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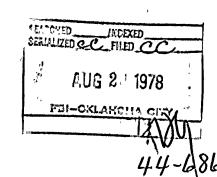

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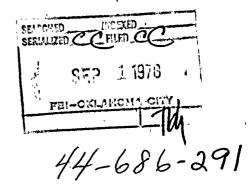

Records of the FAA, Aeronautical Center, Will Rogers World Airport, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, were again checked on September 1, 1978 with reference to FAA registration number N4434L. Those records identified the number as being assigned to a 1956 Model G-35 Beechcraft aircraft, serial number D-4600. That aircraft was initially sold by Beechcraft on April 20, 1956 to Gopher Aviation, Inc., Rochester, Minnesota who sold the aircraft on May 3, 1956 to Franklin Manufacturing Company, 65

Franklin Manufacturing Company sold the aircraft on March 17, 1960 to Mid State Aviation Corp., Sky Harbor Airport, Northbrook, Illinois. That aviation corporation sold the aircraft on April 18, 1960 to CONNIE C. MILLER, 9618 Sagamore, Kansas City, Missouri.

MILLER sold the aircraft on May 27, 1968 to Fisher Sales and Service, Inc., Box 6516, Leawood, Kansas, and that sales and service company sold the aircraft on June 6, 1968 to BURGES WILSON and LOU CREWS, 553 N. Scott, Belton, Missouri. On June 12, 1969, the aircraft was sold by WILSON and CREWS to GARY W. WILSON, 1302 N. Hocker, Independence, Missouri.

GARY WILSON sold the aircraft, date not known, but document received at FAA on February 16, 1970, to George T. Ward Builders, Inc., 1401 Plaza Center, Blue Springs, Missouri. 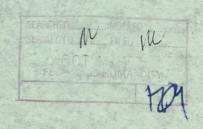

INMATE ROBERT E. HART, INMATE NUMBER 23747, DATE OF BIRTH APRIL 26, 1932, WAS INTERVIEWED ON NOVEMBER 28, 1978, AT HIS REQUEST AT THE FEDERAL CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION (FCI), EL RENO, OKLAHOMA. HART ADVISED HE IS CURRENTLY SERVING A TWO-YEAR SENTENCE FROM ST. LOUIS ON A POSSESSION OF FIREARMS CHARGE WITH ANTICIPATED RELEASE JUNE, 1979. HART STATED HE HAS INFORMATION WITH REFERENCE TO JAMES EARL RAY AND THAT HE HAS PREVIOUSLY BEEN APPROACHED BY CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES AND THE SECRET SERVICE AND THAT TO DATE HE HAS REFUSED TO COOPERATE. HE STATED THAT HE IS SOON DUE FOR RELEASE AND THAT IT IS HIS DESIRE TO NOW COOPERATE SO THAT HE WILL NOT BE BOTHERED FOLLOWING RELEASE FROM PRISON.

HART STATED THAT JAMES EARL RAY, A FORMER NEIGHBOR IN A NEIGHBORHOOD IN THE VICINITY OF MISSISSIPPI AND PARK STREETS, ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI, CAME TO HIS (HART'S) RESIDENCE AT 1921 RUTGER (PH) SHORTLY AFTER MIDNIGHT THE DAY KING WAS ASSASSINATED AND THAT RAY REMAINED AT THE RESIDENCE UNTIL DAYBREAK. HART STATED THAT RAY ASKED THAT A NOTE BE DELIVERED TO HIS BROTHER, JERRY RAY, WHO OWNED A BAR ON BROADWAY IN ST. LOUIS, AND ATTEMPT WAS MADE TO DELIVER THAT NOTE, HART STATED, BUT BAR WAS CLOSED. NOTE STATED THAT "THE BLACK SON OF A BITCH WON'T BE F-----ANY MORE WHITE BROADS." NOTE WAS SHORT AND CONSISTED OF ONE HANDWRITTEN PAGE.

HART SAID THAT HE HAS MORE INFORMATION BUT WILL NOT DISCLOSE THAT INFORMATION UNTIL HE HAS BEEN GIVEN ASSURANCE OF NO PROSECUTION BY MISSOURI STATE AUTHORITIES. HE EXPLAINED THAT AT THE TIME RAY CAME TO HIS RESIDENCE, HE (HART) KNEW THAT RAY WAS AN ESCAPEE FROM THE MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY, AND THAT IF HE ADMITTED THAT RAY VISITED HIS RESIDENCE THE NIGHT OF THE KING ASSASSINATION, THAT HE FELT HE COULD BE PROSECUTED FOR HARBORING A STATE FUGITIVE.

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Inmate ROBERT E. HART, inmate number 23747, date of birth April 26, 1932, was interviewed at his request at the Bureau of Prisons Facility, the Federal Correctional Institution, El Reno, where he is confined. HART advised he is currently serving a two year sentence from St. Louis on a possession of firearms charge with anticipated release June, 1979. He stated he has information with reference to JAMES EARL RAY and that he has previously been approached by congressional committees and the Secret Service and that to date, he has refused to co-operate. He stated that he is soon due for release and it is his desire to now co-operate so that he will not be bothered following release from prison.

HART stated that JAMES EARL RAY, a former neighbor in a neighborhood in vicinity of Mississippi and Park Streets, St. Louis, Missouri, came to his, HART's, residence at 1921 Rutger (phonetic), shortly after midnight the day KING was assassinated, and that RAY remained at the residence until daybreak. HART stated that RAY asked that a note be delivered to his brother, JERRY RAY, who owned a bar on Broadway in St. Louis, and attempt was made to deliver that note, HART stated, but the bar was closed. The note stated that, "The black son-of-a-bitch won't be f----- any more white broads". Note was short and consisted of one handwritten page.

HART said that he has more information, but will not disclose that information until he has been given assurance of no prosecution by Missouri State authorities. He explained that at the time RAY came to his residence, he (HART) knew that RAY was an escapee from the Missouri State Penitentiary and that if he admitted that RAY visited his residence the night of the KING assassination, that he felt he could be prosecuted for harboring a state fugitive.

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HART said DAVID SELLERS was the manager of the apartment in which he resided on Rutger Street in St. Louis, Missouri. HART said that at the time of RAY's visit, he did not know that RAY assassinated KING and that he later realized what happened when RAY was arrested in England.

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U.S. Refuses to Atone For Harassment of King

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Carter adminisgration has quietly shelved a request that the government atone for FBI harassment of the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. by using public funds to carry on the work of the slain civil rights leader. . The proposal was presented to the Justice Department in October 1977 by former Attorney General Ramsey Clark and came to · light last week in congressional testimony by King's widow, Coretta Scott King.

Both Clark and Mrs. King said in interviews that they believed the proposal was still under active consideration at the Justice Department.

However, former Attorney General Griffin Bell, who met with Clark on the subject in 1977, said the idea "never got off the ground." A department spokesman also said the proposal was no longer under consideration.

Clark, who was attorney general from 1967 to 1969, said he gave Bell a list of suggestions that called for the government to atone for the FBI's attempt to discredit King in the 1960s by establishing a program to "advance the cause of Dr. King." Clark said the program could touch on issues that King was identified with, such as voting rights, peace, civil rights or fighting poverty. Or he said the government could establish a scholarship fund in King's name.

"When the government has wronged somebody, it ought to feel a keen responsibility to right that wrong," Clark said. "Here you have a historic abuse of government power di-

rected against a great moral leader.

King, a Nobel Peace Prize winner who was assassinated in 1968, was a target of a lengthy FBI harass-

ment campaign that included bugging his hotel rooms, wiretapping his telephones and diseminating disparaging information about him.

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FBI Ends Probe of Ray in Shooting

QUINCY, III. (AP) -The FBI has no plans to question the brother of James Earl Ray any further about the shooting of civil rights leader Vernon Jordan, a spokesman for the agency said Thursday.

FBI Agent Wayne G. Davis said that "at this juncture" there will be no further interviews with John Larry Ray, brother of James Earl Ray, who pleaded guilty to assassinating civil rights leader Martin Luther King, Jr.

"In the absence of any other information, we don't anticipate talking to him again," Davis said.

FBI agents on Wednesday interviewed Ray in a jail cell here to discuss "where his travels have taken him recently," Davis said. Ray is being held on \$200,000 bond for bank robbery that occurred on May 30.
