B. Peterson, hospital superintendent, said they had been asked only to determine whether Ray was mentally capable of standing trial.

"He showed no more nervousness than the average person awaiting trial," Dr. Peterson said. "He was rather reserved, but we just didn't find anything unusual.

"There was nothing in his mental makeup or back-the executive order in 1962. ground to indicate anything but a recidivistic (habitual) criminal whose crimes were all associated with money. We didn't find anything to indicate he was a killer or had tendencies to kill."

The official report from the hospital said Ray had "no hallucinations or illusions, was oriented as to time, place and person." His "mood effect" was described as "so newhat tense and anxious and at times showed mild depressions, but not of psychotic proportions."

Ray's IQ was listed as 105, considered normal.

In a separate psychological report, Dec. 20, 1966, for the Missouri State Board of Probation and Parole, Ray was reported to have referred to a number of complaints such as pain in the "solar plexus (pit of the stomach), tachycardia (rapid heart action), and intracranial (inside the skull) tension."

"When we commented that these were rather large words, he said he had been reading up in the medical literature," the report said. It added that at certain times, Ray thought he had cancer or heart trouble.

RAY WAS never married, but lived for brief periods with women, the report said. problem revolves around It added: "This man's basic what appears to be an increasingly severe obsessive, compulsive trend.

"He states that at the age of 10 he awoke one night and thought he had lost his eyesight. He became quite fearful.

"These various fears confront him from time to time and in a typical obsessive way.

"He feels he must do cer-

tain things in order to undo occur and might result in what he feels is going to harm to him."

King Murder Suspect

FBI Places Ray On 'Top 10' List

WASHINGTON — (UPI)
— The FBI Saturday placed the name of James Earl Ray, a Missouri prison escapee of 51 weeks being sought in connection with the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King, on its list of "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives."

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said Ray was a special addition to the list "to insure the widest possible dissemination" of pictures and description "to help effect his earliest possible location."

Ray, who has been sought under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, has been the subject of an intensive search since King was felled by a bullet as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis (Tenn.) motel April 4.

On Wednesday of last week, the FBI obtained a warrant in Birmingham, Ala., charging Galt with conspiring to interfere with the constitutional rights of a U.S. citizen. Friday, the law enforcement agency identified Galt as Ray, who escaped from Missouri State Prison April 23, 1967.

The FBI said it was Ray who had registered in a rooming house near the motel where King was staying

and was assigned a room near the bathroom from which the fatal shot was fired.

A comparison of the latent fingerprints uncovered in the room with 53,000 in FBI files determined Galt and Ray are identical.

The FBI said, "Ray should be considered armed and extremely dangerous."


Ray, now 40, was reported born in

RAY Alton, Ill. He has a criminal record dating from 1949. At the time of his escape from Missouri State Prison, he was serving a 20-year, habitual-criminal sentence for armed robbery and automobile theft.

In Alton, Ill., Ray's uncle, William E. Maher, revealed that Ray was the oldest in a family of nine children, three of whom were taken away from the mother and placed in orphanages or foster homes.

Maher said Ray was always a "trouble-maker" but said he knew of no racial influence in Ray's of that might have provided a motive for the slaying he is alleged to have committed.

Inquiry U. S. Customs, and INS, established that neither agency maintains adequate records of departure which necessitated contacting the following named carrier agencies with the names ERIC STARVO GALT, aka GAULT; HARVEY LOWMEYER, aka LOWMYER and JOHN WILLIAMS.

Reference is made to memo from SAC, Miami, to All Agents dated 4/8/68, and captioned as above.

By airtel dated 4/19/68, the Memphis Division advised all offices as follows:

At about 6:00 PM, on 4/4/68, while standing on the second floor balcony outside Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel, 406 Mulberry Street, Memphis, Tennessee, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., was struck in the right side of the face by a single bullet fired from a 30-06 rifle. The bullet severed KING's spinal cord and death was almost instantaneous.

This investigation, predicated upon a specific request from the Attorney General of the United States, disclosed that the fatal shot had been fired from the bathroom of a cheap rooming house located at $422\frac{1}{2}$ South Main Street, Memphis, which bathroom was located at the rear of the rooming house, and had a window overlooking the Lorraine Motel.

At about 3:00 PM, on 4/4/68, an individual using the name JOHN WILLARD had rented Room 5-B in the rooming house at 422½ South Main Street and had paid one week's rent. After hearing the rifle shot at about 6:00 PM, on that same day, other tenants in the rooming house observed a man presumably identical with WILLARD, fleeing from the rooming house carrying a large package which was subsequently abandoned by him on the sidewalk in front of the Canipe Amusement Co., 424 South Main Street Memphis. investigation in the vicinity of 424 South Main Street disclosed that the subject had fled from the scene in a white Mustang.

Found abandoned in front of 424 South Main Street was a 30-06 Remington model 760 rifle which was determined to have been sold to one HARVEY LOWMEYER on 3/30/68, by Aeromarine Supply Co., Birmingham, Alabama.

Investigation at Memphis disclosed that an individual had purchased a set of Binoculars at the New York Arms Company in Memphis on 4/4/68. These binoculars were among the material abandoned with the rifle and recovered in Memphis. Also recovered was a brown and green herringbone bedspread. The blue bag which was inside the bedspread contained numerous items, among which were the binoculars and a set of underwear consisting of a T-shirt and shorts. The T-shirt and shorts are those on which appears the laundry mark which has been a matter of interest in this case.

A search of motel records in the Memphis area disclosed that an individual using the name ERIC S. GALT had spent the night of 4/3/68, at the Rebel Motel, Memphis, Tennessee, and was driving a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama license 1-38993. Investigation at Birmingham disclosed that this automobile had been purchased by ERIC S. GALT on August 30, 1967, from a private person in response to a newspaper ad. He paid a total of \$1,995 While in Birmingham he furnished the address of 2608 South Highland Avenue, Birmingham. This is also the address which appeared on a driver's license issued to him by the State of Alabama, The driver's license identifying data listed his birth date as July 20, 1931, his height as 5 feet 11 inches, his weight as 170 lbs., and his eyes blue and hair brown.

The automobile in question, the white Mustang bearing the Alabama tags mentioned above, was recovered in Atlanta on 4/11/68, and determined to have been abandoned there prior to 9:00 AM, on 4/5/68.

On 4/17/68, AUSA R. MACEY TAYLOR, Birmingham, authorized the filing of a complaint charging ERIC STARVO GALT with a conspiracy to violate Section 241, Title 18, U. S. Code, and recommended bond in the amount of \$50,000. On the same date, SAC JOSEPH H. GAMBLE filed a complaint before USC MILDRED F. SPRAGUE, Birmingham, and a warrant was issued that same date.

In connection with the evidence submitted by Atlanta, Birmingham, and Memphis, identifiable latent prints were recovered. It was on the basis of these latents that identification was made of JAMES EARL RAY. In handling future leads, all offices should be particularly interested in securing an identifying number, military, police, or FBI, in connection with suspects so that the necessary check can be made through the Identification Division.

By teletype dated 4/19/68, the Bureau furnished the following information regarding JAMES EARL RAY and an associate WALTER TERRY RIFE to all offices:

JAMES EARL RAY, aka EARL JAMES RAY, W. C. HERRON, EARL JAMES, JAMES MC BRIDE, JAMES O'CONNER, JAMES WALTON, JAMES WALYON, determined by the Bureau to be identical with ERIC STARVO GALT, against whom a Federal complaint was filed in connection with the fatal shooting of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

JAMES EARL RAY, inmate, Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, escaped the penitentiary on April 23, 1967. Investigation indicated RAY concealed himself in a bread box and escaped from the truck making a delivery to an auxiliary farm. RAY was serving 20 years on a charge of armed robbery - 1st degree and for operating a vehicle without the owner's consent. On 7/20/67, a Federal complaint, authorized by AUSA WILLIAM A. KITCHEN, Western District of Missouri, Kansas City, Missouri, was filed before USC, Jefferson City, Missouri, charging RAY with violation of Title 18, Section 1073, USC, and a warrant was issued.

JAMES EARL RAY and WALTER TERRY RIFE, on 3/7/55, burglarized the U. S. Post Office at Kellerville, Illinois, and stole 66 blank U. S. Postal Money Orders which they passed during 3/55 in numerous states, with the result that both were sentenced in United States District Court, Kansas City, Missouri, on 7/1/55, to the U. S. Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas. Subject RAY has been described as a loner and RIFE apparently is one of his few close associates, suggesting the possibility they could have been associates in the murder of Dr. KING.





Reference is made to memo by SA JACK L. MARSHALL dated 4/20/68 in regard to a telephone call from JIM CRAWFORD.

On April 22, 1968, JAMES CRAWFORD, Assistant Fountain Manager, Liggett Drug Store, 400 Lincoln Road, Miami Beach, Florida, was contacted by the writer at his place of business.

CRAWFORD stated that at about 6:30 PM on Sat. April 20, 1968, an unknown white make, who looked like the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY which has appeared in Newspapers was in the Drug Store alone. This person appeared to be depressed. When he came in he asked the waitress for a menu and then placed it on its edge and sat staring at it for a considerable period of time. While staring at the menu and also later he had a habit of rubbing the right side of his face with the palm of his right

CRAWFORD further advised this unknown person looked as if he had spent some time recently in the sun. His face and forearms were sunburned but not badly. He was wearing a red spotted short sleeved sport shirt.

CRAWFORD stated the only description he could give of the unknown white male is that he was between 37 and 45 years of age and has a white mark of approximately 2" diameter below and behind his left ear.

CRAWFORD made available the check of this unknown white male and stated he believes this person at least picked up the check to look at it. CRAWFORD advised he knows this check was also handled by the waitress SANDY (LNU) and himself.

CRAWFORD stated that should he see this person again, he would attempt to engage this person in conversation and obtain some information about him. He stated he does not know where this person went, nor the method of transportation after he left the store.

It should be noted that the address of this Drug Store is in the heart of the tourist area of Miami Beach, Fla.

MARIANO FAGET, Marine Clerk, Marine Desk, Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), advised his records would contain only the names of aliens departing on foreign flag clearances and the notification of any change in the crew of a foreign flag vessel. His records were reviewed and were found to duplicate those maintained by the Bureau of Customs and the shipping lines, which are set out below, but which were checked prior to the interview of FAGET.

The passenger manifests for all of the above trips had been previously made available by Mr. RIGGS, who also had records of all crew changes.

The following investigation was conducted by SAs STUART GODWIN, JR., and WAYNE O. TAYLOR at Miami International Airport (MIA) on April 15, 1968:

A list was procured from the U.S. Bureau of Customs which shows all departing flights from MIA to foreign destinations. The passenger manifests of each flight were made available and were examined. No person with any of the last names previously set forth was noted as a passenger or crew member on any of the flights. The list of such flights and persons contacted at each airline will be maintained in the files of the Miami FBI Office.

The following investigation was conducted at Key West, Florida on April 11, 1968, by SA WELDON L. KENNEDY:

Records of the U.S. Bureau of Customs and INS were reviewed for the names GALT, LOWMEYER, LOWMYER and WILLARD, and it was determined the records were negative regarding those names during the period April 4, 1968 through April 10, 1968.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROBERT W. WISEMAN at West Palm Beach, Florida on April 11, 1968:

Inquiry at U.S. Bureau of Customs and INS established that neither agency maintains adequate records of departure, which necessitated contacting the following-named carrier agencies regarding the names ERIC STARVO GALT, also known as Gault, HARVEY LOWMEYER, also known as Lowmyer, and JOHN WILLARD. Coastal Aviation, a non-scheduled airline, is based in Orlando, Florida, and American Flyers, a non-scheduled airline, is based out of Ardmore, Oklahoma. Passenger manifests for these two lines must be checked at their home bases.

Check of Eastern Air Lines at Miami covered flights leaving the country from Miami, Fort Lauderdale, Key West and West Palm Beach, Florida.

CUBA INCITES TO RACIAL VIOLENCE

RE:

Because of the violent death of MARTIN LUTHER KING, the Cuban radio stations repeated several times the message from the Joint Committee of the Union of Communist Youth and the University Student Federation, signed by their presidents, JULIO CESAR CASTRO-PALOMINO and JAIME CROMBET BAQUERO. The following is the message:

"The youth of Cuba supports the just decision of the Negro movement to answer the reactionary repression of Yankee racist imperialism with revolutionary violence."

This message was sent by the Cuban youth to the Negro youth of the United States through the Student Coordinating Committee for Non-Violent Action, and also says that the Cuban youth has known and shares the just indignation which moves the public opinion of the world because of the assassination of the pacifist leader, MARTIN LUTHER KING.

The message goes on to say that the assassination of LUTHER KING has served to show that Yankee imperialism does not differentiate at the hour of treacherous assassination between a fighter who preaches a violent fight like MALCOLM X and persons like LUTHER KING who adopt positions of peaceful resistance. The message likewise points out that the wave of repression by the Washington Government among the U.S. Negro population is for the sole purpose of holding back outbursts of indignation and will contribute only to increasing the growing hate of the Negro masses against the oppressive North American system as well as to intensifying revolutionary violence, the only alternative for victory presented to the peoples against the criminal and aggressive policy of the United States.

Note: it can be seen that these statements or message from the Joint UJC-FEU Committee of Cuba incite to racial violence in the United States in the same way that STOKELY CARMICHAEL does at the so-called press conference in New York. STOKELY CARMICHAEL concludes as follows: "The United States must be completely demolished so that the Negroes can survive..."
