- Referenced Butel reads as follows:

During automobile trip of subject RAY and CHARLES STEIN departing Los Angeles on 12/15/67 and arriving New Orleans on 12/17/67, subject RAY made about six telephone calls from various pay stations in Texas.

They traveled via automobile on Interstate 10 through El Paso to Van Horn, Texas, and went south on Route 90 to San Antonio, then Route 90 or Interstate 10 to Houston, Texas, and to New Orleans.

Each office should check with telephone company and determine the long distance calls placed at each public telephone on the above mentioned routes during period of 12/15, 16, and 17, 1967, and have each call checked out.

On 4/30/68, Mrs. HELEN ORNELAS, Service Representative, West Texas Telephone Company, Pecos, Texas, made available duplicate bills on pay stations from Van Horn, Valentine, and Sierra Blanca, Texas.

Noted that these bills reflect the telephone numbers of the individuals receiving the telephone calls from the pay stations in the above mentioned communities. As noted above, the pertinent dates are 12/15, 16, and 17/67. The teletype codes of the respective offices have been added to these duplicate bills, indicating the telephone numbers to be checked out by the various offices receiving this airtel.

Mr. EUGENE JOHNSON, McCabe Road, Holtville, California, advised SA WILLIAM E. HORNUNG on 5/3/68 that he is a cattle buyer and feeder in the Holtville, California, area and because of this business receives many telephone calls from the State of Texas from cattle buyers and brokers.

He advised that it was impossible to state any particular date that he received a call from the State of Texas as calls from this area are of a frequent nature.

Photograph of RAY was displayed to Mr. JOHNSON and he advised subject is unknown to him.

JAMES W. LAUGHRIDGE, Apartment 6F, 800 South Sullivan Street, Santa Ana, California, advised that he has a lease on a used car lot at 2301 West First Street, Santa Ana, California, and is presently trying to get a license to do business at this location.

He stated that as a result of attempting to go into business at this address, he met AL CREWS at the Hollywood Chrysler, Hollywood Boulevard, Hollywood, California, on or about the first of April, 1968. He stated that he did not see CREWS again until Friday, April 19, 1968 when he showed up at his used carlot in Santa Ana. He wanted to buy a car and paid \$450 in cash for a Chevrolet Monza. He stayed with LAUGHRIDGE that night at his apartment.

LAUGHRIDGE stated that all that day while CREWS was with him and also during the evening, CREWS had been drinking and it was his considered opinion that he was drunk.

During the course of the evening, CREWS made several statements concerning a passport that he was trying to get a person out of the country. LAUGHRIDGE stated that CREWS had a passport with him and several photographs of the person that he alleged he was trying to help to get out of the country.

CREWS stated that the AFL-CIO paid \$250,000 to have KING killed and had brought into this country, origin not indicated, a person in 1959 to kill Dr. KING. He stated that this was the person he was trying to help to leave the country.

LAUGHRIDGE stated that CREWS wanted to have an Italian, not further identified, make up this passport in Los Angeles, but he wanted \$2,000 for the job which CREWS considered to be too much.

LAUGHRIDGE brought over to the apartment a Marine stationed at El Toro Marine Base to take a photograph of the pictures that CREWS had in his possession. He identified this Marine as KEN MAPLE who lives at 928 South Minnie Street, Santa

Ana, California. He stated that he had this photograph in his possession and took it to Koda's Restaurant, located at the corner of Manchester and Commonwealth Streets, Buena Park, California, on Saturday April 27, 1968. There the photograph was thrown away.

LAUGHRIDGE stated that the next day, April 20, 1968, CREWS took off for Tijuana, Mexico with MANUEL CENICEROS to have the passport made up. CENICEROS stated that he had a brother in Tijuana who had connections with photographers there who could do the job for CREWS.

LAUGHRIDGE stated that CENICEROS resides at 1207½ West Fourth Street, Santa Ana, California. LAUGHRIDGE stated that he has been in touch with Mrs. CENICEROS who stated that her husband is in jail in Tijuana at the present time.

LAUGHRIDGE stated that CREWS returned to Santa Ana by bus on Monday April 22, 1968 and explained that they had had an auto accident in Tijuana and that the car had been impounded by the police and that he did not have enough money to get the car out of impound. He also stated that the photographer did not complete the passport and insofar as he knows it is still in Tijuana.

LAUGHRIDGE stated that the photographs that CREWS had in his possession were not identical to the photograph of JAMES RAY, that he was shown, nor was it identical to the photograph of JAMES RAY, also known as Eric Galt that he has seen in the newspapers.

He described the person in the photographs that he saw as a "handsome" face, round in shape, wearing a beard, and that he had thick wavy hair on his head.

LAUGHRIDGE stated that MANUEL CENICEROS had another brother DONALD CENICEROS who lived at 2322 Monta Vista Street, Santa Ana, California and who would probably know the name and address of the other brother living in Tijuana.

LAUGHRIDGE stated that about a month ago he was "kidnapped" by "hoods" and taken to Mexico. There he was beaten until he wrote checks in the amounts of \$1,000; \$14,000; and \$25,000 to secure his release. He stated that these "hoods" wanted the money to finance a synthetic marijuana.

JAMES W. LAUGHRIDGE, Santa Ana, California, advised that AL CREWS and MANUEL CENICEROS drove to Tijuana, Mexico on or about 4/19/68 for the purpose of contacting brother of CENICEROS who would be able to arrange for a passport to be made. CREWS stated that passport was to help an individual get out of the United States. CREWS has returned to the United States without this passport and is presently in jail in Los Angeles on warrant from Santa Barbara, California.

LAUGHRIDGE stated that CENICEROS is presently in jail in Tijuana, Mexico, and that the passport and photographs brought to Mexico by CREWS are still in the possession of a photographer in Tijuana.

CHICAGO — The person closest to James Earl Ray — his brother Jerry — issued an appeal for him to surrender during a Chicago Sun-Times interview yesterday.

But at the same time, the brother voiced doubts that the country's most-wanted fugitive is still alive. Jerry Ray, 32, said other members of his family also fear that the accused assassin of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. may be dead.

Jerry Ray said he found it difficult to believe his brother pulled the trigger because he "never was a man of violence."

But Jerry Ray conceded his brother could have been "used," as he put it, by persons conspiring to kill Dr. King.

"Look at all the money he came into all of a sudden," he continued. "Buying autos, taking lessons, taking trips to Mexico. You don't get that kind of money from sticking up grocery stores."

At approx 8:45PM instant evening, Mr. David Taylor, 2869 Grossmont, La Mesa, Ph 460-2213, telephonically contacted this office and related the following information.

Mr Taylor stated he had been in the Tijuana Jail a couple of days before the MURKIN took place and had met a man named THOMPSON who was also confined to the jail. He was described as 5'5". 140lbs, slender build, black thinning hair - greying, 45-47 yrs, came from SAN DIEGO area, spoke spanish and english with an accent.

While in jail THOMPSON was receiving a check every day for amounts varying from \$2,500 to \$5,000 from a big New York banking firm. When asked why he didn't bail himself out of jail he said that there was going to be a nigger killed in a couple of days - Taylor said he seemd to enjoy himself in the jail and would go out to eat and on one occasion ordered steak and wine for Taylor. Mr Taylor noted that he and Thompson were the only two in the jail cell whcih usually holds 12.

On 4/29/68, the records of the Tijuana jail for the period April 1 to May 1, 1968, were checked and no record was located for DAVID TAYLOR or for anyone named THOMPSON.

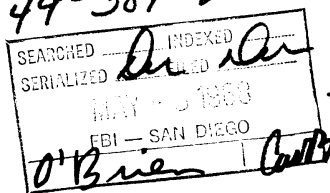
On 4/30/68, Mr. JACK BARTLET, Consul, Consulate General, Tijuana, B. C. Mexico, and ARNOLD FITCH, Vice Consul, Consulate General, Tijuana, were contacted regarding American citizens who had been in jail in the recent past. Mr. FITCH determined from his records that DAVID TAYLOR had been apprehended by Tijuana Police Department on 3/24/68 and released on 4/1/68. Mr. FITCH could find no record regarding anyone named THOMPSON. Mr. FITCH further advised that DAVID TAYLOR was in a cell in Tijuana with other U. S. citizens, approximately 10 individuals in the same cell. Mr. FITCH stated that to his knowledge there was no individual in the Tijuana jail who was receiving a check for any amount of money much less for \$2,500 or \$5,000 from a "big New York banking firm".

Mr. BARTLET advised that if any American citizen was receiving large sums of money while in the Tijuana jail the Consulate would have been aware of this check. He also stated that if an individual received a sum of money by Western Union sums of this size would not have been transferred to a person being held in the Tijuana jail.

Inasmuch as the information furnished by DAVID TAYLOR appears to be a figment of his imagination, no further action was taken to confirm that an individual named THOMPSON was confined at the Tijuana jail during the same period as TAYLOR.

Incomplete reporting continues to limit the comparison of monthly patient movement totals shown in the successive publications of this series. However, it appears there was some increase in Short-Doyle program activity during January. The data show a rise in monthly admissions to each of the three types of direct service and an increase in the caseload of the rehabilitation services. Increases are also indicated in the total number of inpatient and day care days and outpatient contacts.

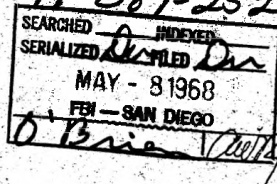
Re Possible Mental Condition of Subject RAY

On 5/2/68, CHARLES LUNDHOLM, Bureau of Viostatistics, California State Department of Mental Health, Sacramento, California, advised they had no record of subject RAY or his aliases ever having been a patient in any of the mental institutions back to 1921. This would also include committed alcoholics.

LUNDHOLM advised that this would not be a complete record for the State of California inasmuch as about 2/3 of the counties in California have their own Inpatient, Outpatient and Rehabilitation Centers where one could go on his own volition. The names of all these individuals are not submitted to the state. He said it was possible that counties could have central indices but did not know whether the indices would be by name or file number.

FBI Offers 2 More James E. Ray Photos

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The FBI today distributed two newly obtained photographs of James Earl Ray, the ex-convict sought in the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. One was described as "an extremely good likeness."

A candid photograph of Ray, which the FBI said was taken in late January or early February of this year somewhere in California, shows him almost full face in a business suit and tie.

The second photograph, which the FBI said was taken last November somewhere in Mexico, also is a candid shot. It shows him in dark glasses wearing what appears to be a white sports shirt.

The FBI declined to say

how the photographs had been obtained. They will be displayed throughout the country along with two other photographs of Ray which appear on the FBI's wanted poster.

One is a photo of Ray at the time he was said to be posing as a man named Eric Starvo Galt, and was taken at the time of his graduation from a bartending school in Los Angeles.

The other photo is actually two likenesses of Ray on the same print — prison photographs taken in 1960 at Missouri State Penitentiary.

King was shot by a sniper in Memphis April 4. The FBI announced April 17 it had issued a warrant for the arrest of Galt.

Earlier on this date, JOHNSON had been at a gas station directly across from his business in San Diego and had observed a white Chevrolet or GMC pickup truck, bearing Arizona license EN 9139. There were two men in the truck and one of them appeared to fit the general description of the man the FBI was looking for concerning the KING assassination. JOHNSON advised that he gave this information to an officer of the San Diego Police Department.

JOHNSON was contacted by SA ARNOLD W. O'BRIEN and furnished essentially the same information, stating that the individual driving the truck was a man about 65 years of age and had a striking family resemblance to the photograph of subject RAY recently appearing in the newspaper.

JOHNSON advised that he did not get a very good look at the individual accompanied by this older man, but that he fit the general description of subject RAY, being about 35 years of age and having brown wavy hair.

Mr. JOHNSON advised that he became suspicious of these individuals in view of the fact that they pulled up into the gas station in a manner which made it difficult to see the younger man in the cab of the truck. Prior to leaving, they inquired as to how to find Linda Vista Boulevard in San Diego.
