





Many responsible people in Harlem feel that there are facts in the Martin Luther King assassination which have not been brought out; they believe James Earl Ray did not operate alone; that he was part of a conspiracy. The real culprits are still at large. Many people feel that there are unanswered questions in the case which patently demand an explanation.

While this is the general tenor of feeling in Harlem concerning the Martin Luther King assassination and prosecution of Riy, these convictions by themselves are not engendering racial tensions at this time. The Negro people appear to be accepting this state of affairs in a spirit of resigned frustration.

According to informant this is the second floor of a two story building. A state liquor store is on the first floor and there are approximately four apartments on the second floor. Everyone residing in the apartments on the second floor is connected in some way with SCLC.

It is to be noted that BEVERLY STERNER, girl friend of BEVEL, and BEVEL have been interviewed by agents at this address.

PH 897-R and TRAVIS, who is a former staff member for Philadelphia Branch SCLC, went to the address to talk to BEVEL. They had been instructed to invite BEVEL to speak at a meeting of "The Resistance" to be held May 1 in downtown Philadelphia. The second purpose for their visit was to determine if they could help in any plans being made by SCLC in connection with the recent arrest of RALPH ABERNATHY in Charleston, S.C.

RAYMOND (LNU), who is currently residing on the second floor of 919 North 18th Street, Philadelphia, advised that BEVEL was in New York and has been in New York for three weeks. He also stated that it would be impossible for informant and TRAVIS to contact him at this time.

With regard to activity of SCLC in Charleston, S.C., RAYMOND stated that no plans have been made by SCLC in Philadelphia and that he did not know what was being done nationally.

Informant advised that after he and TRAVIS left BEVEL's address, TRAVIS made the statement that SCLC was "apparently falling apart in Philadelphia."

The above is furnished for information and was not put into an LHM because it would immediately identify an informant of continuing value.

William Bradford Rule has written a third article for "Look" magazine. The article appears in the issue dated April 15, 1969, but this issue was circulated on April 1, 1969. A review of the article reveals that James Earl Ray allegedly registered at the Travelodge Motel, Five Points, Birmingham, Alabama, on March 29, 1968; at a motel near Florence, Alabama, on April 1, 1968; and at a motel near Corinth, Mississippi, on April 2, 1968. It is to be noted that Ray, using the name Harvey Lowmyer, negotiated the purchase of a rifle at the Aeromarine Supply Company, Birmingham, Alabama, on March 29 and 30, 1969. Cn April 3, 1968, he was registered at the Rebel Motel in Memphis, Tennessee.

In an effort to establish whether or not Ray was in contact with any individuals immediately prior to the assassination, appropriate investigation should be conducted by the Birmingham and Jackson Offices. It should be understood that there is to be no indication made whatsoever that the following investigation has any connection whatsoever with the case involving James Earl Ray.

Dirmingham and Jackson Cifices should make inquiries of the motels in or near the cities indicated above to determine the identities of individuals registered during the period Larch 29 to April 3, 1968. Elforts should be made to identify all individuals listed. As well as

obtaining descriptions and registrations for the automobiles of such persons. A review of such records might indicate whether any one individual might have accompanied Ray or been in contact with him during this period. Pertinent or questionable registration records should be obtained if possible for examination by the FBI Laboratory.

Memphis should insure that the Bureau is kept currently advised of pertinent developments in this case, particularly all aspects of court action since the death of Judge Battle on March 31, 1969.
