We was contacted at work at CAAP. We said he as born at ampbell, Nebrolate him. We lives with his parents, LLCYD and BESSIE MERSIER at sarney, Nebro.

He said on 4-3-68 at 3:30 PM he met one BARBARA (MRS PAT) FARRELL, Gran, Island, age 30, a co-worker at CAAP, in Grand Island. They drove in FARRELL'S car to fatting Hastings, Nebro and had been at the Barrel Tavern. They drove to Joe's Tavern in Lexington, Nebro and had some more beer. They then had a bit of sex in the car.

They drove back to GI arriving about 11:30 PM, 4-3-68. He then get in his old car and and drove to sarney arriving at his parents home about 12:30 AM, 4-4-68. We said he had the flu and a hangover the next day which was 4-4-68 and he stayed home. He said he and FARRELL had been working the 4 PM to midnight shift but on 4-3-68 they decided to play rather than work.

He said he was home with the flu on 4/4,5,6,7 and 8/68. The said his mother and father were with him. The did not have a doctor but did consult telephonically wi with DR LERCY SMITH, The earney Clinic while he was ill. The said BARBARA FARRELL is married to one PAT FARRELL who works for Swift and Co, GI. The said he would perfer that she not be contacted to this matter. The said it would be too bad for him if PAT FARRELL know the above story. PAT thought BARBARA was working while they drank, etc., on 4-3-68.

The said he did not kill DR KING. St Volunteered to take a lie detector test.

Attempts to locate MRS BARBARA FARRELL, 1013 So Eddy, GRand Island on 4-16-68 proved unsuccessful as nobody was home.

On 4-16-68 BARBARA FARRELL, 1013 So Eddy, GI, stated she was with MERCIER from 3:30 PM, 4-3-68 until 11:30 PM, 4-3-68 and they drank beer in Hastings and pearney. She let him out of her car in downtown GI at 11:30 PM, 3/4/68/ 4-3-68 and she presumes he went home to earney.

Because subject was working on the pertinent dates in arch and was in GI at 11:30 PM 4-3-68, it appears #6##/1/2/ he had nothing to do with the murder of DR KING. No further action is being taken MK/ unless advised otherwise by the SAC, OM.

Re telephone conversation with ASAC Franck, 4/14/68.

On 4/14/68, JOHN DAVID KNAPP, night clerk at the YMCA, Dubuque. Iowa, furnished the following information:

He advised that he and another employee of the YMCA were sitting in the lounge area of the YMCA when an unknown man came in the lounge. This man asked if it would be all right if he rested in the lounge since he had been up all night. This was approxmately at 7am, 4/14/68. KNAPP and the other employee began talking about the assessmation of Martin Luther King, and the man that had come in became noticibly nervous. At this time Knapp remembered the artist conception he had seen in the newspaper of the supposed killer of King and he thought this man resembled the artist conception.

At this point, Knapp approached the man and began talking to him. Through the course of the conversation Knapp learned from this man that he had stayed at the YMCA in Dubuque, Iowa, over the night of 4/12-13/68, under the name of JAMES WILSON. The man advised Knapp that he was originally from Oklahoma, but had recently came from Rockford, Illinois, where he had been working in a Del Monte Canning Co. factory. Knapp advised we was fimiliar with the area surrounding Rockford, Illinois, and Knapp asked this person if he knew where Rochelle, Illinois, was located. The man stated he did not. Knapp knows that this is where the Del Monte Canning Co. factory is located.

Knapp then asked the man if he had ever been in the Merchants marines and the man said he had approximately 20 years ago, and that he had been stationed in Guam and other islands in the Pacific.

Knapp has no idea how this individual came to Dubuque, Iewa. He had no luggage. Knapp believes there is a chance this person will come back to the YMCA since he asked how much a room was for a week indicating he might rent one. He advised he worked at Jim's Cafe in Dubuque, Iowa, however Knapp noted that there is not a Jim's Cafe in Dubuque, Iowa.

Knapp made available the registration card for this 14-310-65 person and the following information was obtained:

Knapp stated this person left the YMCA around 8:30am, and he, Knapp, has not seen him since. He noted and described the unknown person as follows:

Knapp noted the age difference than that stated by unknown subject when he registered and the age he, Knapp, stated this person appeared. He stated definitely the person did not look 50 years of age. The person talked with a southern accent.

Knapp stated he doubted if this meant anything but he thought he should report it to the appropriate authorities. Knapp was thanked for the information and advised that should this person return to the YMCA to notify writer.

On 4/15/68, Jack Kritikos, owner and manager of Jack's Cafe, 7th and Main Streets, Dubuque, Iowa, advised that a person named Jim LNU came to his establishment asking for job as a dishwasher on Friday morning, 4/12/68. Kritikos hired this person. The man did not have any identification as for as Kritikos knows. He worked from 10am until 8:45pm. Kritikos paik him \$4.00 and told this person that he had more money coming and to come back tomorvow. He has not seen this person since.

While conversing with this person Kritikos learned that he had come from the Rockford, Illinois, however he originally came from Oklahoma. Kritikos did not note a southern accent when this person talked.

Kritikos described this person as follows:

Height: over 6'
Weight: 200

Hair: black, mixed with gray

Facial features: long

Dress: work clothes

Kritikos has no idea where this person could be located at the present time. He stated that should he come to his cafe he would notify writer immediately.

It was noted by writer that Knapp, the YMCA desk clerk, appeared to be playing detective and appeared to be furnishing a description of this person as he had read the description in the newspapers. Kritikos, owner and manager of Jack's Cafe, however, was very definite in his description and stated that this person was definitely over 50 years of age.

No further investigation being conducted in regard to this inquiry, UAC.
