Memphis witnesses described the suspected assassin, who registered as John Willard at a rooming house opposite King's motel, as about six feet and sandinhaired and "a clean, next man."

No trace of Willard has apparently been found.

An FBI alert for Eric Starvo Galt in a white Mustang was issued in Florida last Thursday, but was canceled. However, fthe FBI has continued a search for Galt's whereabouts or clues to his past.

After Cherpes disclosed what his boarder said of his work and background, Associated Press

inquiries turned up blanks.

Is there a real Eric Starvo
Galt? The FBI was asked, but declined comment. Neither would the FBI say why Galt was wanted, though the Florida alert had sought only to spot the man, not arrest him. No warnant had been issued then.

The man known as Eric Galt had said he was employed at a Mississippi shipyard, but there was no record of him. He claimed he held Louisiana driver's license six years ago, but no record was found in the files.

The owner of a boarding house said today he had identified a drawing of a man sought in the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. as a roomer known by the name Eric Galt.

Cherpes said FBI agents showed him drawings about last Wednesday, or two days before a car registered in the name of Eric Starvo Galt was found abandoned in Atlanta. The car, a white Mustang with an Alabama license tag, matched the description of a car seen leaving the assassination scene in Memphis, Tenn., where King

Memphis, Tenn., where King was shot April 4.

Cherpes was shown a newspaper artist's drawing of the assassin today and he said it was such like the drawings exhibited by federal agents. (therpes said the sketches "looked exactly like Galt."

Reference is made to Serial 50 of this file, which concerns a young man in a Cessna aircraft, which landed at Boeing Field on April 6, 1968.

On April 15, 1968, S. L. WORDEN, Proprietor of A. C. Propellor Company, 7685 Perimeter Road, recalled that on Sunday, April 7, 1968, he received a telephone call at his home, and the caller identified himself as RICHARD SCHMIDT. WORDEN said that SCHMIDT wanted him to come down to his place of employment as he, SCHMIDT, needed repair made on a propellor on his plane. WORDEN said that this call came to him somewhere around the noon hour on that particular Sunday.

Continuing, WORDEN said that he came to Boeing Field and first saw the man who identified himself as RICHARD SCHMIDT washing down the Cessna 205, and SCHMIDT was doing this at Galvin Flying Service and was using Galvin Flying Service's facilities.

According to WORDEN, RICHARD SCHMIDT mounted the propellor on his plane fixed on Sunday as he said he wanted to be in San Diego, California, by Monday morning.


WORDEN said that RICHARD SCHMIDT was joined by another young man and a girl who was with the second fellow, and he, WORDEN, received a strong impression that the second man and the girl lived somewhere in the Seattle area. He said that they were driving in a blue late model Ford, which could have been a rental.

WORDEN said that he could not complete the repairs on the propellor on Sunday, and RICHARD SCHMIDT came back on Money morning, April 8, 1968; and while he was waiting for the repairs to be made on his propellor, he filled out some type of a flight plan, and WORDEN observed that this flight plan would take SCHMIDT to San Diego.

WORDEN said that since the weather was fine on April 8, 1968, it would not have been necessary for SCHMIDT to file this flight plan with the FAA inasmuch as he was going to do visual flying.

WORDEN said that this RICHARD SCHMIDT gave him \$30 in cash for the repairs, which he, WORDEN, had made, and WORDEN recalled that SCHMIDT mentioned something about the fact that he was going to try to obtain a heavy nose wheel assembly.

WORDEN said that he did not know whether or not this RICHARD SCHMIDT actually did so; but if he did, he would have bought these parts at VanDusen, which firm is located on the Perimeter Road just next to the Administration Building of King County Airport, also known as Boeing Field.

WORDEN said that he is certain that RICHARD SCHMIDT and his young man companion took off in this plane at approximately 1:00 p.m. on Monday, April 8, 1968, and that their avowed destination was San Diego. WORDEN said that the girl did not go with these two men.

WORDEN also said that while he was making the repairs to the propellor, SCHMIDT, who was then in company with the other young man and the girl, told WORDEN that he and the other two persons had landed in the Cessna plane at the landing strip at Lake Tapps; and since the field was so wet, they became mired down and stuck. WORDEN said that SCHMIDT told him that instead of pushing the plane out of the hole in which it was mired, he flew it out, and this caused the damage to his propellor and also caused the heavy coating of mud all over the plane itself, which SCHMIDT had to wash off at Galvin Flying Service.

WORDEN said that the man who gave his name as RICHARD SCHMIDT was definitely in his very early 20's; he was 5' 10" in height; he had real blond hair and was suntanned so that he gave the impression of being a California surfer. WORDEN said that the second man fit the same description as SCHMIDT.

On April 15, 1968, STEVE SHAWLEY, who is employed by Boeing Field International, advised that he had not been present when the Cessna 205 arrived at this field on April 6, 1968; but on April 7, 1968, he saw a young man washing this partiplane at Galvin's Flying Service, and he later saw this same young man in the vicinity of the M and O Flight Construction

SE 44-371

Service, which ajoins A. C. Propellor Company.

STEVE SHAWLEY also said that he was never up very close to the young man who seemed to be in charge of this plane, and he did not ever see any ofher person with this young man, and the last time he saw this person, he was taxiing a plane on the ramp either at 1:00 p.m. on April 8 or possibly on April 9.

STEVE SHAWLEY said that this young man did not pay anything for his tie-down and had unloosed the plane himself. STEVE SHAWLEY said that the place where he works does not have any record concerning the name of the man who was in charge of this particular airplane.

STEVE SHAWLEY said the only thing he could say regarding this young man was that he was possibly in his early 20's; had a full head of blond hair, which was not too long and was flat, but neither was it short. He also said that this man appeared to be well dressed and neat, and by this he meant that when he saw this young man, he was wearing Levi's and a sweater, both of which were light colored. He described this young man further as being 5' 11" to 6' 1" and as having a fairly muscular build. W MA

On April 15, 1968, contact was had with VanDusen, who sell airplane parts, and information was received that no person had purchased a heavy nose wheel assembly for a Cessna at this company on April 8. This company was closed on April 7, 1968.

On April 15, 1968, it was determined from a representative of the Galvin Flying Service, Inc., that on April 7, 1968, a person who had given his name as RICHARD A. SCHMIDT had paid \$3 in cash to use the facilities of this company to wash a Cessna airplane. The people at Galvin Flying Service did not know this young man and had no further record on him.

In view of information contained in this memorandum, which concludes information that the young man flying this plane did not look anything like the suspect, no further investigation is being conducted on this particular lead.





FBI Optimistic Clues Will Produce Assassin

By GAYLORD SHAW Associated Press Writer

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP)
FBI agents have uncovered
"very substantial" physical evidence as they work "around the
clock pursuing every lead" in
the search for Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s assassin, says
Atti Gen. Ramsey Clark.
"The FBI is devoting every

"The FBI is devoting every possible resource to this investigation," Clark said. "...While it remains impossible to predict when the killer will be arrested, I remain hopeful that it will be soon."

A Justice Department spokesman said the statement issued in Washington Friday night, Clark's first public pronouncement on the case in five days, was in response to newsmen's queries.

But Clark, like FBI officials, refused to answer newsmen's questions. "All I can say is no comment," said Robert Jensen, special agent in charge of the Remphis FBI office.

King was shot and killed by a sniper April 4 as he stood out-

side his motel room here.

In Washington, Rep. Charles W. Whalen Jr., R-Ohio, said a welter of "premature and contradictory statements" was clouding the investigation and asked the FBI to "set the record straight."

"The handling of the investigation and the efforts to apprehend the guilty person or persons hardly has been reassuring to a tense and troubled nation," Whalen said in a news release.

The search for the assassin has spread hundreds of miles from Memphis, sources report, and involves thousands of investigators.

The scope of the investigation was evident Friday in both Memphis and Birmingham. Newsmen seeking to question persons who might have information about the case were told repeatedly: "The FBI has already been here."

At the Memphis rooming house from which the fatal shot was fired, Charles Q. Stevens said FBI agents had shown him two composite drawings of the

suspected slayer—one a partial profile and the other a full face view.

Stevens said he could identify the partial view, but not the full face view. He said he saw the gunman flee after hearing a shot fired from a communal bathroom next door to his room. The bathroom window affords a clear view of the motel balcony where King was standing when shot.

And at a rooming house in Birmingham, residents said FBI agents had questioned them about Eric Starvo Galt, a white man named in an FBI bulletin issued, then withdrawn, in Florida Thursday night.

The message sent over the state police teletypewriter network in Florida asked help in locating Galt. It said Galt was driving a white Mustang.

Witnesses in Memphis told investigators earlier they saw a man in a white Mustang drave away from the rooming house. Records in Alabama show that a man named Galt bought a 1966 Mustang in August 1967.



On 4/16/68 a letter was received from E. J. FOY, 3916 Terrace Drive, Yakima, enclosing a photograph from page 2-A, Yakima Herald-Republic, dated April 12. It was noted that in the background of the picture there appeared the name GALT followed by a question mark. The letter indicated FOY understood the FBI was looking for a man named GALT and speculated as to whether he could be as real as the World War II fellow whose mane appeared on every wall, fence and building from Africa to England, via Europe. (KILROY?)

In an effort to ascert ain if the name appeared on the original negative, the negative was made available by DEAN SPULER, photographer for the Yakima Herald-Republic, who identified it as one made by a staff correspondent, PAUL HART, at Ellensburg, Washington. It was noted that the name does appear on the negative, but the negative covers a larger area than the print which appeared in the newspaper. An examination of a print furnished by Mr. SPULER revealed that the name was actually in large letters possibly two feet or more in height and applied to what appeared to be a fence enclosing an electric company and probably applied by use of a paint spray can. It is to be noted that the picture was published some few days after an article had appeared in news media to the effect that a man named GALT was being sought for questioning in correction with this case. It is also noted that the art department of the college, with its usual sprinkling of exhibitionists is located in the building shown in the photograph.

It is apparent that this is a prank and in the absence of any information as to who might be responsible, no inquiry was conducted. Hr. FOY'S letter was acknowledged personally on 4/16/68, at which time he was concerned that the incident might have escaped the attention of the FBI. He was thanked for his interest.


