

pFC ALBERT PICKS, C Battery, 1st Training Brigade, advised that ROBERT F. KELLY, US was formerly a member of that unit and departed on leave and transfer 4/5/68 to USARV TRAN DET, APO, San Francisco 96307, for further assignment to APO, San Francisco, 96375, to report 4/28/68, at Oakland, California, for this assignment.

Also contacted in an attempt to identify (FNU)
"MOFIEL" were the Post Locator, A Battery, 7th Training Brigade,
E Battery, 3rd Training Brigade, and E Battery, 6th Training
Brigade.

The above Brigades were contacted pursuant to recommendation by TED PIERCE, above, who indicated he had sold numerous airline tickets to personnel of these units on 4/5/68, and felt that (FNU) "MOFIEL" possibly could be identified through contact with these units.



The Sun-Times interviewed Ray, 32, at a north suburban country club where he works as a maintenance man.

### No Man of Violence

Ray expressed fears that his brother was dead and said other members of the family also doubted that he was alive.

He said he found it difficult to believe his brother shot King because "he never was a man of violence."

His brother's criminal record shows that he never fired a gun or hit anyone, Ray said. But he was reported as saying that his brother could have been used in a conspiracy to kill the civil rights leader.

"If he is still alive," Jerry Ray continued, "I urge him to surrender himself to the FBI or to contact someone in the fanily and ask thme to make surrender arrangeents."

The brother obviously had received a large payoff at some point, Jerry Ray said.

"Look at all the money he came into all of a sudden," he continued. "Bpying Mustangs, taking trips to Mexico. Look at the mileage he put on his car. You don't get that kind of money from sticking up grocery stores, and my brother wasn't the kind to stick up currency exchanges."

James Earl Ray never displayed animosity toward Negroes, according to the brother.

"My brother wasn't about to shoot a man because he was colored," he said.

#### 'Always a Talker'

But Jerry Ray said he and other members of the family had heard of the brother's interest in the political ambitions of segregationist George Wallace, the former Alabama Governor

There was a time, Jerry Ray said, that his brother thought that." about entering rural politics.

But Jerry Ray conceded his ice. He always was a good talker.'

But James Ray turned to crime rather than politics after his discharge from the Army in 1948.

Asked what caused his brother to go wrong, Jerry Ray said, "It's the old routine a broken family, poor and in need."

Was the brother a marksman?

Jerry Ray repeated that the brother never fired a pistol in holdups, but he did remember that the brother was familiar with guns, as were most farm boys, during his youth.

The theme of death often repeated itself in Jerry Ray's conversation.

He said that if the brother "makes contact with the people who used him, he will be dead."

He also said he feared some "trigger-happy ex-con" might kill his brother "because there's such a big bounty on his head." Tells of FBI Visit

"Mr. ROBERT SIMS, Assistant Postal Inspector in Charge, Chattanoogi, Tenn. this date advised SA M. JAY HAWIINS that he has been informed by a postal inspector in Birmingham, Alabama that a letter is in possession of the postal inspectors there addressed to ERIC S. GAULT, 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, bearing a return address of Modern Photo Book Store. 166 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York 10010. bears a metered postmark of 4/30/68. Mr. SIMS telephonically contacted Mr. ROBERT HICKEY, Fostal Inspector in Charge, New York, and informed him that he was instructing the postal inspector in Birmingham to forward this letter registered airmmail to the attention of Mr. HICKEY and that Mr. HICKEY would hold the letter in the event agents wish to examine it before it was returned to the sender. Hr. SIMS advised that since the letter was first class it could not be opened. Mrd SIMS advised that the above information was being furnished on a highly confidential basis inasmuch as he has no authority to disclose this type of information to the FBI, and that any investigation which may be made as a result of this information must be conducted in such a manner that it cannot be attributed to its source. This information is being furnished for any investigation deemed advisable by New York."

The following investigation was conducted by SA JOHN F. SHANLEY on 5/4/68 at New York:

The address 166 5th Avenue, NYC, is a mail operation for Modern Photo Bookstore, which company is actually located at 915 Broadway, NYC. Mr. SEYMOUR USLAN, President, advised that American Photo Bookstore is a division of American Photographic Book Publishing Company, Inc. (Amphoto), which is also located at the same address. The company specializes in supplying photography books.

Mrs. RUTH KOENIG, Manager, Order Department, Amphoto, searched her files and located a coupon clipped from Modern Photography Magazine, which coupon requested that book number 633 be sent to ERIC S. GALT, 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama. The coupon indicates that a money order in the amount of \$8.95 was enclosed. Mrs. KOFNIG stated that this coupon was presumably clipped from the September, 1967 issue of Modern Photography.

Book number 633 distributed by Modern
Photo Bookstore, is titled, "Focal Encyclopedia of
Photography". The book jacket for this book describes
it as a one-volume photographic library. It consists
of 2,000 entries written by 197 experts from 23
countries and covers every aspect of photography:
photographic science, industrial photography, cinematography,
portraiture, equipment, history, and current activities
of workers in foreign countries.

Mrs. KOENIG located a letter, which is set forth in full as follows:

"I recently order a Book from your store titled FOCAL ENCYLOPEDIA-No. 633 for \$8.95.

"If you have not allready mailed the book (PLEASE DO NOT MAIL IT) I am moving and will shortly send you my correct address Thanks

"Birmingham Alabama"

Mrs. KOENIG stated that during a routine review of the company's files, it came upon the coupon and accompanying letter of ERIC S. GALT. The company did not believe that it had shipped the requested book to GALT prior to receiving his letter. As a follow-up the company wrote to GALT by letter dated 4/29/68, asking him what action he wished the company to take regarding the \$8.95. The letter is set forth in full as follows:

"April 29, 1968

"Mr. Eric S. Galt
"2608 Highland Avenue
"Birmingham, Alabama

"Dear Mr. Galt:

"In going through our records we note a request of yours stating your intention to move from the above address, and to please withhold sending the book you ordered (Focal Encyclopedia \$8.95) until further notice.



Sister MARY ANDREW, New York Foundling Hospital, 68th Street and Third Avenue, telephonically advised the writer on 5/6/68, that she had recently seen an individual who resembled suspect GALT. The writer and SA GERALD CASWELL interviewed Sister MARY ANDREW on the morning of 5/6/68.

Sister indicated that on 5/2/68 or 5/3/68, while she was visiting the Sisters of Charity summer convent at Ventnor, New Jersey, near Atlantic City, she observed a man walking on the beach near South Dorset Street, holding a leash on a large Russian wolfhound. She stated that she only saw a side view of this person, but he appeared to resemble a photograph she had seen of GALT in the "News Week Magazine".

Sister MARY ANDREW described this individual as male, white, in his 50's, about 6' 2", 200 lbs., stocky build, fair complexion, dark hair, receding chin, unshaven, wearing a dirty red jacket.
