



south of the bar with the suffleboard sitting against the east wall of the room. The officers then called for an urgent cruiser and secured the scene of the shooting to keep the witnesses from leaving.

Path. Eldridge Walleman 2386, in charge of car 39A, responded to the scene of the shooting and conveyed the victim to City Hospital # one where he was treated by Dr. T.G. Sison of the Staff and diagnosed as being in critical condition suffering from a gunshot wound of the throat and admitted for surgery.

The victim of the shooting then made the following statement to Patn. Walleman in the hospital emergency room. He stated that he had been in the tavern drinking with a friend of his by the name of Jim Claussen. He further stated that Claussen became involved in an arguement with some unknown subject sitting at the bar and that the unknown subject invited Claussen outside to fight. The victim Little stated that Claussen and the subject then went outside but that another man or two, unknown to him, started outside to join in the fight and upon seeing this he, Little, got up to go outside to help his friend, Claussen. He states that he had just gotten to the front door of the tavern when he was shot one time by a white male subject, 30-35 years of age, 5'10" tall, 170 lbs., who was holding what appeared to be a 22 Cal. Snub Nose Revolver with pearl handles. He further stated the subject had the gun in the palm of his hand. Little then stated he staggered back towards the rear of the tavern and collapsed on the shuffleboard. He could give no further information other than the fact he is sure he could identify his assailant.

James Claussen, a white, male, 30, giving a home address of 4454 Shaw, was interviewed and stated the following information. Claussen states he was in the tavern drinking with his friend, Little, when Little began argueing with an unknown white male subject sitting at the bar. Claussen states he then said something to the subject to the effect of leaving his friend, Little, alone at which time the unknown subject stated he would rather fight Claussen and invited him outside. Claussen states the and the subject then left the tavern and began fighting on the street in front of the tavern when two or three other men unknown to him came out of the tavern and started beating on him. Claussen further states that at this point the subjects were getting the best of him and he broke away and ran back into the tavern to get away from them. As he entered the tavern door he heard someone shout "Cliff's been shot." Claussen then ran to the back room and observed his friend, Little, lying on the shuffleboard bleeding from a neck wound.

Claussen states he did not hear a shot and did not see anyone with a gun or see anyone shoot the victim. He states he did see a subject known to him as Clarence or Carl Hanes sitting at the bar just prior to his going outside to fight with the unknown subject.

Lamphere then stated the subject known to him as Haney pulled a small gun from his trouser pocket and told Little to back away, however, at this time Little took a step towards Haney and Haney shot him and then ran out the door of the tavern. He gave the same description of Haney as is listed on page one, Block 30-A.

Mr. Glenwood David Black, a white, male 47, born residing at 1944 Rutgerh, stated he was drinking at the bar at 1824 So. 10th and heard a shot fired at which time he left the bar and went to the rest room. He further stated he heard only one shot fired and did not know who fired the shot or where the shot was fired.

Mr. Winford Black, white, male 27, born residing at 944 Rutger, stated that he did not see or hear anything due to the fact he entered after the police arrived at the scene.

Mrs. Dorothy Turley, white, female 34, residing at 3652 Folsom, Apt. 7, stated she was sitting on the fourth stool from the east end of the bar and heard several men in the south room by the bar argueing among themselves. She further stated that a subject later identified to her as Cliff Little and another white male started fighting towards the front door of the tavern and when almost out of the tavern and at about that time she heard a shot. She ten looked towards the front door and observed a white male, no further, standing outside the front door and heard him shout he would shoot anyone who came after him. She could offer no further information.

Mr. Basil Berry, white, male 60, residing at 1824 S. 10th in the rear of the tavern, stated he was tending bar at the tavern and heard a subject known to him as Clarence Haynes and a subject by the name of Cliff Little argueing along with some other men at the bar. He then saw Little and Haynes begin swing at each other and wrestling around the tavern and when they got close to the front door he observed Haynes remove a small revolver from his right front trouser pocket and shoot Cliff Little and then run from the tavern. He stated Little staggered to the rear of the tavern and fell face down on the floor against the bowling machine.

A further questioning of the witnesses of the shooting determined that the correct name of the subject who did the shooting was actually Clarence Haynes.

At this time a listing was found in the telephone directory for a Clarence Haynes residing at 1822 No. 21st street and it was further determined that Clarence Haynes residing somewhere in north St. Louis. Detectives Fred Armes 2973, and Wayne Thornberry 5482, along with Patn. Charles Ruzicka 1966, then went to 1822 No. 21st street and arrested at that location at 2:00 AM this date the below named subjects.

#1- HAYNES, CLARENCE EDGAR: white, male 53, born married, mover, residing at 1822 No. 21st St. (AR 3-4975)

#2- RAY, JOHN LARRY: white, male 34, born Ill., single, bartender, claiming to reside at 2025 Bellview, Maplewood, Mo. (@ Jerry William Ryan) (AR 3-4976)

Haynes was placed under arrest for Assault With Intent to Kill and Ray was placed under arrest for Suspect of Common Assault due to the fact he had a fresh cut on his forehead and his hands were skinned up as if he had been fighting. The arrested subjects were then conveyed to the Third District Station where they were advised of their rights as follows:

- 1. That they could remain silent,
- 2. That anything they said would be used against them.
- 3. That they were entitled to counsel.
- 4. That counsel could be provided if they were indigent.
- 5. That counsel could be present while they were questioned.

At this time the following named witness identified Clarence Haynes as the person who had shot Little. Basil Berry and James Lamphere made positive identification and James Claussen identified him as the person who had been seated at the bar just prior to the fighting and shooting. Claussen also stated that John Ray appeared to be the man who he had been fighting with and who had hit him about the fact with his fist but he could not make positive identification.

Further investigation revealed that one Lawrence Wright, white, male, 39, residing at 1802 S. 13th St., had been in the tavern and had heard some men argueing and when he looked up he saw a white male subject pull a small gun from his right trouser pocket and shot another subject near the front door to the tavern. He postively identified subject Clarence Haynes as the person he had seen shoot Cliff Little.

At this point the arrested subjects John Ray and Clarence Haynes were conveyed to City Hospital # 1 to attempt to have the victim, Little, make and identification, however, Little was only semi-conscious and was unable to make awake enough to make a statement as to the identification.

The witnesses who made identification of subject Clarence Haynes were given warrant commands to appear in the Office of the Circuit Attorney in the AM to make a statement in this matter.

The subjects were questioned about the shooting after being advised of their rights and both subjects refused to make any statement.
