INFORMATION CONCERNING

On January 25, 1969, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Washington, D. C., received a telegram from R. M. Gaines, 2005 Arena Place, Nashville, Tennessee, which stated "Discrimination against black people of Nashville by telephone operators and Busby's Motors of Nashville."

At 7:10 A.M. on January 23, 1969, R. M. Gaines, 2006 Arena Place, Nashville, Tennessee, telephonically contacted the Federal Bureau of Investigation at Washington, D. C., and stated he was investigating the death of Dr. Martin Luther King. He stated he had evidence and photographs to support his conclusion that King had not been killed by a white man. Gaines said he could be located at 1055 College Street, Memphis, Tennessee. He said he is employed by the Kahalia Jackson Chicken System, 705 South Parkway East, Memphis, Tennessee.

On January 23, 1969, Mr. Harold Jones, Executive Vice-President, Mahalia Jackson Chicken System, Memphis, Tennessee, advised that Robert Gaines has been employed by that company since about August, 1963, and that because of Gaines' drinking problem he has been on a leave of absence since January 19, 1969, at which time Gaines became intexicated and began to annoy other officers in the company with his telephone calls.

RE: UNKNOWN SUBJECT; Telephone Operators, Etc.

On January 28, 1969, Gaines was located at 1056 College Street, Memphis, by a Special Agent of the FBI. Gaines was found holding a half empty bottle of whiskey and gave every indication of being highly intoxicated. He was sufficiently coherent to deny having any evidence concerning the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King.

Records of Central State Eospital, Nashville, Tennessee, reflect that Robert Gaines entered that hospital on October 24, 1966, having been brought to the hospital by Nashville Police after he had fired a gun through the roof of his home. He was diagnosed as having an acute schizophrenic reaction, paranoid type, and he was found to be suffering from chronic alcoholism. He was granted a thirty day furlough from the hospital on January 6, 1968, but never returned to the hospital.

ASSASSINATION OF DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. AT MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE APRIL 4, 1968

The January 29, 1969, edition of "The Washington Post" newspaper contained an article which quoted Rev. Ralph David Abernathy, President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, as indicating in a news conference that a conspiracy exists with regard to the assassiantion of Dr. Eartin Luther King, Jr.

On January 30, 1969, Rev. Abernathy was interviewed by a Special Agent of the FBI at Atlanta, Georgia, and the results are set forth on the following page:

Rev. RALPH DAVID ABERNATHY, President of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, 330 Auburn Avenue, N. E., Atlanta, Georgia, telephonically advised with regards to his statement to the press, which was quoted in "The Washington" Post" newspaper, Washington, D. C., on January 29, 1969, that what he told the press was that he believed in view of the assassiantions of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, ROBERT F. KENNEDY, MEDGAR EVERS and MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., there would be an indication to him that there may be a conspiracy among the forces of evil to do away with any young militant who-stands for righteousness. Rev. ABERNATHY advised that he has no specific information or other evidence that a conspiracy exists with respect to the specific assassination of Dr. KING. He advised that the statement made to the press on January 29, 1969, in which he referred to a conspiracy concerned the assassination of all of the above-mentioned persons. In regard to those assassinations he made it clear he has no evidence indicating a conspiracy and it is only his belief or fear on his part that such a conspiracy does exist. He stated he has no idea what individuals or forces would be involved in such a conspiracy.

Rev. ABERNATHY advised that several months ago Rev. JAMES LAWSON, Minister of the Centenary Methodist Church at Memphis, Tonnessee, told him, Rev. APERNATHY, that it was Rev. LAWSON's understanding that the day before the assassination of Dr. KING, two Negro firemen, who had been assigned to the fire station across the street from the motel where Dr. KING was killed, were moved to another fire station. According to Rev. LAWSON that move left the fire station unmanned and they were moved to a station which was already fully manned and equipped. Also according to Rev. LAWSON, a Negro policeman, who worked the beat which included the motel where Dr. KING was killed, was moved off of that beat the G. a.y Dr. KING was killed, April 4, 1968, but prior to the killing.

#### RECOMMENDATION FOR COMMENDATION

On 2/17/69, I had occasion to meet with District Attorney General PHIL M. CANALE, Shelby County, Memphis, Tennessee. As the Bureau knows, CANALE is the Chief Prosecutor who will handle the prosecution of JAMES EARL RAY. CANALE told me that he and all members of his staff were greatly impressed by the exhibit prepared by the Bureau for the forthcoming trial. CANALE said that in his many years in the Attorney General's Office he had never seen an exhibit of the quality and caliber of the exhibits prepared by the FBI in this case. He stated the availability of an exhibit of this high quality would in his opinion greatly implement the excellent investigation conducted by the FBI in this case. He advised me that he intends to write a personal letter to the Director thanking him for the excellent exhibit made available to his office.

In view of the comments of Attorney General CANALE and the excellent reception the exhibits prepared in this case received, which are, of course, a credit to the FBI, it is being recommended that SA JOHN P. DUNPHY and his associates who helped prepare these exhibits be commended.

Dear Director Mr. John Edgar Hoover (The Federal Bureau of Investigation):

I write this letter to you Mr. Hoover because I am certain that the accused: James Earl Raye is not the man who used a rifle to shoot (Dr.) Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr.,; but that it was rather a full brother of his a multiple birth who used a rifle to shoot the Late Martin Luther King Jr., which shooting resulted in Mr. King's death.

I think that "Mrs. King" was expecting a baby at the time of the shooting and that the father (physical) was the man who used the rifle to shoot The Late Mr. King Jr. (Dr. Rev. Martin Luther King Jr.) (who was an adopted son.)

It is possible to suppose that "Mrs. King." told the Late Martin Luther King Jr., to go out on the portch (second floor portch) where he was standing when he was shot.

"Mrs. King," wife of the Late (Dr.) Rev. Martin Luther King Jr., lived in (the city of) St. Thomas, Ontario, Canada, for a time; with the name "Verna Pearson," ----- she was a portrait painter and she had some of her paintings shown in a display of Art, at The St. Thomas Public Library on Mondamin Street, in the city of St. Thomas, Ontario, Canada. at that time her "(Mrs. Fearson's") address was 52 Hincks Street, St. Thomas, Ontario, Canada.

The father of the baby (an adopted brother) is shown in one of the two newspaper clippings enclosed.

The mother of the baby ("Mrs. King") is shown in the other clipping.

I write this true letter with hope that if not otherwise possible to do so it may save the life of an innocent man in this instance.

In his letter of May, 1960, he furnished information which could have been a violation within the jurisdiction of the Post Office Department. We forwarded this letter to the postal authorities for appropriate handling.

Logat Ottawn should request the RCMP to interview Claire Heating concerning the statements allegedly made to her by Ray regarding his anti-Hegro sentiments. Logat Ottawn should also request the RCMP to ascertain the villingness of her to come to Hemphis and testify. Page 2 - Report from Agent 501 for January 21,22,23,24,25,26,27, 1969

On Tuesday, January 21, 1969 those present at 271 Vance were at approximately 7:20 PM were KING JEWELL (ROBBET IN BURNES JR.) MAURING MACK CHARLES HARDIN (N.C. PEPPER) MARRELL McCULLOUGH, JOHN CHARLES PIGFORD and ROY TURKS. It was learned that KING JEWELL has asked Do to take him to John Guston Hospital because a male colored "JAY BIRD shot by two or three people who had passed by him in a car. At approximately a specific property of the secure of the companies of the said that they were driving a 65 Chevrolet and one of the occupants stepped from the car and shot JAYBIRD in the 'eg with what was thought to be a shotgun.

At approximately 8:30 PM both of the BURNS and DONALD PIGFORD left John Gaston Hospital and were followed to 271 Vance. At approximately 9:45 PM LEWIS WELCH, CHIQUITA SMITH, MELVIN SMITH, EDDIE TATE or MORRIS, ROBERT WILSON and SHIRLEY YOUNG arrived at 271 Vance. They were saying that they had attended a meeting with JTM LAWSON and RALPH JACKSON. Place of meeting is unknown. LEWS WELCH stated, we have been to a meeting with LAWSON and JACKSON. They want us to provide security for the march they are having. MELVIN SMITH then stated, I think we should ask them to march down to the jail with us, since they want us to support them. If they don't want to do that, then we should not march with them. Also I don't think they should be allowed to speak if we cannot speak. We should be allowed to speak so we can tell the people our side of the story at the Lorraine Motel and at the Peabody. If they don't let us speak, then we should do egerything we can to prevent them from speaking and disrupt the march and try to get some of those big shots moved. WELCH stated again, I disagree. I think we should go along with them and do as they want us to if we are going to get some money from those church people. They may be trying us just to see if we are unified. MELVIN SMETH then said, we should do what I have said as a means of getting the money. We should let them know how we feel about them. If necessary we should meet with LAWSON and JACKSON before the march and let them know what we are going to do. WELCH then stated, we will have a meeting with them and let them know what is happening.

At 12:30 PM JOHN CHARLES SMITH, MAURICE LEWIS, TOM DAVIS, DONALD PIGFORD and CHIQUITA SMITH left 271 Vance and went home.

It was learned that CHIQUITA SMITH had asked DONALD PIGFORD about the shooting earlier in the night. CHIQUITA was saying that KING JEWELL's wife, unknown whether senior or junior's wife, had told CHIQUITA that she was there with them and that Jaybird was in the ear with the male coloreds and loaded the shotgun that belongs to one of the JEWELLS and when he (Jaybird) stepped from the ear, the gun went off and shot him in the leg.

On Wednesday, January 22, 1950 at approximately 4:30 PM DONALD PIGFORD was observed to pick up CHIQUITA SMITH at her home and proceed to the Minimum Salary Bldg. at 280 Hernando to use a mimeograph machine to print some literature. It was learned that CHIQUITA and DONALD printed approximately 2500 copies of the literature pertaining to the fast of SWEET WILLIE WINE, a copy of which is attached to our files.

At approximately 6:45 PM CHIQUITA and DONALD left the Minimum Salary Bldg. and were followed to 271 Vance.

Those present when they arrived at 271 Vance were: LEWIS WELCH, MELVIN SMITH, ROY TURKS, JOHN C. SMITH, MAURICE LEWIS, ENGLE MALEN TATE or MORRIS, ETHEL TAYLOR, CARL ARRISTRONG, ROBERT WILSON, SHIRLEY YOUNG, both JEWELLS, and JUNIO MILLER and approximately 10 or 15 others. Each person present was given about 25 or 30 copies of the above mentioned literature and told to distribute it when they left 271 Vance.

At approximately 7:30 PM a male colored named EOB GORE from Jet Magazine out of Chicago, Illinois, arrived at 271 Vance with MARRELL McCULLOUGH. GORE Wanted to do a story on the Invaders. He was given a copy of every piece of literature the Invaders have printed in the past and told to select the story from some of the literature by MELVIN SMITH and ROY TURKS. BOB GORE surveyed the material and said it was sufficient and he would have a story for Jet Magazine about the Invaders soon.

At approximately 8 PM all of the people present at 271 Vance left and went to Clayborn Temple and at Clayborn Temple there were approximately 5 or 6 hundred present and Dr. BLAKE was already speaking when they arrived. It is learned that Dr. BLAKE's speech is printed verbatim in the first edition of the Press-Scimitar, Thursday, January 23, 1969.

On Thursday, January 23, 1969 at 5:30 PM at the Peabody Notel in Room 215 those present were: LEWIS WELCH, ROY TURKS, MELVIN SMITH, COBY SMITH, JOHN C. SMITH, CHIQUITA SMITH, MERKOEPCK MAURICE LEWIS, SHIRLEY YOUNG, CARL ARMSTRONG, DONALD PIGFORD and MARRELL McCULLOUGH were holding a meeting with Mrs. HINEM JAMES M. DOLDEY, president of WOMEN of the NATIONAL COUNCIL OF CHURCHES, female white, address Twin Will Ridge Drive, Cincinnati, Ohio. Also a ROBERT CHAPMAN, male colored, executive director of Social Justice of the NCC and a Mr. BROWN, male colored, attorney for NCC from Detroit and the meeting was about discussing the possibility of the Invaders getting \$51,200.00 from the NCC to finance a program that will train 120 community organizers for a six-month period. It was learned that the Invaders idea about the program by COBY SMITH, ROY TURKS and MAURICE LEWIS. Mrs. HIEM DOLDEY, Mr. CHAPMAND and Mr. BROWN expressed deep concern for the Invaders and said they would get them all of the \$51,200 or at least a part of it because they believed the Invaders are a worthwhile group of people. It was in the Intelligence files.

At approximately 6:30 PM this meeting ended and DONALD PIGFORD, ROY TURKS remained at the Hotel Peabody for the forum on police brutality. It is not known where the other members of the Invades went.

The first speaker at the forum was a male white ROSS FLANWAGAN. He stated the police department in New York City pays its officers more than any other city in the U.S. but still they are grossly underpaid for professionals. The point is no one wants to be a policeman. It is a job that does not attract the best people for the job. Their jobs are not conducive to public image any longer. Egery effort is being made by the police departments gd throughout the country to give them on image the public would welcome. The police departments should be concerned with the Right Wing and organized crime factions, but they are not, because volice brutality is controlled and perpetuated by organized crime and especially the so-called Right Wing groups such as the John Birch Society. I Temions in society are the major crises in law enforcement today: Black people are forced to accept things that other people are not. When the riots occurred in Chicago during theDemocratic Convention our white kids were besten over the heads and it brought on public outery and national concern. Other black children have been beaten by the police for years and no one said a thing. Most of the people in jail are poor and poverty stricken, the reason being that middle class

courts do not convict mid a class defendants. The poll departments in the cities are setting up a public relations store front in black communities. assign black officers to these so-called public relations bureaus to officer a public gesture. These store fronts are set up to create public in any desired that do not reflect police brutality at all. The police departments of Cakkana, California and Washington, D. C. have decided to stop shooting burglars and thieves if they want their cities to survive. They have found that there are limitations that they must observe if they want their cities to remain intact and the training programs that the police have, they teach their officers paychalogy and sociology, but rather than serving its true purpose, it skips over the heads of policemen and they don't want people telling them how to conduct themselves in dealing with our highly elevated society. Police are not about to be psyched out and they are not going to be because they are controlled by the power structures and not the public, the ones who pay their salaries. The police departments are closed societies. It is hard for anyone to investigate police brutality on this basis. The police just do not open their doors to society's wants and desires. Different groups have been set up in some cities to monitor police actions. In some cities we have church groups doing this, but even when they record an not of police brutality, it is difficult for them to get the guilty person brought tocourt for trial. Usually they receive a 30 day suspension. When I was in Cakland, California, we held a psycho drama class for citizens and police officers on police brutality. The setting was a tavern brawl scene. We used regular citizens as policemen and the same as trouble makers, then we used true policemen in the role of policemen and again regular citizens as the trouble makers, then policeman were used as the trouble makers and citizens as policemen, then we used policemen in both instances. The results were what we have been talking about, police brutality only in the scene when policemen acted the roles of their profession and citizens were used as trouble makers. When we put the police against the police, each party was reluctant to engage the other.

Recently in Oakland they have gotten a police chief im who realizes the problems of police brutality and he is doing all he can to correct it, even against the orders of the power structure. He is a model policeman who specializes in rigid discipline. He uses the known brutal policemen to train recruits just to see if they will train people in the manner in which they have acted in the past themselves. The results have been with the exception of very few instances much better. They do not train new people to act in a brutal manner. Some people do not like me because I refuse to call pelicemen pigs. After all, they are human beings just like you and I. I think the public should realize that the police have a responsibility to law and order only in a lawful way. They should not break the laws themselves each time an arrest is made. In light of all I have said this evening I hope the true ENGINGENERY Christian world will use every method at its disposal to eliminate police ENGARY brutality, XYEXX then maybe we can live together in true Christian harmony and brotherly love.

A male colored, Mr. WILKES of Patterson, New Jersey, started his speech by giving geographical location of Patterson and the ratio of blacks to whites. The MM Patterson Police Department has 325 men. Only 12 of those are black and no black officers hold any rank above a patrolman. The department is too heavy with brass with more than 50 per cent of the men being officers. There are more than 75,000 blacks in Patterson, which has a population of 150,000. During the riots in Patterson some people were mosed and had prolonged effects. We were successful in getting the mayor, since he is the only elected official in the cit to take the mace from the police after the Surgeon General of the U.S. said the Mace does produce lasting harmful effects.

Once in Patterson the police drave onto the corner of a block with a fire hydrant open. Standing near the hydrant was a Puerto Rican who the police assumed had opened the hydrant and just because he did not come fast enough when they

called him, he was beaten and it took 37 stitches to close the wound in his head. This liveldent brought the pastic out in force.

First a group marched to the police handquarters and demanded an invest gation. When they left the police headquarters the police assembled and we to the SCLC office because they believed the SCLC had organized the march. It the SCLC headquarters the police broke out every window in the building and intear que inside while women and children were present. Then they went down the street where black businesses are located and broke out the windows of at least 15 stores in an apparent gesture to teach black people to stay out of solice affairs.

Department came to town. After their investigate until the U.S. Justice Department came to town. After their investigation eight policemen were arrested and charged with misconduct; however, they were found guilty but put back on the job upon the mayor's order. Just prior to that three Patterson policemen had been given 30-day suspensions for compiring to commit barghary. It seems to me that human beings do not mean anything to the police. Only material things that are present in our society. During the riots the occupation forces, the State Police and the National Guard, took over in fatterson, but not in the way we had expected them to when they came. We ested the Governor to send help to help detain and stop the unprovided attacks of solicemen upon human beings. When the occupation forces arrived they helped the police continue their brutality, in some instances. The police departments across the nation into the help of the Pentagon. The Pentagon is backing every department across the nation.

The next speaker was JAMES MORRIS LAMSON. He sold, it is to my regret that Director of Momphis Fire and Police Hollowan did not come tonight to engage in this very meanful dialogue. He has attended meanful dialogues with as in the past years. Just last year in Memphis we have experience on untold amount of police brutality in Memphis. Not long ago a home in South Memoria was Elilional Milk converged upon by at least 9 or 10 police cars. The police entered the home from the front and the rear and were inside before the wife and knowned of this household realized it. Once inside they began to methodically search the house and they had no warragt. When the mother of the boy of whom they were looking for asked for a search warrant, they said they did not need any and generally evaded all of her and her husband's questions. Finally the police told the nother and father they were looking for a son of that household because a liquer store had been robbed. The mother told them the son they were looking Will for had been gone about 20 minutes and she caked them to leave and she would call thom when he returned. They refused to leave and sold they were going to stay as long as they wanted to. Finally they went outside and camped on her front perch for a while then left. The next day they came back and witnesses said there were at least 100 police on there. They proceeded to do just what they had done on the previous at he and with no search worrant.

The Invoices have had more than their share of mobble with the pouce. The attitude of the police in Memphis has undergone a change that commer be seen. During the sociation strike they acted like maniacs. Then during hospital strike there was slaply no comparison as to the way they had acres the past, but still I believe the only way to end police legislity in Membhis to take away their guas, billy clabs. Mace, and the other weapons they use give them weapons of imagination. These are weapons of the mind which they need to be shie to function in this sick society.

There is 606,000 pounds of food stored in warehouses for the poor people of Memphis and this food is to be distributed on a personal request basis. Now while the feed is available to the consumity the Memphis Police Department Community Relations Buresu is begging for food and clothing to distribute to the peor. They are taking from the poor and giving it back to the peor. I know a white minister in Memphis that grew up here. He told me that everyDXDD one who praduated from high school with him is now a member of the Memphis Police Press-Scimitar on Friday, January 24, 1869).

After the forem there was supposed to be a discussion on what had been said about police brutality by the three speakers; however, only one person had an opportunity to ask a question.

About 9 PM at least ten different people who are prominent in the NCC and from out of town began to speak out in behalf of the Invaders in a request for the \$51,200.00 that had been submitted. In effect, these people stated that it was senseless to have a meeting and then ignore the request of a group such as the Invaders. The amount of money they had asked for was nothing since NCC gives hundreds of thousands of dollars to organization that don't do anything. The hoard and its cheeted officials should give this matter very deep consideration and if at all possible, give the Invaders the money that they had asked for.

Mrs. DOLDEY told the assembly that if NCC would not fund the Invaders, that She would do It personally.

At 10:30 FM the meeting was adjourned and it was overheard that DONALD PICFORD met privately and briefly with Dr. CHARLES SPIVEY, make colored, Executive Director of Funds of the NCC, from New York City, and also a member of the Board. It was learned that Dr. SPIVEY had said that the Invaders would get the money for sere and to encourage them to keep in contact with him and the others whose mames and address had been given to COBY SMITH. I cannot give you a definite date, but your organization will be furied.

At 11:50 PM BONALD PIGFORD, MAURICE LEVIS, ROY TURKS left the Motel Peabody and went to Clayborn Temple to hear BEVEL speech. There were approximately 100 to 125 pauple present. Some of those present were: John C. Smith, Levis Weich, Maurice Lewis, Melvin Smith, Einel Laylor, Smirley Young, Chroutte Matth, ROY TURKS, both Jewells, Ebbie Tate, Tom Davie, Carl Armstrong, Frank Mitchell, and about 13 others.

BEVEL then stated, I have been to the joil and talked to JAMES HAVE He is not juilty of mardering MARTIN LUTIER KING. You church people who narehold to the memorial of MARTIN were wrong. We are not going to try and catch the guilty; that will be left for the white America, because people who worship white skin killed Martin Luther King and not Ray. We are going to do justice because this is all Martin ever talked about, was doing justice. Isn't it obvious to you that America does not intend to do justice. America wants to murder and lynch Ray for something he did not do but I am not going to let black America be tricked into murder as they had have been in the past. America wants to kill Ray to appeads black people. Ray is a nobody and that is why they are trying to sacrifice him. According to the Constitution of the U. S. the accused has a right to choosehis wwn defense counsel, but there has been thrown in a trick which does not allow the chosen to choose. They are not thinking about doing justice, only about murdering Ray. Tonight when you leave the church and go back to your meeting tomorrow, your agenda should not include anything other than doing justice. If you don't want to talk about doing justice, then you have nothing left to talk about and should pack up and go home and think about doing justice.

On Friday, January 24, 1969 at approximately 10:45 AM MAURICE LEWIS, ROY TURKS, DONALD PIETORD AND COBY SMITH were at the Peabody Hotel. It was learned that COBY SMITH was in a private conference with Dr. CHARLES SPIVEY of the NCC.

At approximately 12 noon COBY SMITH came out of the meeting and said that we could not do anything else today; that Dr. SPIVEY has promised to aid the Invaders all he could and that he has suggested a list of names and addresses that the Invaders contact for additional assistance.

At approximately 1 PM COBY SMITH left the hotel and went to some unknown place downtown and ROY TURKS, DONALD PIGFORD and MAURICE LEHS went to 271 Vance and when they arrived at 271 Vance those present were: JOHN C. SMITH, both JEWELLS, MACH CHARLES HARDIN, ROBERT WILSON, CARL ARMSTRONG, SHIRLEY YOUNG, ETHEL TAYLOR and TOM DAVIS. At approximately 1:45 PM ROY TURKS and DOWALD PIGFORD were followed to CHIQUITA SMITH's house where they picked her up and also a typewriter. At approximately 3 PM they returned to 271 Vance with the typewriter where SHIRLEY YOUNG was to type some letters to the ministers of Memphis, Tennessee. The letters are supposed to be in regard to LANCE WATSON's arrest and the circumstances around his arrest.

At approximately 3:30 PM CHIQUITA SMITH, DONALD PISTORD, ROY TURKS, MAURICE LEWIS were seen at the Hotel Peabody Looking for COBY SMITH, but were unable to locate him. They left the Hotel Peabody and were followed to Whittier's Studio on Beale Street. CHIQUITA placed an order for 1,000 pictures of WILLIE WINE. These pictures are approximately 14 x 20. The cost for 1,000 is \$120. CHIQUITA paid \$60 in advance. When these pictures are finished they are supposed to sell for one dollar each. CHIQUITA and TURKS also had their mpictures made separately. They then left Whittier's Studio and went back to 271 Vance.

At approximately 12 midnight there was no one at 271 Vance and then proceeded to the Twilight Zone and those present there were: ROY TURKS, MELVIN SMITH, TOM DAVIS, SHIRLEY YOUNG, EDDIE TATE, DONALD PIGFORD, ETHEL TAYLOR, LEWIS WELCH, both JEWELLS and approximately 75 others. It was learned that the people with the exception of ROY TURKS, were there as security guards. Their job is to search all people entering. Males search males and females search females; and to stop fights if they occur. LEWIS WELCH is paid \$25 per week, or \$100 per month for this. What is done with the money that LEWIS receives is not known.

At approximately 1:15 AM DONALD PIGFORD was observed to leave the Twilight Zone and go to the U Bar Lounge and present there along with PIGFORD, were JOHN C. SMITH and CARL ARMSTRONG and they played some pool.

On Saturday, January 15, 1969 at approximately 10 A. at 271 Vance those present were: MELVIN SMITH, ROY TURKS, DOMALD PICTORD, CARL ARGSTROMS, EDGE WRIGHT, MARRELL McCollough, OTIS PARNELL, Tom DAVIS, EDGIE TATE, ROBERT WILLS: and ETHEL TAYLOR. At approximately 10:15 AM all of the above mentioned except EDDIE TATE, ROBERT WILSON and ETHEL TAYLOR got into PIGFORD and McCollough's car and they were followed to EZEKIEL BELL's church on S. Parkway E. DELL ton gave the eight of them 300 papers to sell. BELL, his wife and their children took the other hundred to sell in the vicinity of his church. The slogan to at each door was "We are trying to get a black newspaper in each black home." Another slogan used was to use the name of the Invaders if they wanted to.

At approximately LT AM they were followed to North Memphis from BELL's church to Chelsea and Mollywood where they sold the 300 Tri-State Defeaders by going from door to door. At approximately 11:30 AM it was observed that JOHN C. SMITH and MAURICE DEWIJ were picked up at Boxwood and Chelsea and they were followed to COBY SMITH's house at 2240 Brown for a planning session regarding the \$51,200.00 they are seeking from NCC.

At COBY's it was learned they surveyed a long list of names that had been given COBY by Mrs. DOBBEY and suggested by her to write 20 people of different addresses and different cities who would help them get the \$51,200.00. These people would also be contacted by Mrs. DOLBEY and others to alert them as who the Invaders were and that they should be given financial aid from Inter-Religious Foundation for Community Organization (IFCO), and NCC.

At approximately 12:45 PM they left COBY's house and continued to sell the Tri-State Defender, then they returned to BDLL's church at approximately 2:45 PM and it was learned that 400 Tri-State Defenders had been sold. The total amount was \$50 and they sold each paper for 15 cents per paper. The commission for the Invaders was \$36 or 9 cents per paper and the other \$24 goes to Tri-State Defender. The \$36 the Invaders made was left with EZEKIEL BELL.

At approximately 3:15 PM EZEKTEL BELL, ROY TURKS, DONALD PIGFORD, TOM DAVIS and OTIS PARNELL were seen to leave BELL's church and were folicwed to the airport where it was learned they were to meet a Mr. MEDD who had a 45 minute layover at the airport. He is supposed to be a representative from the Negro Book Club, Inc. of New York City. He is a male colored and he had just been to Little Rock and was returning to New York City. It was learned that BELL wanted to find out from Mr. NEDD if he could get some books for his book store that will be opening soon at Gaither and Kerr. Mr. NEDD Informed BELL that he could get the books for a 40 per cent down payment of the wholesale cost and the wholesale cost is \$2000 and it would east him \$800 down payment and the balance would be due in 30 days after delivery date. The books would retail for About \$4,200.

At approximately 5 PM they left the airport and they were followed to BYLL's church where BELL got out and then ROY TURKS, TOM DAVIS, BONALD PIGFORD and OTIS PARNELL went back to 271 Vance.

At approximately 8:30 PM at 271 Vance those present were: ROY TURES, JOHN C. SMITH, LOUIS WELCH, MELVIN SMITH, TOM DAVIS, CARL ARMSTRONG, FARL, possibly last name DAVIS, EDDIE TATE, ROBERT WILSON, DONALD PIGFORD, ETHEL TAYLOR, SMIRLEY YOUNG OTIS PARMELL, PAURICE LEWIS, MACK CHARLES HARDIN, CHIQUITA SMITH and both the JEWELLS. They were just sitting around playing cards and waiting for 10 TM so they could go to work at the Twilight Zone.

At 10 PM all of the above mentioned people went to the Twilight Zone execut JCHN C. SMITH, CHIQUITA SMITH, DONALD PIGFORD, ROY TURKS MAURICE LEWIS and they went to the U Bar Lounge. The reason for this, they are opposed to what LEWIS WELCH and his followers are doing at the Twilight Zone.

On Sanday, January 26, 1969 at approximately noon it was learned that CHIOUTTA SMITH had called DONALD PICTURE and wanted him to take her to the Similar County fail to see SWEET WILLIE WINE. It was learned that PIGFORD and CHIOUT. SMITH arrived at the county jail at approximately 1 MA and visited SMIET MILLS for 25 minutes. It was learned that CHIQUITA asked SMEET WILLIE to end his face. WINE said no, he could not end it. WINE also asked CHIQUITA on Wednesday, January to get are. TISMAE, who is his attorney to take him to the hospital for an example nation to determine if he could continue his fast. He said be sure to keep planty of the liveredure pertaining to my fast in the street. When the weather permits, go shead with the march. Keep the pressure on those people at Stax Records. They will come up with some money because they still owe me for those songs. Get every person you can depend on to get out and organize the people for the march. Also h we it aired on the radio. At approximately 1:45 PM, as PIGFORD and CHIQUITA were leaving the jail, ROY TURKS, MELLYIN SMITH, COBY SMITH and MAURICE LEWIS were waiting outside, so they all left the jail and went back to 271 Vance. It was learned that Coby wonted MIGFORD and MAURICE LEWIS to meet him at the Student Unit Building at Southwestern on Monday January 27 at 9 AM.

On Monday, Summary 27, 1869 at approximately 3:30 Am it was learned that DONALD PIGFORD picked up MAURICE DENIS at 1852 Keltner Circle (this address is possibly where MAURICE DENIS's sister lives). They then left the Keltner address and were followed to Southwestern University where they met CODY SMITH at the Student Union Building, then they continued to Southwestern's library to a private study room on the third floor. There they composed letters to send Mrs. BOLBEY and others asking them not to sent money to the Invaders through Pastor JIN IAWSON, but to send the money to P. O. Box 6214, which is registered to DONALD PIGFORD. When the letters were finished they prepared an intel'igence test that is to be administered to the Invaders. CODY said that the purpose of the test will be to determine whethere they can be used in a productive manner within the organization.

At approximately NEW PIGFORD and MAURICE LEWIS left Southwestern and were followed to CHIQUITA SMITH's house where CHIQUITA was to type up the letters. After the letters were typed they left CHIQUITA's and went to 271 Vance and those present at this time were MELVIN SMITH, ROY TURKS, ROBERT VILSON, EDDIE TATE, JOHN SMITH, TOM DAVIS, CARL ARMSTRONG, LIWIS WELCH and both JEWELLS. It was learned that LEWIS WELCH was to meet a press agent from the Tri-State Defender for a press release, but the party did not show up and the meeting was rescheduled for Tuesday, January 28, 4:30 PM.

At approximately 7:36 PM at 271 Vance those present were: JOHN C. SMITH. THE DAVIS, EDDIT TATE, both JEWELLS and MEDVIN SMITH. It was learned that ROY TURNS was in a meeting in the Christ Missionary Earlist Church on S. Parksay E. where they were having a Dr. KING Memorial Committee Meeting. It was also learned that there was supposed to be a meeting in North Memphis at 1363 Tanica where MERRON lives, but due to the persons not being able to attend, they postponed this meeting patil a later date.

I hereby wish to make a claim on the reward offered for information leading to the capture of James Earl Ray the alleged assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King.

I base this claim on the fact that having recognised Ray and other brutal looking Americans in London I did publicaly state in diverse places in that city, that the man wanted by the F.B.I. in that world-wide search was in hiding in the capital before he was captured. I made this claim at this late date due to the fact that I wished to remain anonymous, until my name was published prominintly in a British newspaper of international recognition (re Sunday Express 2nd Feb '68) for identifying another American criminal in connection with the Domench Dossier,

Please do not misunderstand, as people will vouch for this, and the fact that I caused quite a stir amongst civilians in the metropolis of London by announcing what I knew to be true. This could in fact have led to Ray making for the continent hence his capture at London Airport as no doubt my observations reached the British police, who know of me in connection with the above -- mentioned case and the fact that I was seen at London airport watching departures just a few days previous to the famous capture.

Trusting that this communication reaches you, and finds you in the very best of health I remain yours sincerly

CORTEZ telephonically contacted the WPO 4/10/68 and volunteered his assistance concerning STOKELY CARMICHAEL and the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC).

CORTEZ stated he arrived in WDC on Friday, 4/5/68, after having called STOKELY CARMICHAEL serlier that week from Kansas City, Kansas, where he (CORTEZ) was living (address not indicated). - Further to the memorandum of the A/Officer i/c O.I.E. dated in Ottawa the 28 OCT 68, the hotel mentioned is none other than the Harkey Apartments where RAY resided whilst in Montreal. This building concept is fairly large and is situated at the corner of Havre and Notre-Dame East Street in Montreal. The Acapulco Club is part of this building and has its main entrance on Havre Street while the Harkey Apartments have its main entrance around the corner of Notre-Dame Street.
- Purther to verbal instructions received from Insp. EUCHENNEAU, enquiries conducted at the <u>Neptune Tavern4</u> 121 rue des Commissaires Cest, have revealed the following.
- Mr. Fusine CAUDET, co-owner of Neptune Tavern, residing at Rang St-Dominique, Les Cèdres, Comté de Loulanges, P.J., telephone 452-4438, was interviewed and stated being fully aware of newspaper articles which had been written in respect to MAY's activities in Montreal. He could not however identify photographs of RAY as having been a client at his tavern nor could he offer any information on the blond latin named RACUL.
- Mr. Arthur MORIN, day waiter at Neptune Tavern during the period concerned and residing at 1827 St-André Street, Montreal, P..., was interviewed and could not offer any information of value relative to RAY and one RAGUL ever having been customers at the Neptune Tavern. From his records, Mr. GAUDET was able to supply the name of a former waiter who had been employed on the evening shift at the tavern during the Summer of 1967. This former waiter was identified as Michel BACON, 2823A Ontario East, SIN 205-984-065. Attempts to interview BACON at 2823A Ontario East, have revealed that BACON is no longer residing there and it was not possible to obtain any information as to his present address or employer. It was however, learned that BACON was believed to still be in the Greater Montreal area. Enquiries have been instituted through the regional UIC Office in Montreal in view of locating BACON through his present employer.

One of the newspapermen who spoke broken French, enquired from CHARRON if either RAY or RAOUL had ever been customers at his tavern. CHARRON states having declined to make any identification either of RAY or RAOUL.

The picture of MAY which was in possession of these two (2) men was identical to the last photograph which was obtained prior to RAY's arrest. The dress and tie were similar with the exception that RAY was holding the lapel of his suit jacket with his right hand. The picture of RAOUL was a full-face picture, passport-type photograph which showed RAOUL to have blond curly hair, age approximately 30 years old, wearing a white shirt, a tie, and a dress jacket. CHAURON stated to us that from our photographs of RAY, he could not state whether or not RAY had ever been a customer at the Neptune Tavern. The same applied in the case of RAOUL. One comment made by CHARRON was to the effect that the photograph of RAOUL which had been exhibited by the American newspapermen indicated to him that RACUL was not a sailor. One of the newspapermen also made mention that RAY was in possession of a Neptune Tavern matchbook which served to indicate to them that RAY could have visited the tavern.

- The newspapermen who spoke to CHARGON were described as follows: First Spoke English like an American, height 5'6", built small, hair blond, spoke broken French. Second Spoke like an American, approximately 6' tall, thick dark hair, wore a band indicating that he was married.

- In an attempt to corroborate CHARRON's statement to the effect that a photograph of a man reported to be RACUL had been exhibited to him, further enquiries will be conducted in the Montreal area. Some of the persons who were interviewed earlier during the course of this investigation will be contacted in a view of ascertaining if they have any information pertaining to RACUL.

Mr. Jerry Cohen Los Angeles Times news reporter in New Orleans, Louisiana, residing at the Cochetta Motel, Room 216, Telephone 822-1560, New Orleans, Louisiana, telephonically advised he had contacted the Los Angeles Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and had been referred to the New Orleans Office of the FBI.

Cohen advised that he and Dave Lawson of Los Angeles, California, who is also a reporter of the Los Angeles Times, had obtained from Charles Stein/a telephone number within one week after the arrest of James Earl Ray.

Cohen stated that Dave Lawson had made all the notes of the conversation with Stein but that as he, Cohen, recalls it, Stein showed Lawson a piece of paper which contained a telephone number and that Lawson had copied the telephone number from Stein's piece of paper into Lawson's note.

When Stein questioned Ray concerning this telephone number, Ray had said this is where Ray got his weather report.

Cohen stated that Stein two or three days after talking to Cohen and Lawson had made a call to New Orleans and had determined this number was a number for Troop B of the Louisiana State Police located in the Greater New Orleans area.

Cohen stated that neither he nor Lawson had furnished this telephone number to the Los Angeles Office of the FBI and when questioned at to whether or not this was an oversight advised that subconsciously it had been forgotten with the hope it might materialize into a good story.

#### JAMES EARL RAY

Cohen advised that he did not have the telephone number with him but had made a contact in New Orleans while here to attend the Clay Shaw trial, who had determined that there was a Louisiana State Trooper at Troop B named Raul V. Esquivel

Cohen advised he had no further information concerning this number but that Lawson would have more complete and accurate information from his notes.

A review of the New Orleans indices show an investigation was conducted in the case captioned "TROOPER RAUL VICTOR ESQUIVER, LOUISTANA STATE POLICE, FERDINAND JOSEPH HORIO, JR. - VICTIM, CIVIL RIGHTS." Esquivel in 1964 was described as follows:

Investigation in this regard has failed to indicate that any individual named RAGUL was registered in any one of these places at the same time as the subject RAY or that any individual other than RAY was registered in more than one of these motels.
