On 8/14/69 Mr. GEORGE McMILLAN advised SA PAUL C. TIGUE, JR., that he is a writer commissioned by the Little Brown Publishing Company, Boston, Mass., to write a book about JAMES EARL RAY and moved into a home on Coffin Point, Frogmore, S. C., approximately three months ago with his wife who is writing a book concerning MARINA OSWALD.

McMILLAN stated that he has contacted a Mr. STONER, Savannah, Ga., who is the attorney presently representing RAY on several occasions in order to obtain information for his book. He said that during 1962 he had written an article for the Saturday Evening Post concerning the bombing of a black church in Birmingham, Ala., in which several black children were killed and although he did not specifically indicate that STONER was a good subject in this case he advised he referred to STONER as Mr. X and described him in the article as a man with a limp. McMILLAN said that after this article came out in Saturday Evening Post he had heard that STONER had sworn to kill him but that he has met STONER on several occasions since that time and STONER has made no mention of this.

McMILIAN advised that on the morning of 8/14/69 he attempted to contact STONER telephonically in Savannah and the phone was answered by a man with a young voice who replied to McMILIAN after he identified himself as GEORGE McMILIAN, "don't you think you have got a nerve calling Mr. STONER. You've practically called him a murderer. I know you live in Atlanta Pal and you'd better watch your step. That's all I've got to say." McMILIAN said after this young man made these remarks he hung up on McMILIAN.

Ray made the assertion in a statement dictated to his brother, Jerry, at the Temessee State Prison in Nashville, where he is serving 99 years for mur-dering the civil rights leader. The statement was read by the brother in a televised program on station KMOX-TV here.

In the statement, the con-victed killer said the federal agents employed him during the

spring of 1968. "They told me I was helping them to supply arms and guns to Cuba refugees to over-throw Castro and the Communists in Cuba," Ray declared. "I knew nothing about King being in Memphis until after King had have billed." King had been killed.



JAMES EARL RAY DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. -VICTIM

On July 25, 1969, C. R. CRANK, JR., Superintendent, Federal Detention Center, Florence, Arizona, made available the attached copy of a letter written by JOHN HAMILTON MORRIS, inmate of that institution to Mr. PETER GOLDMAN, 444 Madison Avenue, New York City, New York. Mr. CRANK pointed out that the significance of this letter was the fact that MORRIS indicated that JAMES EARL RAY had been paid by an individual known as "BIG D". Mr. CRANK advised that MORRIS was received at that institution on July 19, 1969, and was incarcerated there until July 25, 1969.

MORRIS was maintained at that institution as a stop-over while en route from San Francisco, California, to Leavenworth, Kansas. He explained that MORRIS was serving a sentence at U. S. Penitentiary, Leavenworth, and had been removed from that institution to San Francisco, where he was afforded a hearing on a Writ of Habeas Corpus.

Mr. CRANK advised that an information card maintained by that institution on MORRIS indicated that he had been convicted for crimes of bank robbery in 1949, bank robbery in 1969 and aircraft piracy in 1969. His attorney was listed as PAUL L. LARSEN, 309 South Third Street, Las Vegas, Nevada.

The Warden was requested to give this receipt to the subject RAY.

Also enclosed for the Bureau are 2 copies of an order signed by Shelby County Criminal Court Judge ARTHUR C. FACQUIN, allowing the subject's attorneys to talk with the subject in an open conference room. This was occasioned by the fact that the new Warden at the Tennessee State Penitentiary had required that RAY communicate with his attorneys through a telephone system while separated by a glass partition.

Attorney General J. CLYDE MASON stated that in a recent conversation with the subject's attorney, RICHARD J. RYAN, it was determined that RYAN intends to appeal this matter to the Tennessee Supreme Court. He has until 10/13/69 to perfect his appeal to that Court, and RYAN has indicated he intends to meet that deadline. The basis for this appeal is that under Tennessee law when a Judge dieschefore ruling on a motion for a new trial, the defendant is automatically granted a new trial on the basis that only the trial Judge would have been aware of errors in the previous trial and that the defendant should be entitled to a new trial. The State contends that this law does not apply in the RAY case since RAY was sentenced on a plea of guilty and was never tried. Referenced communication contained information from a Mr. KARL RAPP! Kansas City, Missouri, regarding a former SS general by the name of HEINZ MUELLER / aka HEINZ MANGER, who he had previously met in Puerto Vallarta. MUELLER was reportedly also a member of Odessa, an organization of former SS officers.

RAPP also had advised that he was previously in correspondence with a JOHN MATHIESON, a retired American formerly living in Puerto Vallarta and over 70 years of age. RAPP visited Puerto Vallarta during spring of 1969 and advised that he determined JOHN MATHIESON was no longer living in that area.

On 9/9/69, KARL RAPP telephonically advised Kansas City Office that he had received a letter from MATHIESON on 9/8/69 from Puerto Vallarta. In this letter, which was mostly personal in nature, MATHIESON stated that HEINZ MUELLER is now residing in Weisbaden, Germany. The letter did not elaborate and RAPP could furnish no more information regarding HEINZ MUELLER or MANGER. RAPP stated that MATHIESON did not give a return address but his former address had been Post Office Box 53, Puerto Vallarta, Mexico.

RAPP advised if any additional information comes to his attention he will immediately contact the Kansas City Office.

Leads in this matter are being left to discretion of office of origin or Bureau.

This case is remaining pending inasmuch as a lead was set out to interview JOHN MORRIS, Leavenworth, Kansas, in Phoenix letter to Director, 9/4/69.

"Attorney General MITCHELL:

"Now that there is evidence that Black Panther, BOBBY SEALE, is able to take part in or direset activities involving murder all the way across the country from San Francisco, I wonder if the following strange and unusual fact has been brought back to the attention of Federal or other authorities.

"Some time ago SEALE had been arrested in this area and was supposed to appear in court on a certain day. He did not appear and both his attorney and his wife indicated they did not know where he was...that nobody had seen him in this entire area that day. About five hours later on that same day the news flashed across the country that...MARTIN LUTHER KING had been killed.

The files of the San Francisco Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation do not contain any information identifiable with "T. WAYNE."

The Jack Tar Hotel is located in the block bounded by Van Ness Avenue, Franklin Street, Geary Boulevard, and Post Street, and is one of the most recent hotels built in the City of San Francisco and is considered to be a first-class botel.

The "San Francisco Chronicle," a daily newspaper published in San Francisco, California, in the edition dated April 5, 1968, carried an article captioned "No Show--Warrant For BOBBY SEALE." This article stated that a bench warrant for the arrest of Black Panther leader BOBBY SEALE was issued yesterday (April 4, 1968) after he failed to appear on an old charge of carrying a loaded shotgun in the Oakland Hall of Justice. SEALE had been scheduled to appear before Alameda County Superior Judge REDMOND C. STAATS at 9:30 a.m. SEALE's counsel explained that he had seen SEALE approximately one-half hour before "tying his tie--and he was supposed to be here." Counsel requested a postponement of SEALE's hearing.

The "San Francisco Chronicle" in the edition dated April 9, 1968, entitled "SPALE In Court. . .Attorney Trouble," stated that BOBBY SEALE, Chairman of the Black Panthers, appeared with his attorney in an Oakland court yesterday thus abrogating a bench warrant for his arrest.

SEALE stated in court that he was actually en route to the court when he "got mad at his lawyer."

At this point in the proceedings, SEALE's new attorney took over saying it was indeed true that SEALE and his former counsel had a falling out but that it was an embarrassing matter to bring up in open court since it involved client-attorney relationships.

A characterization of the Black Panther Party is attached hereto.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY, aka Black Panther Party for Self Defense

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by Bobby George Seale, BPP Chairman, and Huey P. Newton, BPP Minister of Defense. Newton is presently serving a sentence of 2 to 15 years on a conviction of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther," which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service," states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, George Mason Murray, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, "...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

The national headquarters of the BPP is located at 3106 Shattuck Avenue, Berkeley, California. Branches have been established at various locations throughout the United States.
