Martin Luther King's Slayer May Himself Have Been Killed

THE ELUSIVENESS of James Earl Ray, publicly alleged to have been the assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King, has caused agents for the Federal Bureau of Investigation to theorize that he may have been murdered by the very people who hired him.

This assumes that he was, indeed, a hired killer. The FBI and the entire U. S. intelligence apparatus, including the military and the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), previously thought this was not the case. They originally believed—they even hoped—that the killer was a lone wolf who murdered the Nobel Peace Prize winner in a rage of berserk racism.

WHILE RELUCTANT to drop the original theory—because of the explosive repercussions which might result from proof that the killer had been hired by white racists, black nationalists or foreign agents —no clues have been overlooked that pointed in another direction.

The FBI alone has had as many as 2,000 agents working on the case at one time. Every lead has been patiently tracked down. No man-

hunt in the nation's history has been pursued with such infinite attention to details that might reveal useful evidence.

FOR EXAMPLE, Ray is known to have made several trips to New Orleans and to certain foreign countries. He is known to have had plenty of money. Even the prostitutes he visited on these journeys have been tracked down and interviewed.

The current FBI theory is reported to be based on the belief that the fugitive could not get food, drink and protection for so long a time. Consequently he must be dead.

WHO KILLED him? Presumably the people who hired him. A prepayment on the "contract" would account for the large sum of money Ray carried. But when he came back to claim the balance due him, he was considered too great a risk to be allowed to live.

It's pure theory but so is everything else in connection with Dr. King's slaying except the fingerprints and ballistics data upon which the case against Ray is erected.

SMOUSE stated that at approximately 2:00 AM on 4/21/68, a man came into his service station and asked if he could sleep in his vehicle for approximately one-half hour. The man explained that he had to be in Chicago, Ill., on Sunday, 4/22/68, and that he did not desire to sleep too long. SMOUSE stated that the man went into the rest room in the gasoline station and then returned and made the comment to SMOUSE that he felt that he was much too tired to sleep for only one-half hour and decided that it would be better if SMOUSE would akake him at approximately 5:00 AM.

SMOUSE stated that he permitted the man to sleep in the car until 5:00 AM and then attempted to arouse him. At this point, two young Pennsylvania State Police officers came into the service station and SMOUSE explained the problem to them. He stated that they laughingly blew the siren on the State Police vehicle frightening the man badly. He stated they did not question him even though he, SMOUSE, noted to these officers that the man in his opinion looked very much like the man who killed MARTIN LUTHER KING.

SMOUSE advised that he was suspicious of the man because of his haggard looking condition and because of his dirty dress and, therefore, took the license number of the vehicle, a blue Mustang, which he described as having Georgia license

He added that he had received information from PRICE that this individual registered as RUSSELL GRIFFIN during the evening hours of 4/23/68. He further related that this individual was allegedly employed at the new Fort Martin Power Plant in Fort Martin, W. Va. He added that this individual was also driving a Ford truck, white in color, bearing Louisiana license 191-124.

On 4/24/68, RUSSELL GRIFFIN was interviewed at his present place of employment, Fort Martin Power Plant, Fort Martin, W. Va., which is located a few miles outside of Point Marion, Pa. GRIFFIN produced a Louisiana driver's license, dated 2/6/67, in the name of RUSSELL L. GRIFFIN, address 122 Fairview Drive. Bastrop, La. GRIFFIN further related that he was born on at Princeton, Ind. 

On 4/30/68, at approximately 7 p.m., an individual who identified himself as JAMES PETFREY, 517 Evans Street, Huntington, W. Va., telephonically advised he had just seen a man resembling JAMES EARL RAY at the Old Town Tavern on 14th Street West, Huntington, W. Va. PELFREY stated the man was at least 6'4" in height and had a heavy beard. He could furnish no other descriptive data. He stated he would wait at Lewis' Grocery, 14th Street West, Huntington, W. Va., to be interviewed. It is noted PELFREY was difficult to understand and sounded inebriated. He also stated he had already alerted other FBI Agents to the man's location. He was unable to advise who the other Agents were or their location.

Telephonic contact with the Pittsburgh Office revealed that a man identifying himself as PELFREY had called a short time previously with essentially the same information except that he claimed the man resembling RAY was at Easy Bill's Tavern.

Desk Sergeant DON BOLLING, Huntington Police
Department, was immediately contacted regarding the above.
He stated JAMES PELFREY is a habitual drunkard and troublemaker in the community. He also stated PELFREY has never
furnished reliable information to the police, but is more
inclined to deliberately mislead officers in investigations.
He also advised the locations described by PELFREY are the
worst areas of town. He stated he would immediately
dispatch two detectives to the location and attempt to
locate the individual described by PELFREY and also interview PELFREY if he could be located. He stated his
department had an ample supply of wanted posters concerning
JAMES EARL RAY and he would instruct the detectives to
distribute these during their investigation.



On 5/17/68. Special Agent BUSTER WILLIAMS, U.S.Secret Service, Charleston, West Va., advised that Patrolman BEN BLACK, PD, Charleston, was trying to get ahold of the FBI as a local barber had cut a man's hair and he believed the man was the one wanted for the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

Patrolman BLACK and TOM GREENE, a local salesman, were located on Summers Street, Charleston, West Va., and it was determined that a short time before, EVERETT EPLIN, a local barber at 618 Virginia Street, believed he had cut the hair of the man wanted for the KING murder. He had followed the man outside hisbarber shop and when he saw TOM GREENE he asked GREENE to follow the man and find out where he went and report same to the Police. GREENE followed the man and he and a woman, believed to be the man's wife, got into a 1967 or 1968 cream colored Dodge with Florida license 1192795 or 1192759. They drove east on Virginia Street in Charleston and disappeared. GREENE said he did not get a close look at the man and could not identify him.

EVERETTE EPLIN, barber, 618 Virginia Street, Charleston, West Va., advised he had cut the hair of a man who appeared nervous to him and who in his conversation said he had just come up from Florida.

This man had a wrinkle in the middle of his forehead and a cut scar

in his right eyebrow. He was on the short side and somewhat stocky.

and one of his ears appeared to be different from the other slightly. There was a woman with him who wore wedding rings and appeared to be the man's wife.

Mr. EPLIN said the man appeared to him to look like the picture he had seen in the localpaper of the KING murderer.

Mr. EPLIN was shown photographs of subject RAY as appearing on the wanted flyer and the I.O. and he said that the man "Did not look like any of those pictures but he looked like the picture in the paper". EPLIN could not pin point which picture that was in the paper or when, but he positively stated that the man did not look like any of the three photos on the flyers.

It should be noted that Mr. EPLIN is a former county constable from several years back and he has been a barber for many years. He is in his seventys and he still is somewhat of a policeman at heart.

No further action taken since EPLIN could not identify photos of RAY with the man he had seen.

In order to cover the possibility that subject may have died since commission of the crime, the U.S. Census Bureau and Department of Health, Education and Welfare were contacted and they advised that no central records of unidentified deceased are maintained by those agencies. It was suggested that each state may maintain such a record in their Bureau of Vital Statistics or similar agency.

Each office covering state capitals should check to ascertain if such records are maintained, and if so, should check records for the period from 4/5/68, to date, for any information which might possibly identify subject RAY with unidentified deceased person over that period.

If there is no central record repository maintained in the various states or nationally in the case of Mexico and Canada, you should, in connection with your contacts with law enforcement agencies on this case or other Bureau matters, make appropriate inquiries relative to unidentified

It has also been determined that Pennsylvania does not follow this system so it will be necessary for receiving Resident Agents to conduct investigation pursuant to Bureau instructions contained in paragraph three of this communication.
