

On 4/15/68, Mr. GRANT BECHTEL, President, White Star Laundry, advised that the White Star Laundry used to employ the textile marking machine for marking clothing, but that they had changed approximately two years ago and were now using a Polymark Pinnacle which was manufactured by Production Corp., Elmsford, New York. The machine itself was manufactured in England.

Mr. FRANK GONZALEZ, Foreman, White Star Laundry and supervisor of the markers, advised that they do not use a zero as the first digit in the numbering system nor do they use a dash. He advised that the first number or numbers is the route number, that the letter is the route designation and that the last number or numbers is the bundle number. further advised that they do not nor have they used a red tape, but that they do use a light pink tape. He stated that the tapes come from the Dallas Tailor and Laundry Supply Company, Dallas, Texas.

On the same date Mr. RAY ARNOLD, Laundry and Cleaning Machinery Company, 318 Canterbury Hill, advised that he has handled the textile marking machinery in this area in the past, but knows of no laundry in the San Antonio area that still uses them. The White Star Laundry quit using the machinery about two or three years ago.

Re Bureau radiogram to all offices dated 4/23/68.

Referenced radiogram referred to Memphis airtel to all offices dated 4/19/68, which furnished background data concerning JAMES EARL RAY.

The Bureau has instructed that RAY should be considered a possible suspect in any unsolved bank robberies, burglaries or armed robberies (possible ITSP violations) occurring after 4/23/67. RAY should be considered a suspect in any future such violations, and the Bureau is to be advised telephonically of any tentative identification. The Bureau further instructed that any pertinent leads developed during review of past violations should be expeditiously run out and the Bureau advised.

Subject's handwriting and hand printing have not been identified in the bank robbery note file, and his fingerprints are being searched against latents submitted in unsolved bank robberies and burglaries violations,

#### LEADS

All agents should consider JAMES EARL RAY possible suspect in accordance with Bureau instructions set forth above.

SA GEORGE KEEFER will review all unsolved cases in the 91 category in which this office was origin, both pending and closed which have been opened subsequent to 4/23/67. In this review if it is determined that the descriptions of any of the subjects fit the description of RAY, appropriate steps must be taken to eliminate that parson as a suspect. Any latent prints or other physical evidence which might help eliminate any subject should be forwarded to the Bureau if not already done. In either event the Bureau should be requested to make appropriate comparisons to eliminate the individual.

This will record that on the evening of April 24, 1968, Legat NATHAN FERRIS, Mexico City, called with regard to a lead involving Deputy Sheriff ANGEL STICKELBAULT (see serials 174 and 183). Mr. FERRIS said that Mexico City is running out leads and needs additional information.

He informed that STICKELBAULT had three tickets for seats 6, 7 and 11, and that an individual by the name of G. SMITH was in seat 8.

He desired to know precisely the manner of this seating arrangement, what seat did STICKELBAULT occupy? Who were the other two passengers with STICKELBAULT? Where was the look-alike sitting with relation to STICKELBAULT?

Mr. FERRIS went on to say that STICKELBAULT took bus # 382 from Nuevo Laredo. This bus reportedly broke down and passengers were transferred to bus # 362.In Monterrey the through passengers were placed on bus # 359.

Mr. FERRIS desired to know the number of the bus and buses utilized by STICKELBAULT and when the transfer of passengers occurred in Monterrey did all passengers retain the same seats.

I told him we would endeavor to obtain this information immediately and would call this morning.
