The names of those individuals appearing on the motel registrations who reside within the Jackson Division are being identified through indices check in the Jackson Office and appropriate credit and criminal being conducted within the cities in which they indicate they reside.

By airtel dated 4/29/69, PH stated that PH 897-R stated that RAYMOND (LNU) said that BEVEL had been in NY for three weeks.

A lead was set out for NY to locate JAMES BEVEL, and if in a hospital, attempt to determine the reason for hospitalization.

The New York Operation of the SCLC is concerned with fund-raising, and is under the overall supervision of STANLEY LEVISON. NY has maintained close contact with NY 3810-S*, a source close to STANLEY LEVISON, in an effort to obtain information that JAMES BEVEL is hospitalized in NY. This source has provided no information indicating that BEVEL is in the NY area.

There are over 100 hospitals in the Greater New York area with no central repository of information concerning patients. NY does not plan to canvass hospitals in view of the lack of definite information about BEVEL being hospitalized in NY.

No further action is being taken by NY as to BEVEL.

Suit by Ray Accuses Three Of Violating His Civil Rights

NASHVILLE, May 22 (AP)—Attorneys for James Earl Ray, who is serving a 99-year sentence for the killing of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., filed an amended suit today charging that Ray's civil rights had been violated by two lawyers and a writer.

The suit was filed in Federal District Court by Ray's lawyers, Robert W. Hill Jr. and J. B. Stoner.

Defendants named were two former attorneys for Ray, Arthur Hanes and Percy Foreman, and William Bradford Huie, who wrote a biography of Ray.

The latest petition charges the defendants entered into a conspiracy to violate Ray's civil rights. The earlier suit charged that the three men profited unduly from publication rights to Ray's story.

The NY indices contain no reference to ED PINAUD.

In view of the above, the NYO is making no further effort to locate and interview ED PINAUD.

JAMES LUTHER BEVEL

The New York Times on March 18, 1969, carried a story concerning an interview of JAMES BEVEL in which BEVEL stated a letter was turned over to the Memphis Police on approximately April 3, 1968, which contained information that Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., was to be assassinated while in Memphis.

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past and who is familiar with Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) activities in the Philadelphia area, advised in April 1969 that BEVEL was in a mental hospital in New York.

On May 18, 1969, a track meet was held at Villanova University, Villanova, Pa., and the proceeds from the track meet were sent to SCLC.

A second source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised he was present with Rev. RALPH ABERNATHY, Director, SCLC, at the track meet. This source advised while with ABERNATHY he met BEVEL at the track meet. Source stated BEVEL was extremely quiet and did not act in his usual manner. Source stated he mentioned this to Rev. ABERNATHY who stated, "BEVEL is in another world." Nothing further was said.

On May 20, 1969, the first source contacted people active in SCLC in Philadelphia and was told BEVEL is no longer in Philadelphia. One person stated "BEVEL is in New York,"



Now Mr. Goldman, there is something of a similarity between Ferniss v. Ray and the above case -- the plea of guilty to alleged charges -- but I say that my attorney and I find your statement of March 24 a bit naïve, when you suggest that a plea is normal enough in U.S. Court now, a time- and money-saving convenience that permits authorities to settle far more cases than they bring to trial. Not exactly so, Pete -- by reason of the following examples in both cases, supra. On the 4th day of July, 1968, I attempted to commit the craft of piracy (i.e., the attempted hijacking of a jetliner with 71 passengers aboard) -- like in the case today of U.S. Government Marshals. The Government made a "deal" with the defendant, [pursuant to F.R. 17.1, Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure -- which provides for a Pretrial Conference] -- not because of any time- and money-saving convenience. The "deal" was made primarily because the defendant did not want any of those seventy-one passengers to file a multi-million dollar damage action against the U.S. Government. It also, as provided for under Title 28, U.S.C. Chap. 171, Sections 1346 and 2671. The magnitude of this case provided a "flexibility" beyond the normal "frontiers" of the so-called "top-out."

Was the Ray "deal" the same "convenience" as the plea -- but since the apprehension of the "B" in New Mexico two weeks ago, 44-1987-Sub M-647, was made will now be a fact with the events unfold -- with the prosecution placed source within the defendant. 

GORDON advised the purpose of his visit concerned JAMES EARL RAY and that fact that RAY although he had pled guilty to the killing of Reverend MARTIN LUTHER KING, now desired to change his plea.

GORDON said RAY has applied to the State Supreme Court but his application was denied. However, GORDON expects that RAY's attorney will bring the matter to the attention of the U.S. Supreme Court but GORDON fully expects that the motion will also be denied by the U.S. Supreme Court.

GORDON stated his basis for this belief is that the Stalinist and Marxist factions of Communism have infiltrated all Intelligence Agencies and the Department of Justice in America and these agencies will bring force not to have RAY have his say in court.

GORDON then drew inference between the killing of Doctor King by using the killing of President JOHN F. KENNEDY and Senator ROBERT KENNEDY. He also likened this to spy cases involving the Krozens, aka Cohens; BELLA DODD; BELCHERS; BUTENKO and ABLE and COWENS.

GORDON stated he has been openly critical of the Department of Justice in the past and feels that all Intelligence Agencies, including the FBI and CIA should have their say in court to protect themselves and their good name.


