On 4/10/68, HOMARD McCUSITON, Knoxville Parking Service, 5601 North Boradway, Knoxville, Tennessee, telephonically contacted SA HOMARD A. McKAMEY and indicated he had some information concerning the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

On the same date SA McKAMEY contacted McCUSITON, and he provided the following information indicating that he desired that this information remain confidential.

He stated that approximately three years ago he was a member of the American Mazi Party (AMP) at Washington, D. C., and lived in the AMP barracks in that city. He stated he disassociated himself from the ANP three years ago and returned to Knoxville. While in Washington, D. C., he became acquainted with ALLEM WELCH who at that time was the national secretary or the national treasurer of the AMP in Washington, D. C., and worked full time at the AMP headquarters. He stated that WELCH at one time worked with an insurance company in Texas and that he is from either Houston or Dallas, Texas.

He stated he observed a photograph in the local newspaper indicating this individual was the murderer of KING. When he observed this photograph, ALLEN WELCH immediately came to his mind and at this time he looked through some ANP literature and obtained a photograph of WELCH which appeared in some literature he obtained just prior to his leaving Washington, D. C.

He stated that WELCH is a white male, age 32, weight 160 lbs., and has receding light brown or blonde hair, medium complexion, and 6 ft. to 6 ft. 1 in. in height. He stated that WELCH has sharp features and no visible scars or marks. He further advised that WELCH is of the emotional type and that one time in Washington, D. C., he threatened to kill himself.

FBI presses hunt confor King's assassin

Attorney General Ramser Clark announced Wednelday that Eric Starvo Gast is being sought by the FHI as a fugitive on a Federal charge arising from the fatal shooting of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., in Memphis, Tenn., April 4.

FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover stated that a Federal complaint was filed by the FBI in Birmingham, Ala., charging Galt with conspiring to violate the civil rights of Dr. King in violation of Title 18. Section 241, of the United States de.

The FBI complaint charges that "on or about March 29, 1968, at Birminglam, Ala.,... Eric Starvo Galt and an individual whom he alleged to be his brother, entered into a constracy which continued until on or about April 5, 1958, to injure, oppress, threaten, or intimidate Martin Luther King Jr.... in the free exercise or en-

joyment of a right secured to him by the Constitution or laws of the United States; namely, the right to freely travel from state to state. In furtherance of this conspiracy, Eric Starvo Galt did, on or about March 30, 1963, purchase a rifle at Birmingham, Ala.

According to Mr. Hoover, a 30.06 rifle equipped with a telescopic sight was found near a rooming house on South Main St. in Memphis immediately after the fatal shooting of Dr. King occurred. The rooming house overlooks the Lorrain e Hotel and Motel where Dr. King was staying.

Mr. Hoover said that FBI agents determined that the 30.06 rifle had been purchased from a gun dealer in Birmingham, Ala., on March 30, 1968. The telescopic sight also was purchased from this dealer, he said.

The FBI director also

stated that Galt, who has used the names of John Willard and Harvey Low-myer in the past, is the owner of a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama license plates which was located abandoned in Atlanta, Georgia, on April 11. Investigation disclosed that Galt purchased this car from a private citizen in Birmingham on August 30, 1967. The Mustang's odometer showed that it had been driven more than 19,000 miles between late August, 1967, and early April, 1968,

According to Mr. Hoover, Galt's travels in the Mustang included trips to Los Angeles, Calif.; New Orleans, La.; Birmingham, Ala.; and Mexico, as well as to Memphis, Tenn., and Atlanta, Ga. Galt was reported to have been in Memphis on April 3 and 4, 1963, and to have departed from there for Atlanta.

Intensive investigation by the FBI has disclosed that Galt has claimed to have been employed as a cook on Mississippi River vessels and as a Merchant Seaman.

He is said to be an avid dancer and took dancing lessons in New Orleans in 1964 and 1965; in Birmingham during September and October, 1967; and in Long Beach, Calif., from December, 1967, to February, 1968.

Galt left Los Angeles on December 15, 1967, and drove his white Mustang to New Orleans, where he claimed he contacted either an engineering or a contracting firm, FBL said. He left New Orleans on December 19 and arrived back in Los Angeles on December 21, 1967.

While in the Los Angeles Area early this year, Gilt took a course at a school of Bartending and was graduated on March 2, 1968.



According to Mr. Hoover, persons who have met Galt, describe him as a "loner" and state his language and diction have a "rural" quality and suggest that he probably does not have a high degree of education. He is said to drink alcoholid beverages and has a preference for vodka and beer. He is a fan of western and country music.

The Federal statute under which Galt has been charged provides a maximum penalty of ten years imprisonment and/or \$5,000 fine. Bond of \$50,000 has been recommended.

LERT FAILS TO LINK GALT WITH RAY

FBI Turns to Florida in Search for King Suspect

TALLAHASSEE, April 23 (UPI) — The search for the slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. has taken another mysterious twist and was turned toward Florida today.

The FBI last night issued a pickup order for prime suspect Eric Starvo Galt and asked that it be transmitted to all law enforcement agencies in Florida. The order said Galt was wanted for "civil rights conspiracy" and had used the aliases of Harvey Lowmyer and John Willard.

ONE AND THE SAME

It made no mention of James Earl Ray, the 40-year-old escaper from the Missouri State Prison whom FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said fingerprints had proved was the same person as Galt. "Ray and Galt are identical," Mr. Hoover said last week.

The FBI in Miami refused comment. Earlier yesterday, the FBI clamped a lid on any public progress report on the manhunt. The policy was expected to prevail until a suspect is captured or some dramatic new development occurs.

Ray was placed on the list of the FBI's 10 most wanted criminals Saturday, and alerts have been issued in Canada and Mexico as well as the United States.

The Florida alert was the state's second in 12

days for Galt. on April 11, the day a white Mustang car registered to Galt was found abandoned in Atlanta, the FBI issued a "locate and observe" order for Galt in Florida. About five hours later, it was canceled and the FBI indicated later the order was a mistake.

A Miami police official was skeptical of the current alert's failure to mention Ray's name.

"Maybe in about another week the correction will catch up with the message," he said.

A federal warrant charging conspiracy has been issued against Galt and police in Memphis, where Dr. King was slain by a white sniper April 4, have charged Galt with murder.

The FBI is checking out the possibility that Eric Starvo Galt is dead, sources in Birminghám told the Examiner today.

Galt, charged with a conspiracy to violate the civil rights of Dr. Martin Luther King, may have been killed by those who hired him for the King assassination, the sources said.

The Examiner learned that the FBI in Birmingham was told the assassination conspiracy involved at least four persons from New Orleans and Memphis.

The sources told the FBI that Gait was killed before he was paid the \$5,000 promised for the shooting of Dr. King.

FBI officials in Washington refused to comment, other than to say it still has no information as to Galt's whereabouts. The Examiner has learned that more manpower is being turned loose on the Galt manhunt since a national release of photographs has failed to locate him.

The Birmingham sources have named names for the FBI, but the bureau is having crime the confusion as to his description, a difficult time tying those named directly to the King murder. However, the sources did not tell FBI agents who informed them of Galt's death.

It is expected the FBI will be able to decide by this weekend whether to charge one source with conspiracy in connection with the King crime, or to write him off as a reward-seeker,

In its latest bulletins, the FBI has made no mention of James Earl Ray, a 40-year-old escapee from a Missouri prison. The bureau has identified Ray as Galt's real identity, and still maintains it has no doubts that the two persons are the same.

Fake police radio reports immediately after the King shooting have apparently convinced the FBI that a conspiracy was behind the murder. The radio reported a chase through one portion of Memphis, while the killer was escaping in the other direction.

On April 22, 1968, a confidential source advised he had recently learned that subsequent to the death of Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., Bernard Lafayette, Program Administrator, Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), and Hosea Williams, Director of Voter Registration and Political Education, SCLC, have on more than one occasion commented to SCLC Executive Staff members that it can be anticipated other members (not identified) of SCLC's Executive Staff might die as a result of violence in the continuing civil rights struggle. They have pointed out that the continuing civil rights struggle will require the utilization of economic pressures (not specified) which will result in conflicts of interests in the Nation's economy.

with reference to the death of Reverend King, some members of the SCLC Executive Staff feel the shooting of Reverend King was the work of a mentally unbalanced person. While others appear to have an open mind regarding this matter, a minority of the staff feel it is quite plausible that the shooting of Reverend King was directly or indirectly instigated by President Lyndon B. Johnson and/or members of his administration. In support of this line of thinking these members maintain that Reverend King's status as a powerful civil rights leader, his staunch opposition to the Viet Nam War, and potential to embarrass the current administration through SCLC's pending Poor People's Campaign, have undoubtedly irked the President and his administration for an appreciable time.

Source could furnish no further details regarding the above matter, but expressed the opinion that such thinking might be the result of an emotional reaction to a catastrophe, coupled with a distrust of "the establishment".

At 12:25 p.m., this date, an annonomous phone caller called and stated he had just seen a man resembling the photograph in the newspapers of the suspect in the slaying of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. The caller refused to give his name saying he didn't want to get involved. He said he had never seen the man before and didn't know where he went. He said he saw the man leave the Drug Fair at the corner of K and 17th Street N.W. He described the man as a white male, about 45, 6 feet tall, reddish hair, dressed like a bum with extremely baggy pants that were several sizes too large for him. He said the man was carrying two bundles of what appeared to be clothes.

DANIEL DAVID KENNEDY, Suspect

This is to advise that news broadcasts this date on the radio carried stories from Mexico about 80 miles south of Nogales, Arizona to the effect that DANIEL DAVID KENNEDY, an American with an American passport, had been taken into custody by the Mexicans as a look-alike of JAMES EARL RAY. He was said to be from Baltimore, Md. and being taken to the provincial capital for checking by FBI.

On this date a check was made of the files of the Passport Office with no identifiable record being located. One DANIEL DAVID KENNEDY, born at St. Paul, Minn., 1009 3rd St., Farmington, Minn., was issued passport at Chicago 12-12-66 to include his daughter, DIANA LYNN KENNEDY, born at Farmington. This individual does not appear to be identical with JAMES EARL RAY from his photograph. It is noted that since his daughter was born in 1966, he couldn't very well be the father if he were RAY.

The UPI called State Department to advise that the KENNEDY in Mexico had passport This number has never been used on a US passport. Investigation at Passport Office has eliminated the number prefixed with through as having no relation with KENNEDY.

Mr. WILLIAM E. DUGGAN, tex Chief, Legal Division, Passport O fice later advised the writer that he had heard from some State Department official that the KENNEDY suspect had been released in Mexico after elimination by FBI with any connection in the case.

It is recommended that this be filed in case file.
