She and her husband had been discussing the KING Assassination and the name of the alleged assassin, ERIC STARVO GALT. She and her husband noted that in a number of novels whitten by author, MONALD HAMILTON, the names of "ERIC" and "STARVO" appear but she was unable to name the novels in which the names appears. She noted that in a markers couple of the novels the name of one of the main characters was ERIC who was a secret agent in the plots of the novels. She noted that the main hero of most of the novels is named MATT HELM. She thought it a coincidence that the names of "ERIC" and "STARVO" appeared in a couple of the novels written by HAMILTON and that the assassin used the name of ERIC STARVO GALT.

She listed some of the novels written by HAMILTON as follows:

The Shadowers, The Removers, The Silencers, The Wrecking Crew, The Ambushers, The Death of a Citizen, The Night Walkers, The Devastaters, and kke Murderers Row.

She had no rearrigate pertinent information relative to the photo appearing in the newspapers or anyone fitting the description of the one using the name of GALT.

On 4/15/68, Mr. LEON SARFTAS. Owner of Saritas. Cleaners, 519 Davisville Road, Willow Grove, Ra., was interviewed at his place of business by SA JOHN D. STOCKTON, JR.

Mr. SARITAS advised that he does utilize a Thermoseal Marking Machine to tabulate laundered shirts and other garments which are washed. He stated, however, that his machine is a six-digit machine and the color code is changed every 20 orders. They have ten different colors that are utilized on the machine and during the course of one day they may run through these colors several times depending on the volume on a given day. Mr. SARITAS stated that he does not use the code 02B-6. He stated that he uses a number code and the first digit is a number and made an example on the machine, 53-K-8. He furnished an example of the style of marking conducted by the machine. Mr. SARITAS stated that in his opinion, the B would possibly stand for the customer and that of the five digits utilized the first two would be load and day number of the week. The last number would be the bundle number. He stated that it appeared the number being searched for was prepared at a wholesale launderers.

He stated that the number shown him was not prepared on any of his equipment.
