REPORT BY INSPECTOR THOMKINS TO THE CHIEF OF THE SAFETY POLICE

PURPOSE OF INVESTIGATION:

Item No. 20-724, Federal Police Division, Bern, reference B-12220 HPW.

Request to investigate the possibility of the presence in Geneva of James Earl Ray.

On June 13, 1968, the Federal Police Division in Bern transmitted to us by mail a request by the FBI dated June 4, 1968. The request was for the identification of an American observed in the Landolt Restaurant one Saturday evening toward the end of April. The subject answered the description of the alleged assassin of Doctor Martin Luther King, a subject named:

In the first place, I wish to point out that according to the press, James Earl Ray was arrested in London on Saturday, June 8, 1968, under the following alias:

RAYMON GEORGE SNEYD

or

RAYMON GEORGE SNEYDA

The request of the FBI specified that their Washington office had received, on May 14, 1968, an anonymous telephone call from a man who claimed to be a journalist. This man had just had a conversation with certain persons who likewise desired to remain anonymous. These persons believed to have seen -- at the Landolt Restaurant in Geneva, one Saturday evening toward the end of April 1968 -- an American answering James Earl Ray's description. They furnished the following information:

The unknown subject had entered the restaurant with a man and an approximately forty-year-old woman with blond-tinted hair. The two persons in the unknown subject's company appeared to be Swiss. The American was well dressed and had a mid-west accent. His language was coarse and vulgar. He appeared to desire the services of a prostitute. The previously mentioned blond woman suggested a homosexual dressed up as a woman, but he replied that he wanted a woman. The American ordered expensive and exotic dishes which the restaurant personnel had to go get elsewhere. The personnel in attendance were very solicitous but did not appear to know the American. The unknown blond must have been acquainted with the maitre d'hotel because she kissed him before leaving the restaurant with her two escorts.

The inquiries made of Mr. Francis Longchamp, operator of the Landolt Beer Garden, 2 Rue de Candolle, near the University, did not provide confirmation of the moss described above. It is to be noted that the clientele is a very cosmopolitan clientele and that it includes many Americans, but the restaurant never had to send elsewhere for exotic dishes. As to the old maitre d'hotel who knows the employees and clientele very well, he has no recollection of having been kissed by a forty-year-old blond woman in the restaurant.

The same inquiries were made in the Builet de la Gare des Eaux-Vives, whose operator is Mr. Charles Landolf, a chef specialized in Oriental dishes. It is a small restairant just as renormed and with a clientele which is just as cosmopolitan (as the above beer garden). Regrettably enough, the book of table reconvertess from April 4 to April 30, 1030, has been destroyed. In this

restaurant, the customers are waited on by waitresses and there is neither a first-class chef nor a maitre d'hotel. However, the owner, wearing a chef's apron, remembers having been kissed several times by unknown females pleased with his cuisine.

Mr. Landolt made it clear that he had never had any exotic dishes brought into his place from the outside. Quite the opposite is true. People come to him to get them there because this is his specialty.

In short, with the information available to us, it has not been possible to establish the identity of the unknown American subject.

A search of our hotel reservation card file for the name James Earl Ray, his known aliases and the name Raymon George Sneyd or Sneyda has yielded no results. Even so, we wish to point out that from April 2 to April 4, 1968, the Hotel Intercontinental had a guest named:

James Cyril O'Connor

Born: in Ceylon, Canada,
Residing at 180 Iowa Street, Ottawa,

stating he had arrived from London, passport number SP-21440.

I wish to recall that on April 30, 1988, Inspector Marchesi of the Federal Police informed our services that an American woman thought she had seen James Earl Ray in the company of another American woman on Saturday, April 27, 1968, at 2:00 p.m., in the Restaurant Movenpick, in Geneva. The inquiries made there yielded no results and no concrete element was picked up.

Mr. James Earl Ray is listed on the MSP 1967, page 938, item 7-4517, an arrest warrant has been issued against him, the charge is assault with a deadly weapon and suspicion of assassination committed in the United States. Prior to this listing, the subject had never been involved in cases handled by our services.

Legat, London has learned from New Scotland Yard that it has been determined that Ray under the name Ramon George Sneyd, stayed at the Heathfield House Hotel, 181 - 163 Crownell Road, London, 5/17-28/68, the puriod previously unaccounted for relative to Ray's activities in England.

The proprietress of the Monthfield House Motel Ers. Deris Catherine Vestwood, Edvised that sometime after May checked out on \$/38/68, her husband deposited three \$10 American Express checks to their account at their bank. Neither she nor her husband can specifically recall but believe there is a possibility that these travelers checks could have been received from Ray.

It is not known whether it is possible for American Express, New York to check for any checks issued to Ray under the name Ramon George Encyd without the check numbers, however, if it can be done, New York appropriately handle.

Photograph #1 depicts the doorway and the video camera setup that all visitors to courtroom must go by before being permitted to enter. Prior to being photographed and a permanent record made of photograph and voice, all visitors have been searched before coming through this door. A pass has been issued at this point to all visitors and a permanent written record made of this pass.

Photograph #2 is taken from the center of the Shelby County Courthouse and the table visible top center in rear of hall is the table on which the recording equipment mentioned in Photograph #1 is located. Visitors will walk down this corridor, down the stairs, and into the center of the lobby.

Photograph #3 discloses the approximate center of the lobby. The man to the left is ROBERT K. DWYER, Assistant Attorney General, the man in the center shaking hands is the Attorney General, PHIL CANALE, and the person to the right is Sheriff WILLIAM N. MORRIS, JR.

Photograph #4 is the corridor off the main lobby where all visitors and people entering the courtroom turn right

The Legal Attache in London has obtained information from a highly confidential source that subject James Earl Ray while incarcerated in a British prison, using the name of Ramon G. Sneyd, sent a letter to Mr. J. B. Stoner, Attorney-at-Law, Savannah, Georgia. This letter, dated 7/4/68, in essence stated that subject Ray was shown a letter written by Stoner concerning a legal fund which Stoner represents, and Ray advises that he has retained Mr. Hanes and would like to get his advice before he takes any action.

The letter continues by advising that Ray appreciates Stoner's offer of assistance.

It is possible that this Stoner is identical to one Jesse B. Stoner, who is Vice President of the National States Rights Party with headquarters in Savannah, Georgia. Stoner has been described as a racial rabble rouser.

In view of Stoner's association with the National States Rights Party, Savannah and Memphis should determine through contact with appropriate sources and informants if Stoner has had any further contact with Ray.

On Tuesday, June 18, 1968, Cpl. J.S. DUNIOP of the R.C.M.P. "O" Division, Toronto. Ontario, contacted the Laundry and Dry Cleaning identification examiner of this branch in regard to attempting to identify a Laundry mark which appeared on a shirt collar. The mark was described as an encircled C over the digits 24, and when records search had been completed, appeared to be of the type employed by personnel of Community Cleaners, 789 Dundas Street West, Toronto, Ontario.

Subsequently, Sgt FULLERTON and Cpl. DUNIDP, R.C.M.P. officers attended this section on Monday, July 8, 1968, producing photographs of two separate laundry marks. One of the photographs related to the mark previously described. The second photograph portrayed the mark EG-C83 which appeared to be on the waist band of a pair of underpants. The investigating officers were of the opinion that a positive identification had been made in regards to Community Cleaners in the case of the shirt and requested that an examination be made of the second mark.

It is my understanding our examiner Mr. C.O. Byrne and the investigating officers are in complete agreement that both marks examined could have been made by personnel of Community Cleaners. I also believe that the investigating officers would like a report on this matter.
