### 2 new photos of Ray issued

WASHINGTON (UPI) —
The FBI distributed Tuesday two more photographs of the accused killer of Dr. Martin Luther King — one of them "an extremely good likeness."

Both were snapshots of James Earl Ray, alias Eric Starvo Galt, an escaped convict accused of shooting King to death in Memphis April 4.

The "extremely good likeness" is a candid photograph of Ray in a business suit and tie and shows almost his full face, taken in late January or early February somewhere in California

The other, which the FBI said was taken last November somewhere in Mexico, shows him wearing sun glasses and what appears to be a white sports shirt. The FBI said Ray is known to wear sun glasses

frequently.

The two new photographs—the FBI refused to say where or how they were obtained—will be displayed throughout the country along with three other pictures of Ray which how appear on FBI's waited posters.

On 5/9/68 HENRY GRADY LOWERY telephonically contacted WFO and advised he would like to talk to an agent about JAMES EARL RAY.

LOWERY was contacted by SAs JOHN L. PATTERSON and ROBERT W. DAWSON at the Greyhound Bus Terminal, 1110 New York Ave. N.W. He advised that his permanent home is in Athens, Ga but he is temporarily residing at 908 I St. N.W. He has taken a job as a security man at the Washington Hilton Hotel.

While on duty at the hotel he observed two men check into the hotel. The first man did all the talking and introduced the second man as his brother. The second man had bandages on his face and was said to have been involved in an automobile accident. LOWERY believed the second man resembled RXY although much of this mans face was covered with bandages. LOWERY described the first man as 6-1, 200-225 lbs, white, about 40 years ofd with blond hair and a Sweedish accent. The men checked in on 5/4 or 5/5/68.

LOWERY believed the men were staying in separate rooms on different floors. LOWERY thought a woman was staying with the Swede on the ninth floor. While walking past the room where Sweder was staying LOWERY thought he heard the name RAY mentioned along with the amount of a million dollars. LOWERY was unable to recall the room number where the Swede was stayin g.

LOWERY thought that a Negro male who worked in the kitchen was connected with the two men who had checked in. This person, named JIMMY and who had a lorge scar on his cheek, had a gun and several \$100 bills while at work and he mentioned that he had some friends upstairs.

LOWERY advised that he had read in a newspan SEARCHED Was traveling with a Swede and a girl and because of this k 1000 he thought the above people must be RAY and his associations.

ON 5/9/68 LARREA ARMANDO, Gredit Manager of the Washington H<sup>I</sup>lton Hotel advised that there were no persons staying on the ninth floor who would fit the description furnished by Lowery. He checked with all the room clerks, bellboys, and room service personal and none of them remembered checking in a person who had a banadged face. They werex all to be on the lookout for such a person.

ARMANDO advised that a person named JIMMY JOHNSON who has a large scar on his cheek works in the kitchen. He said JIMMY lives at 1352 Columbia Rd. N.W. JOHNSON has been suspectted by the hotel of stealing hotel property and was not to be employed much longer. JOHNSON was first employed 1/30/68. He is very hostile towards white people. ARMANDO knew nothing about JOHNSON knowing any guests of the hotel.

An anonymous male, who mentioned during the conversation he is a newspaperman, called WFO at 5:27pm, this date, and advised as follows:

He was recently in conversation with some people who believe they observed an individual who resembles the published photographs of JAMES EARL RAY in Geneva, Switzerland, about three weeks ago. The caller said the people who furnished him this information did not want their identities revealed, nor did they want him to identify himself. They advised him as follows:

During a Saturday night about three weeks ago they were at the Landoldt Restaurant, Geneva, Switzerland, where they observed an American male enter with a man and woman who appeared to be Swiss. The American was well-dressed and has a mid-western accent. He had the sharp nose and cleft chin depicted in the photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, and he matched the other descriptive characteristics of RAY. Although he was well-dressed, he was observed to use crude language which was mixed with vulgarities.

The woman in the group was a blond (hair appeared dyed) and appeared to be in her forties. She was known to the headin watter of the restaurant, and kissed him when the two men and her left.

The conversation of these three people was loud. The American was interested in obtaining the services of a prostitute. His talk frequently concerned matters of sex. The woman offered to furnish him a transvestite, but he said he wanted a female.

On May 14, 1968, an anonymous male who mentioned that he is a newspaperman telephonically advised the Washington Field Office, Federal Bureau of Investigation, that he recently had a conversation with some people who believed they observed an individual who resembles the published photographs of James Earl Ray. These people believe they observed Ray in Geneva, Switzerland, approximately three weeks ago. The anonymous male stated the people who furnished him this information did not want their identities revealed nor did the caller wish to identify himself.

The anonymous male stated that he had been advised that during a Saturday night approximately three weeks ago his sources were at the Landoldt Restaurant, Geneva, Switzerland, where they observed an American male enter with a man and woman who appeared to be Swiss. The American was well dressed and had a Midwestern accent. He had the sharp nose and cleft chin as depicted in the photographs of James Earl Ray. His other physical characteristics matched those of Ray. Although he was well dressed, he was observed to use crude language which was mixed with vulgarities. The woman in the group was a blond, apparently dyed hair, and appeared to be in her forestes, She was known to the head waiter of the restuarant and wisked him when she left with the above two men. 1703-483 Filed

## Says King's killer is alive

Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark expressed the belief Sunday that escaped James Earl Ray, accused of slaying Dr. Martin Luther King, remains alive. He said he was "very optimistic" that Ray would be captured.

Clark said he found no evidence to support theories that Ray had been hired by conspirators to kill King and then himself was killed. "We have no evidence to believe that he is not still alive," he said.

"I believe we will find

"I believe we will find him," Clark said. Citing the "massive manhunt" under way for Ray, he said, "it is awfully difficult for an individual, and particularly an individual about who so much is known, to remain at large in the United states under these circumstances."

#### Careful Plans

It seems likely that Ray planned the murder of Dr. King for several months. He finally purchased the Rem-ington rifle in Birmingham on March 30, then moved to a boarding house in Atlanta. In his room, agents found a map of Atlanta with four locations circled.

They were Dr. King's residence, his headquarters at the Southern Christian Leader-ship Conference, Ray's boarding house and the spot where he abandoned his Mustang clear thumbprint from Ray's

Evidently, Ray changed his mind about waylaying King in Atlanta and followed him to Memphis instead.

If white extremists put up the blood money it was probably not the Ku Klux Klan or the Minute Men, for they are an impatient lot who would not have waited for several months for Ray to get results.

Black extremists have also not been ruled out. They might have sought to get rid of King in order to remove the prophet of nonviolence.

CREEK was subsequently interviewed, at which time he disclosed that he resides in apartment 302 of the above address and that he is employed as a cook at the Three Thieves. He said that the person resembling RAY (middle picture on W.F. #442A) has been employed at the restaurant for 4-5 weeks and that this individual acts "suspicious". He could not elaborate on the "suspicious" actions of the person.

On 5/18/68 contact was made with Mr. NATHAN SCHNALL, Manager, Three Thieves Restaurant, supra. SCHNALL advised that his dishwasher, JOHN GAUNT, resembled the first artist conceptions of KING's killer, but stated that he does not look like photographs which have subsequently been released in this matter.

After a couple of drinks and during the course of the conversation, GABLE mentioned he had been just released from prison. DOWNEY asked GABLE how much money he had; GABLE replied that he had \$20.00. DOWNEY asked why he was then spending a dollar for a drink, if he had so little money on his person. GABLE replied that he wanted to know how bartenders mix drinks in high class bars. DOWNEY felt GABLE had paid his debt to society and offered to buy him a meal. GABLE Accepted this offer. After leaving the Mayflower Hotel, they stopped on 16th and M Sts., NW, and bought two cups of coffee. For no reason at all, GABLE told DOWNEY: "You are a copper" and said that he had a gun in his pocket and if DOWNEY followed him, GABLE would shoot him.

DOWNEY did not report the above incident to the PD. DOWNEY explained that he was thankfull he was not shot, and hesitated to tell anyone about the above incident, thinking that no one would believe him. Each Special Agent in Charge and Legal Attache is instructed to promptly remind their established cooperative news sources, in a discreet and tactful manner, of the existence of substantial reward money for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the killer of Dr. Martin Luther King. This money now totals at least \$100,000. The FBI should not, however, be publicized as the source of this reminder.

While the Bureau's continuing policy is to encourage the public to furnish information to law enforcement authorities as a matter of good citizenship, without expectation of financial reward, it is fully recognized that monetary rewards are often necessary to motivate some individuals. The knowledge of the existence of the substantial rewards available in the Murkin case could possibly prove of value in the solution of this major investigation.
