Current photographs of JAMES EARL RAY were also shown to RICK JOHNSON, Asst. Head of Operations, and JAMES WYATT, Supervisor of Personnel, and they stated that they had not seen anyone identical to subject.

He advised that he boarded the instant flight 338 at Oklahoma City, Okla., on 4/6/68, with his destination being Philadelphia, Pa. He sat in the most rear seat in the tourist section, next to a white female with blond hair. He was shown a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY with negative results. He advised that he could recall no one on said flight who even resembled RAY. He noted, however, that due to his close attention to the white female with whom he was sitting that he did not really pay to much attention to any of the other passengers. He stated that due to his seat in the most rear section of the airplane, also, that his observation of all passengers in the tourist section would have been quite limited.

Due to the above, no further investigation being conducted re this matter by Norfolk.

Re memo of SA DONALD H. ROBERTS dated 4/25/68, and telcall J. GRIMES to Lawton RA 4/30/68.

Pursuant to rememo, Mr. LOWELL DIKES, 1611 North 26th Street, and EVELYN HOUSE, 1301 Irwin Street, Lawton, Oklahoma, were interviewed by the writer and displayed photographs of Subject RAY. Mrs. HOUSE stated that the individual in the situation recalled by Mrs. DIKES was not observed by her for any extended period of time. She stated she does recall the incident and the only picture of RAY that resembles the man she recalls in the diner is the side view of RAY taken in 1960.

Mrs. HOUSE recalled that the individual at the Big Town Truck Stop was a very pleasant person, did most of his talking with Mr. LOWELL DIKES and to the best of her recollection, he was dressed in a brown suit and for some reason she took him to be a fisherman. He appeared to be 40 or 50 years of age, well tanned, and his height and weight she could not determine because he was sitting during the period of time she was eating at the Big Town Truck Stop.

Mr. LOWELL DIKES, 1611 North 26th Street, Lawton, Oklahoma, was interviewed 5/3/68, and advised the only pictures of JAMES EARL RAY which looked similar to the individual he, his wife, and Mrs. HOUSE observed at the Big Town Truck Stop is the profile of RAY taken in 1960. He stated that the front view of RAY as taken in 1968, does not resemble the man who they observed at the Big Town Truck Stop.

DIKES recalled that the individual was rather pleasant, tried to make conversation with DIKES, his wife, and Mrs. HOUSE but was not unmannerly in doing so. DIKES

CLEO MYERS, Manager, Quo Vadia Motor Hotel, 212 South 14th Street, advised on April 22, 1968, that Desk Clerk NEAL HARRISON and Bellboy BOB GREEN had advised him a guest who had "skipped" without paying his bill resembled and was possibly identical with the individual being sought in connection with the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. MYERS advised he did not see this guest himself. He furnished the registration card and three room service meal tickets of the guest.

NEAL HARRISON, Desk Clerk, residence 901 North Osage, advised on April 22, 1968, he observed RICHARD BURNS on only one occasion that being when he registered. BURNS registered at 4:34 PM, April 9, 1968, and was assigned Room 221. He was alone and on the registration card gave his address as 13008 East Avenue, Fort Worth, Texas, his employment as Elco Cprporation, and vehicle information only as 1967 license (?)CL-721, Tex., the first letter in the license tag being illegible.

HARRISON became suspicious of BURNS' after he did not show himself in the lobby, did not visit the private club on the premises, and had two meals sent to his room. HARRISON requested BOB GREEN, Bellboy, to check for BURNS' vehicle to verify his license, etc., and GREEN reported he could find no Texas license resembling the number on the registration card at the motel. HARRISON then checked the parking area for Room 221, and found a late model, believed 1967, Ford Thunderbird bearing 1968 Texas license FDH-453, parked near that room, this being the only vehicle then in the area. He then called Room 221 on the telephone from the motel office, used the pretext that a possible car prowler had been reported in the vicinity of the motel, and asked what kind of car "BURNS" was driving. He was advised "BURNS" was driving a Texas Thunderbird. HARRISON then entered the "T-Bird" and "FDH-453" on the registration card.

HARRISON advised it is his recollection this person resembled, and could be identical, with Subject. HARRISON had previously observed an artists' conception in a newspaper, and was shown copies of the 1968 photograph of Subject. He described this person as follows:

HARRISON advised there were no local or long distance telephone calls charged to that room.

BOB GREEN, residence 1419 South 13th, Bellboy, Quo Vadis Motor Hotel, advised he recalls "RICHARD BURNS" as he had delivered two, and possibly all three, meals ordered by that guest to the mom, had checked the parking area for his vehicle as requested by Mr. HARRISON, and since "BURNS" had skipped without paying. He advised that a day or so prior to this date he observed a newspaper photograph of an artist's drawing of the suspect in the KING murder, and had this date observed the published 1968 photograph of Subject. He advised "BURNS" strongly resembled the artist's drawing, and resembles the photograph. He described "BURNS" as follows:

On 5/8/68, JEAN JOFFRION, 1529 Northeast 9th, advised that she is the subscriber to telephone number 424-4153, and was the subscriber to this number during December 1967. She stated that she does not recall receiving any telèphone calls from Houston, Texas, as she does not know anyone in that city. She stated that prior to a month ago, she had a tenant by the name of DOROTHY WILLIAMS, and that the relatives of WILLIAMS resided in the Houston area. 
