Assistant United States Attorney R. Macey Taylor, Birmingham, Alabama, advised on September 25, 1969, that he had been in conversation with Arthur Hanes, former defense counsel for subject Ray. Assistant United States Attorney Taylor related certain allegations that Hanes had proposed to him to the effect that one James Robert Blow, a former resident of Cahaba Heights, a Birmingham suburb, may have conspired with other named individuals and subject Ray in interstate transportation of weapons to Memphis, Tennessee, where Hanes believed they were intended for black militant groups.

On October 10, 1969, Attorney Arthur J. Hanes was interviewed at his office, 617 Frank Nelson Building, after the absense of a week from Birmingham. Hanes entered into a lengthy discourse of his theories concerning the James Earl Ray case and stated that although Ray undoubtedly was involved, it was his theory that Ray had been led or instructed in his actions by other unknown individuals. He stated that he had two theories of groups who may have led Ray; one being the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), and the other being black militant groups. He had no definite information in this connection whatsoever. He also commented that he had, while serving as Ray's defense counsel, observed the bullet which was alleged to have been fired from the rifle involved in this matter, and it was his personal opinion that the bullet was sufficently intact to be identified as the murder projectile.

Regarding his former client, James Robert Blow also known as Robert Blow, Hanes related as follows.

On December 18, 1968, the residence of Mr. J. E. Woods, III, 2432 Crest Road, Mountain Brook, a residential suburb of Birmingham, had been burglarized, and numerous shotguns, including automatic shotguns together with silver service, had been taken by a local thief, James Warren Carlisle, who is now serving a penitentiary term for burglary. Carlisle had informed Deputy Sheriff Walter Dean, Birmingham, that some of the stolen effects might be located in the residence of James Robert Blow and wife Janice Blow who at that time were living at 3218 Greendale Road, Cahaba Heights. This led to Dean securing a search warrant for the residence and the recovery of the silver service belonging to the Woods family. Blow was subsequently charged with receiving and possessing stolen goods.

Hanes by reference to his file related that on May 15, 1969, he appeared with Blow in the Jefferson County Courthouse at which time Grand Jury action was waived. On that date, Hanes discussed with Deputy Walter Dean possible cooperation of his client Blow in connection with recovery of the numerous guns taken from the Woods residence. Blow agreed to cooperate and in the presence of Deputy Dean and an agent of the Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms Division of the Treasury Department identified a photograph of one Claude Cockrell of Memphis, Tennessee, as being the owner of a Cadillac into which he had observed Carlisle and Cockrell loading the weapons which were then taken to Memphis, and it was the information of Hanes that Cockrell was later charged by the Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms Division with having transported automatic weapons from Birmingham to Memphis. Hanes stated that a local Birmingham hoodlum, Bob Loveless, had also assisted in loading the weapons into Cockrell's Cadillac according to information furnished by his client Blow. that it was his opinion also that weapons such as these had been intended for black militant groups in Memphis, who might have intended to use them in King's assassination. It should be noted that all weapons involved in the transportation by Cockrell to Memphis which had been stolen from the Woods residence were shotguns and not rifles.

Mr. Hanes stated that he had read of weapons being brought to the United States through Gulf Coast ports such as Mobile, Alabama, and Pascagoula, Mississippi, and thought possibly some of these weapons may have been intended for use in the murder of Dr. King.

Hanes stated that his client James Robert Blow was arraigned on June 20, 1969, and on August 21, 1969, was sentenced to one year and one day which was suspended and he was placed on probation for two years.

Attorney ARTHUR HANES was interviewed by SA HENRY A. SNOW upon HANES' return to Birmingham, stating that he had spent the entire week in eastern North Carolina in the defense of criminal cases there.

Harold Weisberg

On June 13, 1969 Harold Weisberg, a free-lance writer who resides at Route 8, Frederick, Maryland, requested an interview with a Departmental attorney.

Later the same day he visited this Division and discussed certain Haitian exile revolutionary activities. He again visited this Division on October 8, 1969 and continued his discussion of Haitian exile activities. The information he furnished regarding those activities was of no value.

During the course of the interview on October 8, 1969, Mr. Weisberg advised that he had recently received a telephone call from J. B. Stoner, National Chairman of the National States Rights Party. He said that Stoner told him that two men in his Party formerly served as informants of the FBI. Stoner allegedly said that these two men are prepared to testify in court that the FBI offered them \$25,000 to frame James Earl Ray for the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr. Mr. Weisberg said that the testimony presumably would be furnished in a habeas corpus proceeding.

This information is being forwarded as a matter of possible interest to your Bureau.

The Memphis Office should advise appropriate responsible Tennessee state officials handling the King murder case of the information from the Department and that there is no basis to the allegation that the FBI offered anyone any money to frame Ray for the assassination of King. Information furnished Tennessee state authorities is to be confirmed in writing.



Mr. Harold Weisberg, a free-lance writer who resides at Frederick, Maryland, advised an official of the U. S. Department of Justice on October 8, 1969, that he had recently received a telephone call from Mr. J. B. Stoner, National Chairman of the National States Rights Party. According to Mr. Weisberg, Stoner told him that two men in the National States Rights Party formerly served as informants for the Federal Bureau of Investigation and that these two men are prepared to testify in court that the Federal Bureau of Investigation had offered them \$25,000 to frame James Earl Ray for the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Mr. Weisberg indicated that testimony in this regard presumably would be furnished in a habeas corpus proceeding.

Since you are in possession of all of the evidence in this case. I am certain it is obvious to you that there is no basis to the allegations that the Federal Bureau of Investigation offered anyone any money to frame James Earl Ray.

On 9/25/69, AUSA R. MACEY TAYLOR, Birmingham, was interviewed, at his request, stating that he had been in conversation with Attorney ART HANES, Birmingham, former defense counsel for subject RAY. AUSA TAYLOR related that the information set forth below, as obtained from HANES, was being passed on for whatever it might be worth.

TAYLOR stated that HANES contends that subject RAY had been engaged in transportation of weapons (rifles and other automatic weapons), and that the reason he was in Memphis was his interest in disposing of such weapons to black militant groups in that city. HANES contends that there had existed a conspiracy in the transportation of such weapons on the part of RAY whom he contends was operating with one JAMES ROBERT BLOW, formerly of Cahaba Heights, a Birmingham suburb, who is supposed to work for some printing company in Birmingham known as the P&L Printing Co., and according to HANES, BLOW had previously been charged in Jefferson County Court, at Birmingham, by Deputy Sheriff WALTER DEAN on some unknown charge, the status of which he does not now know. RAY and BLOW were supposed to have been engaged in their gun transportation details by one BOB LOVELESS, believed from Birmingham, one CLAUDE COCKRELL, believed to be a Memphis resident, and one JAMES CARLISLE, believed to be of Birmingham. to HANES' conjectures, BLOW and the others were obtaining these weapons through Pascagoula, Mississippi, implying that they were from out of the country.

Aside from the above, TAYLOR stated that during his conversation with HANES, that individual had mentioned that while he was employed by RAY, he had filed a motion in Memphis to observe the physical evidence, and noted that one rifle slug, which had been obtained from the body of the victim, was not mutilated to such an extent that it could not be identified by laboratory examination, although he had been informed that only partial fragments of the fatal bullet were recovered which precluded any positive identification.

As stated above, AUSA TAYLOR did not consider information furnished by HANES to be of material value, but stated that due to HANES' proclivity for publicity, he did not desire to be placed in the position of not having passed on to authorities any information furnished by HANES. He suggested that the Bureau may consider informing the Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms Division of the Treasury Department of information relating to instant transportation of weapons on the part of RAY, BLOW and others.

The Bureau is familiar with the fact that HANES is very closely allied with the UKA and previous information has been furnished to the Bureau that he received a sum of \$12,500 as an attorney for Klan members charged in North Carolina, and also met with UKA officials recently in Tuscaloosa, Alabama.


A file review of this matter fails to reflect any reference of individuals mentioned by HANES.

He cannot recall having ever met or having ever received correspondence from a John Hamilton Morris. A review of the files of the Letter Department of the Magazine failed to reveal that he ever received a letter from John Hamilton Morris.

He has never heard of anyone referred to as "Sig D" in connection with the James Earl Ray case and he has no knowledge of any statement being made that James Earl Ray was paid by "Big D".

He receives numerous "crank" letters which he deposits in the waste basket. No record is keept of these "crank" letters.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

On 11-13-69, CARL F. ZARTER, Administrative Assistant, U. S. Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas, advised that inmate JAMES HAMILTON MORRIS, #83856, was released to the custody of the USM on 9-11-69 to be produced in the USDC, Los Angeles, California. MORRIS has not as yet returned to Leavenworth. Authorities at Leavenworth are unable to anticipate his return. It is therefore suggested that the interview set forth in Phoenix communication for the Kansas City Division be handled by the Los Angeles Division. Los Angeles should be able to determine whereabouts of MORRIS through the USM's office in that area.

It is to be noted that the copy of the handwritten letter from MORRIS to GOLDMAN is barely readable. If Los Angeles decides a more legible copy is needed, it is suggested they obtain one from the Phoenix Office. Kansas City believes that the individual mentioned in the letter as Big D, who was apparehended in New Mexico two weeks ago is possibly ROBERT DE PUGH / head of the Minutemen organization, who is also currently incarcerated at Leavenworth Penitentiary. 44-1987-Sub-M-2008

Mrs. PATTERSON talked at great length about the information in her possession regarding Communist plots and threats against the Government. She also mentioned that she has corresponded with District Attorney JIM GARRISON at New Orleans, Louisiana.

Since it appears that Mrs. PATTERSON is a mental case, no investigation is being conducted and this is furnished for the information of Miami in the event she should contact the Miami Office.

JAMES EARL RAY; Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. - VICTIM

On December 1, 1969, John Hamilton Morris was interviewed at the Los Angeles County Jail, Los Angeles, California, regarding information contained in a letter written by him on July 22, 1969, to Peter Goldman, 444 Madison Avenue, New York, New York. This letter contained information that James Earl Ray was paid by "Big D".

Morris stated that he is a journalist, that as a journalist he has his sources, and that as a journalist he does not reveal the identity of his sources. Morris stated it was common knowledge that Ray was paid to kill Martin Luther King. Morris was asked to explain what he referred to as common knowledge. He said that everyone knew that the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) was behind the murder of Martin Luther King. He continued that the CIA backed the Minutemen and Robert De Pugh of the Minutemen. The CIA wanted King out of the way so it had De Pugh make the arrangements. Ray being a small time criminal, was selected to do the actual killing and CIA the brains behind the whole scheme. When De Pugh was no longer needed by the CIA, he was arrested. Morris said that this scheme is common knowledge.

Morris volunteered that he has been declared medically and criminally insane.

Records of Atascadero State Hospital, Atascadero, California, as of April 13. 1959, revealed that John Hamilton Morris, born at Martin, Michigan, was admitted to that hospital on September 22, 1958, as criminally insane. At that time, he had a criminal record dating back to September 26, 1940, and had over 20 arrests, including grand theft, car theft, mail fraud, postal loss, forgery, and money postal orders. These records reveal that Morris was not found criminally insane by this hospital and had been turned over to the court in San Mateo, California, for further action.

JAMES EARL RAY, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. - VICTIM

John Hamilton Morris appeared at U. S. District Court, Southern District of California, Los Angeles, on February 23, 1967, for jury trial. At the conclusion of the trial on February 24, 1967, Morris was found guilty of violation of Title 18, Section 2113 (a), U. S. Code. On March 20, 1967, Morris was sentenced to 15 years custody of the U. S. Attorney General.

Morris filed an appeal of this conviction April 21, 1969, before the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit. He based his appeal on his not having been protected under Title 18, U.S. Code, Section 4244, in that under this statute, the U.S. Attorney failed in his responsibility to move for a determination of competency where he had reasonable cause to believe the accused might be incompetent. His appeal argues that under the same section and by Constitutional mandate, it was incumbent on the court to order a determination of competency, where reasonable cause appeared to indicate the accused might be incompetent; said failure violated Morris's guarantee of due process under the Fifth Amendment of the Constitution.

The appellant further argues that the courtappointed coursel failed to provide that assistance guaranteed by the Sixth Amendment of the Constitutional rights of due process in the fair trial.

The final point of the appellant's argument is that the Court's sentencing procedure was both a failure of its statutory responsibility and an abuse of its discretion under Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 4244; and under 4208 (b) which provides for committment of the accused to the custody of the Attorney General for a period of time not to exceed six months, for the purpose of evaluation to assist the trial court in passing a meaningful rehabilitative sentence.

On July 28, 1969, Assistant U. S. Attorney Darrell Mac Intyre, Los Angeles, advised that on July 24, 1969, a decision was received from the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals that the conviction of John Hamilton Morris had been reversed.

JAMES EARL RAY, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. - VICTIM

Morris appeared at U. S. District Court, Los Angeles, and entered a plea of guilty to violation of Title 18, Section 2113 (a), U. S. Code. Trial was set for November 4, 1969. Morris was to be afforded psychiatric examination prior to trial date. As of December 9, 1969, the trial of Morris had not commenced.

The Los Angeles Herald Examiner, daily metropolitan Los Angeles newspaper, in its issue of July 5, 1968, carried an article on Page A-1 captioned, "Dynamite Hijack Try Just a Dud", datelined Las Vegas, Nevada (UPI). This article reported that a Federal prisoner identified as John Hamilton Morris, 48 of Martin, Michigan, tried to hijack a commercial airliner, July 4, 1968, by falsely reporting he had dynamite on his person. His high altitude plot failed completely.

The U. S. Attorney at Las Vegas was expected to take this incident before the Grand Jury and ask for an indictment charging Morris with attempted hijacking.

Judge to Rule Whether Ray's Solitary Confinement Is Cruel

NASHVILLE, Tenn. —
(UF1) — Does the solitary
confinement of James Earl
Ray, the convicted murderer
of Dr. Martin Luther King
Jr., constitute "cruel and
unusual punishment?"

This is what Federal Court Judge William E. Miller will be asked to decide Monday when Ray is whisked into court here amid tight security precautions.

Miller named the issue himself.

It's whether "Ray's present incarceration in solitary confinement constitutes the sort of cruel, unusual punishment which is prohibited by the Eighth Amendment to the Constitution," he said.

ON THE OTHER side of the argument, State Correc-

tion Commissioner Lake Russell has said it was in Ray's "best interest" that he be kept in maximum security until settlement of various suits brought in his behalf. Ray and his attorneys differ with the commission on his "best interest."

"I do not believe that I can withstand either mentally or physically this type of imprisonment much longer," Ray said in an afficavit notarized June 23, 1969.

One of his attorneys, Robert Hill Jr. of Chattanooga, compared Ray's imprisonment since his capture in London to Nazi torture.

IN AN emotionally worded brief dealing mainly with Ray's imprisonment in Memphis before his trail, Hill said:

"To systematically strip away all inner psychological defenses through nine, months of constant light,

sound and observation is as legally diabolical as many of the Nazi practices which we so often condemn."

The Chattanooga attorney was referring to Ray's constant surveillance by closed-circuit television cameras while in his cell in Memphis.

Ray said he was not asking to be let out into the regular prison population. However, he said he knew of jobs he could do that would make his exposure minimal.

THE STATE has said it would seek to prove that Ray's release from maximum security would endanger his life......

In his affidavit, Ray in ferred that one of his former attorneys, Percy Foreman and the prosecution at Memi

"I suggest if state officials wanted to keep me in maximum security cells as a form of punishment they should of took (sic) me before a jury and tried to get the maximum penalty instead of dealing with Mr. Percy Foreman," Ray said.

The convicted murderer has also charged that he was placed in maximum security in Nashville because he refused to give certain information to former State Correction Commissioner Harry S. Avery and the FBI.

He did not say what the Information was.

IN ANY EVENT, Avery

lington, may be required to appear.

The defense has filed a motion requesting that the former correction commissioner and the governor, along with a Vanderbilt University psychiatrist, be present. Miller said he would rule on the motion at the hearing.

When Ray walks into the eighth-floor courtroom in the Federal Building Monday, security will be tight.

U.S. Marshal Leon Campbell said that all persons would be searched before being allowed to enter the courtroom and, that after the hearing has started, no one would be allowed to enter the courtroom.

Ray has been in maximum security at the state prison here since March 11, the day after he pleased guilty in return for a 99-year sentence—to the King assassination.

He has been in cell No. 4. an isolated six-by-nine-food cubicle which is one of 41 cells in the maximum security building.

As the Bureau is aware, only one attempt has been made by Bureau Agents to interview the subject JAMES EARL RAY. This was an attempt made with Bureau approval by SAC ROBERT G. JENSEN shortly after RAY was transferred from the Shelby County Jail at Memphis, Tenn., to the Tennessee State Prison at Nashville, Tenn., following his plea of guilty to the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. The subject was uncooperative at that time, and it has not been deemed worthwhile to make any additional efforts to interview him.

The subject RAY was incarcerated under maximum security conditions at the Shelby County Jail while awaiting trial, was transferred to the State Prison with very elaborate security precautions, and has been kept in the maximum security building at the State Prison, all for the purpose of protecting him from both the general public and from other inmates. The State Prison System has been under the direction of two different commissioners during RAY's incarceration, and the prison at Nashville where RAY is confined has had two different wardens during RAY's incarceration. All of these persons have felt it necessary to keep RAY in maximum security in order to prevent his being murdered by other inmates.

Memphis will continue to keep the Bureau advised 44-1987-Sub-M-714

of all litigation on behalf of the subject RAY.
