She said the number XTL 6200 would be needed by B [REDACTED]

She explained that this firm leases trucks from owners, and then gets the trucks properly listed in various states, whereupon the trucks are leased to drivers, usually the owners who had originally leased to National Trailer convoy.

Enclosed herewith for the Laboratory is a piece of white cloth containing samples of Thermo-seal laundry markings of the Clinton Laundry and Cleaners, Clinton, Oklahoma, and two pieces of paper containing Thermo-seal laundry markings of the Stillwater Laundry, Stillwater, Oklahoma.

On April 23, 1968, R [REDACTED] S [REDACTED], Assistant Manager, Stillwater Laundry, 402 South Main, Stillwater, Oklahoma, advised SA P [REDACTED] K [REDACTED] that Thermo-seal laundry mark 20R-3 is employed in his business. S [REDACTED] stated that the letters of the alphabet are used to designate a particular week and that each letter could be used only once every 26 weeks. The digits used in the code before the letter are used to designate a load number and digits used after the letter designate a particular order in that particular load. The color is changed at random and ten colors in all are used. S [REDACTED] produced laundry receipt number 13824 dated 1/30/68, in the name of J [REDACTED] I [REDACTED] no address, for two shirts, which had a Thermo-seal tape attached, red in

color and imprinted with code number 20R-3. S [redacted] advised that D [redacted] is a regular customer and is well known to him. S [redacted] further advised that code number 20R-3 has not been used since 1/30/68, and would have been used prior to this in August of 1967, but due to the fact that no records are available, it would be impossible to determine who might have been assigned this code at that time or the color of the code used. S [redacted] furnished samples of Thermo-seal tape used in his business for submission to the FBI Laboratory.

S [redacted] was exhibited Wanted Flyer number 442-A for JAMES EARL RAY, at which time he advised that he could not identify this individual as being identical with anyone he has observed in the past.

On 4/23/68, R [redacted] P [redacted], manager, Clinton Laundry and Cleaners, Clinton, Oklahoma, advised SA W [redacted] F [redacted] that his firm uses a code such as 20R-3. The letter in the code is changed weekly and the entire alphabet is utilized. By calculating on a calendar P [redacted] was able to determine that the symbol 20R-3 would have been in use from noon, 9/22/67 through noon on 9/29/67. Prior to this time the code would have been used in March, 1967. In March 1968, the code would have been used again but in March, 1968, P [redacted]'s firm was not using a Thermo-seal marking machine. Prior to September, 1967, the firm was using a Thermo-seal marking machine which is no longer in operation but this machine produced a wider tape. This particular tape was a wider tape than the current machine being used and the tape used was gold in color. P [redacted] stated his firm does not retain records on home delivery transactions over 3 months. They do have available records on cash items at the counter. These records were searched for the period 1/1/67 through 4/1/68 without locating any having the symbol 20R-3. Symbols 20R-2 and 20R-4 were located and P [redacted] stated this indicates 20R-3 was a home delivery on which no records are available. Samples of the Thermo-seal laundry markings were obtained from P [redacted] for submission to the FBI Laboratory.

REQUEST OF THE FBI LABORATORY

The FBI Laboratory is requested to compare the enclosed samples of Thermo-seal laundry markings with the questioned

specimens previously submitted in this case to determine if the machine at Clinton, Oklahoma, or at Stillwater, Oklahoma, could have produced the questioned laundry markings.

The enclosed samples may be retained or discarded by the FBI Laboratory and need not be returned to Oklahoma City.

[REDACTED] advised this date that between approximately 1:20 and 2 PM, 4/7/68, she, her husband L [REDACTED] and Mrs. E [REDACTED] H [REDACTED] Lawton, were at the Big Town Truck Stop, 9600 Northeast Expressway, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. They stopped in the dining section of the truck stop and observed an individual who Mrs. D [REDACTED] feels strongly was identical to JAMES EARL RAY. This individual was sitting by himself near the window reading a newspaper and having a cup of coffee. After the waitress had removed the coffee cup, the individual remained at the window seat and continued to read the newspaper. This individual on a couple of occasions attempted to enter into the conversation that D [REDACTED] her husband and Mrs. H [REDACTED] were having. The only specific topics of conversation she could recall in which the individual attempted to participate in concerned whether or not the D [REDACTED] lived in Oklahoma City, a discussion of children and an article in the newspaper dealing with the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

Mrs. D [REDACTED] stated that when she went to the ladies room the individual remained at the seat near the window; however, when she came away from the ladies room, her purse caught on the door knob and she reached toward her purse to free it from the door knob. This all took place in the immediate vicinity of the pay telephone booth and Mrs. D [REDACTED] is of the opinion that as she reached for her purse the individual departed the Big Town Truck Stop restaurant at a rapid pace. She did not see his manner of departure once he got outside of the restaurant.

In discussing the above described situation, she and her husband agreed the person they saw in the Big Town Truck Stop strongly resembled RAY. However, Mr. D [REDACTED] felt that the picture reflected a man who was younger than the person they observed in the restaurant as he was of the opinion that the individual in the restaurant was approximately forty years of age. Upon checking the description of RAY as provided in Newsweek, it was ascertained that he was in fact 40 years of age at this time. Mrs. D [REDACTED] stated that the individual they observed had brown hair, was slightly taller than her husband, who is 5'8", was attired in a brown suit, white shirt and wearing no tie.

THE CRIMES: Ray escaped from the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, on April 23, 1967, while serving a 20-year sentence for armed robbery and operating a motor vehicle without the owner's permission. He subsequently allegedly conspired, under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, to violate the civil rights of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., shot to death on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel on April 4, 1968.

THE CRIMINAL: A 40-year-old white native of Illinois, who is known as a "loner" and "drifter" and has taken elaborate steps to establish a false identity, Ray has an extensive criminal record, including convictions for burglary, robbery and forging U. S. Postal Money Orders. Outstanding characteristics include a straight narrow nose, straight and even teeth, a noticeably protruding left ear and a nervous habit of tugging at an ear lobe. He has taken dancing lessons, attended bartending school, enrolled in a correspondence course in lock-smithing and traveled widely in a 1966 Mustang recovered in Atlanta, Georgia, a week after Dr. King's murder. Ray likes western and country music, drinks vodka and beer and has worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher.

PROCESS: A Federal warrant issued at Jefferson City, Missouri, on July 20, 1967, charges Ray with unlawful interstate flight to avoid confinement for robbery. Another Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, as Eric Starvo Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a citizen.

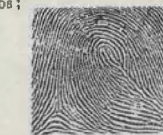

Enclosed herewith for the information purposes to Jackson and Atlanta, is one copy of Tampa airtel to Director, 4/16/68, for background information.

Set forth hereafter is a recapitulation of investigation concerning D ██████████ S ██████████ (former Top Ten Fugitive) and his allegedly being offered money by the Ku Klux Klan of Mississippi to murder Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., in 1964.

forwarded to the Bureau an original and 7 copies of a letterhead memorandum showing information received from J [REDACTED] C [REDACTED], a detective of the Jackson, Mississippi Police Department, considered by Jackson a reliable individual who is acquainted with members or former members of the WKKKKOM. C [REDACTED] in reporting this information that was overheard as general rumor among Klansmen and he did not know the source, was doubtful of its truthfulness.

The information in substance was that on 3/17/65, C [REDACTED] advised that he had received unverified information that in 1964, the original Knights of the KKK of Mississippi had hired a "killer" from the State of Oklahoma to murder MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. when KING was in Jackson, Mississippi. This "killer" was known as "TWO JUMPS" and came to Jackson, Mississippi to "case" the layout and while in Jackson, stayed at the Terrymore Motel. He was to use a high-powered rifle with telescopic sights. This deal allegedly fell through when the Klansmen could not raise the \$13,000 demanded by "TWO JUMPS."

C [REDACTED] also reported "TWO JUMPS" was allegedly also the killer of a Bureau Top Ten fugitive later identified as JOHN GIBSON DILLON. "TWO JUMPS" allegedly killed DILLON at the Flamingo Motel in Jackson, Mississippi and thereafter transported the body to Oklahoma or Kansas where it was dumped in an old well.

The Oklahoma City Division by airtel of 4/8/65, advised Bureau and Jackson Division that complete background in the case involving Top Ten Fugitive JOHN GIBSON DILLON did not substantiate that DILLON was killed in Mississippi. From facts available to Oklahoma City, it was doubtful in fact if DILLON was killed in Mississippi.

The Jackson Division on 4/2/65 interviewed PCI C [REDACTED] B [REDACTED] described by Jackson as a notorious confidence man and gambler who had at that time been under development as an informant of the Jackson Division for some two months.

B [REDACTED] was asked if he knew an individual named DONALD SPARKS or G [REDACTED] S [REDACTED] to which he promptly replied, "Who, TWO JUMPS?" He was thereafter shown a photograph of D [REDACTED] S [REDACTED], Tulsa, Oklahoma Police Department Number 38224 dated September 7, 1963. B [REDACTED] promptly identified this photograph of S [REDACTED] as being identical to the person he has known for many years as "TWO JUMPS." B [REDACTED] went on to relate that SPARKS got the nickname of "TWO JUMPS" from his ability as a cowboy and according to B [REDACTED], SP [REDACTED] was an excellent "broncho buster" and could ride almost any horse. B [REDACTED] considered SPARKS to be an extremely hard and tough individual who would not hesitate to kill anyone. Extensive investigation was conducted in several field offices to concretely identify "TWO JUMPS" and from the identification of PCI C [REDACTED] B [REDACTED] Jackson, Mississippi, it was felt that D [REDACTED] S [REDACTED] was identical to "TWO JUMPS."

Investigation by the Jackson Division at the Terrymore Motel in Jackson failed to disclose any registration that could be identified as being that of S [REDACTED]. In addition to the above identification of S [REDACTED] as "TWO JUMPS", Phoenix CI PX 737-C was interviewed at Phoenix on 1/26/65. This informant advised he knew D [REDACTED] S [REDACTED] and was well aware that S [REDACTED] nickname is "TWO JUMPS."

Based on this identification on 5/14/65, an attempt was made to interview D [REDACTED] S [REDACTED] Inmate Number [REDACTED] at the Oklahoma State Penitentiary. Following his being advised of his rights, S [REDACTED] stated at the outset he would not furnish any information. He did deny being contacted by anyone at any time to commit a murder and said he did not kill anyone for money or any other reason. He denied ever being hired by anyone in the South and specifically in Mississippi to commit any murder. He denied knowing anyone connected with the Ku Klux Klan.

S [REDACTED] at this time stated he had never cooperated with any police officers and did not intend to start doing so now. He said he had been contacted by numerous officers and would appreciate it if police officers would not bother him again since they wasted his time, as he was working in the plumbing shop in the Penitentiary and could not be away from his job. S [REDACTED] terminated the interview by getting up and leaving the room.

By airtel to the Bureau dated 5/17/65, in case "WHITE KNIGHTS OF KU KLUX KLAN OF MISSISSIPPI, RACIAL MATTER" the Bureau was advised of the attempted interview with S [REDACTED]. Additionally, 9 copies of an FD 302 dated 5/17/65, was furnished to the Jackson Division. This showed the interview with S [REDACTED]. At that time, it was the considered opinion of Agents that had worked cases involving S [REDACTED], his associates, and Agents who handled the former case involving former Top Ten Fugitive J [REDACTED] D [REDACTED] that information that S [REDACTED] was hired to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. and that he did kill D [REDACTED] was not accurate nor truthful information. It was pointed out that following D [REDACTED] murder there was a massive amount of rumor, speculation and hearsay information circulated among the criminal element concerning the death of D [REDACTED]. It was this hearsay information that was probably being reported by Jackson's informant in all honesty.

The Bureau's attention is directed to the fact that H [REDACTED] W [REDACTED] aka, ANTI-RACKETEERING, is the subject of a current pending file, Oklahoma City 92-588, Bureau file 92-9329. He is an Oklahoma ex-convict, Burglar, Armed Robber, who travels extensively throughout the United States. He was last interviewed by Bureau Agents, 3/5/68, where he was living at Bartlesville, Oklahoma. He was at that time employed at J [REDACTED]'s Lounge in Bartlesville.

Enclosed herewith for the Laboratory is a piece of cloth ~~XXXX~~ containing samples of Thermo-Seal laundry markings furnished on 4/23/68 by R [REDACTED] P [REDACTED], Clinton Laundry and Cleaners, Clinton, Oklahoma. Samples produced on unit ^{Thermo-Seal} #34444.

On 4/22/68, [REDACTED] advised SA W [REDACTED] F [REDACTED] that his firm uses a code such as 2OR-3. The letter in the code is changed weekly and the entire alphabet is utilized. By calculating on a calendar, [REDACTED] was able to determine that the symbol 2OR-3 would have been in use from noon, ~~XXXXXX~~ 9/22/67, through noon on 9/29/67. Prior to this time it was used in March, 1967, and again in March, 1968.

(Since R [REDACTED] was in custody during 3/67, this date was

disregarded in contact with [REDACTED] Regarding 3/68, PO [REDACTED] said a Thermo-Seal machine was not in use at that time).

P [REDACTED] also noted that his firm does have Thermo-Seal machine #33294 but this machine has not been used ^{since 9/10/67} ~~XXXXXX~~ the week of 9/22-29/67. The unit being used during 9/22-29/67 was #34444. #34444 uses a thinner tape and more narrow tape than #33294. Also, #34444 does use a decidedly yellow tape while #33294 uses a tape which is better described as gold in color.

The firm does not retain records on home delivery transactions over 3 months. They do have available records on cash items at the counter. On 4/23/68, these available records were searched for the period 9/1/67 through 4/1/68 without locating any having the symbol 20R-3. Symbols 20R-2 and 20R-4 were located and POOLE feels this indicates 20R-3 was a home delivery on which no records are available.

Since the record search was ~~XXXX~~ inconclusive, P [REDACTED] provided the enclosed samples of the symbol pertinent to 9/22-29/67.

It is requested that the FBI Laboratory compare these samples with the questioned specimens previously submitted in this case in an effort to determine if the machine at Clinton produced the questioned material. The samples herein enclosed may be destroyed if of no value.

the following information:

He lives in the house at the northeast corner of S.W.
24th and Shartel Streets with his wife, B [REDACTED]. He is employed
as a Glazer for the Del City Glass Company, Del City, Oklahoma.

From sometime in 1961 until June 29, 1964, he was an
inmate at the Missouri State Reformatory, Jefferson City, Missouri.
During his period of incarceration, he became rather well acquainted
with one, JAMES EARL RAY (whom he identified from a photograph
exhibited to him) who was a fellow inmate at Jefferson City during
the same period. They worked together in the prison bakery and
were gambling partners at the prison. C [REDACTED] last saw R [REDACTED] on the
date of his release, June 29, 1964 and has had no other contact
with him since that date.

While an acquaintance of R [REDACTED] at Jefferson City, C [REDACTED]
noted that R [REDACTED] appeared interested in the Spanish language and
in "Old Mexico." R [REDACTED] borrowed a Spanish book from C [REDACTED] and, on
frequent occasions, asked C [REDACTED] to "break up" Spanish words for
him, even though C [REDACTED] himself, did not know much Spanish. C [REDACTED]
also obtained books about Mexico and the Spanish language for
R [REDACTED] from the prison library.

Shortly before leaving prison, C [REDACTED] exchanged addresses
with R [REDACTED] for points of contact where the two, perhaps, could obtain
information about the other's whereabouts. They made no definite
agreement between one another to meet after R [REDACTED]'s term expired;
however, and C [REDACTED] appeared to feel that the exchange of addresses
was little more than a gesture between parting acquaintances who
may never meet again. The addresses given to C [REDACTED] by R [REDACTED] were
written down on the backs of some pictures of women that C [REDACTED]
had in his possession. On one picture, C [REDACTED] wrote down the name
of a person he recalled to be the brother of R [REDACTED]. C [REDACTED] has since
lost or discarded this picture, but believes the town that he
wrote down on the picture was Alton, Illinois. On the back of
another picture, one which C [REDACTED] still had in his possession, were
the following names and addresses:

C [redacted] further advised that if anyone at Jefferson City knew anything about the present whereabouts of R [redacted] it would be LARSON.

In addition to the above names, C [redacted] stated that on the back of another picture in his possession was the name, S [redacted] G [redacted], [redacted] St. Louis, Missouri. C [redacted] further stated that he could not recall whether or not he had obtained this picture from R [redacted] only that he got it while at Jefferson City and it may have come from him.
