He's not the kind of man who would kill deliberately himself in the hope of preventing racial change.

RAY may have disliked negroes, with his background it would be remarkable if he did not but certainly this was not his notivation, so I think that he and others were used and were paid by people who wanted to see great trouble in the United States in 1958.

DOWALDSOW - Do you think there was some kind of conspiracy?

LANG - Well, here again, I've had my say on the matter, and, the judge of course, his order covers that sort of thing. The Attorney General of the United States started proclaiming immediately after the slaying of Dr. KING that one can acted alone and I disagreed with him and to that extent, why I'll have to agree with what Mr. HELMEY has told you.

DOMALOSON .. He Heller has a theory as to why Dr. KING was killed and that it was deliberately into to prove all the ricting which subsequently followed.

Whother there's a connection between the assassination of John KEMERDY and the assassination of Hartin Luther KIRG, this remains to be seen, however, I must have had at least fifty telephone calls, at least one or two of them from Canada incidentally, from people who called and sells assassination books who have read all the books and studied all the files including the voluminous Wine Commission Report, they have people in the United States particularly who make a gareer out of it now, at least a vocation out of it. So many of these people have called me telling me that they are positive that there is connections between the two. One man is meeting me in New York with photographs. RAY's description of the character he called RAOUL tho he met in Montreal, and the man who also had a telephora number in New Orleans, this same Latin figure who is perhaps redheaded and perhaps looks blonde if the sun is shining on him in one angle and is about 35 years old This figure also appears in G.H. GARRISON's mythology.

DONALESON - C.H. CAPRISON, the D.A. and ---

HEMEY - And the District Attorney in New Orleans who has worked so hard to prove that the assessination of John REMERY was a New Orleans based consultacy. Now contains

if appears from what I know now that the assessination of Martin Luther KING was largely Louisagna based. I think MAY was discovered in Montreal but certainly there must be a good deal of criminal contact between Montreal and New Orleans or these people who visit Montreal, some of them also visit New Orleans and so this remains to be seen but you know, in conspiracies where there are four or more people like - A, B, C and D - "D" frequently does not know the identity of BAN and BD" - he only knows "C" and in order to unravel the conspiracy you then have to get "G" and "C" certainly knows who "B" is and this is the way conspiracies have to be unravelled. This is why I think that it may be some time before we know everything about the assassination of Martin Luther KING.

DOMALDSON - Do you think RACUL is going to turn up eventually?

HEWEY - I think somebody very much like NACUL will be arrested one of these days and before too long.

DONALDSON - In connection with the assassination?

The connection with the assassination of Martin Luther KING. I think certainly James Mark RAY knows the identity of at least one other man and perhaps two other men in the plot end I believe that before long the identities of those people, the public will become aware of them.

DUNALDSON . Tell me hr. HEALY, why did RAY decide to tell his

HENEY

RAY, like many criminals, yearns for some form of recognition. His life has been a miserable one and so he yearns for recognition, moreover, in my view from all that he's written me . the many thousands of words hats written to me, I have the feeling that he wanted recognition as a criminal. Several times in his writing he told me for instance that he had to get the plastic surgery because he anticipated that at any moment the F.B.I. would put him on the top ten, meaning the ten most wanted criminals, and, for those of us who have studied RAY's record this seems rather strange because RAY isn't - before the nurder of Dr. KING . RAY had never seemed to qualify for the top ten in the criminal hierarchy and so - but yet he seemed to anticipate that he would be and almost you can feel that he wants to be on the top ten and certainly he's a man that as I've written, his rather impassive countenance lights up, he chuckles or seathing only when he's told about how he has left a false clue somewhere and the idea of F.B.I. agents or Canadian Mounted Police chasing down alleys on felse leads is the only thing that he really chuckles about, you see. this faccinates him. So he thinks of life as himself against the police. That's the game that he playe and he wants to excel at it.

DOMALDSON - What does he think is going to happen to him now?

HEMEY ... What d I think is going to happe to him not?

DOMALDSON - What does he think - with possible electrocution after all?

HELEY

Well I think its been written somewhere that every man has to believe in the fantasies that make life possible so I assume that RAY still has cortain beliefs that, first . there are enough people in Tennessee, in Memphis, Tennessee, the approve of the death of Martin Luther KTMG, that he either might be freed or that there might be a mis-trial, so I would imagine that he believes this and other than that I think that he yearns for, you know, I just thought of it a long time ago that life is a constant effort to feel superior and this is even true of criminals and the little men who have spent many years of their lives behind bars, they still have that some yearning and so certainly other criminals have folk this and this may be part of the explanation of RAY. The hypnotist in California whom I talked to at great length, said that certainly RAY belonged to this type of husan being, the type of husan being who had you know, a terrible yearning to excel in some ways.

It might be of interest to mention that a reservation was made for GALT on the 27 JUL 68 by the P.LAWSON TRAVEL Ltd agency, 2055 Peel st, Suite 802, Montreal Que, clerk A.L. ADAM - Reservation slip number 10946 M was received at the Grey Rocks Inn along with a deposit of \$20.00.

Kindly note that an average of 4,000 clients a year attend the Grey Rocks Inn; therefore it is assumed by Mr EARLE and the writer that the clerk whom attended to the registration of GALT at this hotel does not remember him.

5. Photostat copies of the registration card and the note of GALT were obtained and are attached hereto for your perusal and information.

1. Further to memorandum of the A/Officer i/c 0.I.B. with appended correspondence dated in Montreal 15 MOV 68, the following is to be reported.

19 NOV 68

- Mr. RITCHIE of the Mariner's House was re-interviewed 2. in this respect and could not offer any further information concerning RAY's possible visit there or on his possible association with one RAGUL. It was established that Mr. RITCHIE had during the latter part of October 1968 or beginning of November 1968, received the visit of three (3) Canadian newspapermen. These men were all English-speaking and represented a Montreal newspaper. They exhibited to RITCHIE two (2) photographs of RAY, one with RAY wearing glasses and the other without glasses. No pictures of a man reported to be RAOUL were shown to RITCHIE and no mention was made of the named RAOUL. The purpose of the newspapermen's visit has been to establish whether or not Mr. AITCHIE could confirm the fact that RAY had frequented the Mariner's House. RITCHIE further added that this visit had been very brief because he was mad and he did not want to speak about the RAY affair with newspapermen as he was somewhat put out due to the publicity given the Mariner's House. As the interview with the newspapermen had been very brief, RITCHIE stated he could not recall the description of the newspapermen or the name of the newspaper they had stated representing.
- A check of M.C.P. records has established that during the Summer of 1967, various body houses had been in operation and raided by police in the general area of the 1400 Ste-Catherine East. Their records do not however show any reported theft in the proximity of \$800.00 in that area, with a complaint originating from abandy house.
- Mrs. Joanne LEMOING, present caretaker and rental clerk at the Harkey Apartments, was interviewed in a view of establishing if she had recently be in contact with newspaper reporters in respect to RAY having resided at the apartment during 1967. She replied in the affirmative, adding that on or about 3 NOV 68, two (2) young men who had identified themselves as reporters of the Montreal Star, had approached her in this regard. Mrs. LEMOING could not supply any description of the two (2) men.
- Further to the memorandum from the A/Officer i/c 0.I.B. dated in Montreal on the 31 00T 68, the operators of the only two (2) parking concessions in the area of the Harkey Apartments were again

Persons interviewed again stated that in 1967, a large amount of vehicles bearing many different types of registration plates had made use of their

parking facilities and that no records had been kept by them.

- As per the attached photostat copies of the articles which appeared in LOOK magazine (Article 12 NOV 68, page 103), the red Plymouth is described as a 1962 model which RAY claims having purchased in St. Louis, Missouri; (Article 26 NOV 68, page 87) indicates that RAY sold this car in Chicago, Ill., while en route to Birmingham.
- 7. Further to paragraph 4 of PCR dated 15 NOV 68, Michel BACON, 3685 Berri, Apt. 107, Montreal, P.Q., telephone 843-3397, was interviewed with negative results.

Further to paragraph 9 of PCR dated 15 NOV 68, additional enquiries conducted at English & Scotch Woolen Co. Ltd, 1248 Ste-Catherine West, met with negative results as this firm had not been contacted by any reporters. You will note that in the article appearing in LOOK magazine, the name of this firm does not appear.

- Enquiries conducted at Tip Top Tailors, 488 Ste-Catherine West, Montreal, in speaking with the Manager, Mr. A. CHEVARIE, revealed that approximately three (3) weeks ago, he had been contacted by a newspaper reporter of the Montreal Star. This reporter wanted information on RAY and about the mgm who had visited the Tip Top store with clothing and a suitcase. Mr. CHEVARIE had declined to make any comment to the newspaper reporter in this respect; he was however exhibited two (2) pictures of RAY, one with RAY wearing glasses and the other without. The reporter was described as having fair hair, height 5'9" to 5'10". An interesting aspect of this reporter's enquiry is that on the 19 OCT 68, Mr. CHEVARIE and one of his clerks were interviewed by the writer in the company of Robert K. DWYER of the Attorney General Department, State of Tennessee. During this interview, Mr. DWYER's party had in their possession the suit which RAY had purchased at that store, reference: our PCR dated 21 OCT 68.
- Further to paragraph 2 (b) of PCR dated 21 OCT 68, the Mr. FEIGAN who was interviewed by Mr. DWYER was mentioned as having the first name Louis. It will be noted that the first name of the Mr. FEIGAN interviewed this time, was Eddy who is now operating English & Scotch Woolen Co. Ltd, since the death of his father, Louis, at the end of August 1968.
- Il. Enquiries conducted have failed to either locate or identify the person known as RACUL. Bearing in mind Jean-Marie CHARRON's statement, reference: paragraph 5 PCR dated 15 NOV 68, to the effect

all business establishments mentioned in HUIE's article appearing in LOOK magazine dated 12 NOV 68, had been contacted by persons identifying themselves as newspaper reporters. On two instances, the persons contacted definitely recall that they had been approached by a person identifying himself as a pepresentative of the Montreal Star. No mention of a person or exhibition of a photograph alleged to be RACUL was however made during these interviews. Again having reference to HUIE's article in LOOK magazine on the 12 NOV 68, on page 104 where HUIE makes mention that he flew to Montreal on 14 SEPT 68 to try to confirm RAY's story, this can be confirmed as during the course of a previous interview with Mrs. LEMOING by the writer on the 19 OCT 68, she had made mention that a few weeks prior to our visit, she had received a visit from someone whom she believed to be a reporter and that this person had asked her to see the lease that RAY had signed at the Harkey Apartments. Mrs. LEMOING informed me that at the time she had attempted to locate documentation respecting to RAY's rental but that she had not been successful in doing so. Please note that this documentation had been in our hands since the outset of this investigation in the Montreal area prior to Mrs. LEMOING having become an employee at the Harkey Apartments.

- nention that a year and seven (7) weeks later after Honday, 31 JUL 67, he HUIE, proceeded to the Gray Rocks Inn in the company of a French-speaking detective and a photographer named Jim HANSEN of LOOK magazine. In the same section, HUIE makes mention he interviewed a Canadian Government female employee in Ottawa during the same period. It is further confirmed in Ottawa G.I.S. report dated 16 CCT 68 where Mrs. KEATING mentions that she had been interviewed approximately one month prior to the 15 CCT 68 by HUIE.
 - In view of the above, your further instructions will be awaited prior to approaching reporters of the Montreal Star in a view of ascertaining if they interviewed CHARRON at the Neptune Tavern and if so, exhibited to CHARRON a picture of a man whom they identified as RAOUL.
- From perusal of HUIE's article in LOOK magazine 12 NOV 68, it is presumed by the writer that HUIE is an author maintaining residence in the U.S.A. and it is thus suggested that the F.B.I. contact HUIE with a view of determining if he was in the Montreal area during the latter part of October or early part of November 1968, and if he, or someone of his party, interviewed CHARRON using a photograph whom they identified as RAOUL.

- As noted in this report we have been unable to date to identify the would-be newspapermen who exhibited photographs of both Ray and "Raoul" to Mr. Charron, owner of the Meptune Tavern in Montreal. Furthermore, we have been unable to establish whether or not these are the same people who visited Mr. Ritchie of the Mariner's House, Mrs. Lemoing of Markey Apartments of Mr. Chevarie of Tip Top Tailors. We have also been unable to ascertain in what manner the supposed newspaperman learned that someone had visited the Tip Top Tailor Establishment as outlined in para. 9 above.
- 6. Perhaps, further investigation by the F.b.I. if this has not already been done would be warranted and would clarify this matter as suggested in paras. 14 and 15 above.
- 7. Copy of Look Magazine article on this matter issue dated 26-11-66 has been obtained at this point and was perused, however, same does not appear to contain any investigative leads which would be helmful to us. In

- Discreet enquiries made in the Windsor area with local contacts and with Department of Customs & Immigration officials with a view to determining if in fact RAY and/or the vehicle in question may have been noted in the area or made trips across the border to Detroit, met with negative results. Neither RAY nor the alledged vehicle were noted in this area.
- In addition to the aforementioned checks a check of all traffic infractions occurring within the City Of Windsor was made through the Windsor City Police Department. Traffic Division, in the event this alledged vehicle was issued with any form of a traffic ticket; however, this enquiry also met with negative results.
- In view of the fact that the Port of Windsor is one of the busiest Ports in Canada, with literally thousands of vehicle crossing the border per day, it is impossible to either confirm or refute the statements made by RAY. In view of this fact, and unless otherwise instructed, this file will be considered concluded at this detachment.

RAYNS, as per the attached photostat copies of the Montreal Star newspaper article in question, it will be noted that the Bourgade Motel registration card indicates that, at the time, RAY was driving a 1962 Plymouth with Illinois licence plates. From TAYLOR, it was also learned that the former owner of the Bourgade Motel, Faul RICHEAL was presently residing at 133 Vallée Street, Valleyfield, Quebec, and that RICHEAL still has in his possession the motel registration card concerned which he is keeping as a souvenir.
- 8. Unless the motel registration card signed by RAY is required as evidence, interview of RICHER is not contemplated at this point as earlier investigation has revealed that RAY was definitely in the Montreal area during the course of the year 1967.
- Through interview of TAYLOR, it is apparent that the newspapermen who interviewed CHARLON (ref: paragraphs 5 and 6 of our PCR dated 15 NOV 68) were representing the Montreal Star as TAYLOR made mention that CHARLON had been contacted a day or two, possibly three) prior to the article being published in the Star.

James Earl Ray, accused of assassinating Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., practised double deception during his month long hide-out in the Montreal area last year.

He registered in a Dorion motel as John L. Rayns on the night of July 17, 1967, but used the alias Eric S. Galt for the remainder of his local sojourn which ended on Aug. 18, 1967.

Ray claimed in a recently published story in Look magazine about his activities here that he used only the Galt name while in Canada.

He said he chose the name while passing the city of Galt, Ont., on his way to Montreal and used it during visits to St. Jovite and Ottawa.

The 40-year-old alleged killer, whose trial is sched-uled in Memphis, Tenn., for the middle of November, arrived in Dorion just one day after he fled the United States where he was sought for es-caping from the Missouri State Penitentiary.

The records of the Bourgarde Motel show that he

J. M. Charron, owner of the Neptune for the past several years, said it would be almost impossible to disaprove Ray's claim.

Peering at a recent photograph of Ray, Mr. Charron commented, "It could be that he was here. Who is going to say otherwise?

"I might have seen him and maybe even talked to him but it has been a year and two months since he was here. It is very, very difficult to say from pictures. They can be deceiving. And maybe he was wearing a disguise.

"Perhaps if I saw him in


Ray's romantic adventure with his civil servant girl friend who he had hoped would help get him a false Canadian passport, was probably the only close relationship he had in Montreal.







Information set forth below covers investigation conducted at Acapulco, Guerrero, Mexico and Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico, pertaining to activities of captioned individual who, as FRIC S. GALT, visited Mexico during October and November, 1967.

AT ACAPULCO, GUERRERO

On November 11, 1968, a confidential source abroad advised that on that date LUIS LUNA DEL CASTILLO, Desk Clerk, Hotel Fan Francisco. 92 Miguel Aleman, made available records which showed that ERIC S. GALT registered at that hotel, alone, on October 10, 1967. He occupied Room 202 at the rate of 75 pesos (\$6 U.S.) per day. He listed his nationality as "U.S." and his home address as "Alabama". LUIS LUNA stated that he had no recollection of this individual.

This same source advised that on November 11, 1968, Mrs. ROSARIO DEL CASTILLO, owner of Hotel San Francisco, stated that she had been in contact with the accountant for the hotel in an effort to locate the actual registration card for GALT. This card, she said, would list the guest's home address and the description of his automobile and would also bear his signature. She said the accountant was unable to locate the card and that it was believed to have been destroyed.

Mrs. DEL CASTILLO also stated that she had spoken with several of the hotel employees and that none of them were able to recognize photographs of JAMES EARL RAY. She also made available her copy for October 10, 1967, of a report made daily to the Mexican Government, which lists subject's arrival on that date.

The source also advised on November 11, 1968, that a thorough review had been made of the hotel's guest list for October, 1967, and that there was no guest listed with the name of 'RAOUL' or any similar name.

On November 21, 1968, a second confidential source abroad advised that efforts had been made to find a registration for ERIC S. GALT in other hotels and motels in Acapulco but that these efforts had been unsuccessful to date. This source pointed out that few hotels in Acapulco have an orderly method or system of record-keeping and that it is usually impossible to establish with certainty, from records, that a particular individual has been a guest in one of these hotels.

On December 11, 1968, the second source reported that hotels and motels in Acapulco are required to make daily reports to the Federal Office of Tourism listing their guests, as well as arrival and departure dates. An official of this office advised the source that a check had been made of all records available to him for the month of October, 1967, and that no listing was found for GALT or the other names used by him in the reports furnished by any hotel or motel for the month of October, 1967. This official acknowledged, however, that these reports were probably not complete for 1967, since the office had recently changed its location and there was still not room for all the files and records which should be maintained by this agency.

The source also advised on December 11, 1968, that inquiries had been made throughout the tourist zone of Acapulco and also in the houses of prostitution and that no one was located who could remember subject from his photographs.

AT GUADALAJARA, JALISCO

On November 13, 1968, a third confidential source abroad advised that records of the Pancho-Villa Motel, Avenida Revolucion 1867, had been checked on that date. They showed that FRIC S. GALT registered there on October 15, 1967, alone, and occupied Room 3. He listed himself as a U.S. citizen with address 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama, and his occupation as "employed by publisher". The source said that there was no time of departure shown in the records. GALT paid 40 pesos (\$3.20 U.S.) for the room. The source also found a second registration card for "ERIC S. GOLT, 26-08 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama" showing a registration on October 18, 1967. Again, there was no departure date shown for this registration.

JAMES EARL RAY. Aka

This source determined that the girl who worked as a maid during that period was CARMEN IBARRA OCHOA. She was interviewed and said that she remembered nothing about the subject. The source advised that the doorman during that period, GEEGORIO DEL REAL ROMERO, was no longer employed by the Lotel.

On November 15, 1968, the third source advised that the owner of the Pancho Villa Motel, ELPIDIO VELAZQUEZ, had returned to Guadalajara after being out of the city for several days. VELAZQUEZ stated that he could not recall the subject or recognize his picture. Mrs. VELAZQUEZ, the owner's wife, stated that she recalled subject from a photograph with sunglasses which was taken in Mexico in 1967. She said, however, that he did not wear glasses while at the motel. She remembered that he had a car but could not describe it.

Mrs. VELAZQUEZ said that when subject arrived at the motel he was complaining of a toothache. She said she recommended a doctor. The next day she became concerned when he did not come out of his room and she rapped on his door. He answered that he was all right and was about to check out. She stated that he must have done so before 2 p.m., October 16, 1967, because he was not charged for another day. She stated that he arrived at the motel again on the morning of October 18, 1967, and departed before 2 p.m. on October 19, 1967. She recalled that he was alone at the motel on both occasions. She said she did not recall his luggage but that he wore a white sport shirt with short sleeves and brown trousers.

The third source reported that he interviewed Dr. OSCAR GOMEZ PALOFOX, Madero 975, on November 15, 1968. Dr. PALOFOX stated that he recalled a house call which he made to the Pancho Villa Motel but he could not recognize subject's photograph. He said that the man he treated had an abscessed molar and that he had injected tetrafinicol, a penicillin-type drug, to kill the infection. He recommended to the patient that he go to the Hospital Militar and ask them to recommend a dentist. He said that he made this call to the motel at about 1 or 2 p.m. on October 15, 1967.

On November 17, 1968, the third source advised that he had learned that the former doorman of the Pancho Villa Motel had reportedly returned to his home village of Valparaiso, Zacatecas. On November 24, 1968, the source advised that he had tried to locate GREGORIO DEL REAL ROMERO in Valparaiso,

Zacatecas, but had determined that DEL REAL has not been seen there for several months. His relatives told the source that they believed he had gone to the United States to seek employment but that they did not know how he could be contacted.

MEXICAN GOVERNMENT RECORDS

On November 11, 1968, a fourth confidential source abroad advised that an official of the Inspection Service of Mexican Immigration in Mexico City had advised that border crossing records are maintained permanently on file in Mexico City. He said that these records had been exhaustively searched in April, 1968, without locating information to confirm the departure of ERIC STARVO GALT from Mexico. He did find a record that GALT entered Mexico on October 7, 1967, at Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, and was issued tourist card #7475449. He stated that a further review of records, during November, 1968, still failed to locate information establishing that GALT or JOHN L. RAYNS departed Mexico at Tijuana, Baja California, in November, 1967.

On November 18, 1968, a fifth confidential source abroad advised that an official of the Mexican Federal Automobile Registration Bureau had stated on that date that the temporary permit issued to GALT's car at Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, in October, 1967, had been cancelled, indicating that the car had left Mexico. This official said that he was directing a communication to the Chief of Mexican Customs at Tijuana, Baja California, requesting certification as to the departure of the car from Mexico and the date.

On December 18, 1968, the fifth source advised that the same official stated on that date that he had still not received confirmation from the border concerning the departure from Mexico of the 1966 Mustang which GALT was driving when he entered Mexico on October 7, 1967.

JAMES EARL RAY

Henry Stumm, 2703 North Street, Alton, Illinois, was interviewed on January 8, 1969 by Special Agents Donald E. Stukey, II and Robert C. Haines.

Mr. Stumm stated that he worked at the Leather Tannery in Hartford, Illinois operated by the Brown Shoe Company of St. Louis, Missouri for close to thirty years. He stated that during that period of time he met a great many employees, however. he does not specifically recall ever having met James Earl Ray. He stated that he had been contacted by newspapers and magazine writers as well as novelists who are interested in developing information concerning James Earl Ray, however, he stated that he has not entertained them nor does he intend to entertain them in any way. He stated that their contacts with him and allegations made by them concerning his association with James Earl Ray have upset him to the point where he is close to a nervous breakdown. He stated that in order to preclude any further physical upset to him, he has engaged an attorney whom he identified as Ralph Smith of Alton, Illinois, to represent him in any matters arising from this case.

been made to his knowledge concerning his acquaintance or alleged acquaintance with James Earl Ray. He said that some of the news media contacting him have suggested that he, Stumm, during World War II, was sympathetic to Germany and constantly preached Nazi philosophy and further suggested that he gave James Earl Ray a copy of Adolph Hilter's book, Mein Kampf. He also stated that another suggestion to him was that he had met frequently in a cafe in Alton with James Earl Ray and had discussed Nazi philosophy "in a hushed manner".

Mr. Stumm stated that both of these allegations were completely false; that he has never owned a copy of Mein Kampf and that he never frequented any cafe in Alton.

He went on to say that during the period of time he worked at the tannery in Hartford, Illinois, he went back and

forth to work with Ted Fensterman and Albert Kolk, both of whom lived in his neighborhood in Alton. He said that he has never owned or driven a motor vehicle and does not know how to drive a motor vehicle. He said, however, that both Fensterman and Kolk did drive and alternated driving their cars to work. He said they were kind enough to drive him with them and it was their routine to come straight home after work.

Mr. Stumm concluded by stating that he entered the United States from Germany in 1928 and became a citizen in 1936. He said that he is proud to be an American citizen and has always maintained a pro-American attitude with regard to politics. He stated that his work record and his neighbors would vouch for him in this regard.

Further enquiries made at the Gray Rocks Inn of Lake Oulmet, St. Jovite Que revealed that there is no record of an alledged long distance telephone call made from the room occupied by RAY aka GALT during his being at this hotel. Although two public telephone booths are available to clients and which correspond to numbers: 425-9038 & 425-9076. I was informed by a representative of the Bell Telephone Company that no records are kept from calls made from such booths. Therefore it is felt that the long distance call to a Montreal Road Hotel in Ottawa could have been made from one of these public pay phones or that the charges would have been reversed.



KUTA, Chief, Medical Records Library, VA Hospital, Cleveland, Ohio, advised that BEVEL was admitted to the VA Hospital on 7-1-68, for mixed nucrosis with depressive reaction and hysterical disassociative reactions. He was treated in the Psychiatric Ward by Dr. JEAN BERGGREN, Psychiatry Resident, who has subsequently resigned and is now employed at the Hanna Pavilion, Cleveland, Ohio. VICTOR BEVEL during treatment stated that on numerous occasions he had contemplated suicide by various means. He was discharged from the VA Hospital on 10-18-68, and has had follow-up visits on 10/24 and 31/68.

Mr. KUTA stated that the file revealed that VICTOR BEVEL had a brother, Reverend JAMES BEVEL, who was associated with the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC).

On 1-22-69, Captain WILBUR W. HONN, Plant Protection Officer, Jones and Laughlin Steel Corporation, 3341 Jennings Road, Cleveland, Ohio, advised as follows:
