Hunted Minuteman Chief Had Dr. King Marked for Death

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (UPI).—The U. S. Attorney's office here has revealed that an informant of "apparent reliability" told the Federal Government some time ago that Minuteman chieftain Robert B. DePugh had ordered the assassination of several persons, including the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., if DePugh ever went to prison.

In a motion filed in St. Louis with the U. S. Court of Appeals for the 8th Circuit, the U. S. Attorney's office here quoted the informant as saying:

"DePugh has issued orders to other Minutemen that, if he goes to jail, certain persons connected with his prosecution and others are to be assassinated, including Martin Luther King."

DEPUGH, 43, disappeared late in 1967. Several years ago he organized the Minutemen, a paramilitary group of indeterminate size, to fight what he claimed to be "the Communist-Socialist conspiracy now in effective control of the U. S. Government."

Anthony P. Nugent, Jr., assistant U. S. Attorney, said, however, that "nobody to my knowledge considers DePugh a suspect in the King murder."

Nugent said the purpose of the motion was to strengthen the Government's case to nullify DePugh's appeal of his conviction of violating the National Firearms Act in Kansas City in November of 1966.

The motion noted that DePugh has declared himself a "fugitive from injustice" and has publicly stated his intent to evade capture.

Nugent said "seven to nine" persons were on the alleged "death list."

"Most were Kansas City area people connected with DePugh's prosecution. Some were national figures. H. Rap Brown and Stockley Carmichael were others in addition to King," he said.

Nugent said there was no information linking Dr. King's suspected slayer, Eric Starvo Galt, with the minutemen.

IN BIRMINGHAM, Ala., meanwhile, it was reported that the FBI was working with an informer — possibly the co-conspirator — in its Nation-wide hunt for Galt.

A tip from the alleged informer led the FBI to believe it could arrest the mysterious Galt in California yesterday. This belief led Federal authorities to obtain a conspiracy warrant against Galt. Memphis, Tenn., officials swore out a murder warrant.

But the tip either was wrong or Galt eluded authorities. A good part of the investigation apparently still centers in California, where Galt attended a bartending school in February and March.

THE FBI IN ITS warrant charged Galt, 36, and his "alleged brother" with conspiring to harm Dr. King, shot to death by a white sniper in Memphis April 4. The conspirator was not charged in the Federal warrant or in the murder warrant.

The FBI in Washington said yesterday it "has no one in custody in connection with Dr. King's slaying," but a reliable source said agents either were in communication with or questioning Galt's "alleged brother."

FBI Centers Galt Search In California

Birmingham, Ala. — (UPI) — The Federal Bureau of Investigation today was reported concentrating in California its search for Eric Starvo Galt, wanted in the slaying of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The FBI reportedly has an informer—apparently the alleged co-conspirator with Galt—in the investigation.

A tip from the alleged informer led the FBI to believe it could arrest the mysterious Galt in California Wednesday. This belief led federal authorities to rapidly obtain a conspiracy warrant against Galt. Memphis, Tenn., officials also swore out a murder warrant. King was slain there on April 4.

But the tip either was wrong or Galt eluded authorities; sources close to the investigation disclosed.

Galt attended a bartending school in Los Angeles in February and March.

Conspirator Not Charged

The FBI in its warrant charged Galt and his "alleged brother" with conspiring to harm King. The conspirator was not charged in the federal warrant or in the murder warrant issued in Memphis.

The FBI said it "has no one in custody in connection with Dr. King's slaying."

The FBI has traced Galt's activities to Birmingham, Memphis, Atlanta and Los Angeles.

A picture of Galt, 36, was obtained by the FBI from the International School of Bartending

in Los Angeles, where Galt graduated March 2. School director Thomas Reyes Lau said the picture was taken for Galt's graduation.

"He was a nice fellow with a nice personality, very intelligent," said Lau of Galt. "I don't believe he did this. There must be some mistake somewhere."

Minutemen Threat

Kansas City — (AP) — The U. S. attorney's office said yesterday that an informant "of apparent reliability" told the Federal Government some time ago that the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was among persons ordered assassinated if Robert Bolivar DePugh ever went to jail.

The information was in a motion addressed to the 8th Circuit Court of Appeals in St. Louis and was a move to have appeals by DePugh and Walter Patrick Peyson dismissed on the theory the two are now fugitives.

DePugh is the leader of the Minutemen organization, militant right-wing organization.

The government's motion quoted the unnamed informant as saying that "DePugh has issued orders to other Minutemen that, if he goes to jail, certain persons connected with his prosecution and others are to be assassinated, including Martin Luther King."

DePugh and Peyson are appealing a November 1966 conviction in Kansas City for national firearms violation. They are also wanted on a federal indictment accusing them of conspiracy to rob banks in Seattle.

FBI Still Issues No Warrant**'Assassin' Trailed for Week**

ATLANTA, Ga., April 12 (UPI).—FBI agents investigating the sniper-slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., have been on the trail of Eric Starvo Galt, listed as an unemployed merchant mariner, for nearly a week, it was learned Friday. Galt's name first surged into the headlines Thursday night when a white Mustang auto, registered to him and resembling one that reportedly sped from the King assassination scene, was found parked in an Atlanta apartment complex.

No warrant has been issued for Galt's arrest, but it was learned that the FBI in Miami on Thursday had issued—and then for unexplained reasons withdrew—a "locate and notify" bulletin on Galt.

BIRMINGHAM ADDRESS

The Mustang registered to Galt carried Alabama license number 1-38993. A check with Alabama authorities established Galt's address as a rooming house at 2608 Highland ave. in Birmingham, but residents, while recalling Galt, said they had not seen him since November.

In obtaining his driver's license in 1967, Galt listed his occupation as an unemployed merchant mariner.

The FBI replied with a blan-

investigation, but persons at the Birmingham rooming house said agents were asking "plenty" of questions about Galt last week. This raised speculation, which again officials refused to confirm or deny, whether someone, as early as last September, set about to establish credentials for a fictitious Eric Starvo Galt.

DOCKS CHECKED

This was four or five full days before the Mustang was located in Atlanta. Alabama officials said that at the time he applied for his Alabama license, at the age of 36, come from Attorney General Ramsey Clark, who was sent to Memphis by President Johnson to help with the investigation.

after Dr. King was killed by a sniper while standing on a hotel balcony last Thursday. The name of Galt was further validated when license tags for the Mustang were obtained under that name on Oct. 2, 1967, in Jefferson county, Ala.

Clark said authorities had a suspect and his "name," but would not disclose the name. He also said that officials had a man on the run and were confident the case would be solved.

Reporters checking with mobile time officials in Mobile learned Friday that agents, in addition to questioning persons at the Birmingham rooming house, had also made a check of the docks long before the Mustang was found.

NO TRACE FOUND

A spokesman at the Seafarers' International Union in Mobile said agents had visited the union offices two days ago and had gone through automated files, without success, in trying to get a lead on Galt.

Officials at the Maritime Union of America in Mobile said agents had made a similar check there, and the Star Fishing Co., one of the largest firms of its kind in the area, said it also had been visited by agents.

DRIVER REMEMBERED

Residents of the Atlanta apartment complex where the car was found remember the driver as a neatly dressed man who calmly got out of the car, looked it and walked away. This description roughly tallied with one given by occupants of a rooming house in Memphis, where the assassin stood in a communal bath and fired the shot that killed Dr. King.

The assassin is believed to have checked into the rooming house under the name of "John Willard." He was described as calm, neat and well-dressed—an unlikely candidate for the \$8.50 a week room, which he paid for in advance.

Persons at the murder scene reported a man jumped into a white Mustang and sped away shortly after the fatal shot was fired.

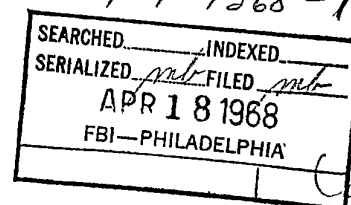

FBI Agents Impound Car In Hunt for King's Killer

Atlanta—(UPI)—The Federal Bureau of Investigation has impounded a 1966 white Mustang for which it has issued a nationwide alert following the assassination of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., in Memphis, Tenn., last Thursday.

The car, which had been parked for several days at a public housing project near the Georgia state Capitol here, was towed to FBI headquarters.

"No comment," was the only word from FBI officials, except to add that no warrant had been issued for the car's registered owner, Eric Starvo Galt, 37, of a Birmingham, Ala., address, where residents of a rooming house said they hadn't seen Galt in three months.

Alert Canceled

Florida police, at the request of the FBI, had issued a statewide "locate and notify" alert for Galt yesterday afternoon, about the time the 1966 Mustang was towed into the FBI's headquarters here and cloaked in secrecy. The FBI canceled the alert about five hours later, saying it was a mistake. There was no further explanation.

The message described Galt as a white male, 36 years old, born July 20, 1931, about 5-foot-

11 and 175 pounds with blue eyes and brown hair.

This roughly matched the description circulated by federal authorities the night of Dr. King's slaying.

Galt's address, 2608 Highland av., was a stucco, two-story rooming house in a south Birmingham neighborhood of old homes, high-rise apartments and modern office structures.

FBI Asking Plenty

The owner of the rooming house refused to talk with newsmen last night, but one of the roomers, Percy Strickland, said he remembered Galt as just "one of the boys," but couldn't remember him very well. "The FBI has been asking about him plenty the last week," said Strickland. There were reports that Galt had not been seen there for three months.

The Mustang, bearing 1968 Alabama license 1-38993 with two 1967 Mexican tourist stickers on its windows, was found in the parking lot of an Atlanta apartment project about five blocks from the Capitol. Several residents of nearby homes said the car had been there since last Friday, the day after Dr. King's slaying.

Mrs. Ernest Payne said she saw "a nice looking man" get out of the car Friday morning and walk away. She said he was about 5-feet, 10-inches tall, 170 pounds with sandy hair.

Others Saw Car

Another resident, Mrs. John H. Riley, said she saw the car

as early as 7 A. M. Friday, about 12 hours after King was shot 382 miles away. Joe Manus also said he had seen the car since last Friday and Mrs. Mary Bridges reported seeing a well-dressed, dark-haired man near the car recently.

Mrs. Bridges was uncertain whether the man resembled a police artist's sketch of the assassin who shot King with a .30-06 Remington rifle, reported purchased in Birmingham, after checking into a rooming house across from King's hotel in Memphis.

The killer, described as a neatly dressed man with dark hair and "a silly smile," fled the rooming house after shooting King and abandoned the rifle and a suitcase in front of a nearby business firm.

King was killed as he stood outside his motel room about 205 feet from the bathroom window in the Memphis rooming house from which authorities say the shot was fired.

Took Off at High Speed

One Memphis witness said he saw a man get into a white Mustang and take off at high speed. Another witness said the Mustang was not from Tennessee because it had no front tag and no Memphis city inspection sticker.

Other witnesses said the car had a red and white license plate. Alabama tags are red and white.

Shortly after the King slaying, there were reports on the Memphis police radio of a high-speed chase involving a white Mustang. It later was learned that these reports were picked up by a motorist with a citizen's radio band and relayed to the police dispatcher by a patrol car parked next to the motorist.

The motorist later told the Memphis Commercial Appeal, a newspaper, that he knew the reports of a chase were false after a while because the signals of the car allegedly chasing the Mustang never wavered, indicating he was stationary.

Clark Comments

In New York, U. S. Attorney General Ramsey Clark said last night, regarding the King slaying, that "We will report on some developments that should be made public soon." Asked when, he replied, "When there are facts, a report will be made."

Clark said, however, "I remain as optimistic as I ever have been" that the killer will be caught.

Last weekend Clark had said federal agents were on the trail of "one man on the run." He said the man had used the name John Willard but "whether it proves to be the right name remains to be seen."

Bullet Smashed

The New York Times reported that the bullet that killed King had been smashed and laboratory technicians of the FBI had been unable to match it with the .30-06 rifle believed to have been the assassin's weapon.

In another development, it was reported that gun sale records of a dealer believed to have sold the rifle have been seized in Birmingham.
