Who Killed Martin Luther King?

WHO STOOD TO PROFIT?

You will recall that King first came to notice in 1955, as head of the Montgomery Bus Boycott launched by Mrs. Rosa Parks. Mrs. Parks was a student at the Highlander Folk School, which was organized with the help of Don West, then district director of the Communist Party of North Carolina, and which was of course a Communist training school -- cited as such by several government agencies. And King ran the boycott as head of the Montogomery Improvement Association, which had been formed by the Rev. Fred Shuttlesworth, who is a former convict, says the Joint Legislative Committee on Un-American Activities of the State of Louisiana, and "has been affiliated with several communist-front organizations."

Another former convict is Bayard Rustin, who in 1953 was arrested by the Pasadena Police Department for homosexual activities. The "Allen-Scott Report" for August 16, 1963, reports that in 1936, as a college student, Rustin joined the Young Communist League, "and was active in its operations on the campus and elsewhere"; and that in World War II, he was arrested for making speeches opposing our war against Hitler, and served twenty-six months in federal prison.

And in 1955 he became Dr. King's "secretary." In March, 1957, at a meeting in Atlanta, they formed the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. The meeting probably couldn't have been called in February, because Mr. Rustin, Dr. King's secretary, was then attending the sixteenth national convention of the Communist Party.

The president of SCLC was of course the Rev. Dr. King. The vice-president of SCLC was the Rev. Fred Shuttlesworth. And Shuttlesworth later also became the new president of the Southern Conference Educational Fund -- which has been described by three government agencies as a department of the Marxist Conspiracy. It was organized by Communists, is run by Communists and is the most important Communist organization in the South.

Mr. Carl Braden has served as field director and has been named under oath as a Communist Party member. His wife, Anne, an SCEF official, has also been named under oath as a Communist.

Mr. Braden is a former convict, of course.
You have to be to get anywhere in the Movement.
While in Louisville, he was convicted of a felony—a little matter involving some dynamite.

Mr. Aubrey-Williams was SCEF president until 1963. In April, 1954, he was named under oath as a Communist. It was Williams, a Communist, whom Shuttlesworth -- King's vice president -replaced as president of SCEF, a Communist organization.

And there was James A. Dombrowski, executive director of SCEF, who has also been named under

oath as a Communist Party member.
On October 7, 1958, Dr. King wrote a letter to Anne Braden, in which he urged her and her husband Carl -- both already well known as Communists -to become permanently associated with his SCLC.

And on August 16, 1960, King wrote the following letter to Communist Dombrowski: "Dear Jim, This is just a note to acknowledge receipt of your letters of recent date. We, too, were more than happy to have you in our home, the fellowship was very rewarding. I will expect to hear from you when Bishop Love returns to the country. At that time we can set the date for an Atlanta meeting. Very sincerely yours, Martin."

In fact, King actually filed an affidavit in federal court in New Orleans, strongly supporting Dombrowski and SCEF -- and refused to repudiate the affidavit even after being shown proof that he was actually a Communist.

Indeed, a photograph exists which shows Martin Luther King along with Anne Braden, Carl Braden and James Dombrowski (the last three all identified Reds), the back of which reads as follows in Dombrowski's handwriting: "The 6th Annual Conference of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Birmingham, Alabama, September 25 to 28, 1962."

And there is a check, issued by the Southern Conference Educational Fund, signed by James A. Dombrowski, and dated March 7, 1963, to the order of Martin Luther King, in the amount of \$167.74, with a notation on it: "New York ex--- and Dr. King's endorsement on the penses'

The Louisiana Committee on Un American Activities concludes that the Southern Christian Leadership Conference -- founded by Dr. King -is "substantially under the control of the Communist Party through the influence of the Southern Conference Educational Fund and the Communists who manage it."

There is also the fact that on the Labor Day weekend of the year 1957, in a speech at the Communist Highlander Folk School, King called Com-munist Aubrey Williams "one of the noble personalities of our times," and had his picture taken with Abner W. Berry, of the Central Committee of the Communist Party.

And there is Hunter Pitts O'Dell, who was exposed in 1956 as a southern district organizer for the Communist Party, in 1962 as a member of the National Committee of the Communist -- and as late as the summer of 1963,

was still employed by Dr. King to help run the

In fact, we read in the BOSTON GLOBE of April 15, 1964: "Official warnings have again been given to King about another, even more important associate who is known to be a key figure in the covert apparatus of the Communist Party. After the warnings, King broke off his open connection with this man, but a second-hand connection none the less continues. . . ."

And last September, the nationally syndicated "Allen-Scott Report" revealed that "the FBI has unimpeachable evidence, including photographs, showing that King is now listening to a man who. . has been one of the Communist party's biggest money raisers in this country." He it was apparently who wrote King's statement in April, 1967, at the UN, that Congress is "wild with racism"; and his statement later in the year, at his SCLC convention, that he U.S. is the "greatest surveyor of violence in the world today."

Dr. King of course was the inventor of "non-

Dr. King of course was the inventor of "non-violence." What actually was "nonviolence?" How did it work? Well, in "Saturday Review" for April 3, 1965, he tells us:

"1. Nonviolent demonstrators go into the streets to exercise their constitutional rights.

"2. Racists resist by unleashing violence against them,

Americans of conscience in the name of decency demand federal intervention and legislation.

The Administration, under mass pressure, initiates measures of immediate intervention and remedial legislation.

Now remember, this isn't my idea. This is straight from King himself. And observe that according to Dr. King himself, the violence that usually occurred in one of his demonstrations wasn't unexpected, wasn't to be avoided, wasn't something to be sorry about. It was exactly what he wanted. It was the point to the whole Production.

It was in fact, said Dr. King, the only reason for a "non-violent" demonstration; to generate more pressure on the Congress to institutione collec-

"For weeks", explains NEWSWEEK of March 22, 1965, "Martin Luther King had been escalating his Selma voter-registration campaign toward the state he calls 'creative tension' -- the setting for a paroxysm of segregationist violence that can shock the nation to action. . . . '

"The Negroes' rationale in folding night marches," explains the "New York Times" of February 24, 1964, "is to provoke the racist ele-

rebruary 24, 1964, "Is to provoke the racist element in white communities to show its worst."

So King's "nonviolence," to repeat, not only wasn't in any way an attempt to avoid violence -according to King himself, violence was an inescapable, essential, desirable part of it. "Nonviolence" meant only that King himself did not use the violence -- he caused it, the provoked it, finally forcing "racists" -- everyone who doesn't own a pair of sandals and doesn't seed a bath -either to lie down and die or to retailate, so that either to lie down and die or to retaliate, so that King could play the innocent victim. "Nonviolence" in short was nothing else but a demonstration of dialectical materialism, the pseudoscience invented by Marx, according to which Marxists advance by controlling both sides of the conflict; by advancing a thesis, which provokes an antithesis -- a reaction by reactionaries -- a struggle which produces a synthesis, which becomes a new thesis, and

continues until the complete victory of Socialism, "In short," said King in "Stride Toward Free-(New York Harper & Row, 1958, pp. 94-95), "I read Marx as I read all of the influential historical thinkers -- from a dialectical point of view, combining a partial yea and a partial no. . . . The Kingdom of God is neither the thesis of individual enterprise nor the antithesis of collective enterprise, but a synthesis which reconciles the truths of both."

So the ironic truth is that King contributed to his own murder. For in Memphis he was once again applying his philosophy of "nonviolence," was he not? Once again, he was trying to provoke violence according to stage 2 of his tactics.

And he succeeded. And what were the "immediate intervention and remedial legislation" King was after according

to stage 4? In the Selma March, for instance, in 1965, the violence he provoked according to stage 2, followed on schedule by the sympathy of stage 3, caused the lightning passage of the "voting rights" bill, under which the federal government grabbed from the states power to register voters -- the point being, of course, that in any dictatorship, whether Communist or Nazi, all the power must be centralized.

And soon King's organization will launch his "Poor People's March" on Washington. The plan as you know envisions the actual interruption of Congress unless "poor people" are handed about \$100 billion -- which would be used as usual to recruit, train, finance and defend the Communist gangs which are destroying our country, through the 'war on poverty." For such an amount of course you have to put on a good show. You need some really bloody "nonviolence."

And where is it all heading? What is the goal? Suppose the "Poor People's March" does manage to

interrupt Congress. Suppose in fact that so many "poor people" physically occupy the government, that the government is paralyzed and cannot function. What would we have?

What we would have, of course, is the Russian Revolution. We would have a coup -- the seizure of our government by "nonviolence"; by force. Now imagine once again that you are one of the small band of rich, educated and not at all oppressed conspirators secretly running the communization of America. And once again you are looking down from your skyscraper in New York. Your scheme to create a race war is going very well. You are sorry you had to wait so long, of course -- you remember wishing years ago that you could im-mediately indulge your great love of killing -- but you knew that Americans of both colors had to be properly prepared. So you began with something Americans could be sold: "nonviolent integration," and you used a clergyman named King to sell it -to capitalize on the fact that black Americans have sometimes been the victims of injustice -- and to sell it so as deliberately to create the bitterness

But now it's 1968, and your scheme is going very well. There's lots of beautiful killing and blood, "Watts was glorious," you said, if you happen to be Herbert Aptheker. Now you no longer need to bother with such nonsense as "integration." Yet at the same time, you have serious problems. Your use of King is being more and more exposed. His use of violence is becoming understood. Everybody says he is becoming unpopular. In fact, he is turning from an asset into a liability. "Reaction-aries" are preventing the passage of important Communist legislation. King is doing his best, but you are having difficulty, for instance, getting that \$100 billion.

Suppose King were violently removed? You ask yourself. You no longer need him -- so suppose he were brutally murdered as part of his next demonstration of dialetical materialism. That would be the ultimate in "nonviolence." With one 30.06 bullet you could blame "white racism," as usual, restore King's reputation, further accustom Americans to martial law, pass your Communist legislation -- and at the same time notify your troops around the country that "nonviolence" is dead, too, and should be replaced by guerrilla

So you call in your shooters and you order the hit. Observe the first results of the murder. Riots and looting raged for a week, making Americans of both races furious. Many feel great sympathy for the victim. And in New York, Nelson Rockefeller was able to ram through a \$6 billion "urban renewal' program which lets the state intervene over the heads of the mayors.

Rockefeller participated by the way in a memorial march for King, arm linked with Charles Kenyatta, head of Harlem's Mau Mau Society -named for the Communist terrorists of Kenya. Whether or not Kenyatta is just another psycho, I don't know, but he specializes in appearing in public with a machette on which a Bible has been

In fact that's what he was carrying when Rocke feller took his arm.

And in Washington, Johnson's forced housing bill was passed. When the Communists grabbed Russia, they naturally also grabbed housing, using the welfare of workers as the excuse. They didn't say they were doing it for black people because no black people are there. They said that everyone had the 'right'' to a certain living space, and moved those who had less in with those who had more. Remember that no black people were involved -- everybody who was, was as white as the Governor of Mississippi -- so those who resist weren't racists, were they? They resisted because the point as always was not to establish "racial justice," but to control the population. And Party members and sympathizers naturally got the best.

The same thing will now begin to happen here. This is why we must continue telling the truth about Martin Luther King; not for revenge, or just to destroy a phony reputation, but because of the use to which his murder -- like that of John F. Kennedy -- is being put. So who killed King?

The fact that Ramsey Clark heads the investiga-

tion is suspicious enough. If and when Clark ever presents a suspect, you can bet we will be told that he is a "right-wing

extremist." So what should Americans do now?

1) Demand that we be told all the facts and that the investigation continue until King's killers are found. Then we might as well also find out who killed Medgar Evers, blew up the four little black girls in that church in Birmingham in 1963, and

helped Communist Oswald kill Kennedy. 2) Refuse to be intimidated. King was almost entirely a creation of public relations -- of a bunch of liberal reporters, most of them white. Like the barrage of publicity after the Kennedy assassination, the current propaganda is designed not only to advance Communism but to demoralize the opposition -- to make Americans uncertain and guilty. In fact, on Long Island, for instance, hoodlums stoned automobiles whose drivers refused to turn on their headlights "for the King." say, the growing number of Americans of both colors aware of what King really was, and really was doing, will not be given coverage on CBS. You are not as alone as that net work would have you

3) Continue telling the truth -- explaining that "free handouts" are nothing but the bait of dictators; that the trouble in this country isn't caused by black people, but by the small band of criminals-most of them white -- who have been framing them; and that the "civil rights movement," which now has taken the life of Martin Luther King, was designed from the beginning to enslave us all.

This week there is a full page ad in the Chronicle that we feel has no place in any paper and particularly this pager. The one we refer to of course is the one which purports to tell a story about Martin Luther King. The reason we do not feel it should be running in this paper is that (1) we cannot see how any good can come of it; (2) we doubt the accuracy of some of the statements contained in it, and (3) we feel that it is an attempt to impugn reputations through guilt by association.

We wish to make one point crystal clear. While we may disapprove heartily with some of the views expressed in several of the columns, the editorial cartoons and some of the advertising, we still believe that others have a right to be heard, no matter how violent the disagreement. We will never knowingly print anything that is scandalous or libelous, and we will hever knowingly print anything we know to be untrue. We believed there was some question in the case of the Martin Luther King ad this week and so we asked a lawyer who said he did not believe it was libelous. So, we printed it, even though we disagree with it and disapprove of its message. Voltaire is supposed to have said "I may disapprove of what a man says, but I will defend to the death his right to say it". No such extreme measure is needed right now, but we do believe that such an attitude is essent at to freedom.

Mr. OTIS stated that the only way that these applications could be processed would be if at the time the application is received, they are individually processed and the information furnished to the Milwaukee Office at that time. Inasmuch as he advised that it was not possible to retrieve previous applications, he was not requested to process current applications with a view to informing the Milwaukee Office.

The following efforts were made by SA REMS J. DUMAINE to identify the individual using GOLDMAN's gas credit card who had been picked up by the Chicago Police Department but had been released; as a matter of police cooperation.

On 5/20/68, Sergeant JAMES CASTEN, General Assignment, Review Section, Chicago Police Department, advised that based on the information available, he could not identify the person allegedly using GOLDMAN's gas credit card who had been arrested by the Chicago Police Department and released. Sergeant CASTEN suggested that appropriate personnel at Area #5 General Assignment, Chicago Police Department, be contacted since the Shell Station address, 4233 Armitage Avenue, would fall within that area's jurisdiction.

On the same date, Lt. JAMES O'NEILL, Commanding Officer, Area 5, General Assignment, advised that without

knowing the name of the complainant, it would be extremely difficult to locate the case number for the original offense that is, the purchases on March 3 and 11, 1968. He said that this case number would have to be obtained since if anyone was arrested by the police department on that charge, it would have been listed within that case number. He said that either Detectives W. HICKEY or J. ZACHARIAS, of his Command, might have handled the matter because they are the officers he usually assigns credit card cases to.

On 5/21/68, Detective WILLIAM HICKEY advised that he thinks he recalls the original report from the Shell Station and would make an effort to locate it. He further advised, however, that he could not recall anyone being arrested for this offense. Subsequently, on 5/22/68, Detective HICKEY advised that he was unable to locate any CB number for a fraudulent credit card purchase on the dates indicated at a Shell Station on Armitage Avenue. He also advised that he had discussed this matter with the various detectives assigned to Area 5 with negative results. He did suggest, however, that Detectives ZACHARIAS be contacted.

On 5/27/68, Detective ZACHARIAS advised that he had no record nor recollection of either the original offense or of anyone being arrested and released on a fraudulent credit card use in Area 5.

Due to the manner in which the Chicago Police Department maintains its records, it would be physically impossible, based on the information furnished, in Milwaukee airtel of 5/16/68, to identify the individual supposedly using GOLDMAN's gas credit card who had been picked up and then released by the Chicago Police Department. Accordingly, for that reason and for the reasons set forth in referenced Chicago airtel, no further investigation being conducted into the identity of the assailants of MARSHALL GOLDMAN.

In above referenced communication, the Bureau directed that all offices should contact the Bureau of Vital Statistics or similar agency in their States to cover the possibility that subject may have died since the commission of the crime. It was also pointed out that if no central record repository is maintained, appropriate inquiries relative to unidentified dead should be made during the course of normal business with appropriate agencies and reasonable investigation should be pursued.

In an effort to broaden this coverage, Dr. SAMUEL GERBER, Executive Secretary-Treasurer, National Association of Coroners and also coroner, Cuyahoga County, Cleveland, Ohio, who has cooperated with this office in the past and of whom there is no derogatory information, was contacted and he advised he is presently the Executive Secretary-Treasurer of the National Coroners Association. Dr. GERBER advised that this group consists of approximately 2400 members throughout the country. He stated that he has access to the addressograph plates and he would be most happy to make these plates available to circularize the Bureau's Identification Order to the various members.

Dr. GERBER stated that in his opinion, if the Identification Order would be accompanied by a short letter from the Director, indicating that this was being done with the cooperation of the National Coroner's Association, it would create much more interest in the recipients of the letter and would obtain a higher degree of cooperation and awareness as to the contents.

In cooperation with the National Association of Coroners, I am enclosing an Identification Order which contains the name, aliases, description and fingerprint classification of James Earl Ray, who is wanted in connection with the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King.

I would appreciate your bringing the information and photographs contained in this Identification Order to the attention of your staff and request that they remain on the elert for a possible identification of James Earl Ray by them during the course of their employment.

Should any information come to your attention in this matter, I would appreciate your notifying the FBI Office nearest you as noted on the back of the enclosed Identification Order.

Thanking you for your cooperation, I remain.

Dr. GERBER stated that as a rule, only bodies that have met with violent deaths or have not been identified are taken to the morgue in Cuyahoga County, Ohio. However, he stated that many individuals who have died of natural causes do pass through a coroner's office where there is no physician available to sign the death certificate.

Dr. GERBER stated that many decreased do not pass through a coroner's office or medical examiners office when the death certificate is signed by a physician. In such cases, the body goes directly to a mortician. Dr. GERBER stated that the Executive Secretary for the National Funeral Directors Association is HOWARD RATHER, Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Recommendations and Requests:

- 1.) Bureau will furnish the Cleveland Office with 2500 Identification Orders #4182, along with Bureau approval for Cleveland to circularize this Identification Order with a letter from the Director as set forth above.
- 2.) At Milwaukee, Wisconsin: Will contact HOWARD RATHER, Executive Secretary, National Funeral Directors Association, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, in an effort to see if it is possible to utilize mailing list of members for circularization of Identification Order. This contact will be made subsequent to 6/6/68, UACB.
- 3.) Will consider furnishing National Headquarters of American Dental Association, dental chart of JAMES EARL RAY if available from records of Missouri State Penitentiary, and circularize same to members of the American Dental Association.

Story Of FBI's Search For Dr. King's Killer

By DREW PEARSON and JACK ANDERSON WASHINGTON — T

FBI's failure to apprehend the assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King has led to reports that J. Edgar Hoover is not interested in catching the murderer. The reports are based partly on the fact that Hoover and Dr. King were not on good terms, Hoover having publicly branded Mr. King as "the most notorious liar in the world."

We have checked into the operations of the FBI in this respect and are convinced that it is conducting perhaps the most painstaking, exhaustive manhunt ever before undertaken in the United States. Ginen have checked every ball ever patronized by James Earl Ray, every flophouse me ever stopped at, every cantina in Mexico he ever visited. It has collected an amazing array of evidence, all linking Ray with the murder.

That he has not been found may be due, first, to the possibility that he himself was murdered by those who hir d him to kill King; or, second, that he is hiding in some remote Mexican village.

If he has money—and apparently he had—Ray might be able to live in a distant part of Mexico indefinitely. The Mexico City police are atficient and co-operative, but police in the remote areas are not. In some villages few Mexicans can read or write, and radio news of the outside world does not penetrate.

What the FBI has establisted about King's assassin was that he was a professional killer who had studied the suspense writing of Ian Fleming and Ayn Rand. His pseudonym, Eric Starvo Galt, for instance, was taken from both authors.

Yet, while a student of crime he was also a bungler. For he left behind the murder rifle with his fingerprints on it and, wrapped around the rifle, a bedspread which contained strands of his hair. He also left behind a blue zipper bag containing a brush with hair matching those on the bedspread.

Probably Hired

ALL THE evidence we have been able to gather points to the probability that Ray was hired to kill Dr. King. He broke out of the Missouri State Penitentiary on April 23, 1967, after boasting to fellow prisoners that he intended to make a big "score" on the outside. He remarked to one inmate that he might try to collect a rumored \$1 million bounty that supposedly had been offered by a "businessmen's group" for the death of Dr. King.

Four months later, on Aug. 30, 1967, he opened a safe deposit box in the Birmingham Trust National Bank and suddenly began passing out crisp \$20 bills like a big spender. He plaid \$499 for dancing instruction, then quit after only a few lessons. He spent \$395 for mail-order photographic equipment that he didn't know

he to operate.

He shelled out money for a bartending course, but showed no interest in working behind?

He also took a course in lock-picking from a correspondence school in Michigan. His white Mustang cost \$1,995, which he paid in cash He drove it from Mexico to Montreal, from Los Angeles to New Orleans.

Occasionally he slipped \$20 to bar girls and prostitutes. In Mexico he lived with a prostitute in small towns like Jalisco and Puerto Vallarata where prices were cheap Once he posed in sun glasses for a picture with his Mexican prostitute. In Los Angeles, he advertised in the hippie newspaper that he would like to meet "a passionate married womai." He also paid \$1 to the Swinger's Club for the names and addresses of five girls.

All told, Ray spent an estimated \$10,000 in seven months. Yet he never held a job, and committed no crimes following his escape from the Missouri Penitentiary, that the FBI has discovered. Previously he had been involved in a long list of filling station and other robberies. But after his escape he became a loner, in some respects became another Lee Harvey Oswald. Meanwhile, he sought to establish a new identity as Eric Starvo Galt.

Long Planning

It seems likely that Ray planned the murder of D King for several months. He finally purchased the Reming(Indicate page, name of newspaper, city and state.)

ton rifle in Birmingham on March 30, then moved to a boarding house in Atlanta. In his room, agents found a map of Atlanta with four locations circled.

They were Dr. King's residence, his headquarters at the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Ray's boarding house and the spot where he abandoned his Mustang after the murder. In the middle of the map was a clear thumbprint from Ray's right thumb.

Evidently, Ray changed his mind about waylaying Dr. King in Atlanta and followed him to Memphis instead. After all the elaborate planning new identity, Ray left behind bindeulars and a bag full of toilet articles.

If white extremists put up the blood money it was probably not the Ku Klux Klar or the Minute Men, for they are an impatient lot who would not have waited for several months for Ray to get results.

Black extremists have also not been ruled out. They might have sought to get rid of Dr. King in order to remove the prophet of nonviolence.

Ray was the product of a broken home. He was the eldest of eight children. His father deserted Ray's mother, and various people adopted the children. When the FBI approached the father, they and the careful creation of a new identity, Ray left behind in Hemphis the murder rifle, years. "I would be the last one he would come to for help," the father said.







On 5/7/68 Shelby County GJ, Memphis, returned a secret indictment charging JAMES EARL RAY with murder in the first degree, Chronological listing of subject's activities from 4/67 to 4/68 set forth and reflects he resided briefly at Montreal, Province of Quebec, Canada. He traveled to Birmingham, Ala., purchased a 1966 Ford Mustang, then traveled to Puerto Vallarta, Jalisco, Mexico, for a brief residence, and then to Los Angeles, Calif. Subject made 2 round trips by automobile from Los Angeles to New Orleans and in 3/68 established residence in Atlanta, Ga. Using the name HARVEY LOWMEYER, a Remington, Model 760, rifle was purchased 3/30/68 Birmingham, Ala. At 6:00 P.M., 4/4/68 Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., was shot and killed by a single bullet fired from the bathroom of a nearby rooming house while he was standing on the balcony of the Lorraine Motel, Memphis.
