SUBJECT: MURKIN

PAUL HOWARD, temporarily residing Room 224, Rogers Hotel, Bloomington, Illinois, a known pimp, gambler and alleged burglary set-up, who is acquainted with the writer, contacted SA WOODS on 12/5/68.

HOWARD advised that he desired to furnish information as he believes he is 'mixed up with something he did not realize was as big as it is". He related that on or about 11/26/68 in the bar at the Rogers Hotel, Bloomington, Ill., he engaged in conversation with an individual known to him as ROBERT H. STRADER. alleged owner of Prototype Specialty Company, 2745 South Holt Rd., Post Office Box 41004, Indianapolis, Indiana. He related STRADER stated that his wife, MARGARET STRADER, is a patient at St. Joseph's Hospital, Bloomington, Ill., anticipating childbirth. HOWARD advised Mrs. STRADER has since given birth and is allegedly ready for release from this hospital. He stated STRADER at present is attempting to obtain an apartment where he can house his family.

HOWARD advised since his original contact with STRADER he has been with him constantly to date. HOWARD related STRADER has told him that he was in a truck stop at Memphis, Tennessee prior to the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, and while in a rest room at this truck stop, heard some individuals planning the assassination of KING. HOWARD states STRADER informed him that the assassination was taking place by these individuals, who were allegedly paid \$1,500,000. The contributors of the \$1,500,000 were alleged to be noted businessmen from the Southern states and "Cuba money". HOWARD states STRADER further told him that he, STRADER, was approached to kill KING himself.

HOWARD advised STRADER told him that the FBI was fully familiar with his story but that they did not believe him. He stated that he, STRADER, was well acquainted with numerous FBI Agents throughout the United States, and that the Federal agents were protecting him and are constantly alert as to his whereabouts. He stated that his contact with the FBI came further through a correspondent (FNU) STERN, of Washington, D.C.

44-561-809 HOWARD stated that STRADER speaks frequently of being personally acquainted with Agent SULLIVAN in charge/of

the Springfield Office of the FBI and Agent ART WOODS of Bloomington, Illinois, HOWARD states that according to STRADER, he has talked on numerous occasions with these two Agents, who are familiar with his knowledge in this matter. HOWARD related that STRADER went into detail concerning an event which allegedly happened recently when he left his wife's parents' residence, name unknown, in Lexington, Illinois, en route Detroit, Michigan, whereas STRADER took the blacktop roads and noted he was being followed by a brown Chevrolet. He proceeded to the Holiday Inn at Bloomington, Illinois, where he climbed to the balcony rails so he could observe the area and then telephonically contacted his wife. According to HOWARD, STRADER then proceeded to Indianapolis, Indiana, and inside the State of Indiana at a roadside rest area, he stopped and this car allegedly appeared, and the occupant took a shot at him, STRADER. He fell to the ground and posed as dead.

HOWARD advised that STRADER continually talks of this matter. He has furnished so much detail thathe, HOWARD, is confused. He stated STRADER is allegedly in the process of selling his story concerning the KING murder to the Chicago "Daily News" for allegedly \$2,500,000. HOWARD related that according to STRADER, he has an appointment with a reporter of the "Chicago Daily News", JOHN LINDSTROM (phonetic), at an unrecalled motel at Lafayette, Indiana, on 12/7/68. HOWARD states STRADER told him that the FBI is fully aware he is going to sell his story. STRADER stated he did not care who gets the story, the newspaper of KING's defense, whichever would pay the most.

HOWARD advised STRADER frequently talks concerning a (FNU) DONNELLEY who owns a construction company in Denham, Louisiana, with whom STRADER was allegedly associated. Also of kix one CHARLES SHAPIRO (phonetic) of Miami, Florida, who is a large financier of a race track in the Miami area. States SHAPIRO allegedly obtained his money from contacts in Cuba.

HOWARD advised that along the afternoon of 12/4/68 STRADER asked him to go to the Veterans Hospital at Danville, Illinois, where he, STRADER, was allegedly a patient and is on a temporary leave to report back on or about 12/26/68. The purpose of this trip to Danville was to pick up alleged checks which were to be mailed to him at the hospital. He stated upon arrival at Danville, STRADER entered the hospital. He, HOWARD, did not. STRADER returned and stated the checks were not there.

HOWARD advised STRADER then stated they must proceed to Indianapolis, Indiana, where he an appointment with his attorney at 8:30 AM on 12/5/68. HOWARD stated they drove to Indianapolis, Ind. and spent the night driving in the Indianapolis and Martinsville, Indiana areas. He advised he arrived in Indianapolis at the attorney's office at 8:30 AM and was in the attorney's office from 8:30 AM to 5:30 PM on 12/5/68. HOWARD advised that STRADER's attorney is DONALD FOLEY, who has office in the Merchants Bank Building at Indianapolis, office phone 639-5454, home phone 257-5044. He related that while in the attorney's office during this above-designated period of time, STRADER made four or five disc recordings on both sides relating all of his knowledge of the incident involving MARTIN LUTHER KING. HOWARD stated that STRADER referred to an Agent of the FBI of the Indianapolis Stated he would be in contact with this Agent on 12/6/68 Office. concerning the information furnished by STRADER. HOWARD advised he is unable to recall the agent's name but stated it was a German name and as he recalls the latter part of the Agent's last name was "BERG".

HOWARD advised during the course of STRADER making these disc recordings, he inserted HOWARD's name on several occasions. He advised that HOWARD told FOLEY he knew nothing concerning this matter and FOLEY was allegedly concerned as to why HOWARD was present. He stated he told the attorney he merely came along with STRADER for company, at STRADER's request. He stated he informed the attorney he knew nothing whatsoever concerning this and had only known STRADER for a short period of time. HOWARD stated during this contact, STRADER signed a contract with the attorney, whereas at such time he receives the royalties from his story, he, STRADER, would pay the attorney \$25 per hour for his time, plus expenses. He further stated that the attorney had him, HOWARD, sign a contract whereas he, HOWARD, should he receive any royalties, would pay a similar amount to the attorney. HOWARD stated he was at a loss and signed his name but then did not know why.

HOWARD advised that on one occasion the attorney walked out of the room and STRADER stated to him that he wanted HOWARD to tell the attorney that there was a contract out on him, STRADER, in Louisiana. HOWARD stated he refused. He advised STRADER later told him that he, HOWARD, "blew the deal". The reason he wanted HOWARD to state there was a contract on him, STRADER, was to make the newspapers more interested to pay more money.

HOWARD advised he is very much concerned about this

matter and feels that he has gotten himself into a position where he does not bdong and stated he is furnishing this information for whatever value it may be. He further advised if he can furnish any additional information or if any further information is needed, which he can obtain, he is available.

Enclosed herewith for the Bureau are three copies of an FD-303 interview of GRONGE SEYMOUR HELLER, setting forth information concerning the subject's purchase of a 1959 Chrysler in June, 1967, at Chicago, Illinois. Enclosed for the Homphis Division are 15 copies of the same FD-302. Enclosed for the St. Louis and Springfield Divisions are one copy each of same FD-302.

The investigation conducted to locate GEORGE SEY-MOUR HELLER for interview is not being set forth in the interest of brevity and economy.

It is noted that HELLER advised that the manager of the Sunoco Gas Station, Lunt and Western Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, was present at time of sale and also observed JAMES HARL HAY. On 12/13/68, Mr. JENS JANSEN, Partner, aforementioned Sunoco Station, advised that WAURICE GIVANT, previous owner for six years, had left the station in about August, 1988, and has not been heard of since. JANSEN advised that the gas stations report to the Sun Oil Company

He further advised that numerous collection agencies, as well as the City of Chicago and the Illinois State Department of Revenue, have been to the gas station attempting to locate GIVANT. He said that the only information he knows of concerning GIVANT's whereabouts is that he supposedly is in California to avoid paying the Illinois state taxes wanted by the Department of Revenue. In view of this, no further attempt is being made to locate GIVANT for interview since it does not appear that he could add any additional information not obtained from HELLER, UACB.

GEORGE SEYMOUR HELLER, 1337 West Fargo, Chicago. Illinois, phone 262-4854, was interviewed at his place of employment, the Bernard Harwich branch of the Jewish Community Centers of Chicago, 3003 West Touhy, Chicago, Illinois, phone RO 1, 9100, where he is employed as a social group worker. Mr. HELLER advised that some time in the summer of 1967, he ran an ad in the "Chicago Tribune" for the sale of a 1959 Chrysler, green over white. He said that the manager of the Sunoco Station, Lunt and Western Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, named MAURICE (LNU), acted as his agent. the ad had been run in the paper, he received a call from MAURICE (LNU), telling him that a party had called about the car and would be at the gas station. HELLER went to the gas station and waited for the purchaser to arrive. first observed the purchaser alone walking into the gas station. RAY made no comment as to his residence, employment, or any other matters of a personal nature. RAY also made no comment concerning the reason for the purchase of the car and in fact seemed to have very little interest

They were instructed in the event they were contacted by Mrs. STRADER to simply take whatever information she has in a courteous way but that she should be advised no FBI protection is available.

SA WOODS is of the impression STRADER himself may have returned to the VA Hospital at Danville, Ill.



On 3/25/69, DAVE BAIRD, Reporter for the newspaper "Commercial News", Danville, Illinois, advised that on 3/24/69, he was telephonically contacted by ROBERT H. STRADER, 1220 East Fairchild Street, Apartment 7, Danville, Illinois, and STRADER related that he had vital information concerning the assassination of Doctor MARTIN LUTHER KING. STRADER told BAIRD that prior to KING's death he was in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, where he was approached by unknown individuals and these individuals attempted to hire STRADER to murder Doctor KING. STRADER said he refused the offer and related that since that date he had been followed and several attempts have been made on his life. STRADER told BAIRD that if the "Commercial News" newspaper was interested in his story that arrangements could be made through STRADER's attorney, DONALD FOLEY, Indianapolis, Indiana, for payment for this story. STRADER requested BAIRD to meet him in the near future, however, BAIRD said he felt that STRADER was a "nut" and he doubted if any action would be taken by this newspaper.

As noted in referenced communication, as well as other communications to the Bureau, STRADER has alleged he had information concerning the assassination of KING. In view of past information concerning STRADER, no action is recommended regarding contact with STRADER or his wife, MARGARET CARMICHAEL STRADER.




