The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent PRINCE G. MELTON:

AT LEAVENWORTH, KANSAS

A former inmate of the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, advised on April 30, 1968, that he had worked in the bakery at the Missouri State Penitentiary while JAMES RARL RAY was an inmate at the penitentiary and also a bakery worker. RAY was a friend of BOB POWELL and an inmate recalled only as J. R. RUSSELL, believed to be from Farmington, Missouri.

POWELL intimated that RAY was planning an escape from the penitentiary and his escape was finally effected with a large bread box--POWELL, RUSSELL, and possibly others assisting in the loading of the bread box containing JAMES EARL RAY. When the bread truck came in, a remark was made by POWELL about sending something to the farm, and a rather heavy bread box was loaded on the bread truck.

RAY on one occasion made the remark concerning a Negro guard known as Lt. BILLY BOB "That's one Nigger that should be dead." RAY on one occasion referred to a male Negro cook as "that black son-of-a-bitch."

RAY was characterized as a longr and one who seemed to live in his own world. RAY was known to purchase the physical favors of homosexuals while still in the Missouri State Penitentiary, although it was believed that RAY would seek sexual relations with women outside the prison walls.

Prior to the time that RAY escaped in the bread box, POWELL was overheard telling RAY that he wanted RAY to go to Doe Run, Missouri, where a girl named FRANKIE BARBARA (phonetic) remided. POWELL wanted RAY to "beat that bitch real good, but don't kill her." POWELL wanted RAY to tell FRANKIE that the beating had come from POWELL. Apparently FRANKIE BARBARA had been POWELL's girl friend, and when she stopped corresponding with POWELL, POWELL became quite upset.

It was also believed that RAY had stabbed one inmate while still in the Missouri State Penitentiary down on the dock by the garbage cans, but his identity was never discovered by prison officials. It was believed that POWELL held this inmate while RAY stabbed him with a knife. It was not believed that this was a mortal wound, but simply an assault with a knife.

It was indicated that RAY used to steal locks from different doors in the bakery and kitchen area and practiced picking these locks later.

RUSSELL was described as a white male, age 35, about 5'10", 160 pounds. POWELL was a nice-looking, well built, white male with black hair.

On 4/22/68, the Atlanta Office advised that JAMES EARL RAY was last known to be in the Atlanta, Ga. area on 3/24/69. Intensive investigation by the Atlanta Office has not established the mode of transportation utilized by RAY after 3/24/68, through checks with transportation companies. car rental agencies, etc.

The Atlanta Office requested various offices to check car recoveries within their respective divisions of cars stolen from the State of Georgia subsequent to 3/23 68, and to give consideration to any cars recovered in the near future which may have been stolen from the State of Georgia.

In those instances where cars were stolen from Georgia and where the transporter of the car cannot otherwise be accounte for, investigation should be conducted to determine if RAY could have been the person who stole the car and transported it to the place where it was recovered.

The Resident Agents receiving copies of the memorandum should review their cases in the 26 category in an effort to identify any cars stolen in the State of Georgia and abandoned in territories covered by the Resident Agents.

Any Resident Agents who have MSHP Troop Headquarters should review their files for any cars recovered stolen in the State of Georgia and which may not have been reported to the FBI.

Headquarters Agents receiving copies of the memorandum should review their files for any cars stolen in Georgia and recovered in the St. Louis area. If any such cars are located, additional effort should be made to identify the transporter of same.

RE: ACTIVITIES OF SUBJECT SINCE ESCAPE FROM MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY (MSP), 4-23-67

The following represents a chronological order of events in the recent history of JAMES EARL RAY including his escape from the MSP and known activities since that time:

Investigation at the MSP reflects JAMES EARL RAY officially escaped from that institution on 4-23-67, ostensibly by hiding in a bread box which was delivered by truck to an auxiliary ferm. RAY was serving out a sentence of 23 years on an Armed Robbery Charge - First Degree, and Operating A motor vehicle Without Owner's Consent. RAY was received at the MSP on 3-17-60.

Subsequent to his escape an FBI complaint was filed on 7-20-67, charging JAMES EARL RAY with UFAC.

The date of RAY's escape appears to be significant for two reasons, the first that his brother, JOHN RAY, while having visited subject in prison on several occasions also visited him on 4-22-67, one day before RAY's alleged escape. JOHN claims, however, that he knew nothing of his brother's escape until much later and that he knew nothing at all of his brother's escape plans. He stated that he did not make all of the visits to the prison claimed by officials of that institution and that he has no specific recollection of having visited on 4-22-67.

Officials of the prison further advised that signatures on the visitors' register are compared at the time of visit with signatures of authorized visitors in the prison files and that it, therefore, is not likely that a visitor's cardwould be used by someone else as JOHN RAY has claimed. JOHN has chaimed that JERRY RAY possibly made some of the visits attributed to him. It was pointed out by these officials that if a discrepancy in signatures were discovered trouble could result for both the inmate and the visitor and it is, therefore, considered by them to be very unlikely that a visitor would use someone else's identity.

The date of escape is significant from a second point of view, that of WALTER E. NOLAN's statement on 4-24-67, that RAY went out of the prison 30 days before reported and that he actually walked out the front door. NOLAN did not elaborate further as to what was meant by this.

There is little indication of where RAY went after his escape or how he spent this time until \$5-67, with three possible exceptions. The first is a statement by fellow inmate, LEO HOLDEN PARKER, who advised the KC Division on 4-26-68, that he had been told by an unrecalled inmate at the SL Jail that subject RAY had been living and cooking in a garage somewhere in SL until as late as 9-67. RAY was reported to have had a car during this period of time, was pushing narcotics, and pulling stickups. It was not known to this source whether RAY had made any contacts with SL relatives.

The second indication of RAY's whereabouts is a statement by Det. Sgt. ED SCHAAF of the SLPD Intelligence Unit reporting information from a confidential source that J. D. DAILEY of Portageville, Mo., had "holed up" RAY first at the Half-Way House, 1549 S. Jefferson Ave., in 9-67, which tavern was owned by DAILEY before going to Portageville where he also is supposed to have "harbored" RAY. Sometime during this period RAY was supposed to have offered an attorney \$1500 to "square" his escape from prison.

The third indication of RAV's whereabouts is a statement by HOMER TOWNSLEY, acquaintance of RAY, on 4-22-68, that he did not see RAY after his escape from the MSP in 4-67, but that he did hear that RAY had come to SL in order to kill a man responsible for his arrest and imprisonment. TOWNSLEY stated that J. D. DAILEY had said RAY contacted him after his escape but did not know if DAILEY had ever helped him

Subject RAY's first verifiable relidence since escape in March or April of 1967, is as ERIC STARVO GALT, 2608 Highland Ave., Birmingham, Ala., 8-30-67. It was on this date that a white 2-door Ford Mustang, VIN 6TO7C190647, was transferred to ERIC S. GALT. Ala. driver's license #2848947 was issued to ERIC STARVO GALT at 2608 Highland Ave., S. Birmingham, Ala., on 9-6-67. 1968 Ala. license 138-993 was

thereafter issued on 10-2-67, to GALT at the same Highland Ave. address. GALT's driver's license described him as a white male, born 5'll", 175 lbs., occupation - merchant marine. No surrender of license for an out-of-state license has been recorded. It is noted that GALT took his driver's license test in a 1967 Mustang bearing Ala. license 1A88354.

A duplicate license was issued to GALT on 3-1-68, to the same address and which was not returned.

The next verified indication of RAY's whereabouts is reported by the legat, Mexico City, who advises that ERIC STARVO GALT resided in the Hotel Rio, Room 212, Morelos, 86 Puerto Vallarta, Jalisco, Mexico, 10-19-67 to 11-6-67. GALT thereafter checked into the Hotel Tropicana, Puerto Vallarta, Room 417, checking out on 11-13-67. There were no known toll charges at either of these hotels.

Subject JAMES EARL RAY next appeared under the name of ERIC STARVO GALT at LA, Calif., where he is known to have resided between 11-19-67 and approximately 3-17-68. RAY, aka GALT, resided at 1535 N. Serrano, Apt. 6, LA, from 11-19-67 to 1-18-68. The USPO, LA, Calif., furnished a change of address reflecting that on 1-22-68, ERIC STARVO GALT moved from 1535 N. Serrano Ave., LA, to the St. Francis Hotel at 5533 Hollywood Blvd., LA. GALT stayed at the St. Francis Hotel from 1-21-68 to 3-17-68. While in LA he serviced a 1968 white Mustang, Ala. license 138-993, at a Chevron Station, 1506 N. Normandy, LA, on 2-13-68, mileage reading 34,185, and again on 2-22-68, at Cort-Fox Ford, 4531 Hollywood Blvd. LA, mileage 34,289. GALT's address on the latter service ticket was reflected as 1535 N. Serrano, LA. While in LA GALT took dancing lessons from the National Dance Studios from early 12-67 until 2-12-68. The lessons cost GALT between \$400 and \$500 and were paid for by him in cash.

During this approximate period of time ERIC STARVO GALT also attended the International School of Bartending in LA between the dates 1-19-68 and 3-2-68. In both pursuits GALT was described as an introvert, a loner, lacking in social graces, and as having an apparent low level of education.

GALT left LA for a brief period of time beginning on 12-15-67, on which date he left for New Orleans, La., with an acquaintance identified as CHARLES STEIN. The purpose of this trip was to return two of STEIN's wife's children to LA who had been living in New Orleans with their grandparents. GALT met the STEINs in the bar of the St. Francis Hotel and voluntarily agreed to transport STEIN to New Orleans after learning from his wife of the plight of her children. claimed that it was necessary for him to meet with some "contractors" in that city. He later stated to STEIN that he had met with two or more men whom he did not identify. did impose a condition on his agreement to make this trip which was a requirement that STEIN, his wife, and a third acquaintance register for the Gov. GEORGE WALLACE political party at the WALLACE headquarters in LA. GALT took it upon himself to transport these individuals to WALLACE headquarters, oversaw their registration, and thereafter began the trip to New Orleans with Mr. STEIN.

STEIN has advised the LA Division that GALT paid all expenses of trip for both parties and that he, STEIN, only spent \$35 during the entire trip. GALT apparently had some doubt about the trip, however as he advised a third female acquaintance that if the trip was a setup he would kill STEIN, as he had a gun.

After departure on 12-15-67, GALT and STEIN arrived in New Orleans on 12-17-67, departed that city on 12-19-67, and arrived in LA on 12-21-67. STEIN advised that he separated from GALT in New Orleans at GALT's request and that he, GALT, stayed at a motel in that city. STEIN claimed that throughout the entire trip GALT kept dropping his name in restaurants and service stations which made it appear to him as if GALT was desirous of these individuals becoming aware of his name.

It is also noted that during the time GALT spent in LA he was free with his money, giving away \$20 on at least two occasions and that he traded a woman acquaintance a large console TV set for a small portable which he could carry with him.

THOMAS LAU, Director of the International School of Bartending, advised the LA Division on 4-15-68, that after

GALT had graduated from the bartending school he, LAU, telephoned GALT on 3-2-68, as he had in mind a possible job for him. GALT stated at this time that he did not want the job as he was leaving town within two weeks for an undisclosed destination for the purpose of visiting with his brother. As previously noted GALT checked out of the St. Francis Hotel on 3-17-68, leaving a forwarding address of General Delivery, Main Post Office, Atlanta, Ga., until 4-25-68. It is noted that Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. visited LA in 3-68, but there is no known significance in the simultaneous appearance of GALT and KING in LA at that time.

The next known appearance of GALT is in Atlanta, Ga., on 3-24-68, inasmuch as Atlanta has advised in an airtel dated 4-25-68, that GALT can be placed in that city on that date. Specific information is not furnished.

ERIC STARVO GALT's next appearance was at the New Rebel Motel in Memphis, Tenn., on 4-3-68, where he stayed overnight until 4-4-68, at which time he moved into the rooming house at 422½ Main St., Memphis, Tenn. GALT's registration at the New Rebel Motel reflects he was still operating a white Mustang bearing Ala. license 138-993 and that he gave an address of 2608 S. Highland Ave., Birmingham. It is noted that this is the same address given by GALT when he purchased the car on 8-30-67, and to which a duplicate driver's license was sent on 3-1-68.

The above-described Mustang was thereafter recovered in Atlanta, Ga., on 4-11-68, apparently having been abandoned there on 4-5-68, prior to 9:00 a.m.

Relatives claim no knowledge of RAY's whereabouts since his escape from the MSP, all of whom state that they either saw him last while in prison or it has been several years since having seen him. JERRY RAY, JOHN "JACK" RAY, and CAROL and ALBERT PEPPER apparently got together in SL in 2-68, at which time JERRY and JOHN were both registered at the MacArthur Hotel, SL. JERRY was registered on 2-2-68, JOHN on 2-6-68, and Mr. and Mrs. JOHN RAY on 2-17-68. There is no known Mrs. JOHN RAY and all claim that JAMES EARL RAY was not present when they had this gathering and that they had no knowledge of his whereabouts at that time.



This report is concerned with the behavior and statements of Inmate Earl Harris C-12108 during his Assignment to the Maximum Security Unit.

Wherever Harris has called in Maximum Security he has spread dissension and created unnecessary incidents. His record during his past and present sentences in the institution is heavily documented as to his preoccupation with violent and often vicious behavior. He is very vociferous, profane, and threatening in his remarks concerning Department administrators, Prison Guards, and employees of this institution.

He uses his reputation and his known propensity to violence to abuse, and intimidate other Inmates until they accede to his wishes in causing disturbances, food strikes, slanderous comments concerning Officers and employees of the Dept. of Corrections.

When called before Adjustment Board this A.M. on a Violation Report of his Agitating another Inmate (A charge that was witnessed by several Officers) he was insolent, and abusive, (calling adjustment board a Kangaroo Court) and upon being placed in Seclusion Cell he threatened Officer's life stating he would kill them if he got a chance.

We believe and with good reason that if Earl Harris C-12108 were placed in any segment of the population that before long he would have promulgated disorder and behavior contrary to the rules of common sense, decency, and good order.

We believe therefore that Inmate Earl Harris C012108 should be placed in Seclusion Cell for an indefinite period (subject to the decision and judgment of Warden H. Swenson, Associate Warden's. W. Kern and C. White, and the Classification committee) We are under no illusions as to this reforming or changing Harris. It will simply make it more difficult for him to implement his often stated plans of riot, destruction, and murder.

This 68-year-old white male has been in the prison system for the last 30 years of his life. At this time there is a possibility of a discharge. He is a surprisingly tovial individual despite the thirty years of incarceration. He himself states that there is no use worrying about things like this. He indicates that he has kept up a legal interest for the last thirty years and expects to be discharged. He also indicates that he feels that the warden stopped him from learning more about being a pastry chef. He states that he was transferred to Moberly and this stopped him from being able to continue as a pastry chef. He indicates that he is specifically against the warden for this. This is apparently a grudge that he has maintained over the years. He states that he would be all right as long as the warden had nothing to do with him. He seems to be a rather opinionated individual who once he "gets stuck on something" he follows through to the end. However, there is no evidence of any paranoid thinking or any delusional system. He indicates that he hopes to be able to go into business for himself when he leaves here. He indicates that there are people who owe him a few favors that he feels that he can approach for a sizable loan. However, this seems to be somewhat guarded in that he states that "There are not too many things that an old man like me can do". During the psychiatric interview he smoked a pipe and talked quite freely. There was no evidence of any guarding. There was no evidence of marked emotional lability. There was also no evidence of any thought disorder. It was clear that he had some difficulties with his sensorium and that both his immediate recall and his past memory were mildly impaired. This would seem the result of a mild brain syndrome. The diagnosis at this time is chronic brain syndrome, mild, which should not impair his functioning very much.
