HARRIS does not ~~XXX~~ fit the description of the subject in the captioned matter, and teletype was sent to ident. division to compare fingerprints of SCHMIDT with the latents in captioned matter.

Ident, Division has not replied to date and it can be assumed that SCHMIDT is not identical to subject in this case.

Hunt Drags for Assassin of Dr. King

From Press Dispatches

An arrest in Missouri and reports of a manhunt in Mexico appeared Wednesday to add up to nothing in the search for the killer of the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., in Memphis Thursday.

An itinerant, 33 year old Baptist preacher was jailed Tuesday night in Joplin, Mo., for vagrancy and questioned in connection with the assassination. He cleared himself, however. He pleaded guilty Wednesday to vagrancy and was sentenced to three days in jail.

In Washington, the justice department denied that the investigation had been extended into Mexico.

The Mexican rumor started after Rolando Veloz, the Mexican consul in Memphis, told authorities that there was a resemblance between a composite sketch carried in a newspaper and a young man who applied for a tourist card the day before Mr. King was shot.

The young man turned out to be a 19 year old student at Memphis State university, Memphis police said. They said that what was thought to be a false address and phone number were those of his father in Park Ridge, Ill. They dismissed the possibility that he was connected with the case.

Meanwhile, the Memphis Commercial Appeal, in a front page copyrighted story Wednesday, said conspirators might have faked a series of police radio calls to confuse authorities after Dr. King was shot.

The story, written by George Bryan, said police radio reports of a car chase involving a white Mustang, like the one the slaying suspect was reported to have fled in — apparently were faked.

It should be further pointed out that SA MC MILLEN has no cases assigned to him involving Klan Members, Minute Men, rabble rousers, hate group members, or other individuals known to have violent proclivities. This agent handles primarily student left wing activities at the University of Wisconsin (UW) Madison, Wisconsin.

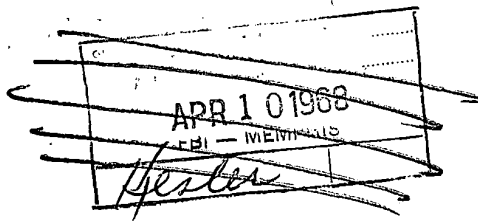

Attached are r.d. 302's covering interview of NOBLE JENSEN and CAPT ROMAN RAPPERT of Menasha P.D.

C of P. LESTER CLARK, Menasha P.D. advised 4/11/68 that NOBLE JENSEN, an auxiliary policeman who is an amateur photographer and an auxiliary policeman had been one of 14 auxiliary policeman assigned along with members of his Dept to security for the appearance of DR MARTIN LUTHER KING at the Fox Valley Center U of Wis Menasha 5/12/67. He noted DR KING and REV ABERNATHY had come to Menasha by chartered plane from Wausau, Wis. on the afternoon of the speech and after staying briefly at the Club Terrace Motel had gone to the Center for the speech and a press conference, after which he recalled they immediately left the area by chartered plane, presumably for Chicago. The speech was sponsored by the Center and in addition to seats in the auditorium seats were also sold or given out for seats in other rooms in the Center to which the speech was transmitted by closed circuit t.v.

He advised that after an artist sketch of the killer suspect in this case had appeared in the Milwaukee Sentinel, JENSEN had noted a resemblance to a man whose picture he had taken at the Center. He stated officers of his Dept viewed the picture and were unable to identify the persons pictured in the front row other than a man and his wife, that JENSEN indicated he had been told by CAPT RAPPERT to photograph three men but there are 4 in the row who are strangers to the officers. He noted however that college students from outside the Menasha-Appleton area attended Dr KING's speech in numbers.

He stated that after talking to RAPPERT and other officers who were at the Center that night he has received no indication that anyone other than RAPPERT has any knowledge of JENSEN being asked to take a picture of these persons. He stated RAPPERT was unable to recall any more details of the incident referred to.

He advised that on the evening of May 12, 1967 he had, along with other members of the Menasha auxiliary police been assigned to security for the appearance of MARTIN LUTHER KING at the U of Wis. Fox Valley Center, R.F.D. ⁴³Menasha.

He stated that just prior to the beginning of the speech of KING he had been told to take a picture of three ~~persons~~ men sitting in the front row in the Cafeteria room of the Menasha Center to which room the speech of Dr KING was being beamed by closed circuit television. He noted he takes pictures as a hobby and ~~always~~ takes pictures of the functions of the auxiliary police. He stated he is quite certain he was told to take the pictures by CAPT RAPPERT of the Menasha P.D. and that at the same time he was told the person to be photographed were strangers and had come in a car with California license plates.

He stated that he recognized a man and woman sitting in the front row whom he knew slightly but not by name and 4 other persons, three young men and one older well dressed man whom he did not know. ⁴⁴He then took a picture of the the entire row. He noted that the 3 persons were not particularly pointed out to him and that they could have included the older man and two of the younger men or all three of the younger men.

He stated he had no indication that these men were not in sympathy with KING
 * and took the picture only because he was told to do so. He made it available.

Man Quizzed in King's Slaying

Joplin, Mo. —AP— A hitchhiker arrested and booked for vagrancy was questioned by the federal bureau of investigation Tuesday night in connection with the assassination of the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., Joplin police said.

Detective Capt. Walter

Flenner said the man bore a slight resemblance to a nationally broadcast description and a penciled portrait of the man sought by the FBI in the slaying last Thursday.

Police said they picked up the hitchhiker in Joplin on a tip by a woman at a motel. He

told police he had been in Springfield, Mo., and was trying to hitch a ride to Tulsa, Okla.

The man identified himself as Lynn R. Cleveland, 33, a Baptist evangelist from St. Louis, and said he was a native of Palmer, Tex.

Police said he carried several religious pamphlets from Ozark, Ala., Harrison, Ark., and Memphis. Police in Memphis said they did not know of the man and had no hold order for him. St. Louis police said he had no record there.

Hunt Drags for Assassin of Dr. King

From Press Dispatches

An arrest in Missouri and reports of a manhunt in Mexico appeared Wednesday to add up to nothing in the search for the killer of the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., in Memphis Thursday.

An itinerant, 33 year old Baptist preacher was jailed Tuesday night in Joplin, Mo., for vagrancy and questioned in connection with the assassination. He cleared himself, however. He pleaded guilty Wednesday to vagrancy and was sentenced to three days in jail.

In Washington, the justice department denied that the investigation had been extended into Mexico.

The Mexican rumor started after Rolando Veloz, the Mexican consul in Memphis, told authorities that there was a resemblance between a composite sketch carried in a newspaper and a young man who applied for a tourist card the day before Mr. King was shot.

The young man turned out to be a 19 year old student at Memphis State university, Memphis police said. They said that what was thought to be a false address and phone number were those of his father in Park Ridge, Ill. They dismissed the possibility that he was connected with the case.

Meanwhile, the Memphis Commercial Appeal, in a front page copyrighted story Wednesday, said conspirators might have faked a series of police radio calls to confuse authorities after Dr. King was shot.

The story, written by George Bryan, said police radio reports of a car chase involving a white Mustang — like the one the slaying suspect was reported to have fled in — apparently were faked.



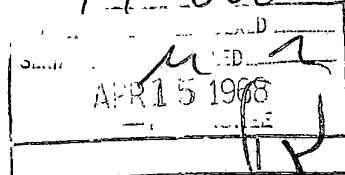

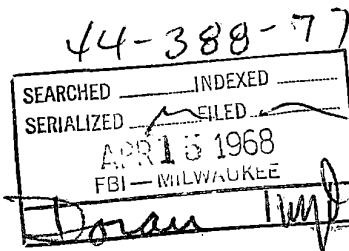
