. This item was turned over to us by CHEVARIE and same was initialed by Cpl. POWELL, Cst. HOUSSIAU and CHEVARIE. This item is held as an exhibit this point and is shown as item #9 on Exhibit Report #63/41. Photostats of this item are attached.

13. CHEVARIE advises that he believes the #54424 as shown on the sales slip is also marked on the tag which showed #3-7153. Confirmation that #54424 is on this tag will enable a more complete investigation with the possibility of obtaining all original documents concerning the sale of this suit. The #54424 is typed on the tag in the colour blue and #7153 is typed in red.

14. The salesman who sold the suit, Mr. J.B. CHEVRIER, could not identify any of the photos of RAY. This applies also to CHEVRIER and the other employees of this firm.

15. CHEVRIER believes that this purchase by GALT was paid by cash, however, this will be established when the confirmation of 154424, reference para. #13 above, is obtained.



On June 21, 1968, a Chicago bank official made available for review a Western Union cable dated May 8, 1968, and received in Chicago May 9, 1968, which was signed Tottajo. According to the bank officials, the signature is the code word for the Banco Totta-Alianca, Rua-Douro 69-79, Lisbon, Portugal. The cable read as follows: "Please send us by cable credit information on Arthur T. Galt, Chicago."

The heading on the cable is as follows:

"W. V. MCDUO7L RVV 201 LBR 763

20 15 PD INTL CD LISBON VIA WV181438"

According to the Chicago bank official, no account had been located in their records for an individual named Arthur T. Galt and the Lisbon Bank was advised of this fact by cable May 9, 1968.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

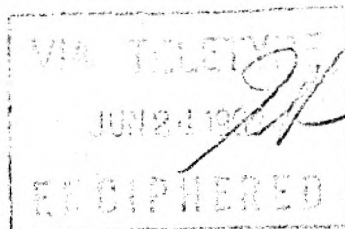

Efforts by New Scotland Yard to photograph fluorescent laundry markings were unsuccessful.

At the time of his arrest, RAY was in possession of a Wittnauer Geneve wristwatch. Scotland Yard has determined that this watch, which is made in Switzerland, is manufactured exclusively for the American market and Scotland Yard has been advised that no jeweler in London has the special tools required to open the case without inflicting serious damage. Therefore, it has not been possible to determine the serial number, if any. The watch, together with RAY's other personal possessions, will be turned over to Bureau representatives when RAY is removed to the United States.

RAY's personal possessions include a receipt dated 6/7/68 for one pound, fifteen shillings. Scotland Yard determined this was issued by a men's wear shop at 330 Vauxhall Road, S.W. 1, London. The manager was unable to identify RAY or the person to whom the receipt was issued but the records of the shop indicate that the receipt was issued for a rollneck pull-over sweater. No such sweater was found among RAY's possessions.

Scotland Yard requested RAY's solicitor to provide information regarding RAY's whereabouts, May 17-28, 1968. The solicitor informed the Yard that RAY refused to cooperate and RAY also refused to be interviewed by Scotland Yard regarding his whereabouts or activities in England.

Scotland Yard has checked all car rental agencies in London for the period of 5/17-6/8/68 without finding any record of the subject.

London airtel 6/8/68 sets forth a copy of the charge sheet at Cannon Row Police Station. On page 2, fifth item from the bottom, is listed a BOAC ticket No.0614/4256/8753, London to Toronto. The charge sheet is in error in that this ticket is actually for passage from London to Lisbon. //

The revolver in RAY's possession when arrested has been examined by a Scotland Yard ballistics expert who concluded it had been fired several times since it was last cleaned. He found no reason to believe the gun had been recently fired.

With regard to the call made from Houston, Texas, 6/9/68 by one JIM TATUM, who attempted to call RAY person to person, it is noted the original information alleged TATUM was connected with Cannon Row Police Station, London and was referred to Chief Superintendent Butler but the night duty officer declined to call BUTLER. Scotland Yard has been unable to identify the night duty officer in question or to develop any information regarding this call.

Under the reporting procedures in use by Scotland Yard, the results of negative investigation, as well as details of the nature and scope of investigation conducted are not recorded in report form and are not collected in any central file. This material appears only in the "pocket book" carried by each officer to record his activities. The formal report is limited to a brief account of information intended to actually be introduced as evidence. Chief Inspector KENNETH THOMPSON, who is coordinating the investigation, is having a "schedule" prepared which will show details of the nature and scope of investigation conducted. This is an unusual procedure and requires a great deal of effort by many Scotland Yard officers. This is being closely followed on a daily basis and when received the schedule will be immediately reviewed, after which any additional investigation that appears necessary will be discussed with Scotland Yard.

ARTHUR HANES, accompanied by his son, arrived in London, 8:40 AM, 6/20/68, via TWA Flight 704. He was not met by the Embassy and has had no contact with the Embassy. In order to see RAY he will have to apply through RAY's British solicitor or through the Home Office. HANES is staying at the Royal Lancaster Hotel.

In a London press conference, 6/20/68, HANES reportedly stated he has never met the subject but was retained by a letter signed R. G. SNEYD, dated 6/10/68, and forwarded to HANES through the Birmingham Bar Association. HANES said he is a lawyer who works

for fees and does not work for nothing but he declined to identify the source of his fees. He indicated he probably will not see RAY in London but wanted to confer with RAY's British attorneys.

On 6/21/68 ARTHUR J. HANES and his son, who practices law with him, visited Scotland Yard where they saw a Chief Inspector. We have been advised in confidence that HANES requested an interview with RAY and was told he could not see him. He was asked the source of his fee and replied that he expected to collect his fee from RAY. When he was told that RAY is practically without funds, he apparently lost interest in seeing him and requested that RAY be given his business card, on the back of which he wrote, "Dear Mr. Sneyd. We made an effort to see you but will see you immediately upon arrival in the USA."

In the transistor radio in the possession of RAY at the time of his arrest was a torn piece of paper jammed against the battery, apparently to hold the battery right. This paper has parts of notations, apparently in RAY's handwriting, as follows: "Consul for ", "Then Write" "Portuguese know about" "MERIUND". It would appear likely that these notes pertain to RAY's efforts to go to Africa as a mercenary. Chief Inspector THOMPSON has determined that "MERIUND" is meaningless to IAN COLVIN and Major WICKS.

IAN COLVIN has advised New Scotland Yard that the organization in Brussels known as CRISP, which is mentioned in COLVIN's previously submitted statement, is a research organization that attempts to keep track of mercenaries in Africa. COLVIN's mention to RAY of CRISP and M. JEAN GIRARD-LIBONDS, who is connected with CRISP, was in the context of suggesting a possible means of locating RAY's brother whom RAY had alleged was a mercenary in Angola and missing. In this regard it is noted that COLVIN did not provide RAY with the address of the above individual or organization.

It was alleged that when RAY left the Pax Hotel on the morning of his arrest he carried a small flight bag over his shoulder and no other luggage. When arrested he had no luggage, having already checked one suitcase to Brussels. This suitcase was recovered by Scotland Yard and is a square, plaid, fabric zipper bag somewhat larger than the usual "two-suiter".

Scotland Yard conducted an exhaustive search of all baggage rooms and lockers in London without locating any luggage identifiable with RAY. All indications are that at the time of his arrest RAY was on his way to Brussels for the purpose of making the necessary contacts to go to Africa as a mercenary and it would therefore seem unlikely that he was leaving anything of value behind.

An examination of RAY's airline tickets shows that the number of pieces and weight of luggage was not entered on the ticket for the flight from Toronto to London. From London to Lisbon he checked one piece weighing 12 kilos (26.46 pounds). On the return flight from Lisbon to London he checked one piece weighing 15 kilos (33.07 pounds); and on the intended flight to Brussels he checked one piece weighing 13 kilos (28.66 pounds). Scotland Yard has advised that his bag in its present condition weighs 23 pounds and 12 ounces. A raincoat he was carrying when arrested weighs an additional two pounds. Articles removed from his bag for his use in prison, not counting what he actually wears, consist of a suit, a shirt, a pair of socks, an undershirt and a pair of shorts, having a total estimated weight of 3 pounds.

Scotland Yard has advised that airline employees often fail to take time to precisely weigh luggage unless overweight charges are involved (the allowance is 20 kilos) and they often estimate the weight while the scale is fluctuating. This could readily account for an error of one or two kilos. It is noted that his raincoat may have been in the suitcase on the flight from Lisbon to London; therefore it is not apparent that any of his personal effects are missing.

The Atlantic edition of "TIME" Magazine, 6/21/68, has been withdrawn from sale in England because of an article on Pages 22-23 captioned "RAY's Odd Odyssey." This article includes details of the subject's prior criminal activities as well as a detailed summary of this case and his activities since July, 1967. Publication of such material concerning a defendant under pending charges is strictly prohibited by British law.

In removing outdated messages from their bulletin board at Heathrow International Airport, London, TWA noted that one of their message forms, dated 5/28/68, at 8:00 AM, was addressed to Mr. YARUM CHANDRA DUTT, Flight 700 on 5/27/68, advising DUTT that "Mr. RAY will meet you at TWA ticket desk." Scotland Yard believes that the message is in the handwriting of a TWA employee but all TWA employees have been contacted without identifying the person taking the message and without developing any information concerning DUTT, "Mr. RAY" or the subject.

TWA Flight 700 is from Kennedy Airport, New York, to London. The name DUTT does not appear on the passenger list of Flight 700 on 5/27/68 and no record could be found of DUTT's arrival in London.

Enclosed is the original message which should be examined for latent fingerprints to be compared with the subject's fingerprints. Also enclosed is the passenger list for TWA Flight 700, 5/27/68. New York should check with TWA for any information regarding DUTT and determine if he has any connection with the subject. Since DUTT is an uncommon name, apparently of Indian or Pakistani origin, INS records should also be checked.

Reairtel 6/24/68 from Legat, London, submitting items of property taken from personal effects of James Earl Ray for Laboratory examination and TWA message slip for latent fingerprint examination. These items were personally delivered by SA W. Martindale, General Investigative Division.

The scratch pad of blank paper was examined for indented writing and watermarks with negative results. The hand printed word "CERTIFICATE" appears on the cover of this pad. Although a number of hand printing similarities were noted in this word when compared with Ray's hand printing indicating it was possibly prepared by subject, limited nature of this hand printing precludes definite identification of Ray as author of this hand printing. The five handkerchiefs were examined for visible and invisible laundry marks but none were found. Regarding the Wittnauer wrist watch, the back of this watch was removed, no serial number was found on the movement, no foreign material was found and no evidence watch had been subjected to repair. The four test bullets and four cartridge cases from a .38 Special caliber "Liberty Chief" revolver, serial number 715, were compared with all similar specimens in the National Unidentified Ammunition File without effecting an identification.

The TWA message slip was examined for latent fingerprints. Two latents of value were developed but these are not identical with fingerprints of James Earl Ray. It was also determined that writing on this slip was not

She could provide little information at this time, she didn't know where he worked, if he had any friends, owned a car or where he could be located. He did pay his rent in cash, worked somewhere at night and slept during the day. No further information was gained at this time. He apparently moved out because the children in the house made too much noise.

4. Mrs. ITTAS, widow, was located at 108 Ossington Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, where she lives with a young daughter. When questioned concerning one, Paul MILLERMAN, she stated that he had not resided here during the fourteen years she has operated a small confectionery store on this site.

5. Enquiries at the KENNEDY TRAVEL BUREAU LTD., 424 Bloor Street West, Toronto, Ontario, revealed that Raymond George SMITH, 962 Dundas Street West, Toronto, Ontario, had arranged on 10 APR 68 for transportation from Toronto to London, leaving Toronto via BOAC Flight # 600 6 MAY 68 returning from London via BOAC Flight # 601 21 MAY 68. It was suggested at this time that Miss Lillian SWICK, Branch Manager, be interviewed when she was to return to the office 3 JUN 68.

6. The above information was telephoned to "A" Division this same date.

1 JUN 68

7. On this date, I was advised by the Officer i/c C.I.B. that the above particulars were to be thoroughly checked out.

8. Accompanied by Cst. G. Vandegraaf, I proceeded to KENNEDY TRAVEL BUREAU LTD. and interviewed Miss Lillian SPENCER. She verified the information, as noted in para. 5 above, and added that she arranged the trip to London for SHAYD and also completely filled out an application for his passport on 16 APR 68, which he signed. SHAYD also signed a Statutory Declaration in Lieu of Guarantor at this time in Miss SPENCER's presence. This Statutory Declaration was filled out during the a.m. but notarized by Mr. Henry MOON, Notary Public, President and owner of KENNEDY TRAVEL BUREAU LTD. during the p.m. and some time after SHAYD had left the premises. Arrangements were made with SHAYD to return to this Agency after about two weeks to pick up the tickets and passport. SPENCER produced from her files a printed letter signed Raymond George SHAYD dated 4-20-68 to the effect that he was going to Coprac for several days on business and would pick up the passport on his return. Photostat copies of letter attached. Miss SPENCER stated that on 2 MAY 68 the tickets were issued and on this same day SHAYD picked up both the tickets and his passport, on payment of \$345.00 in Canadian funds. SPENCER failed to recognize any FBI pictures of James Earl RAY shown to her.

9. At the Office of Vital Statistics, 79 Lombard Street, Toronto, Ontario, a record of Raymond George SHAYD was found as follows:

10. It was subsequently learned that the SHAYD listed with Vital Statistics was a member of the Metro Toronto Police Department, employed at # 33 Division. I called this Division and spoke with Insp. O'Hara, who verified that this member was working out of this Division. I told him briefly the reason for this investigation after which he confirmed the member under his command was working in RAY and did not make a trip to England on 6 MAY 68. SHAYD's holidays were not due until JUL 68, his address was given as 1731 Victoria Park Ave., Toronto, Ontario, phone 750-7562. I call SHAYD, told him the reason for the enquiry and asked him if he had any knowledge of this person using the particulars of the SHAYD born 8 OCT 32. SHAYD replied that he knew nothing of this situation, therefore, arrangements were made for him to view the photo that was expected later in the day. SHAYD sounded quite honest during this telephone conversation.

11. As a result of information supplied by Headquarters, a check was made at the ARCADE PHOTO STUDIO, 137 Yonge Street, Toronto, Ontario, under the names of both SHAYD and KENNEDY. SHAYD proved

negative but it was learned a man using the name BRIDGMAN purchased a passport photo on 11 APR 68; a negative of this photo could not be found. A picture of this person was located and given to the investigator by Mrs. AGNEW, Proprietor.

12. Also from information supplied by Headquarters, Mrs. Feliksa SZPANCOWSKA, 102 Ossington Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, was contacted. She informed that a Paul BRIDGMAN resided at this address from 8-19 APR 68; however, he kept to himself and his employment was not known. Mrs. SZPANCOWSKA immediately advised the investigator that she had seen a picture of KAY in the newspapers connected with file subject and had requested her husband to call the police concerning BRIDGMAN; however, he laughed at her so she forgot the idea. SMYID paid \$10.00 cash per week for his room, had no visitors, was not seen driving a car nor did she know where he went from here. SMYID was thought to be a car salesman. She also added that a couple of days after the information regarding the suspect in the KING murder case was released, BRIDGMAN moved from this address.

13. Mrs. LOO was again contacted and shown a picture received from ANCADS STUDIO. She identified the picture taken as BRIDGMAN as the person who resided at her home using the name SMYID. She then produced a small blue coloured flight bag containing the articles as shown on attached Form C.246, which she stated were items left by SMYID. These items were immediately taken to the R.C.M.C. i/c Identification Branch for his attention. No evidence of fingerprints was found on these goods that could be identified with the suspect KAY in this case. Other persons interviewed at this address, without result, as follows:

14. Mrs. SZPANCOWSKA also identified the photo of BRIDGMAN as the man who rented the room at her home, but she failed to recognize the F.B.I. picture of KAY. Mr. SZPANCOWSKA, as well as tenants RAFFAELS, SARAFAHO and C. JOLLYING were interviewed but they could not supply additional information concerning the suspect.

15. At this point most members of C.I.B. General were beginning to check the various sources locally in an effort to identify SMYID & BRIDGMAN. Metro P.D., O.P.P., Postal Investigation, Department Motor Vehicles (names of registered car salesman), Retail Credit Bureau, and all names of SMYID in the Toronto Telephone Directory. Our C.I.B. and S.I.B. records were checked as well as arrangements made to receive the passenger list of persons on Flight 600 BOAC dated 6 MAY 68 and Flight 601 BOAC 21 MAY 68.

4 JUN 68

16. Sgt. A. Sikora, R.C.M.C. i/c Identification Branch, together with S/Sgt. G.L. Yocality, R.C.M.C. Co-ordinator, and members of C.I.B. General patrolled to both 962 Dundas Street West and 102 Ossington

Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, where a complete and thorough search was made of the rooms occupied by the person in question in an effort to gather evidence connecting the suspect with the captionally-noted case or to identify this person. This search proved negative.

17. Neighbourhood enquiries were conducted, as well as local banks, dry-cleaning establishments, and grocery stores in an effort to identify this man using the name SNEYD as well as to locate associates or places he might have frequented with no results.

18. Pictures of SNEYD & BRIDGMAN as well as the Passport Application and Statutory Declaration were received by facsimile from Headquarters; Telex 6181050 summarizing this investigation was dispatched to the Commissioner, Information "A" Division. Special Agents J. McMan and W. Campbell, F.B.I., Buffalo, N.Y. arrived to assist in this investigation.

5 JUN 68

19. A meeting took place in the offices of the Metro Toronto Police Department with members of M.T.P.D., R.C.M.P. and F.B.I. present. The purpose was to make the M.T.P.D. aware that the suspect was using the particulars of a member of the M.T.P.D., that the suspect had spent one month in Toronto which no doubt would require their attention in one phase or another, and to advise that the F.B.I. Agents were at our Office for liaison purposes direct to U.S. sources if necessary.

20. Miss Lillian SPENCER, Manager, KENNEDY TRAVEL BUREAU LTD., Toronto, Ontario, was contacted and requested to come to this Office to be interviewed. She readily agreed and after being interrogated for some time she gave the attached voluntary statement.

21. The ARCADE PHOTO STUDIO was visited and the negative of Paul BRIDGMAN was asked for. Mrs. ARCADE stated she valued the negative at \$20.00 and without this payment she refused to produce same. Immediately Cst. Clifton obtained a Search Warrant under Section 58(1) C.C. seized this negative as well as Bill of Sale 11 APR 68. Exhibit Report C.246 dated 6 JUN 68 attached.

22. A check was made at Vital Statistics regarding the name SNEYD to determine whether or not someone might have applied for a birth certificate under this name. A printed letter signed by Raymond George SNEYD dated 4-18-68, listing the necessary details of the birth, father's name and mother's name including mother's maiden name, was found. See photostat copies of this document attached. This document was turned over to our Identification Branch for examination after which the original was returned. Copies of this document, as well as the letter located in the Travel Agency signed by SNEYD were forwarded via air direct to the F.B.I. Office in Buffalo, New York.

6 JUN 68

23. Special Constable David Yue and I patrolled to 962

Dundas Street West and interviewed Mrs. Sun Fung LOO. This interview was conducted in the Chinese language and although Mrs. LOO did not want to sign any statements, she agreed to answer all questions. She advised that CHAY appeared at her door during the morning of 18 APR 68 and enquired about the room for rent. Mrs. LOO had a sign "Room to rent" in the front window of her home. CHAY paid her \$7.00 Canadian money and made arrangements to move in 19 APR 68. He was carrying a newspaper at this time. On 19 APR 68, CHAY appeared at this address and took possession of the room. He carried no luggage, had only one suit of clothes, did not buy any new clothes, did not bring any liquor into the house, nor was he seen driving a car. He indicated he worked a night shift in a hotel, she remembered he was out all night and slept during the day while at this point. Mrs. LOO further added that although he moved in on the date in question, he was not seen by her again until 26 APR 68. She had a short conversation with him at which time he indicated he went back to Montreal. She then assumed Montreal might be his home. A few days after he returned from his trip, an unknown male described as tall, fat, husky, appeared at the door with a letter. She called CHAY; a very short conversation took place between the two men, after which the visitor left. Mrs. LOO could provide no further identification concerning this person, although she knew he was not a postman nor could she describe him as a delivery man of any type. Added, CHAY first paid Mrs. LOO on 18 APR 68, he paid for the second week on 18 APR 68 and the third week 2 MAY 68, where he was last seen. Mrs. LOO discovered him missing on either 10 or 11 MAY 68. She does not know exactly when he left this address. Mrs. LOO's husband Ted LOO was questioned at this time, but he could offer no information concerning this case.

24. On this date, I was informed by the Officer i/c U.I.L. that the suspect under investigation here had been positively identified by the F.B.I. as James Earl RAY, wanted by the F.B.I. for the murder of Dr. Martin Luther KING Jr.

25. Det. S.S. Cliffin and I, accompanied by C/M S. Kishan, Polish Interpreter, interviewed ELLISA MURRAY, 192 Ossington Ave., Toronto, Ontario. This woman declined to give a written statement but agreed to co-operate with investigating members. She advised that a Paul MURRAY appeared at her door on 8 APR 68 to rent a room. A sign was in the front window advertising a room to rent. He paid \$10.00 per week for rent, Canadian money, and stayed for two weeks. He told Mrs. MURRAY he was a car salesman; however, she thought it strange as MURRAY was not seen to drive a car. He allegedly worked days but was sometimes home during the day. He owned a brown sports jacket, black pants, black tie and one shirt as well as a tobacco coloured raincoat. He carried a small suitcase, colour unknown, but a plaid design inside. No associates could be ascertained nor was he visited by anyone. One letter arrived addressed to him and although he saw the letter on the small table where all letters for boarders are placed, he refused to pick up the letter. This letter, from 70 Leonard Street, Toronto, the address of Vital Statistics, was returned to the postman by the lady.

26. Mrs. SUTOWSKA added that she recognized SMYD as a man wanted for the shooting of KING. She had seen pictures in the newspapers. She immediately told her husband to call the police; however, he laughed at her and convinced her it was not so. She therefore gave the matter no further thought.

27. Mr. W. W. HALL, Registrar-General's Department, Vital Statistics, was contacted and advised of the investigation, especially dealing with his Department. During a check at this point, a printed letter applying for a birth certificate signed by Paul Edward SMITHMAN, listing the same information as the letter found concerning SMYD, was found. This document was also examined by the Identification Section with negative results. It was ascertained that a birth certificate applied for by SMITHMAN had been returned to the Department.

28. P.C. Raymond George SMYD was questioned at length by Det. Sgt. R. B. HARRIS, R.C.M.P., and Cpl. J. B. BUNLOP, Toronto C.I.B. Attached please find copies of voluntary statement given to these members by SMYD.

7 JUL 68

29. At the suspect had now been identified as RAY, every effort was being made to determine associates, movements, habits and any other information that might be available at this point with a view to locating RAY, as well as any person who might have assisted him. Belonged enquiries were again made on both Ossington Avenue and Dundas Street West. Members also began a check of all Consulates in the City in the event RAY may have made arrangements for a Visa to another country from here; hotels, dry-cleaning shops, photo studios, as well as further checks at Vital Statistics, all enquiries using the photo as an aid. No information of value was gained.

30. At Vital Statistics I was informed by Mr. A. PINK, Assistant Deputy Registrar General, a very simple method to gain information concerning a person's name, correct date and place of birth, father and mother's name, as well as the mother's maiden name. All newspapers in this City keep on file all editions printed. It is a very easy task to locate in Toronto copies of local papers printed for any year where a person can check the birth announcement for the required information. Toronto newspapers are adopting this practice to obtain birth certificates for persons over twenty-one years in order that they can frequent beverage rooms. In this case, it will be noted RAY had the necessary particulars to secure birth certificate for both SMITHMAN and SMYD, even though he never did have possession of the SMITHMAN certificate. The manner in which he acquired this information regarding SMITHMAN and SMYD is not known at this time; however, as pointed out, it is not difficult.

31. Mr. Paul SMITHMAN, 83 Cabotville Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, the man whose particulars RAY was using when the birth certificate was applied for, was interviewed. Paul SMITHMAN is employed by the Toronto

any knowledge of RAY and as far as can be ascertained at this point, SWIDOMAN is completely innocent of any connection with this investigation.

32. Canvassing of hotels, banks, car dealers, Post Offices, dry-cleaning establishments continued on this date by C.I.B. members. Through co-operation with Mr. CLOUGH, Security Department, SOAC, the passenger and crew manifests for both 6 MAY 68 and 21 MAY 68 were obtained and checked. Also the name of Mr. & Mrs. D. KILBURN, 212 Burns Ave. East, Whitby, Ontario, the passengers directly in front of RAY, were forwarded. These people were contacted but they do not remember RAY. The persons directly behind RAY and those across the aisle from him on 6 MAY 68 booked one-way passage, therefore, it is assumed these people are from somewhere overseas.

33. Information was received from Headquarters that RAY had left London and was known to have gone to Lisbon, Portugal. It was also ascertained that RAY had used his return ticket from London to Toronto on the purchase of a ticket from London to Lisbon, after which he was issued a return voucher valued at \$12.00, SOAC Voucher No. 0010444/3731. A request was received to contact SOAC, Toronto, Ontario, to put a stop notice on this voucher and to supply any information available. Mr. CLOUGH was again contacted, however, he informed that this voucher is similar to a traveller's cheque, accepted by travel agencies and airlines throughout the world. He also added that it would be practically impossible to put a stop notice on this voucher. It could be from one month to one year before this voucher would finally end up in their local files. This matter was not pursued further.

6 JUN 68

34. I was advised by the Officer i/c C.I.B. that RAY was apprehended at the London Airport by Scotland Yard.

10 JUN 68

35. Telex 3131507 was received from the Commissioner relating to clothing and items found in RAY's possession. Telex 3131094 dispatched 11 JUN 68 from this Division.

36. A systematic check of all banks in an area bounded by Brock, Bloor, Jarvis and Front Streets was begun by members of this Section in an effort to link RAY with any money transactions either locally or with the U.S.A. Results will be reported.

11 JUN 68

37. Information was received to the effect that Mrs. SCAPARONE indicated to newspaper reporters that a man had called at her home asking for SWIDOMAN. She was contacted by myself, accompanied by Det. Henry PANKOSKI in this regard. Det. PANKOSKI, who speaks Polish, translated

r the interview. Mrs. SZPANKOWSKA advised that three or four days after BRIDGMAN moved out, a young man about thirty years, 5'10", dark blond, round face, wearing a 3/4 length coat appeared at the door and asked if BRIDGMAN lived at this address. He showed her BRIDGMAN's name type-written on a piece of paper. When she replied that he moved, the man left. She did not know the man, he did not show any identification nor does she know what agency, if any, he represented. She was asked why she had not related this event during her numerous contacts with investigators earlier whereupon she stated she thought she had told us. At this point she admitted she was thoroughly confused by the events of the past week especially by her encounters with various newspaper men and photographers. It will be noted in para. 25 that on 6 JUN 68, she was interviewed with the assistance of C/A B. HUBBARD, at which time Mrs. SZPANKOWSKA advised that BRIDGMAN had no associates nor was he visited by anyone. This phase of the interview was explored at that time and no mention was made of anyone asking for BRIDGMAN after he left. Due to Mrs. SZPANKOWSKA admitted a confused state of mind, I place some doubt that a young man asked for BRIDGMAN; however, every effort will be made to identify this person.

38. Mr. Robert McHAULTON (DB: 26 MAR 17) 10 Bellehaven Cresc., Toronto, Ontario, appeared at M.T.F.D. Headquarters and identified himself as probably being the "fat man" who delivered the letter to SNEYD, 962 Dundas St. West, Toronto, Ontario. He stated that he used the phone booth just up the street from this address, found an open letter addressed to SNEYD, realized the address was just a few houses away, walked up to the door and delivered same, telling SNEYD he found it in the phone booth. Cpl. J.D. Dunlop and Det. Sgt. R. Marsh interviewed this man and subsequently had him positively identified by Mrs. LEO. There is no doubt that McHAULTON is innocently connected with SNEYD. In view of the publicity given all known persons involved with this investigation by the press, McHAULTON asked that his identity not be released to the press. This request has been respected at this point.

39. Various avenues of investigation are underway at this time, checking on persons who allegedly believe that had some association with RAY during his stay in the Toronto area. A map of Toronto found at 962 Dundas St. West has an area circled in pen at Queen Street and Ossington Avenue, which is close to where RAY lived as BRIDGMAN; the Vital Statistics Office circled, and four areas marked in the eastern section of the City. Investigation is continuing to determine what connection these marked areas have with RAY.

40. An Eric S. GALT, one of the aliases used by RAY was previously checked on in Toronto on 19 APR 68. The man here is Eric St. Vincent GALT, Supervisor, UNION CASSEIDE CANADA LIMITED, home address 49 Lehaman Drive, Scarborough, Ontario. He is a trusted employee and known to be in Toronto on the date in question. See Telex CIBY26/2 received from the Commissioner and Telex CIBY36 sent from "O" Division 19 Apr 68.

2. Further to Para. 24, as you are aware, the positive identification of the Toronto suspect by the F.B.I. came as a result of handwriting comparison of one of the attached letters to the Department of Vital Statistics.

3. The BOAC manifest referred to in Para. 32 showed SNEYD as a passenger on Flight 600, however, their manifest for the proposed return flight on 21-5-68 did not list this name. This information was relayed to Ottawa by telephone and we believe was assistance to Scotland Yard in determining that RAY had exchanged the return portion as detailed in Para. 33.

4. It might be mentioned that the laundry marks referred to in your telex CIB 1507 have been checked against the records held by the O.S.P., negatively. They suggest they might have originated in Montreal last summer or in the U.S.A. prior to RAY entering Canada.

5. We have no concrete information that anyone knowingly assisted RAY during his stay in this city, however, all aspects are receiving continuous attention and further correspondence will be forthcoming as information of value becomes available.
