HERMUSILLO, Mexico (UPI).-A bearded American tourist from Baltimore, Md., arrested and questioned yesterday by Mexican police in their hunt for a suspect in the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., has been areleased with apologies by State authorities.

Daniel D. Kennedy, 42, left State Police headquarters in Hermosillo saying he wanted to continue his trip to Guay mas, a small fishing and resort town on the Pacific Coast about 80 miles south of Hermosillo.

A Miami police official was skeptical of the current alert's failure to mention Ray's name.

"Maybe in about another week the correction will catch up with the message," he said.
