Fatal Shot Not Close Range

WASHINGTON — New York City's chief medical examiner Tuesday ruled out any possibility that Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was shot at close range with a pistol or, in fact, from any area other than the boarding home across the street from the Lorraine Motel 10 years ago.

Dr. Michael M. Baden told the House Assassinations Committee King was killed by a single 30-06 caliber soft-nosed rifle bullet that could have been fired from the bathroom window of the boarding house or from a grassy area at its rear.

Baden failed to link the death bullet with any weapon, but did establish what investigators believe is an essential foundation to later expert testimony.

Meanwhile, James Earl Ray, confessed killer of King, goes on national public television to testify today. WKNO-TV (Channel

10) will televise his appearance from 8 to 11 this morning.

Rep. Harold Ford (D-Tenn.), a member of the investigating panel, predicted Tuesday Ray will testify through Friday.

Baden, a leading authority in the field of pathological and forensic medicine, headed a three-man panel appointed by the committee to examine autopsy findings of Dr. Jerry T. Francisco, Shelby County medical examiner 10 years ago, and the medical treatment given to King at St. Joseph Hospital following the shooting on April 4, 1968.

Baden, using illustrations of King's body after death, traced the trajectory of the bullet that shattered the right jaw, severed the spine and lodged in King's back.

He said given King's standing position

King Shot From Afar, Baden Says

on the balcony of the Lorraine, and other evidence, the bullet had to have been fired from the rear area of the boarding house at 416 Main in Memphis, directly across the street from the Lorraine.

But he said autopsy results cannot determine from a difference of a few degrees whether the bullet came from the bathroom window of the boarding house or the grassy area at the rear of the building.

"It had to be a rifle, and not a pistol?" Baden was asked by Rep. Richardson Preyer (D-N.C.).

"That's correct," Baden replied.

He told the committee the bullet clearly could not have been fired from the Lorraine courtyard below where King was standing.

Baden said the autopsy, combined with witness accounts, showed the bullet struck King as he was bending slightly forward. The bullet struck from the right and at an angle from above, he said.

"It is clear from the autopsy that one, and only one, high velocity bullet struck Dr. King," Baden said.

He said a firearms panel — expected to testify in November — can show severe tissue damage to King's body would easily have occurred from a 30-06 rifle shot from the boarding house.

Committee members reviewed a series of illustrations taken from medical photographs showing "extreme damage" to Dr. King's body.

There were no questions seeking to link the bullet to the death weapon.

An FBI ballistics expert has said he could draw no conclusions on whether the bullet came from the rifle Ray had purchased.

Baden said the panel — which also included Dr. John Coe of Minnesota and Dr. Joseph Davis of Florida — agreed in "general terms" with Francisco's autopsy findings.

Calling Francisco a "fine forensic pathologist," Baden said the panel did not unanimously agree Francisco went as far as he could in tracking the bullet's course through the entire body, only so far as to determine certain cause of death by the bullet.

Baden, almost apologizing for that fact, said it is an "unfortunate" fact in America that forensic pathology does not receive greater emphasis in the investigation of homicides.

He said Francisco apparently felt it was an "unnecessary mutilation of the body" to dissect the track of the bullet after he had concluded death occurred from a severing of the spinal cord.

Ford asked if the medical panel were satisfied that Francisco felt "no constraints" in his autopsy of King's body.

Baden said a policy in Tennessee of first

getting permission from next-of-kin before an autopsy is performed made it difficult to determine if there was "an attitude of constraint" in effect at that time.

But he told committee members Francisco assured the panel this policy "in no way caused any constraints."

Baden also praised Drs. Rufus Brown and Ted Galyon, the physicians who treated Dr. King at St. Joseph Hospital, for being "very cooperative" in the investigation.

He said the panel was "entirely inspired" by the vigorous effort the two men made to save King's life when he was brought to the emergency room.

"Only after almost an hour, 50 minutes, of this intensive medical treatment, did they determine Dr. King's life was irretrievable," he testified.

Committee members were told King died of extensive blood vessel and nerve injuries as well as massive damage to the spinal cord.

Baden said Galyon and Brown told the panel that when King was brought to the emergency room he was still alive.

"They both assured us that although they could feel a faint pulse ... that he was totally unresponsive ... that he did not talk at all ... that he was unconscious ... that they felt he was irretrievably dead," Baden said.

Still, the two men made "extensive" ef-

orts to save King, he said, before death was pronounced at 7:04 p.m. on April 4, 1968. King was brought to the emergency room at 6:15 p.m.

Saying the panel was "very impressed" with the cooperation of the various doctors interviewed, Baden said the panel thinks it has been able to reach "firm conclusions based on work done 10 years ago."

Ford, interviewed following the hearing, confirmed that Ray — flown by helicopter from Brushy Mountain State Prison at Petros to Knoxville and then to Washington — remained in Washington early Tuesday under tight security guard.

Ford, who has received a number of briefings concerning Ray's pending testimony, also said he believes Ray will "try to put on a show" when he testifies today.

"This is his last go-round," Ford said. "James Earl Ray might fire his lawyer tomorrow right here on this spot."

He said Ray will be expected to explain what he meant in a letter he wrote two weeks ago to Dr. Ralph Abernathy, the committee's first witness on Monday.

Abernathy told investigators Ray is pre-

pared to tell who gave him money to get out of Memphis and the country following King's murder — if he can get a new trial.

Lane accosted Ford in the hearing room following Baden's testimony to ask why panel members had not asked more specific questions about the trajectory of the death bullet.

He also invited Ford to attend his Tuesday afternoon press conference in which he repeated earlier statements that the committee had violated its own rules as well as broken the law, in its investigation.

"There was a conspiracy to keep you from getting the facts," he told Ford.

Ford stood quietly and listened as Lane talked. At one point he said, "I'd like to sit down and talk with you."

Ford did not attend the press conference and later had no comment about Lane's remarks.

Sources, meanwhile, report Renfro Hays, the Memphis private investigator for Percy Foreman, Ray's first lawyer, and Ed Redditt, the black former Memphis police officer who was removed from the King detail, the day of King's murder, both have been subpoenaed to testify on Thursday.

"I KNEW IT NEEDED TO BE DONE." WILSON DID NOT BELIEVE HE

WOULD HAVE TO SERVE MUCH TIME FOR HIS INVOLVEMENT, STATING
"I'M NOT SORRY I DID IT. THE NIGGERS ARE BETTER OFF."

LATER IN THE CONVERSATION WITH THE GLADDENS, WILSON SAID HE
WAS SORRY HE HAD DONE IT.

WILSON STATED HE HAD TALKED WITH THE MEMPHIS SHERIFF
BY PHONE AND WAS TO MEET HIM AT THE GULFPORT, MS., HOLIDAY
INN DURING THE MORNING OF 3/18/78. WILSON SPECULATED AS
TO WHETHER OR NOT HE WOULD BE PROVIDED WITH A TV IN HIS CELL
AND INDICATED HE PROBABLY WOULD BE GIVEN WORK AS AN
INSTRUCTOR OR REPAIRMAN OF WATCHES WHILE IN JAIL.

REVERTING TO THE KING ASSASSINATION, WILSON TOLD
THE GLADDENS THAT HE SHOT KING "NOT FROM 50 YARDS AWAY, BUT
50 FEET AWAY." HE WAS CLOSE ENOUGH TO SEE THE BULLET HIT

AND STATED SPECIFICALLY THAT "I SHOT THE BRIT OUT OF HIM AND
SAW IT FLY." WILSON NEVER MENTIONED TO GLADDEN THE TYPE OF
GUN HE ALLEGEDLY USED OR THE LOCATION FROM WHICH HE ALLEGEDLY
SHOT KING.

AT ONE POINT IN THE CONVERSATION WITH THE GLADDENS, WILSON APPARENTLY FEELING A DISAPPROVING GLANCE FROM GLADDEN'S 18 YEAR OLD SON, WARNED THE SON HE HAD BETTER NOT INTERFERE.

CONCERNING THE UNIDENTIFIED MEMPHIS SHERIFF, WILSON OFFERED TO FURNISH THIS INDIVIDUAL'S NAME AND TELEPHONE NO.

TO GLADDEN FOR VERIFICATION OF HIS REMARKS; HOWEVER, GLADDEN REFUSED. WILSON SAID HE HAD "GONE THROUGH TEN YEARS OF HELL, AND BECAUSE HE KILLED KING, IT ADDED 20 YEARS OF HELL; HOWEVER, HIS CONSCIENCE ONLY STARTED BOTHERING HIM IN THE LAST FEW YEARS.

APPARENTLY REFERRING TO A SKETCH OF KING'S KILLER, WILSON TOLD THE GLADDENS THAT IT WAS ALMOST AN EXACT LIKENESS OF HIM AND BECAUSE IT HAD RECENTLY SHOWN ON TV, HE DECIDED TO TURN HIMSELF IN. HE SAID HE HAD A SISTER IN FULTON, MS. (NOT FURTHER IDENTIFIED), WHO TELEPHONED HIM IN OCEAN SPRINGS TO SAY THAT THE SKETCH LOOKED JUST LIKE HIM. WILSON TOLD THE GLADDENS THAT HE HAD TELEPHONED VARIOUS FAMILY

MEMBERS TO LET THEM KNOW HE WAS TURNING HIMSELF IN.

WILSON ALSO STATED THAT HE, AT ONE TIME, INTENDED TO OPEN A WATCH REPAIR BUSINESS IN TUPLOO, MS., BUT DECIDED

AGAINST IT BECAUSE OF THE TENSE RACIAL SITUATION.

WILSON ALSO ONCE TOLD MRS. GLADDEY THAT HE GETS "FLIGHT PHYSICAL EXAMINATIONS" AT REESLER AIR FORCE, EILOXI, AS.

GLADDEY ADVISED THAT WILSON REPEATED HIMSELF MANY TIMES DURING THE ONE HOUR AND FIFTEEN MINUTE CONVERSATION ON 8/18/78, BUT HE PROVIDED NO FURTHER DETAILS CONCERNING THE KING ASSASSINATION, OTHER THAN THAT STATED HEREIN.

AT THE END OF THEIR CONVERSATION, GLADDEY ADVISED WILSON DEPARTED THE STORE IN HIS AUTOMOBILE AND HEADED IN AN EASTERLY DIRECTION. THE GLADDEYS WERE AFRAID AND DISTURBED AT THE CONVERSATION AND PROMPTLY TELEPHONED THE JACKSON FBI OFFICE.

GLADDEY ADVISED THAT TO THE BEST OF HIS RECOLLECTION DURING THE SHORT TIME HE AND HIS WIFE RENE WILSON, HE NEVER TALKED ABOUT HIS PAST, OTHER THAN TO MENTION THAT HE HAD BEEN IN THE U. S. AIR FORCE; HAD BEEN MARRIED FIVE TIMES, TWICE TO THE SAME WOMAN; HE GREW UP IN MISS.; AND HAD BEEN ON THE GULF COAST LESS THAN THREE MONTHS. THE GLADDEYS DO NOT KNOW WHERE HE CAME FROM OR WHAT HE HAS DONE PRIOR TO HIS ARRIVING AT THEIR PLACE OF BUSINESS 7/26/78.

GLADDEN ADVISED THAT IN HIS REGULAR BUSINESS AS SOCIAL SECURITY OFFICE MANAGER HE HAS PERSONAL DEALINGS ON A FREQUENT BASIS WITH PEOPLE HAVING MENTAL PROBLEMS AND WHILE HE IS NOT A QUALIFIED PERSON IN THIS FIELD, HE IS NOT OF THE OPINION WILSON HAS MENTAL IMPAIRMENT. HE DESCRIBED WILSON AS A WHITE MALE; 5 FT. 8 INCHES; 155 LBS; MEDIUM BUILD; REDDY COMPLEXION; GRAYING HAIR; AGE 46, WHO LIKES TO DRINK VODKA AND COKE.

ON 6/18/78, SHORTLY BEFORE NOON, WILSON TELEPHONICALLY CONTACTED GLADDEN ADVISING THAT HE HAD BEEN BETRAYED, THAT HE HAD BEEN TO GULFPORT, MS., HOLIDAY INN, ALONG WITH "THE FATHER" (NOT FURTHER IDENTIFIED BY WILSON), WHERE HE HAD SEEN PERSONS BELIEVED TO BE WITH THE FBI. HE WAS NOW BACK

AT HIS RESIDENCE WATCHING THE WINDOWS AND WOULD BLOW THE HORN OFF OF ANYONE WHO CAME, EXCEPT "THE FATHER."

ABOUT THREE HOURS LATER, MR. AND MRS. GLADDEN WERE SURPRISED TO SEE WILSON WALK INTO THEIR GIFT SHOP. HE WAS CLEAN SHAVEN AND NEAT. HE APPARENTLY HAD NOT BEEN DRINKING. HE IMPLIED HE HAD BEEN IN TOUCH WITH THE FBI, BUT THEY WERE NOT GOING TO DO ANYTHING TO HIM. HE HAD MADE SOME KIND OF

SAFARI. HE NOW WANTED TO LIVE A NORMAL LIFE AND ASKED IF HE COULD KEEP HIS WATCH REPAIR BUSINESS IN THE BACK OF GLADDEN'S STORE AS USUAL.

THE GLADDENS ADVISED WILSON THEY WERE SERIOUSLY CONTEMPLATING SELLING THE BUSINESS AND HAD ALREADY CONTACTED A REALTOR.

AT 6:20 PM, 8/10/78, FIVE FBI AGENTS ESTABLISHED PHYSICAL OBSERVATION AT THE HOLIDAY INN, U. S. HIGHWAY 58, CLIFTON, MO.

AT APPROXIMATELY 8:40 PM, A 1972 PLYMOUTH DARTING SHARON COUNTY, MO., LICENSE [REDACTED] STOPPED IN FRONT OF THE HOLIDAY INN AND A WHITE MALE, WHO LATER ACKNOWLEDGED THAT HE WAS BUSINESS ADVICE WILSON, JR., EXITED THE VEHICLE AND ENTERED THE HOLIDAY INN. THE WHITE MALE DRIVER OF THE VEHICLE IMMEDIATELY PARKED THE VEHICLE AND CAME TO THE ENTRANCE OF THE HOLIDAY INN, WHERE HE WAS APPROACHED BY SA BENJAMIN F. GRAVEL AND WAS ASKED IF HE WAS FATHER NOEL FARRON. HE ACKNOWLEDGED THAT HE WAS.

FATHER FARRON WAS ADVISED THAT GENE BARKSDALE, SHERIFF OF SHREVE COUNTY, MEMPHIS, TENN., WAS NOT GOING TO ASSIST

WILSON. HE WAS ADVISED THAT AGENTS OF THE FBI WERE IN THE HOTEL AND HE WAS REQUESTED TO TELL WILSON THAT THE SHERIFF WAS NOT GOING TO MEET HIM; HOWEVER, THE FBI AGENTS WERE AT THE HOTEL AND DESIRED TO TALK WITH HIM. IF HE, WILSON, WOULD AGREE TO TALK WITH THE AGENTS. FATHER FARNON STATED HE WOULD LIKE

TO TALK TO WILSON BECAUSE SHERIFF BARKSDALE HAD LINED ABOUT HIS APPEARANCE IN GULFPORT.

FATHER FARNON THEREAFTER ENTERED THE HOTEL AND TALKED WITH WILSON IN THE LOBBY. SHORTLY THEREAFTER, THEY BOTH

RETURNED TO THE SIDEWALK IN FRONT OF THE HOTEL AND SA GRAVES

IDENTIFIED HIMSELF TO WILSON AND ASKED HIM IF HE WERE SURELY AUGIE WILSON. HE ACKNOWLEDGED THAT HE WAS AND LATER STATED HE WAS A JUNIOR.

WILSON WAS ADVISED THAT SHERIFF BARKSDALE WAS NOT THERE TO MEET HIM, HOWEVER, FBI AGENTS WERE THERE AND DESIRED TO TALK WITH HIM, PARTICULARLY ABOUT HIS DAUGHTER SUPPOSEDLY HAVING DRIVEN A WHITE MUSTANG FROM NANNAS CITY, MO., TO MEMPHIS, TENN. HE STATED HE HAD NO INFORMATION TO FURNISH

THE FBI. WILSON INQUIRED AS TO WHETHER OR NOT HE WAS UNDER ARREST AND HE WAS ADVISED HE WAS NOT UNDER ARREST. WILSON

COMMENTED HE WAS NOT GOING TO GIVE ANYONE ANY TROUBLE. HE WAS ASKED IF HE HAD ANY WEAPONS ON HIM AND HE STATED HE DID NOT AND THAT SA GRAVES COULD SEARCH HIM IF HE SO DESIRED. WILSON WAS THEN "PATTED DOWN" AND NO WEAPONS WERE FELT ON HIS BODY.

WILSON COMMENTED THAT HE AND FATHER FANNON HAD BEEN TO THE MOTEL AT 9:00 AM, 8/18/78, AND AGAIN AT 3:00 PM, 8/18/78, TO SEE SHERIFF BARRSDALE AND THE SHERIFF HAD LIED TO THEM.

WILSON THEN ASKED FATHER FANNON IF HE WOULD DRIVE HIM BACK TO THE PLACE HE HAD BEEN PICKED UP AND FATHER FANNON AGREED TO DO SO.

WILSON WAS AGAIN ADVISED THAT FBI AGENTS WERE AT THE MOTEL AND WERE STILL WILLING TO TALK TO HIM AND HE REITERATED HE HAD NOTHING TO SAY TO THE FBI AND, AS HE DEPARTED, COMMENTED THAT THE FBI IN THE PAST HAD HARASSED HIS FATHER WITHOUT ANY EXPLANATION.

FATHER FANNON AND WILSON THEREAFTER LEFT THE AREA OF THE HOLIDAY INN IN FATHER FANNON'S VEHICLE PROCEEDING EAST ON HIGHWAY 90. A SURVEILLANCE WAS MAINTAINED OF THE VEHICLE.
