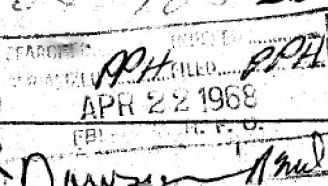

Re Albany airtels 4/10/68 and 4/11/68, setting forth concerns who purchased Thermo-Seal marking machines, and Bureau teletype to Memphis, 4/12/68.

The FBI Laboratory advised that pillowcase and bed sheet were found in trunk of 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta 4/11/68. These items contain Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately same size as tapes on items previously recovered, but are yellow in color and contain code, "20R-3." In opinion of Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the twenty in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three is the bundle number.

LEADSALL CONTINENTAL OFFICES

Will recontact laundries determined to be operating Thermo-Seal Marking Machines in an effort to locate laundry using the code, "20R-3."

On 4/13/68, GIRARD HIRSHMAN advised that the artists sketch of the killer of MARTIN LUTHER KING, Jr. which appears in the Washington Post of 4/13/68, closely resembles an individual presently in Ward 4-East of Cafritz Hospital.

According to HIRSHMAN, [REDACTED], this individual whom he recalls as FNU ANDERSON arrived about three days after the death of Dr. KING.

HIRSHMAN stated he does not have an address in WASHINGTON but is staying at a friends house and can be reached on LI3-8420. He did not give the address except it was at 13th and H Sts., NE., WDC.

Since HIRSHMAN is apparently [REDACTED] and due to the problems inherent in checking administrative records at hospitals, it is suggested this lead be handled Monday

Pursuant to telephonic information received by SA GEORGE NORTHUP on this date, he and SA WALTER E. THOMAS interviewed the party calling, ANNA MAE HARRINGTON, phone 296-4177, the manager of the apartments at 1400 20th St., N.W., Washington, D.C., and she furnished the following information: On April 7, 1968, a white male came into her apartment with many clothes, and a few pieces of luggage, and wanted to rent an apartment. She said that she did not take renters until she had checked out the references, but he said that he needed an apartment, and he left with her an expensive \$500 Omega watch as evidence of good faith, saying that he did not have any cash on hand. He made out an application, and the next day, came back with his clothing and 175 dollars for an apartment. She agreed to let him in on a temporary basis. He continued to live in Apartment 606, and on this date, said that he is going to move from the apartment to # 1 Washington, circle.

She said that, coming in as he did, she thought that he might have had some connection with the MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. ~~MURDER~~.

She was shown wanted flyer # 442 on ERIC STARVO GALT, and she said that he did not resemble this person. She described him as being a white male, 5' 8" tall to 5' 10" tall, 175 pounds, blue eyes, fair colored hair, possibly described as light brown. He had balanced ears, and mild pit marks on his face. She said that he was working at the Eagles Nest Restaurant prior to this time that he came to her address for an apartment.

She furnished additional information reflecting background on this person. She said that his name was given by him as WAYNE KOFFS, that he was a bar-tender, and that she thought that he had come from California.

The totality of background is not set out in view of what was learned at the Eagles Nest Restaurant.

On 4/19/68, SAs NORTHUP and THOMAS interviewed the manager of the Eagles Nest Restaurant, CHRIS KRIKRIS, 2121 P St., N.W., Georgetowne Apartment House. He said that KOFFS, who said that he was retired from the Marine Corp arrived on April 1, 1968, saying that he was a bar-tender at the officer's club in Quantico, and that he wanted a job. He was hired as a bartender. He said the GALT photo did not resemble KOFF in any way.

Mr. KRIKRIS said that KOFFS is no longer employed with the Eagles Nest, having left to take another job, where he allegedly made more money. He said that he could personally verify that KOFFS worked from 9 AM until 6 PM on April 4, 1968.

In view of the fact that KING was Killed at Memphis, Tennessee, at 6:03 PM on April 4, 1968, investigation of this instant matter was discontinued.

LONG, General Investigative Division, called to advise he had been contacted by TAYLOR RUDD, Special Agent, Secret Service Intelligence Division, WDC, re above case. RUDD said Secret Service was then interviewing one FRANCIS DORSEY HARRIS who claimed JAMES EARL RAY had been in HARRIS' home and RAY had admitted to him RAY had shot MARTIN LUTHER KING. RUDD thought the FBI might want to have an Agent present during this interview with HARRIS which was continuing. *aka
Jesse
Woods*

LONG requested WFO send Agent to participate in this interview which was being conducted at Secret Service Field Office, 1825 H. St. N. W., WDC. Secret Service Agent CREAMER was handling the interview with HARRIS and could be contacted at telephone number Code 184, ext. 8063. LONG said he would advise RUDD an FBI Agent would be so detailed.

SA JOHN PATRICK BYRNE subsequently determined from Secret Service Agent HAROLD E. CREAMER that it had been decided HARRIS [REDACTED]

No further interview with HARRIS was being conducted by Secret Service. CREAMER RELATED THAT HARRIS HAS HAD PREVIOUS COMMITMENT AT D.C. GENERAL HOSPITAL.

WFO indices disclose one FRANCIS HARRIS, bartender, Lexington Park, Md., was interviewed by WFO in 1957 re GEORGE CAMPBELL PRATNER case (115-28-589); however, lack of background information made identification impossible.

On 4/18/68, Mrs. VIRGINIA GUY, a photographer and journalist with Flair News Service, 1028 Connecticut Avenue, NW, telephonically advised WFO that while covering the funeral of MARTIN LUTHER KING in Atlanta, Georgia, she took pictures during the procession from the church to Morehouse College. Among these pictures were 3 of a group of people standing on an overpass above the procession. It was her impression that one of these individuals in the photographs resembled the FBI poster photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT.

She had furnished the above information to JERRY O'LEARY of the "Evening Star," who suggested that she contact the FBI.

On 4/19/68, Mrs. GUY appeared at WFO with her attorney, PHILIP HIRSCHCOP, 110 North Royal, Alexandria, Virginia. Mrs. GUY brought with her the above-mentioned

photographs, which she stated were taken approximately ten minutes prior to the funeral procession passing the point in the photograph. Mrs. GUY pointed out one individual whom she believed may be identified as ERIK STARVO GALT. She also had blown-up shots of this individual.

Mrs. GUY's attorney was of the opinion that the individual mentioned by GUY was a much younger man than GALT. SAs JOHN J. CREAMER and JOHN BLAZEK observed these photographs and determined they did not resemble GALT's photograph as it appears on the wanted poster. Mrs. GUY advised that she did not wish to release her photographs, but stated they would be available in the future if a better likeness was obtained and appears to be the same as the individual in her picture.

WFO is taking no further action concerning photographs taken by Mrs. GUY of the unidentified individual, UACB.

Galt Had Money While in Birmingham but F.B.I. Finds No Evidence of a Job

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., April 20 —The man whom the Federal Bureau of Investigation has accused of conspiracy in the murder of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., seemed well supplied with money when he lived in Birmingham last fall creating a fictitious identity.

Agents have found that he spent more than \$4,000, but they have been unable to find where he worked during that period, or whether he worked at all.

The F.B.I. has said that the man named in their warrant as Eric Starvo Galt in actuality was a habitual criminal, James Earl Ray, who escaped from the Missouri State Penitentiary in April of 1967 where he had been since 1960 after being caught in a \$120 grocery store holdup.

The operator of a Birmingham rooming house where Galt lived for six weeks last summer and fall said that Galt did not work during that time and spent most of his days sitting around talking about the weather.

Trip to California

After Galt left Birmingham in October of 1967, the F.B.I. said he drove to California and spent most of his time either there or driving to and from New Orleans.

While he was in Birmingham, Galt apparently kept his money in a safety deposit box at the Birmingham Trust National Bank.

On Aug. 27, 1967, William D. Paisley, the sales manager of a Birmingham lumber company, ran the following advertisement under the automobile for-sale classification in The Birmingham News:

"Mustang, '66, V-8, auto trans. Radio, W.W. tires, factory warranty. Individual, \$1,995-592-0448."

Mr. Paisley said that a man introducing himself as Eric Galt had responded to the advertisement and bought the car on Aug. 30, paying the \$1,995 asking price.

"He didn't try to cut the price at all," said Mr. Paisley. "He just drove the car around

the block once and said he'd buy it."

Mr. Paisley said that Galt went to a bank, got the money and paid cash.

During the six weeks that he resided in the Birmingham rooming house Galt's living expenses averaged at least \$50 a week. He paid \$27 a week for his room, which included dinner, but much of the time he ate elsewhere.

Repairs on Car

He bought gasoline and had minor repairs done on his car at a service station near the rooming house.

At \$50 a week, a figure that a source in the Justice Department said was probably low, Galt spent \$1,650 for rooms, meals and incidentals from Aug. 27 through April 4, the date that Dr. King was shot to death in Memphis.

The F.B.I., which impounded Galt's Mustang in Atlanta on April 11, said that it had been driven more than 19,000 miles from late last August through the time it was abandoned in Atlanta the day after Dr. King's murder.

At a cost of 4 cents a mile, Galt spent more than \$750 in operating the automobile.

The F.B.I. said that on March 30, 1968, Galt bought a .30-'06 caliber rifle at a Birmingham gun store.

The management of the store, the Aeromarine Supply Company, refused to comment. But the Remington Arms Company

of Bridgeport, Conn., said that it was a Remington rifle.

A new Remington .30-'06 rifle with a telescope sight such as the one that Galt had mounted on the rifle would cost more than a \$150.

Galt also bought an expensive pair of binoculars in Memphis on the day that Dr. King was killed.

There was an indication in Birmingham that Galt may have taken one or more airplane trips during the seven months preceding the assassination of Dr. King.

An employee of Welta Airlines said that F.B.I. agents had confiscated some airline records and had asked luggage

handlers whether they recalled a certain piece of luggage being loaded on to a Birmingham-to-Memphis flight on April 3, 1968.

The confiscated records were said to have included a copy of a ticket from Birmingham to Chicago for April 3. The ticket was used only as far as Memphis, a source said.

The F.B.I. continued to refuse to amplify its statement of last Wednesday that Eric Starvo Galt and another man, alleged in a complaint by the bureau to be Galt's brother, conspired to injure Dr. King and violate his civil rights under a 1909 law. The Tennessee authorities have sworn out an arrest warrant charging Galt with murder.

A bureau theory that more than one man may have used the name of Eric Starvo Galt was bolstered today.

The bureau said last Wednesday, when it issued a warrant for Galt's arrest, that in February of 1968 Galt was in California attending a bartender's school.

In Birmingham last night, two service station attendants said they had seen Galt in Birmingham in February. They said they remembered his purchasing gasoline several times last September.

The Birmingham Trust National Bank would not give details of the rental of the safety deposit box by Galt, but it did

say that Galt's key to the safety deposit box was returned to the bank last December.

The F.B.I. said that last December Galt was either in California or driving between California and New Orleans.

Earlier, witnesses who had known Galt since last August gave widely varying descriptions of him to the F.B.I.

The description from Memphis witnesses said that Galt was a man in his late 20's. The description from Birmingham witnesses said that Galt was a man in his mid-30's.

The F.B.I. said that James Earl Ray was 40 years old.

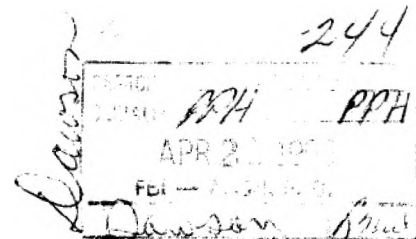
The bureau has not issued a

warrant in Ray's name. Joseph H. Gamble, the agent in charge of the Birmingham office, said that the original warrant in Galt's name was legally sufficient on which to arrest Ray because Galt was an alias of Ray.

The F.B.I. said yesterday that it had determined that Galt was Ray after comparing his fingerprints with more than 53,000 sets of prints of wanted criminals.

On Most Wanted List

WASHINGTON, April 20 (UPI) — The FBI placed the name of James Earl Ray today on its list of 10 most wanted fugitives.

Constantly in Trouble, Often Because of Drunkenness, Ray Left Trail of Violence

James Earl Ray, the man suspected of killing the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., was described yesterday as a drunken drifter, prone to thievery and violence, a failure at everything.

Ray was born in Alton, Ill., a manufacturing town of 43,000 persons along the Mississippi River 20 miles north of St. Louis.

His father, James Ray, was born in Carthage, Ill., and worked mainly as a laborer. His mother, the former Lucie Maher, was born in Alton. Both parents are dead.

Records of Madison County show that James Earl Ray was one of several Rays, believed to be either brothers or other relatives, who constantly caused trouble.

Oldest of 3 Brothers

The oldest of three brothers, he grew up in Alton and Quincy, Ill., and left school in the 10th grade.

"I just didn't want to go any more," Ray told a probation officer in Los Angeles years later. According to the probation

report, Ray began a life of drifting that took him first to Hartford, Ill., where he went to work at the International Shoe Company for 77 cents an hour. He was laid off in December of 1945 and several months later joined the Army.

Ray served for more than two years, mostly in Germany, as an infantryman and military policeman. He was given a general discharge in December, 1948, because of "ineptness and lack of adaptability to military service."

While in service he spent three months at hard labor for drunkenness and resisting arrest.

Losses His Job

Ray was no more able to adapt to civilian life. After five months, he took a job operating a rubber mold in the Dryden Rubber Company in Chicago for \$45 a week but soon lost it.

A 1947 Mercury he had bought in St. Louis was repossessed and a bank account in Alton of more than \$1,000 was used up by June of 1949.

Ray then moved on to Los Angeles, and on Oct. 4, 1949, Ray, then 21 years old, was surprised in the office of Forum Cafe by the assistant manager. A typewriter had been placed on the fire escape.

He dashed away, but in trying to elude a parking attendant, he dropped his identification. Several days later he was seen in the same area by the cafe manager and arrested.

He was convicted on one count of second-degree burglary and sentenced to eight months in the County Jail, but the term was suspended on the condition that Ray spend at least 90 days in jail and stay away from alcohol.

I Had Some Beers

He told a probation officer that he had not entered the Forum Cafe to commit a crime. He said he knew nothing about the typewriter or about why he had been arrested.

Asked why he had entered the building he said:

"I guess I had some beers or something."

Ray told the officer that several times in Illinois he had tried to enter houses after drinking too much, but never knew what he was doing.

Ray then returned to Chicago, where he worked as a laborer at a publishing company. On May 6, 1951, he entered a taxi and after several blocks put a gun against the driver's head and fled with \$11.

A passerby gave chase, but Ray seemed to be escaping. Then he ducked into an alley, which proved to be a dead end. He tried to climb a wall but was shot by the police.

Robert Everhart, the man who chased Ray, recalled yesterday that Ray had said when he was captured, "What the hell are you getting out of this?"

Ray was sentenced to one to two years and released from the State Reformatory in Pontiac, Ill., on March 12, 1954. He also served time in Joliet, Ill., before next appearing in Kansas City, Mo., where he was convicted in 1955 of cashing forged money orders.

Arrested Again

After three more years in prison, Ray moved to St. Louis, where he lived in a dilapidated boarding house in the once fashionable Lafayette Park area. He was arrested in his 10-by-10-foot room in 1950 after a grocery store hold-up.

The armed robbery conviction carried a 20-year sentence. He was also facing charges for robbery and auto theft at the time, and the jury deliberated just 20 minutes.

As he was led away from court Ray tried to escape by jumping into an elevator, but he was recaptured and sent to the Missouri State Penitentiary. Twice he tried to escape, the second time by hiding in a ventilator shaft.

He was confined for a time in the maximum security ward at the state hospital in Fulton, Mo., but was back at the penitentiary last year when he finally succeeded in escaping by hiding under a batch of bread.

Ray's travels since his escape are uncertain.

Harold Swenson, the Missouri prison's warden, said yesterday that Ray's stay at the hospital for mental observation had turned up no personality problems not common to confined men.

"He just had the usual type of problems," Mr. Swenson said.

The State Board of Probation however, recommended that he "not be seriously considered for parole" until he underwent psychiatric care.

Warden Swenson called Ray a "constant disciplinary problem" because of his repeated attempts to escape but an otherwise "innocuous" prisoner.

"He always seemed to work alone," the warden said. "If he hid or did anything he never seemed to have anybody with him."

There was also no evidence, Mr. Swenson said, that Ray had displayed any animosity toward Negroes.

HOW MANY 'GALTS'? WITNESSES DIFFER

Three Earlier Descriptions
of Suspect Vary Widely

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., April 19—The descriptions given the police and the F.B.I. of the assassin of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. have varied so widely it appears that as many as four men may have been under suspicion.

A source in the Justice Department said that credible witnesses in Memphis and in Birmingham who saw Eric Starvo Galt, now identified as James Earl Ray, the accused murderer of Dr. King, seemed to be describing different men.

This, observers believe, is why the Federal Bureau of Investigation changed its view and decided that death of the civil rights leader may have resulted from a conspiracy.

Shortly after the murder, Attorney General Ramsey Clark said that there was no evidence of a conspiracy.

Before the bulletin on Ray, there were at least three separate descriptions from witnesses who had known a Galt in the last six months.

Galt had been described as follows:

QA long-nosed man in his late 20's who was seen in a Memphis rooming house from which the shot was fired that killed Dr. King April 4.

QA 30-year-old quiet-spoken man who talked about the weather at a Birmingham rooming house last fall.

QA 36-year-old "avid dancer" who bought a rifle in Birmingham and who took dancing lessons in New Orleans at the time James Earl Ray was imprisoned in Missouri.

Ray Is Described

James Earl Ray, a five-time convict, was described by the F.B.I. as being 40 years old, 5 feet 10 inches tall, 163 to 174 pounds, with blue eyes and brown hair. He has a scar in the center of his forehead and on the palm of his right hand.

The witnesses who saw a Galt at a Memphis rooming house the day Dr. King was slain said that he was 5 feet 11 inches tall, slender,

165 pounds, with sandy hair. The highest estimate of his age was 32 years, the lowest 26. He was said to have a long pointed nose and a Southern accent.

At a Birmingham rooming house where a Galt lived for six weeks last fall, he was described as being 5 feet 10 inches tall, 175 pounds, with brown hair and a slightly Southern accent. He was described as being about 30 years old.

The first F.B.I. description of Galt, which came principally from a gun dealer in Birmingham, from whom a Galt bought a rifle, and a gun dealer in Memphis, from whom he bought a pair of binoculars, was not precise.

The description, which was released Wednesday night, said that Galt was between 5 feet 8 inches and 5 feet 11 inches tall, weighed 160 to 175 pounds, was of medium build, and had brown hair and blue eyes.

A 'Rural' Accent

His birth date was given as a date that the bureau apparently got from an application that a Galt had made for an Alabama driver's license. The bureau said that Galt's voice had a "rural" accent.

Newsmen showed copies of a picture released Wednesday of Galt to the people who had seen him in Birmingham and in Memphis.

Almost every witness said that the picture did not resemble Galt.

Two developments have tended to bolster the speculation that more than one man used the name Eric Starvo Galt.

On March 1, 1968, an Eric Galt telephoned the Alabama Highway Patrol to ask for a duplicate copy of the driver's license he got in September of 1967. The copy was mailed to a Birmingham address and a bill for 25 cents that was enclosed with the duplicate was returned to Montgomery on March 6 with the 25 cents.

The F.B.I. had said that Galt had been in California during this time.

In its bulletin describing Galt as an avid dancer, the F.B.I. said that he had taken dancing lessons in New Orleans in 1964 and 1965.

Today's bulletin said that Galt, under the name James Earl Ray, had been in prison in Missouri from 1960 until he escaped in April, 1967.

No Mention of Brother

It did not mention Galt's "alleged brother," who the F.B.I. had said entered into a conspiracy with Galt in Birmingham on March 29, 1968, to deprive Dr. King of his civil rights.

Statements by officials of the Justice Department have indicated confusion within the F. B. I.

The day after the assassination, Attorney General Ramsey Clark said that there was no conspiracy to kill Dr. King. He repeated this assertion three days after the slaying and again the following day.

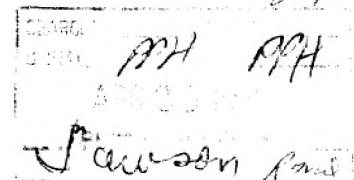
Last Wednesday, the F. B. I. charged that Galt had "conspired" with an "alleged brother" to violate Dr. King's civil rights by injuring him.

On several occasions, the bureau has been reported as knowing the identity of the killer

and being close to arresting him. On April 7, for instance, Mr. Clark said that the killer was "on the run" many miles from Memphis with F. B. I. agents close behind him.

A poster from the Missouri authorities stated that Ray's grandmother, Mrs. Mary Maher, and a brother John lived in St. Louis, while another brother, Jerry, resided in Wheeling, Ill.

F.B.I. Says 'Galt' Is an Escaped Convict

WASHINGTON, April 19—The Federal Bureau of Investigation announced today that an escaped convict named James Earl Ray was the man being sought under the alias of Eric Starvo Galt for the murder of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The bureau pictured Ray as a trouble-prone drifter with a long record of erratic and violent behavior.

Galt's true identity was discovered after latent fingerprints uncovered in the King investigation were compared with the prints of more than 53,000 persons listed as wanted by the bureau.

Attorney General Ramsey Clark and J. Edgar Hoover, the director of the bureau, said in a joint announcement that Ray escaped from the Missouri State Penitentiary on April 23, 1967.

Ray, a 34-year-old native of Illinois, had served seven years

of a 20-year sentence for armed robbery and car theft in St. Louis.

The bureau released front and side "mug" photographs of Ray that were taken by Missouri prison officials in 1960. They bear a close resemblance to pictures of Galt, taken in 1968, that the bureau released Wednesday.

Ray had close-cropped hair and a leaner face than the Galt

photo shows, but the protruding left ear, which the bureau emphasized in its initial description of Galt, appears to be the same in both photographs.

The F.B.I. announced Ray's identity after an around-the-clock check of fingerprint records.

Fingerprints can be matched quickly by an elaborate classification and filing system when the full 10 prints of the person to be identified are available and it is known which finger and hand each prints represents.

But when only a few prints are available and it is not known which fingers or thumbs made them, they can be checked only by comparing each latent print with all 10 prints on the card of each wanted person.

This can be a monumental task, since the bureau's wanted list includes a cumulative file of all persons who have been reported as fugitives by the local police forces around the country and who have not yet been caught.

Latent fingerprints are not readily apparent and are discovered only by careful search and sometimes chemical development. There was no indication by the authorities where these prints were found.

Ray was said to have used the names of James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Connor during his criminal career. When the F.B.I. filed formal charges against Galt on Wednesday, it gave two other aliases, John Willard and Harvey Lowmyer.

The identification of Galt as the escaped convict explains some of the circumstances that led to speculation Galt might have established a false identity in contemplating the assassination of Dr. King.

On Wednesday a fugitive warrant was obtained by the bureau accusing Galt of having conspired with a person "whom he alleged to be his brother" to injure Dr. King and violate his civil rights.

Dr. King was killed by a sniper on April 4 as the civil rights leader stood on the balcony of the Lorraine Motel in Memphis. The Tennessee au-

thorities have sworn out an arrest warrant charging Galt with murder.

Bureau spokesmen declined to say whether Ray had a brother or to comment on reports that the bureau had the "brother" in custody.

No New Warrant Planned

Special to The New York Times

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., April 19—The F.B.I. does not plan to issue a new warrant for the arrest of Ray.

Joseph H. Gamble, the agent in charge of the Birmingham office, said that because Galt was an alias used by Ray, the warrant issued on Wednesday was legally sufficient.

A source said that the bureau thought that Galt's "alleged brother" probably was not a relative. Galt had reportedly told a gun store clerk in Birmingham that he and his brother planned to go hunting with a rifle he was purchasing.

The .30-06 caliber Remington rifle was found on a Memphis street on April 4 near the site of Dr. King's murder.

What Is a Conspiracy? A-24

The most troubling aspect of the charge laid by the Federal Government against the suspected murderer of Dr. Martin Luther King is that it is drawn in terms of a conspiracy. To the non-lawyer, a conspiracy means a plot hatched by many men, worked out in great detail, and executed with precision. This meaning may attach particularly to that word's use in the King case because of the charge by Negro extremists that white America conspired to kill Dr. King. But the legal meaning of a charge of conspiracy, and the reason such a charge is used in cases like this one, are often quite different from the image the word conspiracy is likely to raise.

In legal terms, a plot laid by two men to commit a crime is just as much a conspiracy as a plot hatched by two hundred. So far, no information has been released that indicates this conspiracy against Dr. King involved more than two men—one of them allegedly Eric Starvo Galt and the other a man described as one the accused said was his brother. If that is the extent of any conspiracy, it is a far cry from the kind of conspiracy the extremists have been shouting about.

More importantly, however, the Justice Department may or may not think it has a valid conspiracy charge in the works when it uses that charge in this kind of case. There is probably no Federal charge other than conspiracy that can be laid against the killer of Dr. King. A murder charge

can be filed only by a state, not by the Federal Government. In several civil rights cases in the past, the Government has used the conspiracy charge as a way of keeping full control of the investigation and of bringing its full resources into play. A few years ago, for example, a conspiracy charge was filed in the murder of Medgar Evers, but once the suspect was arrested the conspiracy charge was dropped and no evidence was ever presented to indicate that more than one man participated in that murder. The only other handle the Federal Government has in cases like this is to turn its evidence over to state officials, let them obtain a murder warrant and then ask the FBI to pursue the man as a fugitive. And the FBI is always reluctant to let go of its evidence until a case is sewed up.

It may, of course, turn out that two or more persons were involved in planning the murder of Dr. King. But, on the basis of the information released so far and on the kind of charge placed against Eric Galt, it is presumptuous to leap to such a conclusion.

A-1 New Light Cast On Galt Identity

HOLLYWOOD, April 18— the presidential bid of former Eric Starvo Galt, prime suspect in the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King, emerged today as:

- A fervent supporter of

the presidential bid of former Alabama Gov. George C. Wallace.

- A man with anti-Negro attitudes who once got into a wild argument at a Hollywood cocktail lounge with a girl who defended Negroes.

- A man who made at least one mysterious trip in recent months to New Orleans, a fact which appears to be of great interest to the FBI.

- A steady drinker, alternately moody and contentious in public.

This picture came into focus as the result of a series of interviews conducted by the Los Angeles Times with persons who knew Galt when he lived here.

A songwriter whom Galt drove to New Orleans and back in a white Mustang in December said he had a strong impression that the suspect was not using his right name.

The statement was made by Charles Stein, 38, who was offered the free ride after he agreed to add his signature to the drive by Wallace to qualify for a place on the California June primary ballot.

Stein said his sister, Rita, had made the arrangements. While at the Sultan room, a lounge on Hollywood Blvd.,

she had let it be known that her two children had to return soon from her sister's place in New Orleans. Galt let it be known that he would be going there.

Stein appeared at the Sultan room that same night and Galt agreed to take him along to fetch the children if Stein would sign up for Wallace.

The next day, Stein said, Galt picked him up at the sister's home and drove him to the Wallace headquarters.

"I thought he was some kind of politician," Stein recalled. "I got the impression they all knew him."

Statement Disputed

Robert Walters, campaign coordinator for Wallace in California, disputed this. "We checked all of our name files here—particularly those from the North Hollywood office—and found nothing under the name of Galt or the other names he reportedly used," Walters said.

Stein said that after he had registered for Wallace's American Independent Party, he and Galt departed that afternoon on the two-day trip to New Orleans.

Galt did not disclose why he was making the drive. He told his passenger he "knew some people there." He said he had been there before.

While passing through Texas, according to the songwriter, Galt made several long-distance calls from phone booths, but declined to discuss any of them.

Stein said Galt went to uncommon pains to impress upon him his name, emphasizing it in unnecessary ways, such as when they checked in at motels.

Establishing Identity?

"I think he was establishing a fictitious identity," Stein said.

Stein said that when he brought up the subject of race with his companion, commenting that the same creator made everybody and that color is just incidental. He said Galt was noncommittal.

Stein said he believes the suspect made a subsequent trip to New Orleans. "I heard he was asking people if they wanted him to drop anything off while he was down there," Stein said.

Stein said FBI agents have been visiting him almost every day, showing great interest in the suspect's activities in New Orleans.

He said, however, that he and Galt went their separate ways while in that city, and he had no idea what his companion was up to.

At the time of the trip, Galt was staying in a Los Angeles apartment. Residents there either did not know or remained tightlipped about him.

Moved to Hotel

However, Galt subsequently moved to a hotel, the St. Francis, at 5533 Hollywood blvd. One block away is a cocktail lounge known as the Rabbits Foot Club, at 5623 Hollywood blvd.

The crowd there remembers Eric Starvo Galt very well.

Until three or four weeks ago, according to bartender Bo Del Monte, Galt was a nightly patron.

He would come in at around 9 p.m., perch on a stool near the door, and order the first of several screwdrivers (vodka and orange juice).

The thing everybody at the Rabbits Foot Club remembers most about Galt is the big dispute he got into.

Jim Morrison, who was the bartender that night, recalled that Galt had begun talking with a young woman named Pattie. Somehow the conversation turned to Negroes, and she declared them to be "good people."

Suddenly, Galt began dragging her by the arm toward the door.

"I'll drop you off in Watts and we'll see how you like it there!" Galt shouted.

Del Monte said another customer who had been dating the girl followed the pair outside, and Galt fled.

A short time later, according to Del Monte, a Negro was struck in the head by a rock while in a nearby parking lot.

Sgt. MARFIZO said that GOOCH was acting very strange in that he wanted to be arrested, and for this reason, together with the fact that GOOCH came into D.C. by plane on the evening of KING's murder, he felt the F.B.I. might be interested in GOOCH as a possible suspect in the KING assassination.

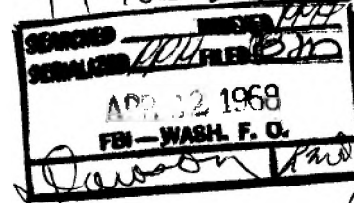

The FBI said yesterday that it was hunting the assassin of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King with "all possible vigor," but that there was nothing new to report in the Nation's largest manhunt—now in its 17th day.

With prison escapee James Earl Ray given an extraordinary emergency listing on the FBI's roster of most wanted criminals, a special alert was ordered along the Mexican border to prevent him from leaving the country.

But the FBI, which is directing the massive search, had nothing new to report since Saturday, when it made Ray—alias Eric Starvo Galt—the 11th man on its 10 most wanted list. It would only say the search is going along with all possible vigor."
