



Detective JOSEPH INSALACO, Port Authority Police, who resides at 166 Lucky Hollow Drive, Paramus, New Jersey, was interviewed at the Port Authority building, La Guardia Airport, Oueens, New York, and furnished the following information:

At approximately 1:50 p.m., April 6, 1968, INSALACO received a call from Patrolman FRANK PUGLIESE advising him that he had observed an individual who closely resembled the composite sketch of the assassin of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. Detective INSALACO proceeded from the Port Authority building, La Guardia Airport, to the Eastern Airlines Terminal at the airport, where he met Patrolman PUGLIESE, who pointed out the individual resembling the composite sketch. Detective INSALACO approached the individual and identified himself. He asked the individual if he would accompany him to the Port Authority building to answer some questions. The individual replied that he would be willing to do so and would be willing to cooperate with the police authorities in any way he could. Detective INSALACO was accompanied at the time by Captain THOMAS COFFEE, Lieutenant JOHN MAZIONE and Detective EUGENE KELLY. Upon arrival at the Port Authority building, the individual, who identified himself as JACK C. HAM, was advised by Detective KELLY at approximately 2:15 p.m. of his right to remain silent, his right to an attorney, that anything he said could be taken down and used against him in a court of law and that if he did not have sufficient funds to retain an attorney, one would be provided for him by the court. HAM advised that he was aware of his rights and would be willing to answer any questions posed to him and cooperate in any way he could with the police.

During the interview with HAM, he advised that he was in the process of getting a divorce from his wife. HAM advised that he had arrived on an Eastern Airlines Shuttle from Washington, D.C., to La Guardia Airport at approximately 1:35 p.m., and that while on the plane he might have made comments concerning the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. HAM advised Detective INSALACO that he felt there were certain people in the United States who should be assassinated, and that he felt KING was a traitor to this country and that he (HAM) would assassinate KING if ordered to do so by the proper authorities.

HAM advised that he was not now and had never been a member of any organization protting the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. HAM advised Detective INSALACO that he may have been in Memphis, Tennessee, on April 4, 1968, but could not remember for sure. HAM advised he had been arrested on one occasion for driving while intoxicated in Kansas. HAM advised that if three different individuals could show him there was a necessity to commit an assassination, that he would do so without any feeling of guilt. Detective INSALACO advised that HAM appeared to be emotionally unstable and could give only a disjointed account of his whereabouts during the bast week. He advised that HAM had no baggage upon his arrival at La Guardia and was carry two small airline bags when he departed the plane.

INSALACO advised that due to the possible connection with the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, he notified the Federal Bureau of Investigation concerning the incident with JACK C. HAM.

On April 6, 1968, Patrolman FRANK PUGLIESE, who resides at 439 7th Street, Brooklyn, New York, Port Authority Police, New York, New York, was interviewed at the Port Authority building, La Guardia Airport, Queens, New York, and furnished the following information:

PUGLIESE advised that he was on duty in the Eastern Airlines Terminal of La Guardia Airport at 1:40 p.m when he observed an individual in the terminal who bore a resemblence to a composite sketch of the assassin of MARTIN LUTHER KING. This sketch had appeared in the New York "Daily News." PUGLIESE was approached by two men who had a copy of the New York "Daily News" showing the above sketch. They advised that a passenger on the Eastern Airlines Washington, D.C., to New York Shuttle resembled the person shown in the composite sketch. They identified this individual as being identical with the individual PUGLIESE had observed a short time earlier in the terminal. They advised PUGLIESE that while on the plane this individual made statements that he would commit assassination if ordered to do so by the proper authorities, he also stated that he had been in Memphis, Tennessee, at the time of the shooting of MARTIN LUTHER KING, and made numerous statements concerning Dr. KING and his assassination. This individual also stated that he might be forced to take his own life. WGLIESE further advised that he obtained a business card from one of the men which reflects the following information:

PUGLIESE then approached the individual who resembled the composite sketch and asked him to identify himself. This individual identified himself as JACK HAM, by showing a Masonic order card. PUGLIESE recorded HAM's name and keeping HAM under surveillance, telephoned the police desk at the Port Authority building at approximately 1:50 p.m.





Suddenly, the shrouds of mystery and confusion surrounding the elusive phantom known as Eric Starvo Galt were ripped apart yesterday.

The man wanted for the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. stood revealed as a man of many aliases, a ruthless criminal capable of murder for a price.

An Escapee From Pen

The discovery through a fingerprint check that Galt was in reality James Earl Ray, an escapee from the Missouri State Penitentiary, strengthened theories that King had been the victim of a paid assassin.

"There is no doubt in my mind that Ray could be a paid assassin," Warden Harold Swensen said. "He is extremely dangerous, coldblooded and ruthless."

Additional evidence that Ray might have killed for cash came from Los Angeles, where the wanted man lived prior to the assassination. Witnesses reported they saw Ray flashing large amounts of money in bars and restaurants there.

Attempts to Escape

The picture of Ray that emerged yesterday's howed a tough, habitual criminal, a man who would resist arrest until he was brought down by gunfire, a man who could not stay out of jail but had a violent hatred of confinement.

In the Missouri jail he was given the nickname "The Mole," because of his frequent attempts to escape. Twice he was reported missing, only to be discovered hiding within the prison walls.

The third attempt was successful. On April 23, 1967, Ray was working in the bakery, an assign-



The identification of Galt as Ray would have been impossible except for the systematic examination and comparison of latent prints found at the Memphis site of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s assassination with the prints of more than 53,000 persons on the FBI fugitive lists. The 53,000 prints were among 187 million in the bureau's files.

Washington, April 19 (NEWS Bureau)—James Earl Ray, 40, a Missouri prison escapee and "drifter" with a long criminal record, was identified today by the FBI as the mysterious Eric Starvo Galt, sought in a nationwide manhunt as the slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said that a check of the fingerprints of 53,000 fugitives in the FBI's files had established that Galt and Ray were the same man. Ray has been missing since he fled the Missouri State Penitentiary at Jefferson City on April 23, 1967.

The FBI gave no indication that it had any clue as to the whereabouts of the man who has been the object of a massive search since warrants were issued Wednesday under his alias as Galt charging him with murder and conspiracy.

A three-page statement identifying Ray as Galt and photos of the suspect—including an eight-year-old mug shot-were distributed to newsmen at FBI headquarters. Reporters were not permitted to leave the building until given the go-ahead by an FBI spokesman.

The FBI declined to elaborate on its announcement, which dealt mainly with Ray's criminal record, starting in 1949 and leading up to a 1960 conviction for armed robbery, for which he was serving a 20-year term when he escaped.

Silence on "Hired Killer"

Asked if the fact that Ray had a long criminal record lent support to the theory that the sniper who shot King April 4 in Mem-phis, Tenn., was a "hired killer," a FBI spokesman replied: "No comment.





The article Contained two Comments of interest, however, one concerning Plev. Dr. Martin Luther King, fr. read as follows: "He and others have built an illusion by telling the colored geople they can gain freedom now under the gresent system of government. The second Comment allegedly made by a leader of Barness following was quoted as saying, "We'd assassinate the gresident of it shited our ends. Don't think we couldn't do it."

However, based upon the facts that Barnes's left arm is reported missing at the elbow and the age and description differences, as well as apparent background differences it is felt that James Earl Ray and Jack Barnes are not identical but two separate and destinct individuals.
