

Dixie Highway. While servicing a 1967 red Mustang last evening he recalled the driver of this vehicle closely resembled the photos of ERIC GAULT appearing in the Miami Herald for 4/18/68.

The above described Mustang bore 1967 Iowa license plate 3681. This number was preceded by the vertical numbers "89". The driver did not leave the vehicle and "had a funny look on his face." He asked for a dollars worth of gas and rolled up the window although it was very warm outside. He had sandy-brown hair and was wearing a "recently grown CLARK GABLE style mustache."

Judge Hits 'Censor' In King Case

An Orange County circuit judge today accused the U.S. Department of Justice of gagging the FBI in connection with the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King.

Judge Richard H. Cooper told the Coral Gables Lions Club there are "dangers to the public interest resulting from such a policy of secrecy and censorship."


Cooper said the public has a right to know any information which would lead to the positive identification, the prompt apprehension, the speedy trial and the sure conviction of the criminal responsible for Dr. King's murder.

Cooper, a candidae for the State Supreme Court in the May 7 primary, asked:

"Following the arrest of anyone, how will America be certain that the real killer or killers have been brought to justice, if all the factual information we are given is a 'no comment'?"

FBI-Calls Death Of-King-a Plots

Galt-Is Accused

'Brother'
Linked As
A Partner

WASHINGTON — (UPI)
— The Federal Bureau of Investigation declared-Wednesday that Martin Luther King was the victim of a conspiracy to kill him. It named 36-year-old Eric Starvo Galt as a partner in that conspiracy and issued a warrant for his arrest.

The announcement by Attorney General Ramsey Clark was the first official confirmation that officials believed that the slaying of King in Memphis, Tenn., on April 4 was the result of a conspiracy and not the work of one man acting alone. Clark had first ruled out a plct.

A few hours after the FBI announcement, Memphis authorities charged Galt with first degree murder.

The FBI said the conspiracy to kill King involved at least one other man, an individual whom Galt apparently had once referred to as his brother.

It said the plot originated on March 29 — seven days before the slaying — and that Galt was reported to have been in Memphis on the day of the slaying and the day preceding.

The FBI had named Galt in a lookout bulletin last week in Florida but withdrew the bulletin four hours later, saying it had been released in error.

The FBI portrayed Galt as a poorly educated loner with a taste for country and western music, vodka, beer and dancing. It said he spoke with diction reflecting a rural background and that he claimed to have worked as a cook on Mississippi River vesses and as a merchant seaman. He had taken lessons in dancing and was a graduate of a bartending school.

The FBI statement, said Galt paid cash for a 1966 white Mustang in Birmingham, Ala., on Aug. 30, 1967, and drove 19,000 miles between then and when it was found abandoned in Atlanta April 11.

Without explaining how it knew, the FBI said Galt drove the car to Los Angeles, New Orleans, Birmingham and Mexico before going to Memphis and, after the killing, to Atlanta.

The FBI made public two photographs of a man it identified as Galt and said he used the aliases "Harvey Lowmyer" and "John Willard." In one photograph his eyes were closed; in the other, a print of the first, an FBI artist had sketched in opened eyes.

But the FBI refused to say where or how it got the picture or detailed information about Galt's activities, some of it dating back four years. The announcement was handed to reporters at the Justice Department and no questions were permitted.



Peter Cerpes, Galt's former landlord who once identified him from sketches of the man seen running from the scene of the assassination, said "I don't think so" when asked if the photographs were of his former tenant.

Others in Birmingham who had identified the sketches as Galt said they were not satisfied Galt was the man shown in the photographs.

Joseph H. Gamble, special agent in charge of the FBI in Birmingham, insisted of the picture was of Galt. "It's him all right," Gamble said. He said the picture was taken this year — "in March, I think."

In legal language, the FBI complaint filed in Birmingham charged that Galt and the other man "entered into a conspiracy which continued until on or about April 5, 1968, to injure, oppress, threaten or intimidate Martin Luther King Jr."

"In furtherance of the congpiracy," the FBI charged, Galt purchased a rifle in Birmingham on or about March 30.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said a .30-06 caliber rifle equipped with a telescopic sight was found near a rooming house on South Main St. in Memphis immediately after King was shot. The rooming house overlooks the Lorraine Hotel where King was staying.

Hoover said FBI agents had determined that the rifle and telescopic sight had been purchased from an unidentified gun dealer in Birmingham.

The FBI did not say that the gun was the murder weapon.

Galt was described as a white man, between 5 feet, 8 inches and 5 feet, 11 inches in height, weighing between 160 and 170 pounds, with a medium build. He was said to

be a neat dresser. The FBI said Galt had brown hair which he wore in a brush cut, blue eyes, a straight and narrow nose, and straight and clean teeth. It said he had given his birth date as July 20, 1931.

The fugitive was further described as having a nervous habit of occasionally pulling at an earlobe with his hand. His left ear protrudes farther from his head than his right, the FBI said.

The FBI said Galt should be considered armed and dangerous.

Earlier information in the case suggested strongly that Galt's identity was carefully contrived seven months before King's murder to help disguise the real killer.

Under this theory, Galt first began establishing an identity for himself on Aug. 16, 1967 when he rented a room at a boarding house at 2608 Highland Ave. in Birmingham.

On Sept. 6, 1967, Galt and the boarding house manager, Peter Cherpes, went together to get Galt an Alabama driver's license. Galt told authorities then that he had a Louisiana driver's license but lost it and that he was an unemployed shipyard worker, his last job being at Ingalls Shipbuilding Co. at Pascagoula,

However, checks of Louisiana records and employment records with Ingalis, as well as Merchant Marine, Coast Guard and Seaman Union records found no trace of Galt.

Later in September, Galt received a prepaid package in the mail from Chicago. Cherpes said it weighed 20 to 25 pounds and was about two feet long and one foot wide.

Cherpes says Galt told him the next day that the box contained the wrong merchandise and he was going to send it back.

In October, Cherpes said, Galt gave him one week's rent in advance and said he was going to Mobile, Ala., to find a job. Employment records in Mobile showed no signs that Galt searched for or found work there.

Cherpes said Galt told him he would not be back but that he expected a letter from Chicago and wanted Cherpes to hold it for him. Cherpes said he never saw or heard from Galt after Oct. 7, 1967.

In late February or early March, Cherpes said, the Chicago letter for Galt came. Cherpes held it for a week then returned it in the mail, he said.

While in Birmingham, Galt kept a safe deposit box at the Birmingham Trust National Bank. The FBI belives Galt used money from it to buy a 1966 white Ford Mustang last Aug. 30 from a car salesman, William D. Paisley of Birmingham, for about \$2,000.

The same kind of car was seen fleeing from the Memphis flophouse after King was shet. A Mustang impounded in Atlanta by the FBI last Thursday was registered to Galt in Alabama.

ROOD was interviewed at 1827 S. U. S. #1, Vero Beach, Fla.

ROOD indicated that at the time he was residing in Vero Beach, Fla., since late 1/68, he has taken no overnight trips outside the State of Ma.

He indicated that on 4/4/68, he may have been at the Public Library in Vero Beach, Fla., or at O'Hare's Business Machine Company in Vero Beach.

On 4/12/68, Mrs. MARGARET SSARGENT, ROOD's mother, and Mr. MURRAY SARGENT, ROOD's stepfather, both of whom reside at 1827 S. U. S. #1, Vero Beach, Fla., were interviewed separately. Each advised that THOMAS ROOD had spent every night at the above residence since he first came to live with them in late January, 1968. They recalled that he had slept late on the morning

on 4/4/68, and that he had eaten dinner with them on the evening of 4/4/68. They also recalled that he had spent the evening of 4/4/68, watching television in his room.

On 4/15/68, Mrs. BETTY ROGERS, Librarian, Vero Beach Public Library, advised that she is acquainted with THOMAS ROOD. She stated that in recent weeks he has frequently visited the library. She advised that she does not recall whether or not he was in the library on April 4, 1968. She stated that he did not withdraw any books on 4/4/68, but that he frequently came to the library without withdrawing books.

She further advised that it was very possible that he may have been at the library on the day in question.

On 4/15/62, JACK O'HARE, Manager, O'Hare's Office Machine Store, 1422 20th St., Vero Beach, Fla., advised that he had rented an adding machine to Mrs. MARGARET SARGENT, the manager of Sargent's Antiques, which is an antique store on Highway #1, south of Vero Beach. He advised that Mrs. SARGENT's son had picked up the rented machine and to the best of hisrrecollection this had been on 4/4/68. He stated that he could not be sure of the exact date because of the fact that no written record was made of the transaction.

In view of the above investigation it appears that THOMAS ROOD was not in the Memphis, Tennessee area on 4/4/68, and therefore can be eliminated as a suspect.

No further investigation is being conducted concerning ROOD UAC.

Mystery-Man Galt Charged In Slaying

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — (AP)
— The mysterious Eric Starvo Galt has been charged
with conspiracy and murder
in the assassination of Dr.
Martin Luther King Jr.

The FBI said in a fugitive warrant issued last night in Birmingham, Ala., that Galt, 36, conspired with a man "whom he alleged to be his brother" to violate King's civil rights.

The state charge of firstdegree murder was filed against Galt in Memphis

where King, 39, Nobel Prize winning civil-rights leader, was shot to death on a motel balcony April 4 by a sniper who fled from a nearby rooming house.

First-degree murder in Tennessee carries the death penalty although the electric chair has not been used in the state since 1960.

The maximum penalty under the federal charge of conspiracy to violate a person's civil rights is a \$5,000 fine and 10-year prison sentence.

There was no further mention in the TBF statement about the alleged brother and no charge was filed against him. FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover announced in Washington that the conspiracy to "injure, oppress, threaten or intimidate" King began "on or about March 30" in Birmingham.

The FBI statement said a .30-06 rifle equipped with a telescopic sight found near the rooming house shortly after King was slain, was purchased March 30 in Birmingham.

The statement did not connect Galt directly with the rifle.

The FBI sarted hunting Galt a week ago. Agents even contacted persons named Galt in several states in an attempt to find him.

The picture — which had to have the eyes "opened" by an artist — brought uncertain responses from witnesses who were acquainted with Galt or saw the fleeing sniper.

"Unless he was wearing a wig or had had a face lift or something, it's not the man I saw," said Charles Q. Stevens, who lives at the Main Street rooming house from which the fatal shot apparently was fired.

The hair is too full and the face is too young." he said. But Stevens said he only got a side view of the fleeing figure.

A source in Birmingham sail the photograph was taken within the past three months, although the FBI did not specify when it was made. The photo has sharp contrast, making hair and features very dark.

"It's very near, but I'm not sure," was the reaction of Peter Cherpes, owner of a Birmingham boarding house where an Eric Galt stayed from Aug. 26 to Oct. 7 last year.

"I don't really know," Cherpes said. "It's so hard to tell. His hair seemed to be lighter."

The FBI, relying on witnesses apparently, said the fugitive had been described as a white man, 5-8 to 5-11, weighing 160 to 175 pounds, with brown hair in a brush cut, blue eyes, straight nose.


Persons who have met Galt, the FBI reported, described him as a loner with a "rural" speech and little schooling, fond of vodka, beer and hillbilly music.

The FBI statement also said, "The fugitive is said to have a nervous habit of occasionally pulling at an ear lobe with his left hand. His left ear protrudes further from his head than his right ear."

"Galt should be considered armed and dangerous," the FBI release warned.

Galt has used the names of John Willard and Harvey Lowmeyer, the FBI said. The assassin registered at the Memphis rooming house under the name of John Willard.

Dealls of the alleged conspiracy were missing from the FBI r lease, as were vital statistics, such as Galt's birthplace, formal schooling, employment. The statement said Galt claimed to have been a cook on Mississippi riverboats, a merchant seaman and "is said to pe an avid dancer." THE MIAMI NEWS

King Gun Identified, Paper Says

(AF) The Birmingham News said today, in a copyrighted story, that a gun which the FBI said was purchased in Birmingham, has been determined by ballistics tests to be the weapon used in the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The News story, quoting an unidentified source, also said that the man charged with conspiracy in King's death, Eric Starvo Galt, may have fled to Mexico or Cuba.

"There's no positive trace. He just vanished," the News quotes the source.

It apparently was because of the expected impending arrest that authorities obtained a first-degree murder warrant! against Galt, and also a flderal warrant charging him with conspiracy.

The exact location in California where authorities expected to make the arrest

was not disclosed, but Galt is known to have spent time in the Los Angeles area.

Sources said the tip obviously was wrong, or that Galt - if he is in California - eluded authorities.

The Birmingham News said in a copyrighted story that the search for Galt has spread outside the U.S. and that it is believed the man has fled to Mexico or Cuba.

"There's no positive trace. He just vanished," the newspaper quoted its source as saying.

The News also said that a gun which the FBI said had been purchased in the city had been identified in ballistics tests as the .30-06 rifle which killed King.

The FBI has refused to say what ballistics tests on that weapon, found near the Memphis, Tenn., flophouse that served as the snipers' post, had revealed.

The FBI apparently had reason to believe that Galt, who speaks with a rural accent and had several aliases, might have returned to Birmingham after the assassination April 4.

A check of 22 rooming houses in Birmingham Thursday found 10 managers who said FBI agents had questioned them in search of Galt early this week.

Galt was charged Wednesday on a federal warrant signed by FBI Agent Joseph H. Gamble and U.S. Commissioner Mildred F. Sprague with conspiracy to violate the civil rights of Dr. King.

All copies of the warrants from the charge were in FBI hands and not being released publicly. The complaint from which the warrant was drawn said the charge was based in part on "identification of the gun used by defendant (Galt) found at the scene of the crime."

HOLLYWOOD, Calif. — Eric Starvo Galt, prime suspect in the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King, emerged Thursday as:

A FERVENT supporter of the presidential bid of former Alabama Gov. George C. Wallace.

AN ANTI-Negro who once got into a wild argument at a Hollywood cocktail lounge with a girl who defended Negroes.

A MAN who made at least one mysterious trip in recent months to New Orleans, a fact which appears to be of great interest to the FBI.

A STEADY drinker, alternately moody and contentious in public.

This picture came into focus as the result of a series of interviews conducted by The Los Angeles Times with persons who knew Galt when he lived here.

A songwriter whom Galt drove to New Orleans and hack in a white Mustang in December said he had a strong impression that the suspect was not using his right name.

The statement was made by Charles Stein, 38, who was offered the free ride after he agreed to add his signature to the drive by Wallace to qualify for a place on the California June primary ballot.

Stein said his sister, Rita, had made the arrangements. While at the Sultan Room, a lounge on Hollywood Blvd., she had let it be known that her two children had to return soon from her sister's place in New Orleans. Galt let it be know that he would be going there.

Stein appeared at the Sultan Room that same night and Gan agreed to take nim along to fetch the children.

The next day, Stein said, Galt picked him up at the sister's home and drove him to the Wallace headquarters.

"I hought he was some kind of politician," Stein

recalled. "I got the impression they all knew him."

Robert Walters, campaign coordinator for Wallace in California, d is puted this. "We checked all of our name files here and found nothing under the name of Galt or the other names he reportedly used," Walters said.

Galt did not disclose why he was making the drive to New Orleans. He told his passenger he "knew some people there."

While passing through Texas, according to the song-writer, Galt made several long-distance calls from phone booths.

Stein said Galt went to uncommon pains to impress upon him his name, emphasizing it in unnecessary ways, such as when they checked in at motels. "I think he was establishing a fictitious identity," Stein coad

Galt told his passenger he had just sold a bar in Mexico. "I didn't believe it," Stein said. "His Spanish was too touristy."

Stein said he believes the suspect made a subsequent trip to New Orleans. "I heard he was asking people if they wanted him to drop anything off while he was down there," Stein said.

Stein said FBI agents have been visiting him almost every day, showing great interest in the suspect's activities in New Orleans.

He said however, that he and Galt went their separate ways while in that city, and he had no dea what his companion was up to.

At the time of the trip, Galt was staying in a Los Angeles apartment. Residents there either did not know him or remained tight-lipped about him.

However, Galt subsequently moved to a hotel, the St. Francis, on Hollywood Blvd. One block away is a cocktail lounge known as the Rabbits Foot Club.

Until three or four weeks ago, according to bartender Bo Del Monte, Galt was a nightly patron.

A short time later, according to Del Monte, a Negro was struck in the head by a rock while in a nearby parking lot.

Nobody interviewed at the Rabbits Foot Club remembered Galt furnishing is name. In fact, nobody realized who he was until his picture appeared in newspapers Thursday.



Mr. KELLY stated that he and his wife were recently in Florida, having arrived there 3/28/68 from the West Coast. They checked into the Sun Castle Club, 1380 South Ocean Blvd., Pompano, Florida which Mr. KELLY stated was operated by an ex-FBI Agent, ERNEST CASTLE. He said that upon his arrival he was roomed by a bellboy of the Club and subsequently requested this bellboy to furnish him with three or four copies of various newspapers. He stated that two or three days later he attempted to locate the bellboy to reimburse him for the papers and found out that he had left the employ of the Club. 

At about 6 p.m. on 4/4/68, while standing on the second floor balcony outside Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel, 406 Mulberry Street, Memphis, Tennessee, Dr. MARTIN LUTEKR KING, JR. was struck in the right side of the face by a single bullet fired from a 30-06 rifle. The bullet severed KING's spinal cord and death was almost instantaneous.

This investigation, predicated upon a specific request from the Attorney General of the United States, disclosed that the fatal shot had been fired from the bathroom of a cheap rooming house located at 422½ South Main Street, Memphis, which bathroom was located at the rear of the rooming house, and had a window overlooking the Lorraine Motel.

At about 3 p.m. on 4/4/68, an individual using the name JOHN WILLARD had rented Room 5-B in the rooming house at 422½ South Main Street and had paid one week's rent. After hearing the rifle shot at about 6 p.m. on that same day, other tenants in the rooming house observed a man presumably identical with WILLARD, fleeing from the rooming house carrying a large package which was subsequently abandoned by him on the sidewalk in front of the Canipe Amusement Co., 424 South Main Street, Memphis. A neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of 424 South Main Street disclosed that the subject had fled from the scene in a white Mustang.

Found abandoned in front of 424 South Main Street was a 30-06 Remington model 760 rifls which was determined to have been
