Inquiries at Westgate Cleaners and Laundry and White Brothers Dry Cleaning, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, ascertained these two companies do not utilize the Thermo Seal machine.

J. C. FOX, Thrifty Cleaners and Laundry, N. W. 1st Avenue, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, advised that his cleaners has five outlets which utilize the Thermo Seal Machine, however, the laundry mark 02(D2)-B-6, is not utilized by his company. He suggested that if the garments were obtained they be looked at under a black light to ascertain if any cleaning invisible markings appear. He pointed out that prior to installing the Thermo Seal machine, his company utilized invisible markings.

# 60 Miamians Join Crowd At Services

ATLANTA — For threescore bus riding Miamians, the first 660 miles to Atlanta were the easiest.

The last four piles slowly on foot through the sunbaked streets of this capital city, were the hardest and saddest.

Walking behind the coffin of Martin Luther King, resting on an old wooden muledrawn farm wagon, they sang the familiar chants of marches past.

And when it was all over and the final tributes had been paid, they began the trip back to Miami with a glimmer of hope, for their nation and their own city.

"Maybe this will be remembered," said J. T. Southall, a Miami school teacher who had once felt the sting of a policeman's billy club during a King march in Montgomery.

The bus ride to Atlanta, sponsored by the Florida Council on Human Relations ended in the already busy downtown sector at 8:55 a.m., 13 sleepless hours after the two buses left Miami.

"Yow," said Augie Vanden Bosch, FCHR's state director, "there's a feeling of unity here — at least for now." THEY HAD crossed the Georgia border at 1 a.m., stopping at Valdostas and again two hours later in Albany. The return to Georgia, where some once had flived, and others had relatives, brought no elation.

At the Albany terminal, many got off the bus to stretch legs.

"They're not serving food — you can just go in and pick up coffee," a white bus driver at the station told the predominantly Negro passengers.

Later, he was seen in the little eatery in the back of the old terminal — munching a hamburger and french fries.

"Georgia is a great place to be away from," somebody said.

In Atlanta, the passengers decided to make a 20-minute stop at the downtown bus terminal, then go directly to the Ebenezer Baptist Church, two miles away, where the march would start after noon.

"We wanna get there as fast as possible — this is too far to come to worry about breakfast," they said.

AT 10 A.M., they were part of th throng that stretched along Auburn St., west of the church. Most of the Miami contingent first climbed an old wooden ladder and stood on a reoftop a halfblock from the church.

The church was already

The church was already closed to the public and the celebrities had already begun to arrive.

Some of the Miamians slipped down the ladder to get a closer look.

In front of the church, there was an angry ripple when someone yelled: "They're not letting Stokely in."

"Let him in — he's a black man," a young Negro shouted.

"They're just making him wait until the family gets in," a lady jammed against one of the police motorcycles said.

ON THE was ride eather, dawn had begun to light up the misty fields at 6 a.m., showing flowering dogwood and abandoned shacks. Few could sleep for more than an hour or so during the night.

Two housewives talked late into the night. Earlier there had been little talk of Martin Luther King, just time-killing bus conversation about jobs, child rearing, school teaching, gossip.

Now the ladles talked about poverty in the promised land.

"I know my children are gonna see the promised land, I know it," one said.

"You remember," her friends inswered, "how we once had to get up and give a white man a bus seat—we've come a long way."

EYRON MILLER, Foreman, Prather's Laundry, Naples, Florida, advised he uses a Thermo-seal Identification Machine and Thermoseal Taperolls made by the Textile Marking Machine Company, Inc., Syracuse, New York. He stated the code O or D2B-6 is not one of his codes and has never been. He stated he uses only numbers. He at one time, years ago, used the letters of the week at the beginning of the code to show what day the item was processed but now he uses different colored tapes. Red is used only to show a special. The Machine is Model M5Ll Serial No. 31793. Model M5Ll SN 31631 not used.

Samples of 0 and D2B-6 were run on the above machine and it was noted that depending on how the machine was operated resulted in the first part of the letters0 and D being cut off. MILLER stated that if the machine is operated fast, the first letter is many times partially cut off. We stated this does not mean the machine is faulty. We also stated that all of these machines he has ever seen have differents size type on the first three and last two or three characters.

Mrs. BILL MENDRY, Manager, advised the above machine came from the main office, Prather's Laundry and Dry Cleaning Company, 1828 Evans Ave., Ft. Myers, Florida. She stated she has had this machine for several years and Ft. Myers would be able to tell where they originally get this machine. She stated she has never seen the code 0 or D 2B - 6 and does not know if Prather's in Ft. Myers would use such a code or not. She stated she uses only numbers in her code.

Same of the samples taken from the machine are enclosed for information. It is pointed out that the machine also stamped out the code when operated properly so that the 0 and the D were not cut off. No samples were taken from other machine which is not in aperation.



Search of premises believed occupied by Unsub who assassinated Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING on 4/4/68, disclosed suitcase in which was located tee-shirt and undershorts bearing laundry mark on red tape with black lettering believed to be thermoseal type, manufactured by Textile Marking Machine Co., Inc., Syracuse N. Y. The tape is  $\frac{1}{4}$ " wide and 1 1/16" long and bears letters and numbers O2B-6.

Experts at Textile Marking Machine Company advise type on this machine is unusual in that the first two characters are 15 point type and the last three characters are 18 point type, with the middle character, the letter B, probably being narrow rather than regular type. The usual machine carries 15 point type for the first three characters and 18 point type for the last two characters

Textile Marking Machine experts also stated this machine is defective in that it is producing a tape 1 1/16" long instead of 1 1/8" long and is not projecting the tape far enough resulting in cutting off a portion of the first letter. The code used in the Northeast part of the U.S. is as follows:

The first letter O stands for lot number; the first number 2 indicates the day of the week, two being Tuesday; the second letter indicates the first letter of the store name, this is the letter B; the last number is the bundle number, this is 6 Color coding of the tag may designate various things such as a different month or the identity of a store in a chain. Experts also state the use of this system on laundry items is unusual in that the system is normally used on garments being dry cleaned

The Bureau has instructed that all textile machines using this type tape be located and machines using this code be identified.
