

Hunt Drags for Assassin of Dr. King

From Press Dispatches

An arrest in Missouri and reports of a manhunt in Mexico appeared Wednesday to a d d up to nothing in the search for the killer of the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., in Memphis Thúrsday.

An itinerant, 33 year old Baptist preacher was jailed Tuesday night in Joplin, Mo., for vagrancy and questioned in connection with the assassination. He cleared himself, however. He pleaded guilty Wednesday to vagrancy and was sentenced to three days in jail.

In Washington, the justice department denied that the investigation had been extended into Mexico.

The Mexican rumor started after Rolando Veloz, the Hexican consul in Memphis, told authorities that there was a resemblance between a composite sketch carried in a newspaper and a young man who applied for a tourist card the day before Mr. King was shot.

The young man turned out to be a 19 year old student at Memphis State university, Memphis police said. They said that what was thought to be a false address and phone number were those of his father in Park Ridge, Ill. They dismissed the possibility that he was connected with the case.

Meanwhile, the Memphis Commercial Appeal, in a front page copyrighted story Wednesday, said conspirators might have faked a series of police radio calls to confuse authorities after Dr. King was shot.

The story, written by George Bryan, said police radio reports of a car chase involving a white Mustang like the one the slaying as peur was reported to have fled in apparently were faked.

Attached are r.d. 302's covering interview of NOBLE JENSEN and CAPT ROMAN RAPPERT of Menasha P.D.

C of P. LESTER CLARK Mena sha P.D. advised 4/11/68 that NOBLE JENSEN, an auxiliary policeman who is an anateur photographer and an auxiliary policeman had been one of 14 auxiliary policeman assigned along with members of his Dept to security for the appearance of DR MARTINLUTHER KING at the Fox Valley Center U of Wis Mena sha 5/12/67. He noted NR KING and REV ABERNATHY hadcome to Menasha by chartered plane from Wausau, Wis. on the afternoon of the speech and after staying briefly at the Club Terrace Motel had gone to the Center for the speech and a press conference, after which he reclled they immediately left the area by charteredplane, presumably for Chicago. The speech was sponsored by the Center and in addition to seats in the auditorium seats were also sold or given out for seats in other roomsin the Center to which the speech was transmitted by closedcircuit t.v.

me advised that after an artist sketch of the killer saspect in this case had appeared in the Milwaukee Sentinel, JENSEN had noted a resemblance to a man whose picture he had taken at the Center. He stated officers of his Dept viewed the picture and were unable to identify the persons pictured in the front row other than a man and his wife, that JENSEN indicated he had been told by CAPT RAPPERT to photograph three men but there are 4 in the row who are strangers to the officers. He noted however that college students from outside the Menasha-Appleton area attended Dr "ING's speech in numbers."

He stated that after talking toRAPPERT and other officers who were at the Center that night he has received no indication that anyone other than RAPPERT has any knowledge of JENSEN being asked to take a picture of these persons. He stated RAPPERT was unable to recall any more details of the indident referred to. 2 JDO

NOBLE JENSEN, 2333 Pallisades Drive, Appleton, Wis. advised that he is employed at Wisconsin Tissue Mills, Menakka, Wis. and is an auxiliary policeman with the Menasha Police Dept. He advised that on the evening of May 12,1967 he had, along with other members of the Menasha auxiliary police been assigned to security for the appearance of MARTIN LUTHER KING at the U of Wis. Fox Valley Center, R.F.D. Menasha.

He stated that just prior to the beginning of the preech of KING he had been told to take a picture of three Makazaraxax men sitting in the front row in the Cafeteria room of the Menashs Center to which room the speech of DrKING was being beamed by closed circuit television. He noted he takes pictures as a hobby and always takes takes pictures of the functions of the aucliiary police. He stated he is quite certain he was told to take the pictures by CAPT RAPPERT of the Menasha P.D. and that at the same time he was told the person to be photographed were strangers and had come in a car with California license plates.

He stated that he recognized a man and woman sitting inthe front row whom he knew slightly but not by name and 4 other persons, three young men and one older well dressed man whom he did not know. We then took a pricture of the the entire row. He noted that the 3 persons were not particularly pointed out to him and that they could have included the older man and two of the younger men or all three of the younger men.

Hunt Drags for Assassin of Dr. King

, From Press Dispatches

An arrest in Missouri and reports of a manhunt in Mexico appeared Wednesday to add up to nothing in the search for the killer of the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., in Memphis Thursday.

An itinerant, 33 year old Baptist preacher was jailed Tuesday night in Joplin, Mo., for vagrancy and questioned in connection with the assassination. He cleared himself, however. He pleaded guilty Wednesday to vagrancy and was sentenced to three days in jail.

In Washington, the justice department denied that the investigation had been extended into Mexico.

The Mexican rumor started after Rolando Veloz, the Mexical consul in Memphis, told authorities that there was a resemblance between a composite sketch carried in a newspaper and a young man who applied for a tourist card the day before Mr. King was shot.

The young man turned out to be a 19 year old student at Memphis State university, Memphis police said. They said that what was thought to be a false address and phone number were those of his father in Park Ridge, Ill. They dismissed the possibility that he was connected with the case.

Meanwhile, the Memphis Commercial Appeal, in a front page copyrighted story Wednesday, said conspirators might have faked a series of police radio calls to confuse authorities after Dr. King was shot.

The story, written by George Bryan, said police radio reports of a car chase involving a white Mustang—like the one the slaying suspect was reported to have fied in—apparently were faked.
