Re: James Milton Curtis Oshel

With Oshel's consent, officers of the Fremont Police Department searched Room 312 of the Magil Hotel where Oshel was registered April 22, 1968. This search disclosed only personal effects, including apparatus for printing the Manual Alphabet cards from sale of which Oshel apparently subsisted.

In Oshel's billfold was found a small piece of yellow paper bearing the handwritten name "Wilkerson Printing Company, 215 South Cooper, Memphis," which Oshel subsequently advised, was the place of employment of a brother, not otherwise identified.

On numerous occasions Oshel stated, in effect, "I love Martin Luther King," spontaneously and without relavancy to the progress of the interview.



In opinion of Textile — Marking Machine Co., Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

"The Textile Marking Machine Co. suggests the twenty in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batach of laundry, and the three is the bundle number."

All Continental Offices were requested to recontact laundries determined to be operating Thermo-Seal Marking Machines in an effort to locate the laundry using the code, "20R-3."

It was determined by SAs MOHR & O'KEEFE that BURKE is apparently a mentally retarded alcoholic. His expressions were dis-jointed, illugical and obviously without basis in fact. It was immediately o'vious that the individual he had observed had no conceivable resemblance to the subject of captioned investigation.

The manager of the Plaza Barber Shop identified BURKE as a "sub-standard mental case and an accoholic". He said that although BURKE had mentioned seeing this individual at a local bar, he, the barber, had placed no credence in BURKE'S comments in light of his retarded mental state.



Name Galt ... Murder, Conspiracy Warrants

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The FBI Wednesday issued a warrant charging Eric Starvo Galt with conspiracy in the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King.

The state of Tennessee later filed a first degree murder charge against Galt in Memphis where King was slain on April 4.

Atty Gen. Ramsey Clark announced that Galt was being sought as a fugitive on a federal charge of conspiracy to violate King's civil rights.

The FBI issued two photographs of a man it identified as Galt, also known as Harvey

Lowmyer and John Willard. His eyes were closed in one photograph.

The FBI complaint filed in Birmingham charges that Galt and an individual "whom he alleged to be his brother entered into a conspiracy which continued until on or about April 5, 1968, to injure, oppress, threaten or intimidate Martin Luther King, jr."

The FBI charged that the conspiracy began at Birmingham on or about March 29, 1968.



FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said a 30.06-caliber rifle equipped with a telescopic sight was found near a rooming house on South Main street in Memphis immediately after King was shot. The rooming house overlooks the Lorraine hotel where King was staying.

Hoover said the rifle and telescopic sight had been purchased from an unidentified gun dealer in Birmingham on March 30

The FBI did not say that the gun was the murder weapon.

However, the Birmingham News said Thursday in a copyrighted story that the gun has been determined by ballistics tests to be the weapon used in the slaying of Dr. King.

The News story said also that the search for Galt has spread outside the United States.

Quoting an unidentified source described only as an investigator, the News said it is believed that Galt has fled to Mexico or Cuba.

White Mustang


Hoover did identify Galt as the owner of a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama license plates which was found abandoned in Atlanta April 11.

Galt purchased the car from a private citizen in Birmingham Aug. 30, 1967, the FBI said. The Mustang's speedometer showed that it had been driven more than 19,000 miles between late August and early April of this year.

In Memphis

Hoover said Galt had driven the car to Los Angeles, New 1 Cedar Rapids Gazette Cedar Rapids, Iowa 4-18-68

Orleans, Birmingham and Mexico, as well as to Memphis and to Atlanta. He was reported to have been in Memphis April 3-4 and to have left there for Atlanta.

Galt was described as a white male between 5 feet 8 inches and 5 feet 11 inches tall a n d weighing 160 to 170 pounds. He was described as a neat dresser with a medium build.

The FBI said its investigation has disclosed that Galt claimed to have been employed as a cook on Mississippi river vessels and as a merchant seaman. He was described as an avid dancer who took lessons in New Orleans in 1964 and 1965; in Birmingham during September and October, 1967, and in Long Beach, Calif., from December, 1967, to 1 as t February.

Galt left Los Angeles last Dec. 15, the FBI said, and drove the white Mustang to New Orleans, where he claimed he contacted either an engineering or a contracting company. The FBI did not explain why he had done so.

Bartender Course

It said Galt went to New Orleans Dec. 19 and returned to Los Angeles last Dec. 21. While in Los Angeles early this year, the FBI said, Galt took a course at a school of bartending and was graduated on March 2.

The FBI refused to say where it obtained Galt's photograph. It said he had brown hair which he wore in a brush cut, blue eyes, a straight and narrow nose, and straight and clean teeth. It said he had given his birth date as

The fugitive was further described as having a nervous habit of occasionally pulling at an earlobe with his hand. His left ear protrudes further from his head than his right, the FBI said:

Hoover said persons who have met Galt said he was a "loner" whose language and diction have "rural" quality, suggesting "that he probably does not have a high degree of education." He is said to drink alcoholic beverages with a preference for vodka and beer.

Armed and Dangerous

Galt is a fan of western and country music. The FBI said he should be considered armed and dangerous.

CHARLES SAGE, CITY MISSION, advised that the old records are very incomplete during the 1950s and 1940s. He made the best check possible and could not find any one by the name of DINKINS. He found one JOHNNY A. RAY who was there one night 9/12/55 enroute from west coast to Chicago who was age 27, 5'10, 160 lbs with brown hair and who stated had been in the Navy. There is no other information on this person in the file.

C. FREY, Chief Clerk of the Burlington Railroad advised that the Burlington Cafe has been a part of the Burlington operation but is on a lease basis. For the past three years it has been an automat. The lease holders changed frequently and there are no employement records available. e knows also that they did not maintain records on men from the city mission who worked short periods in the kitchen as dishwashers and helpers. He could find no record for DINKINS or identifiable with RAY.

JUDY STONER, Nebraska State Patrol, advised that they have a record for one ROBERT E. DINKINS, FBI# 5042244 who was born in Illinois. He is 5'7", 145 lbs, brown eyes and black hair. His only Nebraska arrest was for investigation by the Hastings, Pebraska PD on 7/29/49. He had a prior record of Auto Theft in Illinois, AWOL in Rawlings, Wyoming and later arrests in Ft. Worth Texas and Passo Texas for Auto theft and vagrency with the last arrest shown in 1957.

There appears no way in which the information furnished by DINKINS can be verified.



First Nebraska licenses have a county number, followed by a letter of the alphabet which is followed by a series of numbers.

Using the number 436-092 even considering that a letter may be missing it is too high a number for 1, 2 or 3 counties which are Douglas, Lancaster and Gage respectively. It is too high for 4 county which is Custer County and also too high for 43 county which is Colfax County. Any other county is out of consideration.

ADELINE BAUER, Department of Motor Vehicles, Lincoln, Nebraska, advised that she has made a complete search of her files and it is impossible for the number as furnished by New Orleans to be a Nebraska number. 
