William Bradford Huie has written a third article for "Look" magazine. The article appears in the issue dated April 15, 1969, but this issue was circulated on April 1, 1969. A review of the article reveals that James Earl Ray allegedly registered at the Travelodge Motel, Five Points, Birmingham, Alabama, on March 29, 1968; at a motel near Florence, Alabama, on April 1, 1968; and at a motel near Corinth, Mississippi, on April 2, 1968. It is to be noted that Ray, using the name Harvey Lowmyer, negotiated the purchase of a rifle at the Aeromarine Supply Company, Birmingham, Alabama, on March 29 and 30, 1968. On April 3, 1968, he was registered at the Rebel Motel in Memphis, Tennessee.

In an effort to establish whether or not Ray was in contact with any individuals immediately prior to the assassination, appropriate investigation should be conducted by the Birmingham and Jackson Offices. It should be understood that there is to be no indication made whatsoever that the following investigation has any connection whatsoever with the case involving James Earl Ray.

Birmingham and Jackson Offices should make inquiries of the motels in or near the cities indicated above to determine the identities of individuals registered during the period March 29 to April 3, 1968. Efforts should be made to identify all individuals listed, as well as

obtaining descriptions and registrations for the automobiles of such persons. A review of such records might indicate whether any one individual might have accompanied Ray or been in contact with him during this period. Pertinent or questionable registration records should be obtained if possible for examination by the FBI Laboratory.

Memphis should insure that the Bureau is kept currently advised of pertinent developments in this case, particularly all aspects of court action since the death of Judge Battle on March 31, 1969.

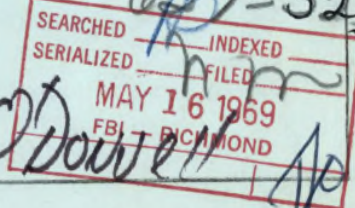

"It was a relatively simple thing," Robert G. Jensen said in a telephone interview. "A man was killed. A man was caught. In many ways, it was like any other case, but the stature of King gave it a lot more publicity than the usual case."

Robert I. Livingston, attorney for James Earl Ray, said Friday that he has been in periodic contact since March with a representative of the

"men who actually carried out the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr." Ray, the only person charged in the case, pleaded guilty to murdering King, and is now serving a 99-year prison sentence.

"If he (Livingston) has something, more power to him," said Jensen, who now is head of security for an international motel firm. He said he had not read Livingston's claims because there was "no particular reason for me to read them."

"The facts that were developed were made public," Jensen said. "Many people don't want to accept what the facts

are because in many instances they don't lend themselves to grandiose theories. But we had to go with what facts we had. Theories and suppositions don't hold up in court."

Alleging a conspiracy behind the April 4, 1968, shooting of King in Memphis, Livingston said the intermediary he talked to is seeking immunity from prosecution for the slaying conspirators. He said they want to testify "in revenge" against "four Southern gentlemen" who allegedly hired them, not Ray, to kill King.

According to Livingston, eight men were involved in King's death, with Ray the "patsy." He

said Ray was "...just a gullible-type sort of fellow, easily influenced and led around. He had never been a high-powered criminal all his life, just penny ante stuff..."

Jensen described the investigation as a "good case, well worked, well handled. I'm satisfied with the results."

It is probably true, Jensen said, that King's slaying was one of the most thoroughly investigated murders in criminal history.

"There is little doubt that it was an extensive and in-depth investigation," he said. "It was

worldwide, involving the cooperation of Canadian authorities, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Scotland Yard and many, many others. We explored every angle and the only thing is that when the case developed, we could find no evidence of such a thing (a conspiracy)."

Jensen said when the FBI had compiled the facts, "a representative of the attorney general's office followed

through and rechecked the material."

"The case was analyzed and it will continue to be analyzed," he said. "I don't think history buffs have ever put to rest the story of Lincoln and John Wilkes Booth."

"Fifteen years from now people will ask the same questions, but my personal opinion now lies with the public record. I have no personal theories whatsoever that differ with the record of the case."

Scandal, Slaying Link Seen

HAMPTON (AP) — The Rev. Jesse Jackson, refused permission to hold a news conference on the Hampton Institute campus, said Wednesday some of the same people involved in the Watergate scandals may have been involved in the assassination of the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr.

Jackson did not mention any names, but asked for an investigation of two alleged memos sent by the late Federal Bureau of Investigation director J. Edgar Hoover on Aug. 25, 1967, and March 4, 1968.

He said the first memo instructed FBI agents to "disrupt and discredit" black organizations and the second ordered them to prevent the rise of a "black messiah."

"One month later King was dead," Jackson said.

Jackson, here to attend the 60th annual Hampton Institute Ministers Conference, was refused permission to hold a news conference for what a conference spokesman said was his failure to get official permission from the college to meet with reporters.

The spokesman also indicated that the ministers wanted to keep the convention from being diverted to controversial political matters.

Reopen Trial

Jackson said also that the trial of convicted King assassin James Earl Ray should be reopened.

"We believe it [King's slaying] was a conspiracy, and we believe the trial should be reopened so all evidence can come onto the table," said Jackson, who was with King the moment he was shot.

The Supreme Court cleared the way Monday for Ray to withdraw his guilty plea and change his testimony.

"Ray's lawyers are now saying they have two more people willing to testify, and they should be allowed to do so," Jackson said.

Court Ruling Favors Ray

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Supreme Court cleared the way today for James Earl Ray to withdraw his guilty plea to the 1968 killing of Martin Luther King. Ray contends he was influenced by the interest of his attorneys in profits from a book about the slaying.

The action could mean Ray eventually will be retried for the King slaying after a plea of innocent.

The Supreme Court refused to hear appeals by Tennessee that Ray's original plea was voluntary and intelligently made and therefore he should not be given a chance to have it changed.

The 6th U.S. Court of Appeals ordered a hearing to decide whether Ray's constitutional rights to due process and assistance of counsel were violated and if he can change his plea to innocent.

Ray was sentenced to 99 years in the Tennessee state prison after pleading guilty in 1969 to killing the civil rights leader in Memphis.

Shortly after sentencing, Ray claimed he had been coerced into pleading guilty by his attorney, Percy Foreman, well known criminal lawyer from Houston, Tex.

Foreman took over the case at Ray's request after Ray dis-

missed his first lawyer, Arthur Hanes. Hanes had signed a contract on Ray's behalf with author William Bradford Huie to write a book about the killing, with Hanes getting 30 per cent of the royalties.

When Foreman took over, he changed the agreement so that he would receive 60 per cent of the royalties.

Ray contended that he was advised to plead guilty by Foreman so that information about the case would not be made public in open court at the fullscale trial, thus assuring the exclusive nature of the book.

Clure Morton denied Ray's motion for a hearing on whether his plea was voluntary. Morton agreed with the state and cited the plea record. In accepting the original plea, Judge W. Preston Battle questioned Ray thoroughly and the defendant said his plea was knowledgeable and voluntary.

In another action, the Supreme Court today declined to decide whether husbands can veto abortion sought by their wives.

The court also refused to consider whether the consent of parents is needed before a minor daughter may have an abortion.

A three-judge federal court declared the law unconstitutional, but refused to issue an injunction blocking its enforcement. Both the plaintiffs and the state appealed.

The Supreme Court declined to rule on whether the declaratory judgment invalidating the act was correct, but said the lower court acted properly on procedural grounds in declining to issue an injunction preventing state officials from enforcing the statute.

Ray Believed Himself Heroic?

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (UPI) — James Earl Ray thought the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. would make him the "champion of the white race" according to the confessed assassin's former attorney.

Percy Foreman, of Houston, Tex., who negotiated Ray's guilty plea into a 99-year prison sentence, made the statement in a deposition printed in a copyrighted story yesterday in the Memphis Press-Scimitar.

The deposition was given to an assistant state attorney general, Henry Haile, earlier this year and will be presented as evidence in a federal court hearing Oct. 22 to determine if Ray is entitled to a new trial.

Foreman said Ray was convinced he would not be convicted by a local jury.

"The other thing that he (Ray) had a misapprehension about was that he could, since (Richard) Nixon and (George) Wallace had received 70 per cent of the Shelby County vote (in 1968), that a jury should be expected to be 70 per cent in his favor because he equated every vote they got (as being) anti-black," Foreman said.

"In other words," Haile asked, "Is it fair to say he thought everybody who voted for Nixon and Wallace in Shelby County was in favor of having Martin Luther King killed?"

"Well, that would be unfair," Foreman answered, "But it is sort of a shorthand rendition. He thought everybody was like him. That isn't unusual for people. He thought everybody thought like he thought and he thought the killing of Martin Luther King would make him the champion of the white race, that he would be the most popular man in America."

"He was a racist — he is a racist and had been one all of his life. He could not think of anybody not being a racist if

they were white."

"Did he ever protest his innocence to you?" Haile asked.

"He never even intimated that he expected anybody to believe he was innocent," the attorney replied.

Foreman, who was fired by Ray shortly after the guilty plea on March 10, 1969, also denied that his financial involvement with Alabama author William Bradford Huie influenced his representation of his client.

In denying the assertion, Foreman said he did not need the money. "I have never made a net worth statement," he said. "I don't want to make one, but I am worth at least \$4.5 million with liabilities of \$140,000."

Foreman said he entered the case not to make money, but to save Ray's life.
