# By All Means.,.

FBI Director Clarence M. Kelley says those FBI policy makers responsible for the investigations into the Communist associations of Martin Luther King should be "brought to account."

Indeed they should. It may be the only way the whole truth as revealed in the tapes of King's conversations will ever be revealed. If those whom Kelley terms responsible are put on trial, one expects they will defend themselves vigorously—and demand the presentation of the tapes and other records to vindicate them.

Mr. Kelley may have, intentionally or unintentionally, opened a noxious can of worms. It will be most interesting to see how the Democraticcontrolled Congress reacts to this suggestion. Will the Democrats risk disclosure that certainly will involve and sully the names of John and Robert Kennedy? Will they risk release of information which certainly will prove detrimental to the reputation of King? It is not I. Edgar Hoover's reputation which will be blackened—but the reputations of the persons responsible for the bugging which produces those tapes—and the reputation of King.

The Congress demanded the release of the Nixon tapes—as it should have. Will the same Congress demand the release of tapes which will implicate two Democratic "heroes" and King? Count the repercussions among the blacks if the Congress should be held responsible for bringing out information sullying King's reputation...

By all means: put the persons "responsible" on trial. It may be the only way the truth will ever come out. And it is the truth we are seeking, is it not?

The press, which left no stone unturned to search out the Nixon tapes, has shown little interest in what's on the FBI tapes. If it had shown the same zeal, the information on the FBI tapes would already have been printed verbatim in some of the big leftwing papers. Obviously, we can't depend on that segment of the press which has the facilities to dig out this information to give it to us. Perhaps Mr. Kelley's way is the only way left. Mr. Kelley, one must assume, is too smart not to know that. One also must assume that he knows what's on those tapes, and moreover, knows who authorized them, and why.

Attached hereto is copy of FD-71 reflecting information furnished by ANN E. MOFFITT during the early morning hours of 8/18/78.

On 8/21/78, MOFFITT was recontacted at her place of business, Standard Register Co., 1506 Staples Mill Road, at which time she stated the individual she made reference to in her phone call on 8/18/78 was one MAX KIMSEY, who operated Kimsey's Floor Covering Co., 608 Church Lane, Tappahannock, Va. (telephone 804/443-5090).

She described KIMSEY as a white male, about 50 years of age, who operates a white van type truck. She advised that she has a place in Aylett, Va., which is located a relatively short distance from Tappahannock, and KIMSEY operated the only floor covering business in the general vicinity, therefore, she hired him to do some work at her residence in Aylett.

He did the work about six weeks ago, and during that time, she had a conversation with him during which the stated that during the same general time period that MARTIN LUTHER KING was assassinated in Memphis, Tenn., he was traveling across the United States, during which time he was approached to assassinate KING. He was offered \$10,000 with a promise of \$40,000 additional dollars if he was successful in assassinating KING. He furnished no more details to MOFFITT, and MOFFITT has no way of evaluating KIMSEY's reliability or integrity.

Facts of complaint  MOFFITT stated that a man, who she would only give as MAX a white male 38-45 yrs of age, came to her home for minor home repairs, During course of conversation MAX stated to her that he was offered \$10,000 to kill Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and \$40,000 to finish the job.  When asked for further details on MAX and the caller who called MAX. Moffitt would only state that she has given out enough info and refused to go any further without speaking to an agent. Moffitt sounded at times to be intoxicated and Incoherent. At one point she would not give out her occupation and stated she would be going to the river and would not give an address. When pressed as to when she would like to be interviewed by an ggent, she then gave as place of employment, Standard Register Co. 1506 Staples Mill Rd. tel #353-3908 and is secretary to the regional manager Ronald c. Doering. Re Richmond memorandum of SA JOHN WILLIAM DAVIS dated 8/21/78.

On 8/23/78, Mr. MAX KIMSEY was located and interviewed at the residence of Mrs. W. I. PRINCE at Laneview, Va., where Mr. KIMSEY was installing carpet.

KIMSEY was advised that a report has reached the Richmond Division of the FBI that he had indicated in a recent conversation that he had been approached to kill MARTIN LUTHER KING for \$50,000.

KIMSEY advised he has recently spoken to several people concerning the MARTIN LUTHER KING assassination, but he was surprised that anyone he talked to about this matter would have come to the conclusion that he had been offered \$50,000 to assassinate KING.

He furnished the following information as the basis of his recent conversations with people about the MARTIN LUTHER KING assassination:

Prior to 1964, he was on an elk hunting trip to Gunnonsin, Colorado, with an associate, Mr. JOE CORLEW. He identified CORLEW as a resident of Chattanooga, Tenn., who was employed by the DuPont Corporation in Chattanooga. After finishing hunting one day on this trip, he and CORLEW were in a combination bar and restaurant with another group of hunters, none of whom he had previously known and none of whom he now However, during dinner and drinking, in general knows by name. conversation with these hunters, he mentioned the fact that he was from the State of Tenn. One of the hunters remarked that he could not understand why the State of Tenn. allowed that "communist school" to operate in Tenn. KIMSEY advised that man was referring to a school in Tenn. that allegedly had communistic ties. In addition, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING had some contact with this school. The conversation then turned to DERMALKET NG and hi

activities at that time.

At the time they were in this restaurant, he and CORLEW had their rifles with them inside the restaurant as they did not want to leave them in their vehicles on the change that they could be stolen.

One of the hunters with whom they were having the conversation pointed to his rifle and made a statement to the effect that a person could probably make a large sum of money if he could hit Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING with a rifle shot. The conversation then speculated on that possibility, and even speculated on what someone could possibly make as the result of such an action. Figures such as \$10,000 front money and a total of \$50,000 were mentioned in this speculative conversation.

However, he advised that there was never any offer made to pay any of these figures for either the attempt to assassinate KING or the actual assassination of KING, and never was there any real serious discussion of actually taking such an action.

He advised that this conversation was all casual and speculative in nature. He advised that the participants in this conversation obviously were not in tune with the objectives of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING and his program at that time. However, he reiterated at no time was there any offer made or any serious discussion made concerning an actual attempt to assassinate KING. He advised the entire conversation was speculative in nature and not at all serious as to an actual attempt.

He stated that if he had thought that anyone in that group was even remotely serious concerning an attempt to assassinate KING, he would have notified the appropriate authorities.

He advised that in view of the publicity surrounding the House Assassination Committee hearings, more people are currently discussing the KING assassination, and he has mentioned his experience in Colorado. However, he does not feel that in his conversations, he ever leaves the impression that his conversations in Colorado were an actual attempt to obtain services of persons to assassinate KING.

Since KIMSEY had no information concerning any bonafide offer in order to assassinate KING and since the conversation he described was all speculative in nature and since

he does not have the intensity of any of the other persons involved in this conversation, no further action is being taken in this regard.
