US Lawyer: Ray to Fight Charges

London, England (AP)—James Earl Ray's American lawyer visited him for the first time Friday in a British prison and said afterward Ray would make a court fight against charges of slaying the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr.

"If this man comes to trial, if he's the man, he will plead not guilty. A plea of not guilty will be entered," Arthur J. Hanes of Birmingham, Ala., told newsmen at his London hotel.

He also said that Ray's health and mental attitude were good.

Hanes, denied the chance to see Ray during his first visit here last month, returned from Birmingham Friday after learning that British permission for a visit had been granted.

Accompanied by Michael Eugene, Ray's court appointed British lawyer for the extradition proceedings here, Hanes spent 35 minutes in an interview room of Wadsworth Prison with Ray. The British lawyer had to be with him because Hanes has no status as a lawyer in this country.

The Alabama lawyer carefully avoided telling newsmen how he might plot Ray's defense.

"I will not try this man in the newspapers," he said. But he did indicate he probably would fight any prosecution move for shifting the trial from Memphis, Tenn., where the Negro civil rights leader was shot down last Apr. 4.

"Most of the other citizens of the United States have television and they have got a barrage of information on this case everywhere. I see no point in a change of venue," he said.

Asked about reports he might go for an insanity plea, he stressed that this was "just one of a hundred possibilities" under study.

He also insisted on referring to his client as Ramon George Sneyd, although a British magistrate has held that the prisoner's identity as Ray has been proved. Hanes said it would be up to the prosecution to prove it again in an American court.

He added that he had received three letters from the prison signed "R. G. Sneyd." In general, he said, they covered the man's request for legal representation and for an interview with the American lawyer.

"I have never seen this man before today," Hanes added.

Hanes was questioned sharply by reporters on who was paying his fee. Some suggested he was handling the case for publicity — which he denied — or out of political ambition.

To that, Hanes snapped: "I would not swap places with the governor of Alabama for all the tea you have in England." His client, he said, "gave me the impression he could meet my fees."

The lawyer did not elaborate but added: "No organiza-

tion has contacted me, no organization has paid me. I expected to get paid. I have faith.

King Case Witness In Police Custody

Memphis, Tenn. —AP—Charles Q. Stevens, identified as a key witness against James Earl Ray in the slaying of the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., has been taken into protective custody.

"He wasn't as impressed at the danger as police and the district attorney general's staff were," a source said in confirming that Stevens had been talked into submitting to protective custody.

Ray is expected to appeal the London court's order that he can be extradited to the United States. It was during the extradition hearing last week that an attorney said Stevens saw Ray in the rooming house from which police say the fatal bullet was fired.

Appeal Date Set for Ray Extradition

London, England -UPI- A British court said Tuesday that it would hear James Earl Ray's appeal against extradition to the United States on July 29.

The surprise announcement was made when Ray appeared at Bow Street magistrate's court on charges of violating British gun and immigration laws. He is accused in the United States of assassinating the Rev. Martin Luther King.

Ray was ordered to appear again July 16 to answer to charges of carrying a loaded .38 caliber pistol and two forged passports, on which he was arrested June 8.

It was expected that Britain might ignore the charges if Ray is to be extradited.

Ray, whose extradition was ordered a week ago, appeared in court Tuesday to meet a British legal requirement that prisoners appear before a magistrate every eight days while they are held.

The announcement on the extradition appeal was unexpected. The appearance Tuesday was supposed to deal only with the gun and passport charges, which it took less than a minute to dispose of.

Ray Appeal Expected July 29

London, England - An appeal of the extradition ruling against James Earl Ray, 40, will be heard on Monday, July 29, before the divisional court of the high court, it was learned Tuesday. The date was set by mutual agreement between court officials and British lawyers representing Ray, whom the United States is seeking to extradite to face charges of murdering the Rev. Martin Luther King jr. Michael Eugene, Ray's British solicitor, has not yet filed the actual appeal, which takes the form of an application for a writ of habeas corpus, but he is expected to do so on or by July 17, the deadline date.

Complaints were received from other guests as to their misconduct. She further recalled that RICHARD KARR played a guitar during the time that he lived at the hotel. She had no information as to KARR's residence or employment at this time but did recall that he was originally from Beaumont, Mississippi, as that is her home town also. She said she did not know him or his parents during the time she lived in Beaumont, but during conversation with her he mentioned that he was from Beaumont and this fact stuck in her mind.

Inasmuch as RICHARD KARR's current whereabouts is not known at this time and since HEEDERIK's identification of JAMES EARL RAY was based upon a brief meeting with an unknown individual who did not identify himself approximately one year before the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY appeared in the paper, no further efforts are being made by the Jackson Division to locate KARR and attempt to identify the person with KARR in HEEDERIK's room, UACB. The fact that HEEDERIK was at the time an alcoholic and acquaintances of his at that time did not consider him reliable is of significance in evaluating his information.

One copy of this communication is being furnished the Milwaukee Division for their information since it is possible they may have further contacts with DELBERT HEEDERIK.

HEEDERIK as long as they did was the fact that his father felt sorry for him. He said that one day he did not show up for work and that was the last they ever saw him. They received information from some source that he was deceased.

Mr. OBERLIE advised that he would be skeptical of any information furnished by HEEDERIK and would not consider him to be a reliable individual because of his use of alcoholic beverages.

Mrs. EVIE HOLDER, owner and manager of Holder's Hotel, 1801 22nd Avenue, advised she is personally acquainted with DELBERT HEEDERIK and he rented the front room on the second floor on the southeast corner, which would be Room 201, from them for a number of months. Since he was there for a number of months, she was unable to verify the exact dates of arrival or departure but did locate records showing that he was a guest in the hotel as of 4/26/67. She recalled that he came to them from Pass Christian, Mississippi, and he was later evicted by them. His eviction was the result of his drinking, which they do not tolerate in the hotel and the fact that he claimed he could not sleep and would play his radio and records all hours of the night. He was not the type guest they like to have in the hotel. She added that she could not state if any information furnished by him would be reliable or not but she would be inclined not to believe him and it would depend on his condition at the time he furnished the information, and whether he had been drinking.

Mrs. HOLDER further advised that she had located records showing that RICHARD KARR occupied Room 205 in the hotel as of 5/9/67. This room would have been two rooms down the hall from HEEDERIK's room.

She recalled that KARR was living at the hotel the same time as HEEDERIK and that they were also friendly with one another and would visit in each other's room.

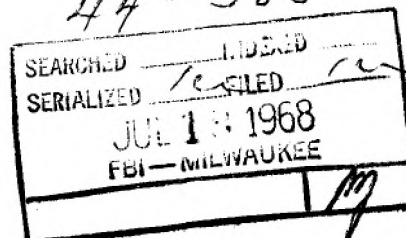

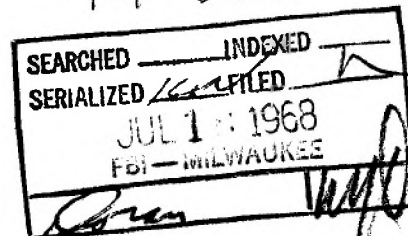

Ray Agrees To Return to US for Trial

London, England — James Earl Ray Tuesday abandoned his legal fight against extradition from Britain.

A British lawyer for the accused assassin of the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., said Ray probably would be sent to the United States Thursday or Friday.

A legal informant said Ray signed a statement declaring he would not press the British high court appeal against a magistrate's court order issued July 2 extraditing him to the United States.

The statement was signed in an irregular hand, "Ramon George Sneyd," the alias under which he has been held here since his arrest at London airport June 8.

Ray's American lawyer, Arthur J. Hanes, jr., of Birmingham, Ala., is flying to London in hopes of accompanying Ray back to the United States. Hanes is due in London Wednesday morning. Ray is expected to be on a plane to the United States within a day after that.

He will be sent home under heavy guard, probably on a

special aircraft, either an American military plane or a civilian jet chartered by the United States government. Then he is to be turned over to authorities in Tennessee for trial in Memphis on charges of assassinating the Negro leader there last Apr. 4.

Ray's statement, signed Tuesday morning during a conference with his court appointed British lawyer, cut short a complicated legal case.

Court Clears Ray's Return to Memphis

London, England - UPI - A magistrates' court Thursday dismissed two British charges against James Earl Ray, clearing the way for his extradition to the United States to face trial for the murder of the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr.

London's chief metropolitan magistrate, Frank Milton, took just 60 seconds to hand down his decision.

Ray was arrested on the charges — possession of a fraudulent passport and unlawful possession of a loaded weapon — June 8 at London's Heathrow airport.

Milton's dismissal of the charges "sine die" — indefinitely — cleared the way for Home Secretary James Callaghan to sign the extradition order handing Ray over to United States authorities for return to America.

Earlier, a United States embassy spokesman said he did not know yet of any definite plans for transporting Ray back to the United States.

Unofficial reports said a United States air force transport was standing by at Heathrow, a United States air base west of London, to take Ray and an escort of marshals to Memphis, Tenn., where the Ne-

gro civil rights leader was shot April 4.

There was no official word whether the United States government would allow Ray's Alabama attorney, Arthur J. Hanes, sr., to accompany his client on any return flight.

Hanes, former mayor of Birmingham, contends that Ray's civil rights will be in danger if he is left alone with United States agents.

Ray, Hanes said Wednesday, "is innocent and we want to get back to Memphis and prove this as soon as possible."

Security arrangements are being rushed at the Shelby county jail in downtown Memphis. Ray will be lodged in an interior cell in the jail once he is returned.

Lawyer: Ray Set to Prove His Innocence

London, England -UPI- The Alabama lawyer for James Earl Ray said Thursday Ray did not kill the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., and wanted to "get back to Memphis and prove this as soon as possible."

The lawyer also accused the United States justice department of violating Ray's "constitutional rights."

Arthur J. Hanes, Ray's lawyer, explained to newsmen why Ray abandoned his fight against extradition to the United States to face the murder charge.

"This man is innocent and we want to get back to Memphis and prove this as soon as possible," Hanes said.

Hanes lashed out at the United States justice department for refusing him permission to accompany Ray back to the United States. He said that both he and Ray had asked the justice department to let them return together but that the United States embassy in London told him the justice department refused.

"This is totally unfair, ridiculous and violates my client's constitutional rights," Hanes said. He said Ray was afraid of traveling alone with United States justice department agents.

The former Birmingham mayor said he had no idea when Ray would return to the United States. A British home office spokesman said the extradition papers for Ray would likely be signed Thursday.

Hanes said the reason Ray decided not to appeal the British court decision to extradite him was that he wanted to return to the United States quickly.

Ray's British lawyer, Michael Eugene, said the two British charges against Ray would be left "on the file" for adjourned without setting a date for future action.

Ray Pleads Not Guilty

Memphis, Tenn. —AP— James Earl Ray pleaded not guilty Monday to a charge of assassinating the Rev. Martin Luther King, jr., here Apr. 4. Trial was set for Nov. 12.

Appearing publicly for the first time since his extradition hearings in London, England, Ray entered his plea through

his lawyer, Arthur Hanes of Birmingham, Ala.

Security officers searched persons who entered the Shelby county criminal courtroom to witness Ray's arraignment, which took 12 minutes.

Hanes had both indictments read — one alleging murder in the first degree and the other charging Ray with carrying a dangerous weapon.

At the end of each reading, Hanes said: "My client wishes to enter a plea of innocent."

Judge Preston Battle had told Hanes that a plea did not have to be entered Monday, but Hanes responded, "We will enter a plea to the indictment." Ray remained silent throughout the arraignment.

On 9/27/68, the writer received an anonymous telephone call from an unidentified male, who advised that a girl by the name of DENNIS, who supposedly knew the writer, was going to be killed at the Royal Hotel Bar over the weekend of 9/27-29/68. The caller stated that DENNIS is a former dope addict and has gone back "on the needle." He stated that she is presently living with a Negro male by the name of GENE HARRINGTON on Wallace Street (no such street) in Milwaukee. The caller stated that she was going to be "bumped off" for "running off her mouth" concerning Negro people and the MARTIN LUTHER KING slaying.

DYRELL DENNIS came to the attention of the Milwaukee Office during April, 1968, in connection with captioned case. She was reportedly a girl friend of JAMES EARL RAY in the Hollywood, California, area. DENNIS was interviewed on several occasions by the writer and with SA's JOHN J. MARKEY and JAMES E. MC DERMOTT, as well as with members of the Special Assignment Squad, Milwaukee Police Department. In connection with these interviews, background information was developed that DENNIS was "at large" from the Half Way Project of the Norco State Hospital (narcotics hospital), Norco, California.

On 9/27/68, the above information was furnished to Officer DYNISEK (ph) of the Vice Squad, Milwaukee Police Department, who advised he would see that information concerning any attempt to kill DENNIS was placed in the right hands. He also stated that the Vice Squad would attempt to locate DENNIS and bring her in for questioning concerning her narcotics sources. The writer advised the Vice Squad

This Case Is Not Closed

James Earl Ray's plea of guilty in the assassination of Martin Luther King should not be allowed to close the book of criminal investigation into that terrible event. The clues to a possible conspiracy, involving others in Ray's guilt, were not explained away in his trial. Instead he breathed new life into them himself.

The justice department in Washington insists that it is still working on the conspiracy theory, but it did not challenge the stated belief of the local prosecutor that the guilt was Ray's alone. And defense counsel took the same position only to be contradicted by his own client, when Ray volunteered to the court the single, unexplained remark that he "can't agree" with the denial of a conspiracy.

It is, of course, an extremely difficult case for the authorities, and it may be unjust even to wonder whether the search for the whole truth has possibly been mismanaged, in view of Ray's statement. But there was the original complaint by the FBI, when he was still a fugitive, charging a two man plot. And the nature of that flight, aided by passports and hideouts and funds and travel arrangements to several foreign countries, seems unlikely without cohorts who knew what they were doing and why.

The assassination remains a challenge to the skill of the FBI and to the diligence of the justice department. The facts have not been told. This week's developments make a mockery of justice.
