info develops prior to Tuesday 4/23/68 when his paper next
goes to press to call him. He gave his phone # at home as
587-4829.

This date Mrs TAWANA SMITH, asst. mgr., Sporting Goods
Dept, Kings Dept. Store, VB Blve, NF, Va. furnished their
log of firearms sales from 12/17/67 to the present. A review
of the log revealed that ~~XXXX~~ there had onle been one sale of
a 30-.06 rifle. It occured on 3/21/68 to one J. T. BUCHANAN,
3625 E. Sewells Pt., Road, NF, Va. The rifle was a 30-.06
caliber Kodiak bolt action rifle, SN 11156. Mrs. SMITH advised
that her mgr, JIM PEARSON made tha actual sale according to the
records.

aforementioned Kings store with negative results:

A review of the log failed to reveal any name similar to
that of GALT under true name and aliases.

This date JAMES W. PEARSON, 274 Sedgefield Ave, VB, Va.
was interviewed and advised that he does not recall the sale of
the above mentioned rifle. He was shown photos of GALT with
negative results. He then recalled that he ~~had~~ had one man in
mind re above sale: a white male about 24, 5'6", 150#, with
dark brown hair. He could not recall whether it was the same
man as was recorded as J. T. BUCHANAN, the buyer in the log.

PEARSON noted that he is so busy at the Kings Dept. Store that he does not pay any attention to the looks of any of his costumers.

It is noted that PEARSON is the step-father of PAUL ODOM, clerk in the NORFOLK DIVISION.

This date a neighborhood investigation was conducted in the area of 3625 Sewells Point Rd., NF, Va. It was determined that TOMMY BUCHANAN, age about 21 resides at this address with his parents. TOMMY BUCHANAN was described as being about 21 years old, white male, 6'2", 160#, Brown hair, employed at the Naval Base, Norfolk, Va. He drives an International jeep. His father, EARL BUCHANAN drives a red late model Ford. Neighbors noted that TOMMY BUCHANAN is single and has been in the area continuously for some length of time. It has been their belief that he had served in the U.S. Army.

This date the writer contacted Mrs. MAUDE BUCHANAN, at 3625 Sewells Pt., Rd, NF, Va. She advised that her son's full name is JOSEPH THOMAS BUCHANAN, dob [redacted] (age 23) at NF, Va. He is 6'2", 180#, Dard Brown hair, with hazel eyes, He served three years in the U.S. Army. She stated that he did purchase a new rifle from Kings Dept. Store recently. She showed it to the writer. She advised that he has not been out of town in months. He is employed at the Naval Base, NF, Va.

She exhibited a photo of her son to the writer and it was apparent that he was not identifiable with GALT.

ATTORNEY GENERAL RAMSEY CLARK ANNOUNCED TODAY THAT THE FBI HAS IDENTIFIED JAMES EARL RAY, AN ESCAPEE FROM THE MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY, AS ERIC STARVO GALT, AGAINST WHOM A FEDERAL COMPLAINT WAS FILED LAST WEDNESDAY IN CONNECTION WITH THE FATAL SHOOTING OF THE REVEREND DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

DIRECTOR J. EDGAR HOOVER SAID THAT A SYSTEMATIC AND EXHAUSTIVE SEARCH OF LATENT FINGERPRINTS UNCOVERED IN THE DR. KING CASE AGAINST THE FINGERPRINTS OF THE OVER 53,000 PERSONS FROM WHOM "WANTED NOTICES" HAVE BEEN POSTED IN THE FILES OF THE FBI'S IDENTIFICATION DIVISION LED TO THE DETERMINATION THAT GALT AND RAY ARE IDENTICAL.

MR. HOOVER SAID THAT RAY, WHO IS 40 YEARS OF AGE, WAS REPORTED MISSING FROM THE MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY AT JEFFERSON CITY, MISSOURI, SINCE APRIL 23, 1967. HE HAD BEEN RECEIVED AT THAT INSTITUTION ON MARCH 17, 1960, TO SERVE A 20-YEAR SENTENCE FOLLOWING CONVICTION IN ST. LOUIS FOR ARMED ROBBERY AND FOR OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE WITHOUT PERMISSION OF THE OWNER.

Re Albany airtels 4/10/68 and 4/11/68, setting forth concerns who purchased Thermo-Seal marking machines, and Bureau teletype to Memphis, 4/12/68.

The FBI Laboratory advised that pillowcase and bed sheet were found in trunk of 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta 4/11/68. These items contain Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately same size as tapes on items previously recovered, but are yellow in color and contain code, "20R-3." In opinion of Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the twenty in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three is the bundle number.

At about 6 p.m. on 4/4/68, while standing on the second floor balcony outside Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel, 406 Mulberry Street, Memphis, Tennessee, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. was struck in the right side of the face by a single bullet fired from a 30-06 rifle. The bullet severed KING's spinal cord and death was almost instantaneous.

This investigation, predicated upon a specific request from the Attorney General of the United States, disclosed that the fatal shot had been fired from the bathroom of a cheap rooming house located at 422½ South Main Street, Memphis, which bathroom was located at the rear of the rooming house, and had a window overlooking the Lorraine Motel.

At about 3 p.m. on 4/4/68, an individual using the name JOHN WILLARD had rented Room 5-B in the rooming house at 422½ South Main Street and had paid one week's rent. After hearing the rifle shot at about 6 p.m. on that same day, other tenants in the rooming house observed a man presumably identical with WILLARD, fleeing from the rooming house carrying a large package which was subsequently abandoned by him on the sidewalk in front of the Canipe Amusement Co., 424 South Main Street, Memphis. A neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of 424 South Main Street disclosed that the subject had fled from the scene in a white Mustang.

Found abandoned in front of 424 South Main Street was a 30-06 Remington model 760 rifle which was determined to have been

sold to one HARVEY LOWMEYER on 3/30/68 by Aeromarine Supply Co., Birmingham, Alabama.

Investigation at Memphis disclosed that an individual had purchased a set of binoculars at the York Arms Company in Memphis on 4/4/68. These binoculars were among the material abandoned with the rifle and recovered in Memphis. Also recovered was a brown and green herringbone bedspread. The items abandoned in Memphis were all wrapped in this bedspread. The blue bag which was inside the bedspread contained numerous items, among which were the binoculars and a set of underwear consisting of a T-shirt and shorts. The T-shirt and shorts are those on which appears the laundry mark which has been a matter of interest in this case.

A search of motel records in the Memphis area disclosed that an individual using the name ERIC S. GALT had spent the night of 4/3/68 at the Rebel Motel, Memphis, Tennessee, and was driving a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama License 1-38993. Investigation at Birmingham disclosed that this automobile had been purchased by ERIC S. GALT on August 30, 1968, from a private person in response to a newspaper ad. He paid a total of \$1995 cash. While in Birmingham he furnished the address of 2608 South Highland Avenue, Birmingham. This is also the address which appeared on a driver's license issued to him by the State of Alabama. The driver's license identifying data listed his birth date as [REDACTED], his height as 5'11", his weight as 170 and his eyes blue and hair brown.

The automobile in question, the white Mustang bearing the Alabama tags mentioned above, was recovered in Atlanta on 4/11/68 and determined to have been abandoned there prior to 9 a.m. on 4/5/68.

In connection with the evidence submitted by Atlanta, Birmingham, and Memphis, identifiable latent prints were recovered. It was on the basis of these latents that identification was made of JAMES EARL RAY. In handling future leads, all offices should be particularly interested in securing an identifying number, military, police, or FBI, in connection with suspects so that the necessary check can be made through the Identification Division.

On 4/17/68, AUSA R. MACEY TAYLOR, Birmingham, authorized the filing of a complaint charging ERIC STARVO GALT with a conspiracy to violate Section 241, Title 18, U. S. Code, and

recommended bond in the amount \$50,000. On that same date, SAC JOSEPH H. GAMBLE filed a complaint before USC MILDRED F. SPRAGUE, Birmingham, and warrant was issued that same date.

She advised that former VISTA volunteer, JOHN GALLAGHER, in the Norfolk - Portsmouth area was very close to the Negro populous and attended almost all of the meetings of the Negro people in the Ghetto areas. She stated that he possibly could be of some help in regard to furnishing information regarding the leaders and militants in the Ghetto areas. She advised that he presently is a student at the North Michigan College, and that his current address is 823 West Vine Street, Kalamazoo, Michigan, 49001.

CAPLAN stated that she was in receipt of information that one MILT MILLER, Negro male, 28, student at the Norfolk Division of the Virginia State College, is presently attempting to organize the Negro youths of the Ghent and Berkley areas.

It is her knowledge that he has an excellent personality, that he is a former military personnel, and that he is having great success in said organization. As one example, she advised that in regard to the Federal Model City Program in the Tidewater area, that it was necessary to have an election of the residents of the East Ghent area to determine their representative to the Model City Program Council. A former VISTA volunteer had been considered for said position but at a meeting during the last part of March, 1968, MILT MILLER through his organizational ability had approximately 35 young Negro males present at the meeting at Lee School and through their vote one (first name unknown) PALIN, was elected to the position of the area representative to the afore mentioned council from the East Ghent area. Mrs. CAPLAN just used this as one example of MILT MILLER's organizational ability. She advised that he is well liked by the "street young Negro males".

Mrs. CAPLAN advised that one (first name unknown) KOKER (phonetic) of the Berkley area of Norfolk is very jealous of MILT MILLER'S organizational ability. KOKER is younger and does not possess the ability or personality of MILLER. KOKER is described as a Negro male, approximately 22 years old. It is known by CAPLAN that KOKER can organize a group of street fighters within a very short period of time in any area of the Norfolk - Portsmouth, Va. area. It is her knowledge that MILT MILLER will have nothing to do with KOKER.

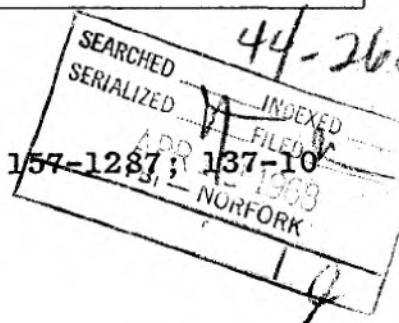

he gets business for his floor sanding and polishing establishment. EDWARDS was presently working as a bus boy and dishwasher for the Service Club and worked every day until approximately 2:30 p.m. He was presently running around with a girl who worked at the Service Club whose name he believed was ROSA MEEKINS but he was not sure of the last name of this individual. ROSA was the alleged wife of a GI presently somewhere in the State of Georgia. He described EDWARDS as approximately 150 to 170 pounds; light complexion; small mustache; and very broad shoulders.

On 4/9/68, CI advised that he had been in the home of suspect EDWARDS in Hampton, Virginia, and stated that EDWARDS lives in a house valued at about \$25,000 or \$30,000, which was somewhat high for a bus boy and dishwasher working at Fort Eustis. He stated he had driven past the home of EDWARDS trying to determine what his activities were after the march in downtown Newport News in commemoration of the death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING and EDWARDS has seen him drive past and called him over to his home and asked him if he wanted to see his house and have a couple of beers. CI stated he was escorted and shown the home and garage of EDWARDS and CI noted inside the garage a sander, air-compressor, and other items, but did not notice a large vacuum cleaner. EDWARDS was driving either a red Ford or Chevrolet panel truck and kept a lot of material in this truck. CI advised that also in the floor sanding business with the suspect, was his brother, name unknown. The brother also owned a fabulous home, which was across from the Wythe School in Hampton, Virginia. CI stated he would continue efforts to develop more information on EDWARDS and determine if he was in possession of the stolen vacuum cleaner or if the vacuum cleaner was being used by EDWARDS or his brother.

CI stated he had been unable to develop any information concerning the theft of 200 rounds of 7.62 millimeter ammunition at Fort Eustis, Virginia, since he had learned about the theft on approximately March 1, 1968, and he further advised that he had been unable to develop any more information on D. K. CRANE or the theft of scuba gear in July, 1967. He also stated he had not developed further information on HARRY THEOPHOLIS JACKSON.

CI stated it would be possible for him to take part in the parade in downtown Newport News in commemoration of the

death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, Jr. CI was instructed to participate in the march and to be alert for any individuals attempting or actually causing trouble or trying to stir up trouble over this incident. He was also advised to be alert for any individuals actually looting in downtown Newport News.

On 4/9/68, CI advised that he had participated in the above-described march that had taken place in the afternoon of April 9, 1968, in downtown Newport News, Virginia. He stated the march was peaceful throughout and there had been no problems with the individuals in the march. The police had covered the march adequately and the police were helmeted and there were many of them the whole length of the march. The policemen were seen to be on the rooftops of the buildings along the way of the march and it was also noted that there were numerous police dogs in the area. He stated that he could not accurately estimate the number of people in the march but it was huge. He had been asked to be a parade marshal as he was dressed in a suit and this had given him an opportunity to watch the whole march. The march itself had formed across from the Whitacker Hospital and had gone from there to the Arch near 25th and 26th Street in downtown Newport News. He had noticed along the way that there were some remarks from the spectators standing on the street as the marchers went past but these had not caused any problems. CI stated that he had noticed about eight or nine young Negro men ranging in age from about eighteen to twenty-five years that traveled in a group by themselves and did not associate much with the other marchers. He had noticed these individuals at the beginning of the march as they had been one of the first groups there when the march formed. He did not know what these individuals were called but he had noted no violence or attempted violence on their part. He noted that these individuals all had Afro-type haircuts and had worn a safari-type jacket and also the same type of trousers. They appeared to be dressed in some kind of uniform but he did not know what they were representing. He did not notice these individuals carrying any weapons and had not overheard any of their conversation because, as he stated before, they kept mainly to themselves. They may have done some talking but this talking was to themselves. He could not recall having seen any of these individuals depart from cars when the parade was formed and did not recall seeing them talking to any particular group of people when the parade started or even after it finished. CI stated that he would attempt to develop more information concerning these individuals such as where they met and what their purpose was.

Elusive Galt Hunted Nationwide

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — The nation's police agencies intensified a nationwide search today for Eric Starvo Galt, the elusive fugitive sought in the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

They were aided by thousands of wanted posters, just gaining wide distribution two days after the FBI publicly identified Galt,

36, as the man it had sought secretly since a week after the April 4 slaying.

The FBI refused comment on queries about whether it believes Galt is the man's real name or was simply a cover built painstakingly over a number of months by the beer-drinking lover of hillbilly music.

Two aliases—John Willard and Harvey Lowmyer—were listed on the federal conspiracy

warrant issued against Galt in Birmingham, Ala., Wednesday afternoon and the first degree murder warrant issued by the state against him here Wednesday night.

"John Willard" was the name used by the man who checked into a Main Street rooming house three hours before King was shot as he stood on the balcony of a motel here. There has

been no reference to the second alias.

The federal agency denied a report that it had taken into custody the man it said Galt described as his brother and that the brother was aiding in the search. The federal warrant, issued Wednesday, claimed that Galt and the brother entered into a conspiracy March 29 to violate King's civil rights.

The statement disclosed for

the first time that Galt was in Memphis the day before King was shot, although he did not move into the rooming house from which the fatal bullet was fired until the day of the assassination.

There were these other developments.

The U.S. attorney's office in Kansas City quoted an informant of "apparent reliability" as saying King was among persons

marked for death if Robert Bolivar Depugh, leader of the militant right-wing Minutemen organization, ever went to jail.

★ A Birmingham man who said he had a brief business dealing with Galt told reporters that the hunted man once told him he had a wife living in the Rocky Ridge section of the Alabama City. There was no official confirmation.

Hunted Man of Today Began Running in '49

LOS ANGELES—The criminal career of James Earl Ray, the man suspected of killing Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. began in downtown Los Angeles early on an October evening in 1949.

He tried to steal a typewriter from the third-floor office of The Forum Cafeteria.

The assistant manager caught him in the act and scuffled with him, but Ray got away—not for long, however.

As he fled across a parking lot, an attendant heard the assistant manager's cries and grabbed Ray. The two struggled. Ray broke free, but a bank savings book and his army discharge papers fell to the pavement from his torn shirt pocket.

That happenstance, and an extraordinary coincidence, led to the first arrest in Ray's long career of lawlessness—a span of misconduct which apparently reached a climax in Memphis April 4, when Dr. King was assassinated.

Four days later, Oct. 11, 1949, the parking lot attendant recognized Ray emerging from a bank.

He attracted the attention of nearby policemen, who arrested Ray and matched him up with the bank book and army papers.

Ray was given 90 days in the county jail and placed on two years probation by Superior Judge W. Turney Fox, now retired.

Judge Fox's leniency was based on the report of Deputy County Probation Officer Herbert W. Audit and the plea of Deputy Public Defender Richard S. Buckley, who represented Ray, unemployed and broke.

Audit today is in the Probation Department's Santa Monica office, while Buckley has risen to head of the public defender's office.

Buckley, in appealing for probation when Ray appeared Dec. 30, 1949, before Judge Fox for sentencing, said:

"I feel he not only is eligible for probation but that he is a fit subject for probation. This man is in a position to stand on his own feet, and apparently has done so for a period of time.

"He apparently is thrifty, acquired some savings and also did fairly well in the Army. In view of these circumstances, I feel he is a good risk on probation. . . ."

"I think you have a point there," Judge Fox told Buckley.

Then the judge turned to Ray and informed him that as a condition of his probation:

"I want you to stay out of drinking places and not indulge in the use of alcoholic liquor or frequent or go to places where it is the principal order of sale."

Audit, the probation officer, had noted that Ray "spends much time on dates with girls" and admitted to "occasional excessive use of intoxicants."

His remarks, and those of the judge, have an ironic echo today, since women and liquor appear to have played major roles in the subsequent life of Ray, who was only 21 at the time.

Audit also observed that Ray appeared to be of normal intelligence, was a Roman Catholic but did not attend church, attended movies two or three times a week and "likes to read magazines and common ordinary books."

Ray, who had been in Los Angeles only two days when he got into the trouble at The Forum Cafeteria, was the oldest boy in a family of three, Audit reported to Judge Fox.

The probation report also disclosed that:

He was reared by his parents in Alton and Quincy, Ill., across the Mississippi River from St. Louis.

His father, Gordon, died in 1946, by which time young Ray had quit high school in Ewing, Mo., across the river from his home. He got only as far as the ninth grade.

Ray joined the Army Feb. 19, 1946, got a general discharge—still a private—on Dec. 23, 1948.

He spent most of that time in Germany, and during part of his service career there he was assigned to the Military Police.

After his discharge, he apparently lived at the home on his serviceman's readjustment pay, and when that ran out moved to Chicago where he got a job operating a mold in a rubber plant, while attending a television repair school five nights a week.

He earned \$55 a week but was laid off work in September 1949. He remained in Chicago only a few days before heading for Los Angeles.

He denied that he had entered the cafeteria in Los Angeles to steal. He claimed he had attended a downtown movie earlier, then had climbed a fire escape into The Forum's third-floor office because:

"I guess maybe I had some beers or something."

When apprehended, he denied he ever had been in trouble with the law. A check of FBI files could establish no previous arrest record.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The elusive Eric Starvo Galt, who is wanted for the killing of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., was identified by the FBI Friday as a 40-year-old drifter and ex-convict named James Earl Ray.

The FBI said Galt's real identity was traced through "a systematic and exhaustive search of latent fingerprints" developed in the King case against the fingerprints of more than 53,000 persons for whom wanted notices are on file in the bureau's identification division.

Galt is only one of the names Ray has used in brushes with the law which began, according to the FBI dossier, when he was 21.

The FBI said he has used the names of James McBride, James Walton, W. O. Herron and James O'Connor.

He is described as about 5 feet 10, weighing 163 to 174 pounds, with blue eyes and brown hair and two scars: a small scar in the center of the forehead and another on the palm of his right hand.

At the time King was shot and killed by a sniper in Memphis, Tenn., April 4, Ray was being sought on a jailbreaking charge.

The FBI said he escaped on April 23, 1967, from the Missouri State Penitentiary at Jefferson City, where he was serving a 20-year sentence for armed robbery in St. Louis.

Ray, sought on a Tennessee murder charge in the King slaying, has an arrest record dating at least to 1949 when he served

time in Los Angeles on a burglary charge.

This followed his discharge from the Army. The FBI said he was an enlisted man from February 1946 to December 1948 when he received a general discharge for ineptness and lack of adaptability.

His Army record showed a three-month sentence at hard labor for being drunk and breaking arrest, the FBI said.

The bureau's dossier on Ray indicates he has been a drifter since he left school in the 10th grade at Alton, Ill.

He has worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher.

In 1952, according to the FBI, he was convicted in Chicago for armed robbery and served two years in Joliet and Pontiac, Ill. state prisons. In 1955, the FBI

said, he was convicted of forging U.S. postal money orders in Missouri and was confined to Leavenworth penitentiary until 1958.

The FBI said Ray was sent to the Missouri State Penitentiary on March 17, 1960, and spent some time in September 1966 in the maximum security ward at the state hospital in Fulton, Mo.

The FBI said Ray has listed his birthdate as March 10, 1928, and his birthplace as Illinois.

The city clerk at Alton, Ill., Paul A. Price, said a James Earl Ray was born there on March 10, 1928, the son of a laborer.

The principal at Alton Senior High School said his records showed three James Rays attended the school during the period Ray would have been there, and he was trying to determine whether any of them was the man identified by the FBI as Galt.

The bureau did not say what set of fingerprints in the King case was matched with those of Ray, but it is presumed that prints were found on a rifle dropped near the scene of the killing as well as in the furnished room occupied by the sniper.

The FBI also has reported recovering a white Mustang automobile in Atlanta, Ga., believed to have been used by the killer.

In a warrant obtained by the FBI Wednesday, the fugitive was accused of conspiring with an individual "alleged to be his brother" to "injure, oppress, threaten, or intimidate Martin Luther King Jr."

The photograph of GALT with his eyes closed is an actual photograph, while the photograph of GALT showing his eyes open was prepared from the actual photograph by an FBI artist.

A federal complaint was filed in Birmingham, Alabama, on 4/17/68, charging GALT with conspiracy to violate the Civil Rights of Reverend Doctor MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., in violation of Title 18, Section 241, United States Code. The complaint charged that "on or about March 29, 1968, at Birmingham, Alabama, ERIC STARVO GALT and an individual whom he alleged to be his brother, entered into a conspiracy which continued until on or about April 5, 1968, to injure, oppress, threaten or intimidate MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., in the free exercise or enjoyment of a right secured to him by the Constitution or laws of the United States; namely, the right to freely travel from state to state. In furtherance of this conspiracy, ERIC STARVO GALT did, on or about March 30, 1968, purchase a rifle at Birmingham, Alabama..."

A 30.06 rifle equipped with a telescopic sight was found near a rooming house on South Main Street in Memphis, immediately after the fatal shooting of Doctor KING occurred. The rooming house overlooks the Lorraine Hotel and Motel where Dr. KING was staying. It was determined that the rifle and telescopic sight had been purchased from a gun dealer in Birmingham, Alabama, on March 30, 1968. The name HARVEY LOWMYER was used by GALT when purchasing this gun. He used the name JOHN WILLARD when registering at the rooming house.

GALT is the owner of a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama license plates which was located abandoned in Atlanta, Georgia, on April 11, 1968. Investigation disclosed that GALT purchased this car from a private citizen in Birmingham on August 30, 1967. The Mustang odometer showed that it had been driven more than 19,000 miles between late August, 1967, and early April, 1968. GALT'S travels in the Mustang included trips to Los Angeles, California; New Orleans, Louisiana; Birmingham, Alabama; and Mexico, as well as to Memphis, Tennessee and Atlanta, Georgia. GALT was reported to have been in Memphis on April 3-4, 1968, and to have departed from there for Atlanta.

GALT has claimed to have been employed as a cook on Mississippi river vessels and as a Merchant Seaman. He is said to be an avid dancer and took dancing lessons in New Orleans in 1964 and 1965; in Birmingham during August and September, 1967, and in Long Beach, California, from December, 1967 to February, 1968.

GALT left Los Angeles on December 15, 1967, and drove his white Mustang to New Orleans where he claimed he contacted either an engineering or a contracting firm. He left New Orleans on December 19, 1967, and arrived back in Los Angeles on December 21, 1967. While in Los Angeles area, early this year, GALT took a course at a school of bartending and was graduated on March 2, 1968.

The pertinent dates for elimination purposes in this case are March 29,30, 1968, in Birmingham, Alabama, and April 4, 1968, in Memphis, Tennessee
