He advised his records reflect that on March 18, 1968, REGINA HAGSPIEL booked passage on Pan American Airways flight number 287 which departed from Kennedy Airport on April 5, 1968, at 8:15 pm to San Juan. His records reflect that REGINA HAGSPIEL is to return on flight number 294 which departs San Juan at 2:30 pm on April 23, 1968 and arrives at Kennedy Airport 5:05 pm the same date.

When this reservation was taken REGINA HAGSPIEL advised the Reservation Clerk that she was residing at 105 East 20th Street, New York City, and her telephone number was listed as area code 212 OR 9-9475.

He advised that he could not locate any ticket at the present time for a person using the name of RICHARDSON who occupied set number 25B on Pan American Airways flight number 287 which departed from Kennedy Airport, New York, en route to San Juan, Puerto Rico. He advised that there was a possibility that this ticket may have been misplaced or filed with another flight which left Kennedy Airport on April 5, 1968 and he would check all of his records on this date in an attempt to locate a ticket for Mr. RTCHARDSON.

Mrs. IRMEARG HAWIE, File Supervisor, Pan American Airways, Departure Building, Kennedy Airport, was contacted and furnished the following information:

She advised that her records reflect that there was a Pan American flight from New York to San Juan, Puerto Rico, leaving New York at 8:15 pm on the evening of April 5, 1968. This flight number was Pan American Airways number 287. Her records reflect that RAMON CASTILIO was a passenger on this flight and occupied seat number 25A which is next to the window on the left hand side of the airplane. Her records reflect that a Mr. (First Name Unknown) RICHARDSON occupied seat number 25B and directly next to him was seated REGINA HAGSPIEL who occupied seat number 25C which was an aisle seat. She stated that the ticket for REGINA HAGSPIEL was booked on March 18, 1968, under the name of REGINA HOGFPIL and her ticket number was 026,162,129,345.

She also stated that her records reflect that the passenger RICHARDSON was booked as a "stand-by" and could not furnish any additional information in connection with this matter. She stated that for further information concerning these three individual tickets, this information cold be obtained from a supervisor assigned to the Passenger Revenue Service, Pan American Building, 200 Park Avenue, 4th Floor, New York, New York.

On April 24, 1968, Miss REGINA HAGSPIEL was contacted at her place of employment the Zum Zum Restraunt where she is employed as a waitress. She advised that she was on Flight #287 which departed Kennedy Airport on April 5, 1968, enroute to San Juan. She was traveling alone and the person seated next to her in the plane was a white male. During this flight this individual seated next to her engaged her in XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX a conversation which was of a general type dicussion. She viewed the photography of JAMES EARL RAY after which time she stated that the picture displayed to her did not resemble the man who was seated next to her in the plane. She could not furnish XXXX any information concerning this individual because she x had been drinking prior to her boarding the plane and this individual also bought her a drink on the flight. When she arrived at San Juan she departed the plane and relatives meet her at the airport. She has not seen the individual who was seated next to her after mx leaving the plane in San Juan and could not furnish any additio XX nal XX information.

CIVIL RIGHTSS

At 10:50am on this date, the Dominican Consel General RAMON CASTILLO telephonically contacted the NYO and asked to contacted at his office immediately by Bureau agents as he had information of national importance.

He was interviewed at the Dominican Consulate, 1270 Avenue of the Americas, NYC, by SAS HEINRICH VON ECKARDT and JOHN A. BEHRINGER at 11:30am to 12:15pm. at which time he furnished the following information:

Last night while reading the Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, newspaper "Listin" Diario" edition of 4/9/68, he noticed a composite drawing of the alleged assassin of MARTIN LUTHER KING and he thought it resembled someone he had seen This morning, while reading the NY Spanish language newspaper "El Tiempo" he saw another composite drawing of the same individual which comfirmed his impression that he had recently seen this person. He then remembered that this person had a striking resemblence with a man who was seated next to him on the evening of April 55 5, 1968, on a Pan American flight from New York to San Juan, Puerto Rico, leaving NY at 8:15pm. (possibly PAA flight 287, but Castillo was not sure of the flight number). He remkered remembered this man as he appeared to be extremely nervous, more so than the usual air traveller. He noted that this man ordered and drank in rapid succession 6 to 8 double scotchs on the rocks. the flight this man attempted to engage CASTILLO in coversation but CASTILLO limited the conversation to a minimum due to CASTILLO 's limited English. CASTILLO remembered that when the man noticed that CASTILLO was reading a Dominican newspaper, "El Caribe", he began his convers ation by asking CASTILLO how conditions were in the Dominican Republic. CASTILLO replied that things were progressing satisfactory. In order not to appear impolite, CASTILLO continued the conversation by asking the man if he was going to Santo Domingo. The man said he was not, but was going to San Juan where he wanted to spend a vacation.

The man then asked CASTILLO what he thought of Puerto Rico, to which CASTILLO replied that it was a very nice island and the The man then asked CASTILLO what he people are friendly. thought of the assassination of the Rev. MARTIN LUTHER KING. CASTILLO said that he thought this was a horrible crime. man made no further mentioned of KING after this. CASTILLO said that this was the extent of their conversation. CASTILLO stated that when the plane arrived in San Juan, he, CASTILLO, got off the plane before this man but noticed this man got off the plane also and the last time he saw him this man was walking toward the air terminal building. CASTILLO noted that this man did not appear to be intoxicated when he last saw him. No one seemed to be accompanying this man when CASTILLO last saw him.

CASTILLO stated that he xamxmax occupied a window seat on this flight, the unknown man occupied the middle seat and an unknown woman occupied the aisle seat. These seats were in the Economy flightxxxx section of this flight, toward the front of the plane. The only conversation that CASTILLO noted between the unknown man and unknown woman was when the man ordered wixxxxxxxx one of his drinks, the woman asked him to order a drink for her also. The woman drank two double scotches on the rocks, which theunknown man paid for. The woman smoked incessantly, even during periods when the "No Smoking" sign was lighted. The man offered CASTILLO a Lark cigarette. The woman smoked extra long king size cigarettes, brand name unknown.

CASTILLE stated that all conversation was done in the English language between himself and the unknown man, but CASTILLO stated that his English is so limited that he was unable to tell whether the man spoke with any type of accent.

CASTILLO described the unknown man as follows:

The forehead, looks and lips of composite in "El Tiempo" bear strong resemblance to unknown man.

CASTILLO described the unknown woman as follows:

30 years old White Race: Height: 515" Weight: 130 lbs. Hair: Dark brown

He could not further describe this woman.

CASTILLO noted that the same stewardess served the unknown man all of his drinks, therefore she may be able to furnish further descriptions of unknown man and woman.



The King Suspect His Firsts-Crime

By JERRY COHEN

LOS ANGELES—The criminal career of James Earl Ray, the man suspected of killing the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, began in downtown Los Angeles early on an October evening 18 years ago.

He tried to steal a typewriter from the third floor office of the Forum Cafeteria.

The assistant manager caught him in the act and scuffled with him. Ray got away—but not for long.

As he fled across a parking lot, an attendant heard the assistant manager's cries and grabbed Ray.

The two struggled. Ray broke free, but a bank savings book and his Army discharge papers fell to the pavement from his torn shirt pocket.

That happenstance, and an extraordinary coincidence, led to the first arrest in Ray's long career of lawlessness—a span of misconduct which allegedly reached a climax in Memphis April 4, when Dr. King was assassinated.

On Oct. 11, 1949, four days after the incident at the Forum Cafeteria, the parking lot attendant recognized Ray emerging from a bank.

He attracted the attention of nearby policemen, who arrested Ray and matched him up with the bank book and Army pa-

Ray, whom the FBI has identified as the "Eric Starvo Galt" sought for Dr. King's assassina-

tion, was given 90 days in the county jail and placed on two years probation by Superior Court Judge W. Turney Fox, now retired.

Judge Fox's leniency was based on the report of Deputy County probation officer Herbert W. Audit and the plea of deputy Public Defender Richard S. Buckley, who represented Ray, who was unemployed at the time and broke.

Audit today is in the Probation Dept.'s Santa Monica office, while Buckley has risen to head of the Public Defender's office.

Buckley, in appealing for probation when Ray appeared Dec. 30, 1949, before Judge Fox for sentencing, said:

"... I feel he not only is eligible for probation but that he is a fit subject for probation ... this man is in a position to stand on his own feet, and apparently has done so for a period of time ...

"He apparently is thrifty, acquired some savings and also did fairly well in the Army. In view of these circumstances, I feel he is a good risk on probation . . . "

"I think you have a point there," Judge Fox told Buckley. Then the judge turned to Ray and informed him that as a condition of his probation:

"I want you to stay out of drinking places and not indulge in the use of alcoholic liquor or frequent or go to places where it is the principal order of sale..."

Audit, the probation officer,

had noted that Ray "spends much time on dates with girls" and admitted to "occasional excessive use of intoxicants."

His remarks, and those of the judge, have an ironic echo today, since women and liquor appear to have played major roles in the subsequent life of flay, who was only 21 at the time.

Audit also observed that Ray appeared to be of normal intelligence, was a Roman Catholic but did not attend church, attended movies two or three times a week and likes to read magazines and common ordinary books."

His father died in 1946, by which time young Ray had quit high school in Ewing, Mo., across the river from his home. He got only as far as the ninth grade.

He spent most of that time in Germany, and during part of his service career there he was assigned to the military police.

He earned \$55 a week, but for Los Angeles.

When apprehended, he denied he ever had been in trouble with the law before. A check of FBI files could establish no previous arrest record.

A CONVICT SAYS RAY SOUGHT KING BOUNTY

DALTON, Ga., April 23 (AP)—A convicted murderer who was in prison with James Earl Ray, now hunted in the slaying of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., said today he had once heard Ray say he would be willing to try to collect \$1-million for killing the civil rights leader.

The prisoner, Raymond Curtis, who is in Whitfield County Jail pending appeal of a murder conviction, said that he and Ray were inmates at the Missouri State Penitentiary when they heard the news that President Kennedy had been assassinated.

Curtis said that a third prisoner had told them a "K-K businessman's association" was offering "a million-dollar bounty of the tring".

oget King."

"King was running his mouth pretty good then," Curtis went on. "Ray said, 'If there is a million-dollar bounty on King, I believe I can collect it.'"

Curtis said he had known Ray since 1955, when they shared a cell in Jackson County jail at Kansas City, Mo.

Later, he said, they had adjoining cells at Leavenworth Federal prison.

Curtis said Ray did not associate freely with other inmates. "You could pick him out of a crowd of 2,000 men in the prison yard," he said. "He would be off to himself walking and his mind would be somewhere else."

"The only thing he would make a long conversation out of was when he was planning something and you were a part of it," Curtis said. "Anything he did was thoroughly planned. He never went off half-cocked."

Curtis said he had heard Ray mention "a King bounty" several times. At one point, Curtis said, Ray referred to the Kennedy assassination by saying: "Boy, probably somebody made a nice little penny off of that. I sure wish it was me

James Earl Ray's Police Record

ST. LOUIS (AP)—This is a chronology of the arrest record of James Earl Ray, sought by the FBI in the assassination of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, compiled by the St. Louis

Oct. 11, 1949—Burglary arrest and conviction in Los Angeles; served eight months in the county jail and released on probation.

April 18, 1950-Arrested for vagrancy at Cedar Rapids, Iowa. No record of conviction. July 23, 1951—Arrested in Alton, Ill., for no operators license and no city license.

May 6, 1952—Arrested in Chicago and convicted of robbery a month later and sentenced to the Illinois penitentiary at Joliet for one to two years. Transferred to state prison at Pontiac, Ill., and released from there March 12, 1954.

Aug. 30, 1954—Arrested for burglary in Edwardsville, Ill.

March 23, 1955—Arrested by Missouri highway patrolman in Hannibal, Mo., for breaking and entering of a Kansas City post office. Convicted of forging government documents, postal money orders and sentenced to 3 years, 9 months in the Fort Leavenworth, Kan., federal prison. Released April 5, 1958.

Oct. 10, 1959—Arrested in St. Louis for armed robbery. Convicted and sentenced to 20 years in prison.

April 23, 1967—Discovered missing from Missouri State Penitentiary.

July 20, 1967—The FBI filed a complaint charging Ray with unlawfully fleeing Missouri. to avoid confinement.

Galt or Ray, His Location's Still a Puzzle

By TIMOTHY LEE

There were no apparent indications today that the FBI was any closer to apprehending the suspected assassin of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. despite it's identification of the man.

The FBI said yesterday that Eric Starvo Galt, whom it earlier had sought in the killing, is really James Earl Ray, an ex-convict high-school dropout and Army reject. He is now the target of a massive nationwide manhunt.

In addition to the federal arrest warrant charging Galt with conspiracy, another, specifying first-degree murder, has been issued by Tennessee authorities in Memphis.

FBI spokesmen minimized reports that a hitchhiker answering Ray's description had been seen about four miles from El Centro, Calif., last Monday and had told a local driver he was heading for Yuma, Ariz.

"We're not getting excited about this," an FBI aide in San Diego told the New York Post. "We just put out the notices of the report."

An FBI spokesman in Phoenix said the hitchhiker had not been seen in Yuma or elsewhere in Arizona.

Police and sheriff's agents in the Imperial Valley in and around El Centro and in Yuma also said they had been alerted by the FBI reports but had no reports of anyone's seeing the unidentified man. The, FBI said a "systematic and exhaustive search" through its fingerprint files revealed Galt and Ray—a 40 year old drifter, loner, avid dancer and prison escapee—to be the same man.

In its first positive identification of the man sought for the sleving of King in Memphis, Tenn., on April 4, the FBI pictured Ray as a man in trouble with the law since his youth, and one who "should be considered armed an dextremely dangerous."

Ray escaped from Missouri Penitentiary on April 23, 1967, while he was serving the seventh year of a 20-year sentence for a 1959 armed holdup and auto theft in St. Louis.

Prison officials said a 1966 escape attempt by Ray was foiled.

The earlier escape attempt landed Ray in a Fulton, Mo. prison hospital facility for a mental checkup.

"We gave him our Grade A, "ass I workup," recalled Dr.

Donald B. Peterson, hospital superintendent. "We found no mental disease or defect within the law."

Prison and police records showed Ray was born in Alton, Ill., son of a laborer of the same name.

Records at the Fulton facility indicated both parents were dead.

The FBI said Eric Stame Calt was one of a string of aliases favored by Ray in frequent brushes with the law beginning when he was 21 years old—several years after he dropped out of high school in the 10th grade.

In addition to the aliases John Willard and Harvey Lowmyer listed on the FBI fugitive warrant, the bureau said Ray also has called himself James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Connor.

John Willard was the name used by the man who checked into a shoddy Memphis rooming house overlooing the Lorraine Motel, where King was fatally shot as he stood on a balcony and talked with friends.

The FBI has said Eric Staryo Galt purchased a 30.06 rifle in Birmingham five days before the assassination. That rifle, with a telescopic sight intact, was recovered outside the rooming house just after the assassination.

The FBI did not make clear where it got the fingerprints which it matched against its files to show Galt is actually Ray.

The FBI said the fugitive's acquaintances called him a loner who likes beer and vodka, favors country and western music and speaks with a rural twang. The loner tag seemed to conflict with the FBI description of him as an "avid dancer."

In more obvious conflict was the FBI's Wednesday statement saying Galt "took dancing lessons" in New Orleans in 1964 and 1965—a time when Ray was still imprisoned in Missouri.

A bureau spokesman said the earlier Galt description should have said he "reportedly" took the dancing lessons, rather than stating flatly that he had.

N<u>EW O</u>RLEANS MOTEL RECALLS GALT STAY

NEW ORLEANS, April 24 (Reuters)—The Provincial Motor Hotel said today that a man identifying himself as Eric Starvo Galt registered there Dec. 17, 1967, and stayed until Dec. 19.

Galt was the name used by James Earl Ray, alleged assassin of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., according to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

In another development, Louis Lomax wrote in an article circulated today by the North American Newspaper Alliance that Ray had used the name of "Galt" when he came to New Orleans to meet a local industrialist with whom he had previous telephone contact.

Mr. Lomax said that Ray, la 40-year-old escapee from the Missouri state penitentiary, traveled around the country after meeting the unnamed industrialist, and finally went to Memphis, Tenn., where Dr. King was assassinated last April 4.

Meanwhile, the F.B.I. was reportedly looking for a woman identified only as "Jerri" and described as a blue-eyed blonde who knew Ray as Galt in Hollywood, Calif.

She was said to have frequented the Sultan Room at the Rabbit's Foot Lounge in Hollywood, and dated Ray before he left Southern Galifornia.

According to PARDI this procedure has been demonstrated to the NYCPD and published in one of the scientific journals. He said the NYCPD is attempting to obtain sufficient funds with which to procure and utilize this procedure.

PARDI stated that by letter he previously offered the use of this system to the FBI in Washington, D.C.



James Earl Ray, a Missouri prison escapee who has been sought under the alias Eric Starvo Galt in connection with the gunshot slaying of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., has been added to the FBI's list of "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives."

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover ordered the special addition of Ray to the "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives" list, which already contains ten fugitives, to insure the widest possible dissemination of Ray's photograph and description to help effect his earliest possible location.

Ray has been the subject of a massive and intensive search since the brutal gunshot slaying of Dr. King on April 4, 1968, as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel. One rifle bullet, believed fired from the window of a nearby rooming house, felled the victim.

An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons on whom wanted notices have been posted in the FBI's Identification Division, succeeded in determining that Galt and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a United States citizen. Ray is also sought for unlawful interstate flight to avoid confinement after conviction for armed robbery, based on a Federal warrant issued on July 20, 1967, at Jefferson City, Missouri. He had been confined at the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, in March, 1960, with a 20-year sentence following conviction for armed robbery and operating a motor vehicle without permission of the owner. In September, 1966, while serving the sentence, he was confined for a time in the maximum security ward at the State Hospital, Fulton, Missouri. He was reported missing from the Missouri State Penitentiary since April 23, 1967.

Ray, who has an arrest record dating back to 1949 and has been convicted of burglary, armed robbery and forging United States Postal Money Orders, has also been confined in the Los Angeles County Jail, the Joliet and Pontiac, Illinois, State Prisons and the United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas.

He served in the Army between February, 1946, and December, 1948, received a three-month sentence at hard labor for being drunk and breaking arrest and was given a General Discharge due to ineptness and lack of adaptability for military service.

Ray is a 40-year-old white male, reportedly born in Illinois on March 10, 1928. He is approximately 5'10" inches tall, weighs from 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and brown hair which he has worn cut short. He has a small scar on the center of his forehead and a scar on the palm of his right hand. He has been described as having a straight, narrow nose and straight and even teeth and to have a nervous habit of occasionally tugging at an ear lobe. His left ear protrudes noticeably.

Acquaintances describe him as a "loner" and "drifter" whose language and diction reflect a "rural" quality and indicate he has had limited education.

He is reportedly a fan of western and country music, drinks vodka and beer, dresses neatly and claims past employment as a merchant seaman and cook on Mississippi River vessels. He is known to have worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher.

He is known as an avid dancer who has taken dancing lessons.

He also completed a course at a school of bartending in the Los Angeles area early in 1968.

Ray should be considered armed and extremely dangerous.
