At 8:17 a.m., 4/13/68, VICKIE FRANCES BURT, 265 Orlando, Apartment 7, El Cajon, California, called to report a conversation she overheard in the Valley Inn on Main Street in El Cajon on Tuesday before KING's murder. The conversation overheard involved a man who said he was an ex-policeman from Tennessee and he claimed he had a contract for \$5,000 to kill KING and that "in two days that black son of a bitch will be dead." She described this ex-policeman, whose first name is believed to be BOB, as follows:

Race	White
Sex	Male
Height	5'11" - 6'
Weight	175 - 180 pounds
Hair	Dark brown, straight, receding
Eyes	Blue
Dress	Dark blue business suit
Car	White or cream colored, make unknown.

BURT was most emphatic that her identity be kept absolutely confidential. She advised that the daytime bartender at the Valley Inn, known as "Sarge," is also familiar with this conversation, but does not want him to know that she has reported this information to the FBI. BURT has no telephone and is not employed and can usually be located at the above address during the day.

William Gault, Alameda Co. SO, telephonically contacted this office instant evening long distance from Ensenada, B.C., Mexico. He sated he was on vacation there and met a person at Mission Santo Tomaz (a tourist attraction) who he believed might be connected with SUBJECT case.

The person mentioned gave the name James L. Sloan. Said he was a Retired A.F. Colonel and had a current A.F. ID issued in 1967, dated June 30. Gault stated that the ID had the letters SSG on it (poss. rank of Staff Sergeant) and no rank of Colonel. SUBJECT was driving 1960 Ford hardtop, Cal. Lic. **OBL** 840. The only further description that could be given of subject was that he was in his thirtys, about 5'8", and had a southern accent.

Mr. Gault stated that he would be staying in the Plaza Hotel in Ensenada if he need be contacted.

FBI Cancels Pickup Order In King Case

MEMPHIS (AP)—The FBI issued, then withdrew, a request that Florida police help locate Eric Starvo Galt, a white man, as the investigation of the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. entered its second week.

Federal agents refused to say why they were seeking Galt, whose last known address was Birmingham, Ala.

Shot April 4

The bulletin distributed yesterday on the statewide police teletype network in Florida said Galt was driving a white Mustang.

Witnesses in Memphis told investigators earlier they saw a man in a white Mustang drive away from the rooming house from which King was shot April 4.

A source in the Dade County Public Safety Department in Miami said the FBI bulletin.

tin began: "Reference locate and notify no warrant issued Eric Starvo Galt" then described Galt and the Mustang. The message concluded: "If located notify Agent Charles Bell FBI Miami."

"This meant they wanted him spotted, not picked up," the Miami source said. It was reported originally that a pickup order had been issued.

White Mustang Found

The FBI in Miami refused any comment.

At about the same time the pickup order was sent in Florida, federal agents in Atlanta impounded a white Mustang that had been parked since last Friday at a public housing project near the Georgia state capitol.

The message, withdrawn with the explanation that it was released by mistake, described Galt as a white male, 36 years old, about 5-foot-11 and 175 pounds with blue eyes and brown hair.

This roughly matched the

description circulated by federal authorities the night of King's slaying.

Special Agent John Hanlon of the Miami FBI office, who withdrew the pickup order about four hours after it was issued, said, "I cannot comment," when asked for further details.

The FBI in Memphis and Atlanta also refused to discuss the developments.

The Florida teletype message said Galt was last seen driving a white 1966 Mustang hardtop, Alabama license 1-38993. Birmingham police said this tag had been issued to Eric S. Galt, 2608 Highland Ave., Birmingham.

Bought in '66

State records in Montgomery, capital of Alabama, show that Galt listed his occupation as "merchant seaman, unemployed," when he applied for a driver's license in Birmingham in September 1967. The application showed Galt noted he had had a 1962 Louisiana driver's license but that it had expired.

Car Seized In Hunt For King Assassin

ATLANTA (UPI) — The Federal Bureau of Investigation yesterday impounded a Birmingham, Ala., man's 1966 white Mustang automobile which had been the object of a secret hunt since the April 4 assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. in Memphis.

King's killer reportedly fled in a white Mustang, moments after a sniper's bullet cut down the civil rights leader.

The car was traced through license tags to Eric Starvo Galt, a 36-year-old, brown-haired man who had listed his address as a south Birmingham rooming house.

NO WARRANT ISSUED

The FBI refused to comment on the development, but said no warrant had been issued in the case. However, it was learned that the FBI issued a pickup order for Galt in Florida yesterday, then canceled it last night.

Reporters in Birmingham found the rooming house listed as Galt's address dark and locked. Although one rooming house resident said a man answering Galt's description had lived there three months ear-

lier, the owner refused to talk to reporters and kept the door locked.

"I don't know him," the owner said through a closed window. "I'm sure he's never lived here. I'm not going to open the door."

EVERYONE QUIZZED

Percy Strickland, a telephone repairman who lives in the rooming house, said "I have heard the name of Eric Galt plenty the last week. The FBI has talked to everybody in the rooming house."

The car, which had been parked for several days in an Atlanta subdivision, was towed to FBI headquarters here.

The car bore Alabama license tag 1-38993 and had two 1967 Mexican tourist stickers on its windows. The FBI earlier had asked authorities in Mazatlan, Mexico, to watch all points of entry and hotel employees there had been given artist's sketches of the neat-appearing assassin.

The telephone repairman said Galt lived in the bottom floor of the two-story, pale gray stucco building and was considered "one of the boys."

FBI Keeping King Suspect Photo Secret

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — The Federal Bureau of Investigation is withholding nationwide distribution of a composite drawing of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s assassin, police sources said yesterday.

"They haven't given us anything but a physical description," said one police official. "They aren't handing out pictures of the man. They either don't have a good one, or they're going it alone."

The official asked that his name not be used, citing the FBI's ban on comment about the investigation.

When Jacksonville, Fla., police questioned a Louisville, Ky., man Saturday night about the King slaying — the man since has been cleared of any connection — Police Lt. M. P. Richardson said, "It's a long shot, but he looks too much like the sketch of the man who is wanted in the King slaying."

Jacksonville police said yesterday the man was arrested after a resident noted a likeness to a composite picture which appeared in Florida newspapers. This sketch was prepared by a newspaper artist from the description given of the slaying. It was not released or endorsed by the FBI.

Residents of the Memphis rooming house from which King was shot April 4 reported last week that investigators had shown them composite drawings. They said the sketches were the same, or at least very similar, as those prepared by newspaper artists.

Clark Hints Plot In King's Slaying

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Investigators appeared yesterday to be re-examining the possibility that more than one person was involved in the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

They seemed puzzled about conflicting reports on the number of getaway cars involved and about police radio transmissions detailing a high-speed chase — which apparently never took place — through northeast Memphis 30 minutes after a sniper killed King with a single rifle shot.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation, conducting the most massive manhunt in its history, maintained silence on all aspects of the investigation. However, Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark issued a new statement that dropped his earlier reference to "one man on the run."

Sixteen hours after King was slain April 4, Clark said evidence "indicates a single individual" was involved. "There is no evidence of a widespread plot," he said.

In a seven-line statement issued in Washington Friday night, Clark said the FBI was

devoting all its resources to the investigation, "working around the clock pursuing every lead." He said it was impossible to predict when an arrest would be made.

In the 10 days since King's slaying, the lights have burned all night, night after night, in the corner suite on the eighth floor of Memphis' new concrete-and-glass federal building.

There, in offices overlooking the Mississippi River, dozens of FBI agents have methodically sifted through what is described as "very substantial" physical evidence.

Exactly what this evidence constitutes is officially unknown, but sources report some of the major items are palm and finger prints, an overnight bag believed to contain clothing and a high-powered rifle with a telescopic sight.

FBI agents have interviewed hundreds of persons in Memphis, Birmingham, Atlanta and elsewhere. They have taken over the records of two rooming houses and at least one gun shop. They have pored through documents in state and local

government offices throughout the South.

This is an account of the events that have taken place as pieced together from scores of interviews:

On April 4, King held a day-long planning session in his \$13-a-day room, No. 306, at the Lorraine Motel. He had come here to lead a march in support of striking sanitation workers.

He told the Rev. Samuel Kyles of Memphis that he was weary of restaurant food.

"I want some soul food," he said.

"You know where to get it," Kyles replied. "Come home and eat dinner with me." King said he would enjoy that.

So 23 minutes before sunset, King stepped onto the balcony in front of his room.

SLAYER AWAITS

Two hundred and five feet away, a man wearing a black business suit, white shirt and narrow black tie stood in the bathtub of a flophouse's second-floor communal bathroom.

Giving his name as John Willard, a man had rented room 5A three hours earlier from manager Bessie Brewer, paying a week's rent, \$8.50, in advance, using a \$20 bill.

Now he looked out of the bathroom window, across a pile of junk in a vacant lot, just above the tops of scrubby trees growing along an embankment and onto the balcony of the Lorraine Motel.

He squinted through the telescopic sight of a .30-06 Remington pump action rifle.

Ka-blam!

One shot rang out.

The bullet ripped into King's neck.

KING GASPS

"Oh!" he gasped as he crumpled to the concrete balcony floor.

It was 6:01 p.m.

King had not asked for protection, but Police Director Frank C. Holloman had stationed about 40 officers in the vicinity. Some apparently were

posted in the vacant lot across Mulberry Street — the lot behind the Main Street flophouse.

The officers, wearing blue helmets and carrying rifles, immediately sealed off the area of the motel. However, the killer already was making his way through the Main Street entrance of the rooming house, one block away.

Two white Mustang autos, both 1966 models, were parked within 100 feet of the rooming house entrance at 6:01 p.m. Fifteen minutes later, both were gone.

CHASE REPORTED

Some witnesses said the killer walked calmly down the steps to the street, turned left and dropped a rifle in the next doorway, and continued several feet to the Mustang bearing a red and white license plate. Red and white plates are used in both Arkansas and Alabama.

At 6:25 p.m., a police dispatcher began relaying calls about a chase in northeast Memphis — eight miles away — including a white Mustang and a blue Pontiac.

A white male driving the Mustang, the police radio crackled, was "responsible for this shooting."

Eight calls, supposedly from a police lieutenant, were relayed by the dispatcher during the next 22 minutes. At one point, the dispatcher reported, the driver of the Mustang was firing on the pursuing Pontiac.

"I was not involved in any chase," the lieutenant said afterward. A college student with a citizens band radio in his car later said he was relaying details of the chase to the lieutenant. He said the voice he was monitoring identified himself as the occupant of the blue car chasing the Mustang.

The student said the transmissions he received never faded, indicating the calls came from a stationary transmitter. By week's end, police appeared to have concluded that the chase, for whatever reason it was reported, was a hoax.

On April 5, 12 hours after the

shooting, an Atlanta housewife looked out the window of her apartment in the Capitol Homes project — 383 miles to the southeast — and saw a "nice looking man" step out of a 1966 white Mustang.

Six days later — on Thursday afternoon — federal agents swooped down on the abandoned Mustang.

The car bore a license tag from Jefferson County — Birmingham — Alabama, No. 1-38993. Two Mexican inspection stickers were pasted to the front windshield. The floor was littered with cigarette butts and covered with mud.

At 5:22 p.m., the Florida police teletypewriter ticked out a "locate and notify" message. It was an FBI alert for Eric Starvo Galt, 36. The bulletin said Galt was driving a 1966 white Mustang hardtop with Alabama tag No. 1-38993.

Four hours later, the message was withdrawn with the explanation it was "erroneous."

DESCRIPTION FITS

Records in Alabama show Galt applied for a driver's license last Sept. 5. The application describes him as 5-11, 175 pounds, with blue eyes and brown hair — roughly the same description given by witnesses for the man seen fleeing the Memphis rooming house.

The document says Galt is an unemployed merchant seaman. The Maritime union has no record of an Eric Galt.

His address was listed as 2068 Highland, Birmingham, a two-story stucco house with a neon light that flashes in red, "rooms."

FBI Hunts Seaman In King Assassination

MEMPHIS (AP) — FBI agents from Virginia to Florida were hunting today for a man whose abandoned white Mustang fits descriptions of a car seen leaving the scene of the Martin Luther King Jr. assassination.

The object of the search was Eric Starvo Galt, 37, known only as an unemployed seaman from Birmingham, Ala. A car registered in that name was seized by the FBI in Atlanta last Friday, eight days after King was shot to death in Memphis.

The FBI refused to acknowledge the hunt or to say why Galt was wanted. "No comment," was the routine reply.

Associated Press checks disclosed that FBI agents had contacted persons named Galt in several states, including Virginia, Alabama and Florida.

An FBI alert for Galt was sent over the Florida police communications network last

Friday, but withdrawn four hours later.

FBI agents have continued to inquire about Galt at numerous places, including dry cleaners and service stations in Birmingham, where a man named Eric Starvo Galt rented a room at a Southside boarding house within the past eight months.

At Birmingham, the owner of the boarding house said today he had identified a drawing of a man sought in the King slaying as a roomer known by the name Eric Galt. "It's him, I'm sure," said Peter Cherpes, 72, who runs a boarding house on Birmingham's South Side.

Cherpes consented to talk after the FBI responded to his request to be released from a secrecy pledge.

furnished the following information:

On April 2, 1968, at around 11:00 a.m. she went to the Valley Inn, 1405 East Main Street in El Cajon, and while there overheard a conversation pertaining to the racial situation in the United States. There were eight or nine people in the bar at this time. She advised that a big fellow known to her only as "BOB" did most of the talking. He said that he used to be a policeman in Tennessee, but after having a hassel with the sheriff he was fired and kicked out of Tennessee. He then stated, "I have a contract for \$5,000 to kill KING." Everyone, thinking he was joking, asked him if he heeded any help. He then stated, "I don't need any help from anybody and in two days that black S.O.B. will be dead."

She left the Valley Inn at this time and when she returned about an hour later BOB was gone. She has not seen him since.

She advised that the daytime bartender at the Valley Inn known as SARGE also overheard the conversation and she believes that SARGE knows BOB and might be able to furnish additional information.

She described BOB as follows:

BOYD YOUNG (SARGE), 198 North Gina, telephone 444-9205, El Cajon, California, was interviewed at the Valley Inn, 1405 East Main Street, El Cajon, and he furnished the following information:

He is the day bartender at the Valley Inn and BOB BRACKEN is a customer of his. He described BRACKEN as a fellow who is always telling unbelievable stories and a little on the "crazy" side.

On April 2, 1968, while tending bar he overheard a conversation in which BRACKEN was involved. The conversation dealt with the racial issue. Someone then mentioned that some of these Negro leaders should be shot. He then heard BRACKEN say that he had a \$5,000 contract to kill KING. When everyone asked him if he needed any help he became very loud and said that he didn't need their help, that he could do it alone and that in two days he was going to kill KING.

After the conversation died down BRACKEN stated that he was going to Memphis, Tennessee that same day. He then asked a customer named AL that if he would take him to the railroad depot he would give him \$500. YOUNG noticed that BRACKEN had a suitcase with him. BRACKEN and AL left and he has not seen or heard from BRACKEN since.

BRACKEN had previously mentioned to YOUNG that he was having marital problems and was planning on leaving the San Diego area for a while.

YOUNG believes that BRACKEN's wife lives at Sunrise Trailer Court on North Third Street in El Cajon. He described BOB BRACKEN as follows:

INGEBORG KATARINA BRACKEN, 2401 Willow Glen Road, telephone 442-3638, El Cajon, California, furnished the following information:

She has been married to ROBERT BENJAMIN BRACKEN for about 15 years. They are presently separated due to his strange behavior which began in 1964 when he was placed in a U. S. Naval Mental Hospital in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He was interned for about five months and has never been the same since. He will be fine for a while, then suddenly begin to act rather strangely and do things which he later does not remember doing.

In 1965 he returned to active duty with the U. S. Navy and was stationed aboard the USS Saratoga. Three months later he had another breakdown and was placed in a Navy hospital in Germany, transferred to Italy and finally to the United States. He was released the same year from a Navy hospital in Largo, Florida. ROBERT BRACKEN's family also has a long history of mental illness. After he was released from the hospital and retired from the Navy they moved around steadily and never really settled down. About a year and a half ago they came to El Cajon, California and have been here every since. He had been working at Fowler Engineering in El Cajon until February, 1968.

In August, 1967, they separated and he went to Lead Hill, Arkansas and stayed with a friend named WAYNE RYAN. RYAN also has a history of mental illness.

Her husband came back to El Cajon in February, 1968 and they attempted to solve their marriage problems.

After seeing that they could not live together he decided to leave again and told her he was going back to his friend WAYNE RYAN in Lead Hill, Arkansas. He telephoned her from San Diego on March 30, 1968 to say goodbye and she has not heard from him since.

She stated that he did not own any rifles and only had the hand pistol. She did not have a photograph of him.

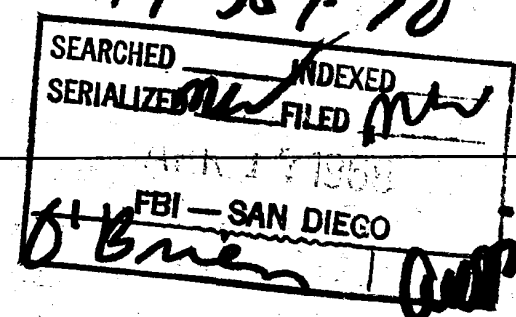

WHILE IN THE LOS ANGELES AREA EARLY THIS YEAR, GALT TOOK A COURSE AT A SCHOOL OF BARTENDING AND WAS GRADUATED ON MARCH 2, 1968.

THE FUGITIVE IS DESCRIBED AS A WHITE MALE. HE IS APPROXIMATELY 5 FEET 8 INCHES TO 5 FEET 11 INCHES TALL AND WEIGHS BETWEEN 160 AND 175 POUNDS. HE IS SAID TO BE A NEAT DRESSER AND HAS A MEDIUM BUILD.
