A man identifying himself as BOB HUMERSTONE, "Long Island News Day," Long Island, N. Y., telephonically contacted the Mempis Office at 3:30 p.m., 4/11/68, inquiring as to whether the FBI was looking for JAMES GEORGE ROBINSON and/or ROY JAMES in connection with the shooting of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

The caller said he had no reason to believe the two were involved in the shooting of KING but based on both having assaulted kING in the past, he was trying to work up a story as to whether the FBI might be currently looking for them as suspects in the shooting of KING.

He stated the only information available to him was news clippings and based on such news clippings he furnished the following information:

JAMES GEORGE ROBINSON, white male American, born 5/22/38 at Barnum, Texas, 6'11", 155 lbs., blue eyes, brown hair, slim build, was arrested for assaulting MARTIN LUTHER KING, 1/18/65, at the Alvin Hotel, Selma, Alabama. ROBINSON received a fine and a brief jail term and subsequently returned to Selma and was again arrested at Selma on 3/8/65.

ROY JAMES reportedly is a member of the American Nazi Party (AMP) and from Hempstead, Long Island, was arrested 9/28/62 at Birmingham for assaulting KING 9/28/62 and received a 30-day jail sentence. Subsequently in 1966 JAMES was reportedly acquitted in a Federal Court on charges of having threatened YBI Agents.

The caller deted he had no further information regarding the above and was merely inquiring as to whether they were being sought as suspects. The carler asked a number of other questions regarding the FBI investigation concerning shooting of KING and was politely informed that no information could be furnished regarding this investigation at this time. The caller was courteous and said he understood the FBI's position in this matter.



SUBJECT: MURKIN

TOM BISHOP, of Crime Records, called at 3:50 PM 4/12/68. He said REGGIE SMITH, a CBS camera man, is a friend of SAC ROY MOORE.

SMITH called MOORE from Kansas City, where he is now working and said that he had covered the KING funeral on 4/9/68. SMITH photographed the ceremony at Spellman College and he and his assistant recall that in the first roll of film they shot at Spellman, they pictured ten people viewing the body. One of the ten was a lone, white man, age 30, height 5'10", who had a sneer or snicker on his face. After a short time, this white man walked away.

SMITH's film would now be located at CBS headquarters in New York. Mr. ROSEN proposed and the Director approved that we contact CBS and examine the film made at Spellman College in an effort to locate the film of the man described by SMITH. We are not to mention SMITH's name nor indicate that we have any specific lead to this white spectator. We should indicate we are making a general examination of funeral pictures to identity suspicious white persons who may have attended. We can eliminate films taken at the church since only invited guests were admitted and we can confine our interest to white persons.

When the film in question has been located, arrangements should be made for us to send the film to Washington for viewing at SOG. These arrangements should be made through Mr. ROSEN's office. We can point out to CBS that this film is not evidence and will not be used in court.

ADDENDUM:

Mr. BISHOP called again at 4:20 pm, 4/12/68, and stated he has been informed by the Washington Bureau manager of UPI that there is a rumor widespread in news circles that CBS has a film which may show the UNSUB at the funeral of KING.

The rumor is that there is a white male in a CBS film who resembles the artist's conception. Based on this rumor, UPI has examined its own pictures of the funeral and found one of a white man passing the casket who may resemble the UNSUB.

On Mr. BISHOP's instructions, I told Supervisor COFFEY to make his approach to CBS on the basis of this rumor.

For the information of San Juan, the following is furnished:

Search of premises believed occupied by UNSUB who assassinated Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING on 4/4/68, disclosed suitcase in which was located tee-shirt and undershorts bearing laundry mark on red tape with black lettering believed to be Thermo-Seal type, manufactured by Textile Marking Machine Co., Inc., Syracuse, N.Y. The tape is $\frac{1}{4}$ " wide and 1/16" long and bears letters and numbers C2B-6.

Experts at Textile Marking Machine Company advise type on this machine is unusual in that the first two characters are 15 point type and the last three characters are eighteen point type, with the middle character, the letter B, probably being narrow rather than regular type. The usual machine carries 15 point type for the first three characters and 18 point type for the last two characters.

Textile Marking Machine experts also stated this machine is defective in that it is producing a tape 1 1/16" long instead of 1 1/8" long and is not projecting the tape far enough resulting in cutting off a portion of the first letter. The code used in the Northeast part of the U.S. is as follows:

The first letter O stands for lot number; the first number 2 indicates the day of the week, two being Tuesday; the second letter indicates the first letter of the store name, this is the letter B; the last number is the bundle number, this is 6. Color coding of the tag may designate various things such as a different month or the identity of a store in a chain. Experts also state the use of this system on laundry items is unusual in that the system is normally used on garments being dry cleaned.

The Bureau has instructed that all textile machines using this type tape be located and machines using this code be identified.

ALL OFFICES PLEASE NOTE: Bureau teletype to All Continental Offices, 4/9/68, stated that all laundries should be contacted in an effort to identify the tape on the shorts and tee-shirt believed to have been abandoned by UNSUB. The Textile Marking Machine Co. has advised that the above are the only machines known by that company to be in the above listed states which would be capable of producing the laundry mark on the garments. This company advised that the tapes on the garments are their tapes exclusively and that there is no other marking machines in the world which could have produced the tapes.

ALL OFFICES should index the names of these locations in their territories for future use in other type cases.

The Bureau has been requested to supply to all of the offices covering the above states copies of color photographs of the tapes attached to the garments recovered. The Bureau has advised that this is being done.

ALL OFFICES

It is suggested in contacts with above establishments the actual operators of Thermo-Seal machines rather than supervisory personnel be contacted. It is further suggested, on the basis of consultation with Textile Marking Machine Co. personnel that the letter "O" in instant tape may have been used rather than a dash for first character. If the code is recognizable by insertion of a dash instead of letter "O", or if the code is recognizable as it appears on instant tape, obtain sample of tape and immediately submit to FBI Laboratory for examination.

Sgt. Kelly, 1st Squad, Nassau Co. PD, telephonically contacted the NYO at 11:35 PM, this date and advised that his department had picked up one JOHN A. BURN, dob. 1-18-43, who resides at 88 Allen Ave., Oceanside, N.Y. tonight in possession of five rifles and shotguns, a bow and arrows and a 10" Bowie knife. Burn was incoherent, appearing to be hopped up on drugs as they could not detect an odor of alcohol. Burn claimed that he had murdered Martin Luther King, Jr., and later said that he had set up this murder, and commented that this arrest by the Nassau PD was a fine reward for what he had done.

Sgt. Kelly advised further that there had been a racial bombing in Oceanside last November, 1967, at which time the NPD had information that Burn was a racist, and was capable of committing such an act. NPD subsequently arrested three other subjects in connection with this

bombing and none of them implicated Burn.

Per instructions of Supv. Robert Stanley, SA John Shanley was advised of above at 11:50 PM, who advised that if NPD would be holding Burn, SA Joe Tangel, Garden City RA should be advised AM, 4-15-68, to handle. If NPD not intending to hold Burn, writer should take no

further action this evening:

Sgt. Kelly was recontacted by writer at 516-BA 3-1100, ext. 51, who advised that NPD was holding Burn on misdemeanor charge of failing to pay for gasoline at service station, and he would be held at the Mineola PD until 10:00 AM, 4-15-68, at which time Burn would be arraigned. Kelly advised that interested SA should contact either him or Det. Harry Waltman sometime prior to 10 AM.




