asked them if they had heard of the KENNEDY assassination and the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING. The women said that they had and ETHRIDGE told them that he had been in on these killings so he wasn't afraid to use a gun. Both women stated that he did not indicate which KENNEDY he meant but they assumed that he meant the killing of Senator ROBERT KENNEDY due to the fact ETHRIDGE had told them that he was only 19 years of age.

RACHEL WHITE and BONNIE WHITE advised that they thought that ETHRIDGE was not telling the truth when he informed them that he had killed two policemen and had participated in the assassination of KENNEDY and KING. They stated that they got the feeling that he was attempting to frighten them and at the same time to build up his own ego. ETHRIDGE informed them that he did not kill women but instead planned to leave them in the country, and take their money and the 1967 Chevrolet.

ETHRIDGE made RACHEL WHITE turn off the highway on a road leading to Albion, Washington, and proceed down that road until out of sight of the highway. He then ordered both women out of the vehicle and ordered them to completely undress. RACHEL WHITE stated that as she was undressing she noticed that ETHRIDGE had a gun in his hand and did not have a shirt on, although he had a pair of dark trousers on. After having both women undress, ETHRIDGE ordered them to walk down the road to Albion. The women proceeded down the road until out of sight of the car headlights at which time they hid in a side ditch beside the road. A short time later ETHRIDGE drove past them in the vehicle proceeding toward Albion, Washington. The women then proceeded to a nearby farm house where they obtained clothing and notified the Whitman County Sheriff's Office.

ETHRIDGE was arrested on August 14, 1968, during the early morning hours near Lewiston, Idaho, following a high speed chase from Pullman, Washington.

He said the CID were polite to him at all times and he in no way wished to complain about their activities although he was disturbed by them quite a bit.

Consulate General Durban herewith returns United States Passport issued to Beverley Harcourt Prophet on June 8, 1966, by the Consumer General of the United States of America in Terento. Mr. Prophet remains in possession of U.S. Passport number issued to Beverley Harcourt Prophet on June 1, 1966. sed passport has not been cancelled by the Consulate General as we assume that PPT/LAD will take whatever final action is necessary.

Mr. Prophet applogized for not returning the passport as requested by the Tenestro Condien. He noted it had expired and therefore felt is was unnecessary.

Beverley Harcourt Prophet used the name "John" on other than official government documents for business purposes only. His driver's license - Florida and London - were in his correct name as is his Social Security card. Because people kept mixing Beverley up and thinking he was a she, Mr. Prophet, in his area of business operations, took to using "John". He has not, however, efficially changed his name or officially registered his AKA.

A full report on his travels and use of the name "John" is being sent to the Regional Security Officer, American Embassy, Protoria. It may be noted, however, that Mr. Prophet created no suspicious on the part of the reporting officer.



On 8/25/58 Special Agent CARAWAY Federal Bureau of Narcoties, San Antonio, advised that an informant of his, who has furnished reliable information in the past, heard from an unnamed person the following information:

Three days prior to the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING a man named (FNU) TURNTIDE, who is employed as a supervisor of a construction crew for the Holiday Inn motels, commented to the unnamed individual that TURNTIDE had received a telephone call from Memphis, Tennesses (headquarters of Holiday Inn motels) and thereafter stated that KING would be assassinated in three days. At that time CARAWAY's informant, the unknown man, and TURNTIDE were working on the construction of a Holiday Inn motel in San Antonio, Texas.

TURNTIDE, according to the informant, is presently employed in the construction of a Holiday Inn motel in Chicago, Ill.

On 9/1/68 WILLIAM BRADFORD HUIE, Author, Hartselle, Alabama, was contacted by SAS WILLIAM H. LEE and STEPHEN L. CRABBE at his home in Hartselle upon his request. HUIE requested that this contact be kept in confidence for reasons depicted in the information furnished. He stated as follows:

While JAMES EARL RAY was incarcerated in London, England, he (NUIE) entered into a contract with RAY to write the true account of RAY's activities and background concerning the assassination of Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING. This contract is also of interest to RAY's attorney, ART HANES, insmuch as the cost of the trial, including attorney fees, is dependent upon the commercial success of the contract. HUIE advised that to date he has invested approximately \$20,000 in this venture. He adrised that he is in constant contact with RAY through Attorney HANES in the form of written questions and answers by RAY, which includes names of cities, states, places, maps and individuals contacted by RAY, as well as activities from the date of his escape from prison to his apprehension in England.

He stated that to date he has been refused personal contact with RAY by Judge W. PRESTON BATTLE, Trial Judge, State of Tennessee, Memphis. Also, he highly desires obtaining current non-publicized photographs of RAY of character type rather than mug shots or those depicting RAY in manacles.

He telephone call from Bureau Supervisor RICHARD LONG, General Investigative Division, to Baffalo, 8/24/68, earing which Supervisor LONG advised that highly confidential information had been received indicating that the subject, JAMES RARL RAY, might have been arrested by the Metropolitan Toronto Police Department in Toronto, Ontario, Canada, during June or July, 1967, on a charge of Jayenlking.

of 8/27/68, Inspector RIGHARD GIRSON (NA), Head of the Central Identification Division of the Notropolitan Toronto Police Department (NEPD), was requested to make the necessary record checks to determine whether RAY was, in fact, arrested in Toronto for jaywalking, and in connection with this request, was furnished with all known aliases used by RAY in the past.

On 8/28/68, Inspector GIRSON advised that subject, under his true name and all aliases, and been checked through the Central Identification Bureau, the Records and Inquiry Bureau, and the Letter File of the MTPD; and no information was developed indicating an arrest in Toronto at any time under any of RAT's aliases.

In addition, Inspector GIRSON pointed out that it was not the practice of the MYPD to arrest individuals for jaymalking but that an infrequent occasions, a police officer would issue summonses for this offense. Inspector GIRSON had all available records of the MYPD checked regarding summonses issued for jaymalking and determined that he unanswered summonses were on file for the offense of jaywalking in the City of Toronto during the months of June and July of 1967.

On August 16, 1968, Howard Phillip Ethridge, inmate, Whitman County Jail, Colfax, Washington, stated that on August 13, 1968, he was hitchhiking from Walla Walla, Washington, to Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. Ethridge stated that he was picked up by two girls outside Walla Walla, Washington. He stated that near Colfax, Washington, he produced a gun and threatened the two girls. Ethridge stated that he told the girls that he had killed two policemen and wounded other men and that he had also participated in the assassination of Kennedy and the killing of Martin Luther King. Ethridge stated that he made this comment only as a means of scaring the two girls. He stated that he has never harmed anyone and is definitely not capable of killing anyone. He stated that he has no knowledge of the assassination of Kennedy and Martin Luther King other than what he has seen in newspapers. Ethridge stated that he thought that by making such a statement it would frighten the girls into cooperating with his demands and that he made the statement for no other purpose.
