On this date ZELL DAVIS, JR., Asst. State Attorney and practicing attorney in Palm Beach Co., Florida advised the writer of the following information concerning captioned matter.

He has a client, whose identity cannot be revealed, that he considers competent and reliable in all respects, who wishes the following information be furnished the FBI concerning a suspect who may be identical with RAY.

This client stated that he first saw this suspect about four days after the shooting of MARTIN LUTHER KING, has seen him on several times since, last being during the middle of last week (about 5/22/68). The suspect has been observed, in each instance in the same area of Miami, Florida, is on foot, sometimes with jacket but not well dressed. Suspect walks from the vicinity of NE 2nd. Avenue and NE 1st. St., past Wilson's Parking Garage (rear of Dupont Building) on NE 1st. St. has sometimes obtained change from the attendant-cashier at this garage for soft drinks and then continues West on 1st. street in the direction of a "mission". The appearances have all been between the hours of 8PM and 11 PM. Photos of subject RAY were given to DAVIS who, in turn advised that his client selected the photo with sun glasses (10/67) and the photo standup with top coat (1955) as most closely resembling this suspect. All other physical data is similar with the addition of the mustache. DAVIS added that his client suggested that if a surveillance of the area by the FBI was set up and this suspect did not appear, that a check with the cashier-attendant at Wilson's to see if subject had been recently observed might be indicated.

## FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Mr. BENJAMIN LARNARD THOMPSON, JR., 12801 East Randall Park Drive, after being informed of the identity of the interviewing Agents, voluntarily furnished the following information:

In March, 1967, he commenced working for Aerodex, Miami. Prior to that time, he earned his living through commercial fishing off the Florida Keys.

For a number of years he worked for East Coast Fisheries, Miami. In this regard, he would operate boats mortgaged through PETER SCHWARTZ who was one of the owners of East Coast Fisheries. Four or five years ago, he operated a 38 foot fishing boat named the "Virginia Lee" on which SCHWARTZ held the mortgage. He returned this boat to SCHWARTZ about a year later and switched the mortgage to a 48 foot fishing boat named the "Miss Gayle," on which SCHWARTZ also held the mortgage. Approximately two and one-half or three years ago, he and SCHWARTZ had financial differences, and he left the employment of East Coast Fisheries.

Following this incident, he went in partnerships with LOUIS LOBER, Miami, and purchased a 28 foot fishing vessel, which had no name. He and LOBER fished commercially until on or about August 1, 1966, at which time he sold his equity in this boat to LOBER and got out of the fishing business entirely.

Most of his fishing was accomplished from Bakers Haulover (Miami) in the north to Elliott Key in the south. His fishing interests were in lobsters.

Approximately four years ago, he was arrested by the British Government for fishing ~~for lobsters in Bahamian~~ waters. He had been carrying on this activity for approximately ten weeks before he was caught. British authorities kept him in jail overnight and the following day he was fined \$27 and allowed to leave Nassau with his boat with the promise of not fishing in Bahamian waters again. He recalls

that there was quite a bit of newspaper publicity for a period of five days during this incident.

With regard to his former partner, LOUIS LOBER, he spoke with LOBER about four months ago. At that time LOBER still had the boat and was fishing. He noted the reason he sold his interest in the boat to LOBER, as mentioned above, was the fact he could not make a living any longer in fishing. LOBER, whom he described as being around 37 years old, recently had an operation on his throat for the removal of a growth from his "voice box." As far as he knows, LOBER has never been arrested and in fact, both he and LOBER went to school together in Miami and he considers LOBER to be of good character and reputation.

With regard to his personal whereabouts during the period from April 3 - 12, 1968, since January, 1968, he has worked at Aerodex, Miami, on a shift in which he leaves home around 2:15 p.m. and returns around 12:30 a.m. On April 3, 4, and 5, 1968, he was working at Aerodex on the above mentioned shift. On April 6 and 7, 1968, a weekend, he remained home and did not leave Miami or Dade County, Florida. From April 7 - 12, 1968, he worked at Aerodex on the above described shift.

He has never left the State of Florida with the exception of going to New York City once when he was in high school.

He has never been in the State of Alabama and he has never heard of the names EDDIE WILBURN, SAMUEL LEWIS, WILLIAM PIERCE or BOB BRINKLEY. He does not know anyone from Huntsville or Athens, Alabama and he has never been in nor does he know anyone that drives an automobile with a police radio.

He has never been in Belle Glade or Okeechobee, Florida, and he does not know anyone that owns a motel, hotel, cottages or owns an airplane.

He has never been a member of the Ku Klux Klan and does not know anyone who is or was a member of the Klan.

There are no other BEN THOMPSONs who are fishermen in the Miami-Key West, Florida area as far as he knows, noting his father, BEN THOMPSON, SR. died in November, 1967, while residing at 4220 N. W. 23rd Avenue, Miami. His father gave up full time fishing in 1954 when he had heart trouble. Prior to that, in 1952, his father sold his boat. From 1952 to November, 1967, his father was semi-retired and only fished occasionally. When his father was much younger, he worked on a wrecking tug and at times, went to Cuba on this tug. However, his father did not own any business in Cuba. He has never been to Cuba himself and he has never had any interests in Cuba.

During the time he was a commercial fisherman, he has had a great many individual deck hands, however, to his knowledge, none of these individuals had ever served any time in a prison or penitentiary.

He has a relative named RONNY PIERCE who is about 35 years of age and who is a fisherman living in Marathon, Florida. As far as he knows, RONNY has never been in any trouble.

Photographs of JAMES EARL RAY were shown to him and he felt the photographs showing RAY by himself, with the picture of RAY with sunglasses, looked familiar, however, he could not be sure of this identification. Possibly he may have seen photographs of RAY in the newspapers or on television.

He emphatically denied being involved in this matter in any manner or under any circumstances. It is a complete mystery to him if or why his name would be used in this matter. If someone is using his name in this regard, then the identity of this individual is unknown to him.

The following investigation was conducted by  
SA PATRICK A. PHILBIN, at Belle Glade, Florida, May  
20, 1968.

WILLIAM LEE PIERCE located at Tru-Flo Pump Company, advised he presently lives in Pahokee, Florida, across from the Farmer's Market on Lewis Friend Highway, but uses P.O. Box 398, Belle Glade, Florida, as his mailing address.

PIERCE advised that he came to Belle Glade as a young man from the area of Uniontown, Pennsylvania, in the early 1930's, and after working hard in construction and other fields became one of the biggest property owners in the area and did construct some apartments known as the Bill Pierce Apartments on Highway 441 in the city limits. He stated just after World War II he and several others cleared out a large field which is now the city airport and that he got into the air taxi and crop dusting business and that he had learned to fly back then but had never gotten a pilot's license. He stated that all of his airplanes were torn up and destroyed in a hurricane about 1949 and that was the end of his venture in this field. He stated that in the 50's he had developed some machinery which wove the fibers of the Rami plant into cloth resembling cotton and was doing an extremely profitable business in Cuba with Batista until Castro took over and put him out of business there. He said his financial statement would have been worth several million dollars at that time but that severe financial losses, poor business operations in construction, etc., cost him almost everything he had. He stated that he had signed a \$350,000 contract with TRUJILLO in the Dominican Republic for his weaving machine and that two days later TRUJILLO was assassinated and that was the end of that.

PIERCE stated that he became involved in several money losing ventures and a shopping center fell through in which he had invested heavily and that friends wanted him to declare bankruptcy but that he had worked hard and had paid off \$27,000 in debts and with the exception of \$125,000 which he owes in Federal Income taxes he is out of debt and plans to work hard and get back on his feet. He stated that at the present time he is completely broke but that he feels he can still make money and will soon have his own welding shop and has plans for the development of various types of machinery.

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PIERCE stated that the only trips made in the past year was one trip to Bainbridge, Georgia, during March, 1968, to visit his sister-in-law, BESSIE WILLIAMS and one trip to Islamorada, Florida, to visit his step son CHARLES WARREN SMITH a day or two prior to Easter.

PIERCE stated he owns no airplane, could not fly one at this time. He has not been to Atlanta, Memphis, Kansas City, Missouri, for years and has not been contacted by anyone from the "Los Angeles Times" and has never heard of anyone named BEN THOMPSON who owns a yacht or shrimp boats in the area of Key West, Florida.

PIERCE stated that in the operation of his apartments and during his lifetime he probably has made a number of enemies.

PIERCE is a white male, born August 8, 1900, at Revere, Pennsylvania, is 5'8½" tall, weighs 200 pounds, hair is dark brown and greying, eyes are brown, has several moles on face, wife FAY nee MILLER. Drives a tan 1957 Ford Sedan, Florida license 6W-62269.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROBERT W. WISEMAN at Boca Raton, Florida, relative to identifying the unknown individual at the Texaco station located at U.S. #1 and Palm Aire Street, in Boca Raton who was the recipient of a business card from Mr. H. D. BRINKER.

Physical inspection of the Boca Raton area developed that there is no Palm Aire Street, however there is a Sunoco station located at the intersection of Highway #1 and Royal Palm Road, which appears to be the logical location of instant service station. Mr. BERNARD IRELAND, Jr., co-owner of instant service station advised that beginning March 7, 1968, and for a period of three weeks he employed one DALE WHITMAN, whom he described as in his early twenties, very personable and an excellent public relations man with customers. WHITMAN was dissatisfied with his employment and was interested in bettering himself and left voluntarily to secure employment elsewhere with an unknown uniform company in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

Subsequent investigations identified DALE WHITMAN's mother as Mrs. GORDON YOST, who resides in a trailer lot #35, Tropic Gardens Trailer Park, S. Federal Highway, Delray Beach, Florida, which is just north of the Boca Raton City limits. Mrs. YOST interviewed on May 21, 1968, stated that her son DALE WHITMAN is an only child of a previous marriage and his father is deceased. She stated that during **approximately** the middle of February, 1968, her son phoned her from Chicago, Illinois, stating that his wife had left him and that divorce action by her had been instituted. As a result he came here to this area and resided with her and her second husband up until May 7, 1968. She stated that he was very dissatisfied with the employment opportunities here in South Florida, and had worked for a while at the Sunoco station in Boca Raton, left there and worked for an unknown uniform company in Fort Lauderdale, as a truck driver and on the afternoon of May 7, 1968, came home saying that he was going up north to seek better employment, and that he would contact her at some later

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date when he got settled and left. She advised that she has had no contact with him since and has no idea of his current whereabouts but is of the opinion that he would not go back to Chicago because of his unhappy situation and divorce action. Mrs. YOST continued saying that prior to coming to Florida, she and her son DALE resided for many years in the Warren, Ohio area and that she has two brothers in Warren, Ohio, now who her son might contact. She stated that one brother or uncle of DALE WHITMAN is BYRD JAY LANE, who resides at 1594 Kuszmaul Avenue in Warren, Ohio, and that the other brother ROBERT LANE also is in Warren, Ohio, address unknown, but his address will be known to BYRD. She added further that she has another brother named NOAH LANE who resides at an unknown address in Columbus, Ohio, and his address also will be known to BYRD. BYRD JAY LANE and ROBERT LANE are both employed by General Motors Corporation in Warren, Ohio. The employment of NOAH LANE in Columbus, Ohio is not known to her.

Mrs. YOST continued saying that her son DALE took most of his personal effects with him upon departure including any correspondence, notes and similar items. She stated that after he departed she did find some notes with telephone numbers on them and business cards which she threw away in the trash without reading and had no knowledge of their contents believing that they were of no value to her son or he would not have left them. Mrs. YOST is unfamiliar with the name of H. D. BRINKER or H. ROBERTSON BRINKER or the Riddle Factory Catering Company of Detroit, Michigan. She does not recall her son mentioning anything about this, but added that she does know that he was interested in bettering himself and was making every effort possible while in this area to get better employment than the two that he did have. Mrs. YOST did divulge in the conversation that her son DALE WHITMAN at age 18 had enlisted in the U.S. Navy and shortly thereafter while being stationed in Bainbridge, Maryland, was involved with the Federal Government concerning a car theft for which he had a two year probationary sentence. She explained this is the reason why she was initially reluctant to discuss her son's whereabouts or possible whereabouts with the interviewing agent.

Chief of Police CHARLES GOODLETT (NA), Belle Glade Police Department, advised that he has known WILLIAM L. PIERCE for about 35 years. He said that PIERCE used to own PIERCE's Quaters which was a sort of "flop house" for migrant farm workers. However, he advised PIERCE lost the business about six months ago for non-payment of taxes.

Chief GOODLETT further advised that PIERCE used to have an interest in cattle, farm land and a "Ramey" machine he invented that wove hemp into cloth. He continued by saying the PIERCE had made a lot of money years ago but had lost it by making bad investments over the years.

Chief GOODLETT stated he was very well acquainted with BILL PIERCE and he is not a racist or a bigot.

Chief GOODLETT advised PIERCE is presently working for the True-Flow Welding Company and lives in Pahokee, Florida.

The records of the True-Flow Welding Company showed that WILLIAM PIERCE was at work on April 4, 5 and 6, 1968.

On May 18, 1968, GERALDINE BOWLES, Ridge Apartments, Buckhead Ridge, advised that she is the wife of JOHN T. BOWLES. She stated that she recalls that she was at the home of BOWLES' sister, Mrs. CHARLES GRIZZAFFE in Tampa, Florida, the day MARTIN LUTHER KING was killed. She stated that she had gone to Tampa that morning from Okeechobee, Florida for a dental appointment. She made the drive with Mrs. GRIZZAFFE and spent the night at her home. Early the next morning JOHN BOWLES flew from Okeechobee to Tampa and she flew back to Okeechobee with him that morning. She stated that she had not known he had been in Tampa the day KING was killed; however, she stated that they are getting a divorce and she is not aware of all of his activities. She commented that upon returning to Okeechobee on April 5, 1968, she asked his mother if he had been home on the night of April 4, 1968, and his mother stated that he had. She asked his mother this question because she wanted to know if he might have been out with his girl friend, MARY KNIGHT, a barmaid at the Fin and Feather Bar. She commented that nothing has occurred within the past two months that would cause her to believe he might have been involved in the murder of KING. She said she did not believe he could possibly be involved. She added that he has been in the Okeechobee area for the past two months with the exception of the few trips he took over to Tampa. She said she did not believe BOWLES would attempt to fly the airplane any further than Tampa.

On May 18, 1968, MARY KNIGHT, 106 1st Street, was located at the Fin and Feather Bar, Buckhead Ridge, and she stated that she was working the night KING was murdered. She said she could not recall if BOWLES was

at the bar that night. She said she is certain he could not have been involved and that with the exception of a few trips to Tampa around the time of KING's death he has been in Okeechobee, Florida. She stated that she is BOWLES' girl friend and that both she and BOWLES are getting a divorce.

On May 20, 1968, CHARLES GRIZZAFFE, Ridge Apartments, Buckhead Ridge, advised that his wife is the sister of JOHN T. BOWLES. He stated that he lives at 332 Westcrest, Tampa; however, he comes to Okeechobee, Florida often since he owns the Ridge Apartments at Buckhead Ridge. He stated that BOWLES and his wife, GERALDINE, manage the apartments for him. He stated that BOWLES made several trips to Tampa around the first part of April, 1968, to visit a dental laboratory. BOWLES would always call him first so that someone could meet him at the airport. He stated that nothing has occurred that would cause him to suspect that BOWLES might have been involved in the murder of KING.

On May 20, 1968, GLEN HAMILTON, Okissimnee Fishing Camp, Okeechobee, Florida, advised that BOWLES keeps his airplane just across the road from his camp. The place is called Hog Island. He stated that BOWLES buys gasoline from him for his airplane. The airplane has a capacity of about 13 gallons and a top speed of about 75 miles per hour. He believes the furthest BOWLES has flown is Tampa. He stated that he has not heard or seen anything that would lead him to believe BOWLES could possibly be involved in the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

PIERCE is related to BEN THOMPSON who he used to fish with several years ago and who he has not seen for over a year.

She stated she and her husband were staying at Conch Key, Florida, on the night of April 4, 1968. Later that night they returned to Miami, Florida where they remained for four or five days prior to her husband's departure to Waynesville, North Carolina, with his mother, DOLLY PIERCE.

PIERCE owns the Rocky Waters Motel, Waynesville, North Carolina, and his telephone number is 926-1585. Mrs. PIERCE advised that he has been at the Rocky Waters Motel since leaving Miami.

Mrs. PIERCE stated her husband has a private pilot's license which he obtained at the Asheville, North Carolina airport. He last flew a private plane in about October, 1967, in North Carolina. He flies only for personal pleasure and does not own a plane. Mrs. PIERCE knows of no one in a position to loan a plane to her husband.

Mrs. PIERCE further advised her husband has not been in Kansas City or New Orleans and to her knowledge he is not associated with JIM GARRISON or EDDIE WILBURN, he has never been associated with any Klu Klux Klan organization and he owns no property such as land or airports. Mrs. PIERCE advised her husband was born in Arizona on September 7, 1913.

Synopsis: JAMES EARL RAY, FBI #405 942 G, escaped Missouri State Penitentiary (MSP) 4/23/67, and on 7/20/67 a complaint was filed before USC W. C. SHELEY, Jefferson City, Mo., charging RAY with unlawful flight to avoid confinement in violation of Title 18, USC, Section 1073. On 4/17/68 an authorized complaint was filed against ERIC STARVO GALT for violation of Title 18, USC, Section 241, charging that he did conspire to injure, oppress, threaten, or intimidate MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., in the free exercise and enjoyment of his rights secured by the Constitution of the United States. Complaint was filed before USC, Birmingham, Ala., by SAC JOSEPH H. GAMBLE, and a warrant was issued for the arrest of GALT. Recommended bond is \$50,000. On 5/7/68 Shelby County GJ, Memphis, returned a secret indictment charging JAMES EARL RAY with murder in the first degree. Chronological listing of subject's activities from 4/67 to 4/68 set forth and reflects he resided briefly at Montreal, Province of Quebec, Canada. He traveled to Birmingham, Ala., purchased a 1966 Ford Mustang, then traveled to Puerto Vallarta, Jalisco, Mexico, for a brief residence, and then to Los Angeles, Calif. Subject made 2 round trips by automobile from Los Angeles to New Orleans and in 3/68 established residence in Atlanta, Ga. Using the name HARVEY LOWMEYER, a Remington, Model 760, rifle was purchased 3/30/68 Birmingham, Ala. At 6:00 P.M., 4/4/68 Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., was shot and killed by a single bullet fired from the bathroom of a nearby rooming house while he was standing on the balcony of the Lorraine Motel, Memphis. Same Remington rifle identified above recovered at scene along with other items and personal belongings of the subject. Results of Laboratory examinations of all evidence described herein. Interviews of relatives of JAMES EARL RAY, fellow prisoners, and associates set forth. Subject is described as a loner with no close associates, reportedly on amphetamine, and selling drugs at MSP while incarcerated there. Identification record and description also set forth. ARMED AND DANGEROUS.

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I. CRIMES COMMITTED FOR WHICH  
FEDERAL PROCESS OUTSTANDING

The subject, JAMES EARL RAY, was received at the Missouri State Penitentiary (MSP), Jefferson City, Missouri, March 17, 1960, from the St. Louis City Circuit Court to serve a sentence of 20 years after conviction for robbery first degree by means of a dangerous and deadly weapon (2 counts) and for operating a motor vehicle without permission of the owner. He was given sentences of 20, 7, and 5 years, all to run concurrently.

The subject, who was MSP inmate #00416, was assigned to the Bakery Unit of the Food Service Department. Just prior to the 5:00 P.M. count on April 23, 1967, he was discovered missing and could not be found within the penitentiary. It was not until some 10 days later that prison officials determined that the subject had escaped by being concealed in a large bread box being taken by open truck from the main prison to Renz Farm, a prison farm that lies outside the prison walls and about 5 miles north of the main prison. This method of escape has not been positively verified and remains largely a matter of conjecture.

Federal assistance was requested to locate the subject, and on July 20, 1967, a complaint was filed before U. S. Commissioner W. C. SHELEY at Jefferson City, Missouri, charging the subject with Unlawful Flight to Avoid Confinement following a conviction for robbery first degree, this being in violation of Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 1073.

On April 24, 1968, an amended complaint was filed by SA ROWEN B. AYERS before U. S. Commissioner SHELEY.

At about 6:00 P.M. on April 4, 1968, while standing on the second floor balcony outside Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel, 406 Mulberry Street, Memphis, Tennessee, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., was struck in the right side of the face by a single bullet. Investigation disclosed that this shot was fired from the bathroom of a rooming house located at 422½ South Main Street, Memphis, which bathroom was located at the rear of the rooming house and which had a window overlooking the Lorraine Motel. It is 207 feet from the bathroom window to the spot where KING was shot.



It was determined that on the afternoon of April 4, 1968, a man using the name JOHN WILLARD rented Room 5B at 422½ South Main Street, paying one week's rent. After hearing the rifle shot at about 6:00 P.M. on April 4, 1968, other tenants in the rooming house observed the man known as WILLARD fleeing from the rooming house carrying a large package which was subsequently abandoned by him on the sidewalk in front of 424 South Main Street. Further investigation disclosed that WILLARD fled from the scene in a white Mustang parked a few feet south of 424 South Main Street.

Found abandoned in front of 424 South Main was a 30-06 Remington, Model 760, rifle, a small plastic suitcase containing numerous toilet articles, undershorts, a T-shirt, binoculars, a newspaper, an after shave lotion bottle, 2 cans of Schlitz beer, and a brown and green bedspread in which all of these items were partially wrapped.

Investigation at motels in the vicinity of Memphis, Tennessee, to identify persons who might be driving a white Mustang automobile disclosed that ERIC S. GALT, 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama, had spent the night of April 3, 1968, at the Rebel Motel, 3466 Lamar Avenue, Memphis, Tennessee, and was driving a Mustang with Alabama license 1-38993. Subsequent investigation at Birmingham, set out in more detail elsewhere in this report, indicated that ERIC STARVO GALT was responsible for the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., and on April 17, 1968, Assistant U. S. Attorney R. MACEY TAYLOR, Birmingham, Alabama, authorized the filing of a complaint against ERIC STARVO GALT for violation of Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 241, charging that GALT did conspire to injure, oppress, threaten or intimidate MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., in the free exercise and enjoyment of his rights secured by the Constitution of the United States, namely, the right to freely travel from state to state. Assistant U. S. Attorney TAYLOR recommended bond be set in the amount of \$50,000.

This complaint was filed by SAC JOSEPH H. GAMBLE before U. S. Commissioner MILDRED F. SPRAGUE, Birmingham, on April 17, 1968, and Mrs. SPRAGUE issued a warrant of arrest for ERIC STARVO GALT.

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On May 7, 1968, a Shelby County Grand Jury, Memphis, Tennessee, returned a secret indictment charging the subject, JAMES EARL RAY, with murder in the first degree. While this indictment has not been made public, the local press is aware of its existence and has commented on it.
